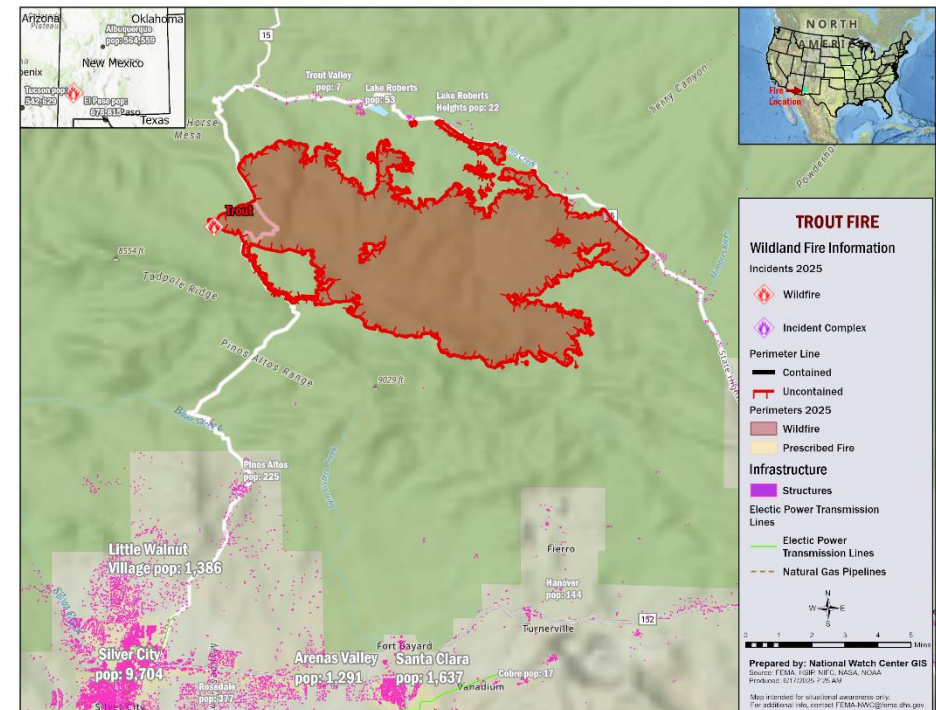
Situation and analysis: The Regional Administrator for FEMA Region VI has granted a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Trout Fire, which has burned 18,872+ acres with 0% containment. The fire is burning on federal land and threatening homes in Lake Roberts, Lake Roberts Heights, Sapillo Creek, Mimbres, and surrounding communities in Grant County, NM (est. pop. 28k). At the time of the request/approval, the fire was threatening 1,247 homes, with 3,117 people under mandatory evacuation orders.

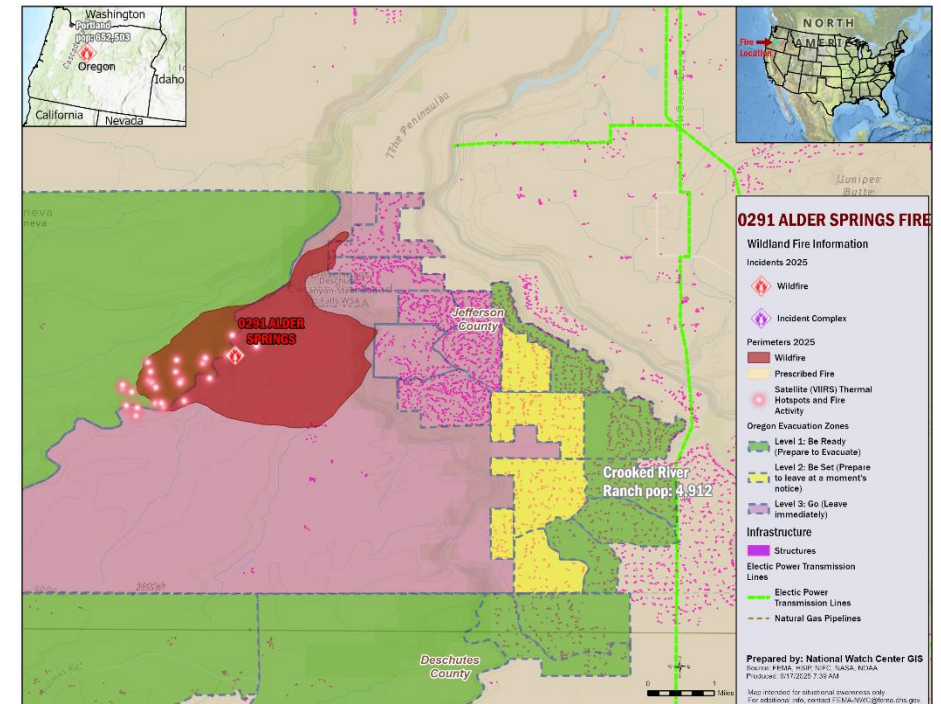
Situation and analysis: The Regional Administrator for FEMA Region X has granted a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Alder Springs Fire, which has burned 1,500 acres with 0% containment. The fire is burning on federal land and private land threatening homes in around the community of Redmond, OR (pop. 39k). At the time of the request/approval, the fire was threatening 1,255 residences, with 2,688 people under mandatory evacuation orders.

State / Local Response:

- OR SEOC is at Normal Operations, will escalate to Monitoring due to Wildfire at 11:00 a.m. ET

- FMAG Approved Jun 17

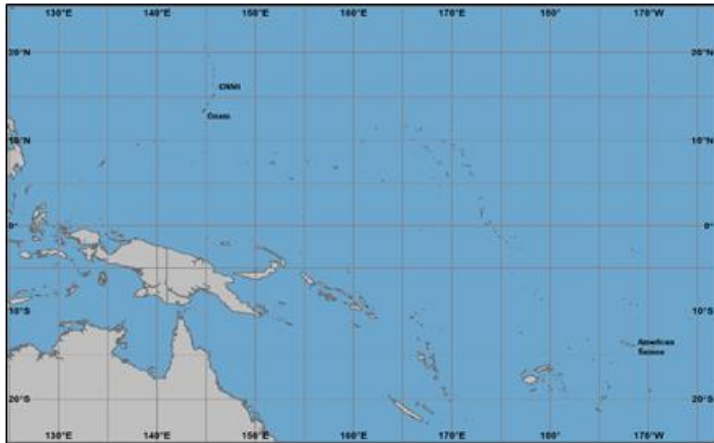

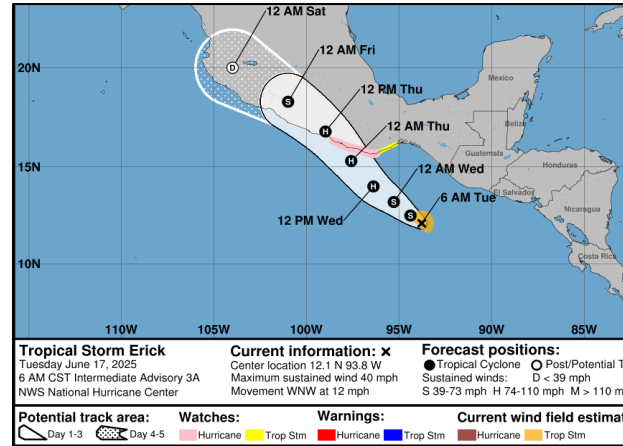
Tropical Outlook

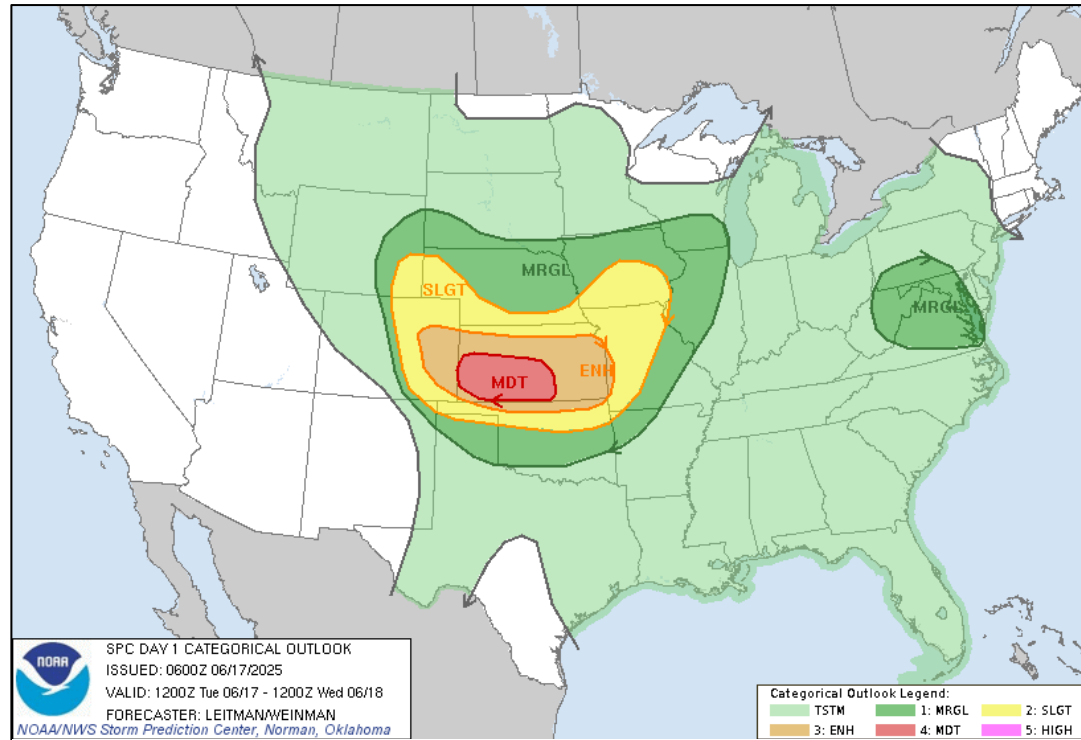
Severe Weather Outlook



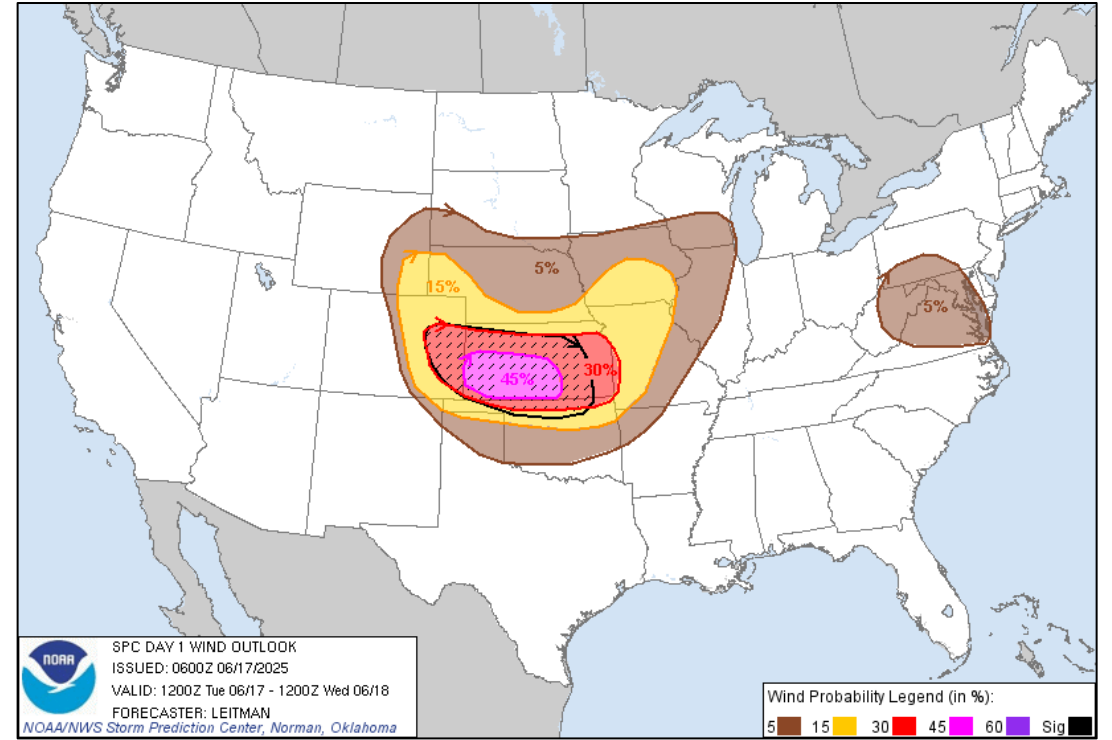

Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

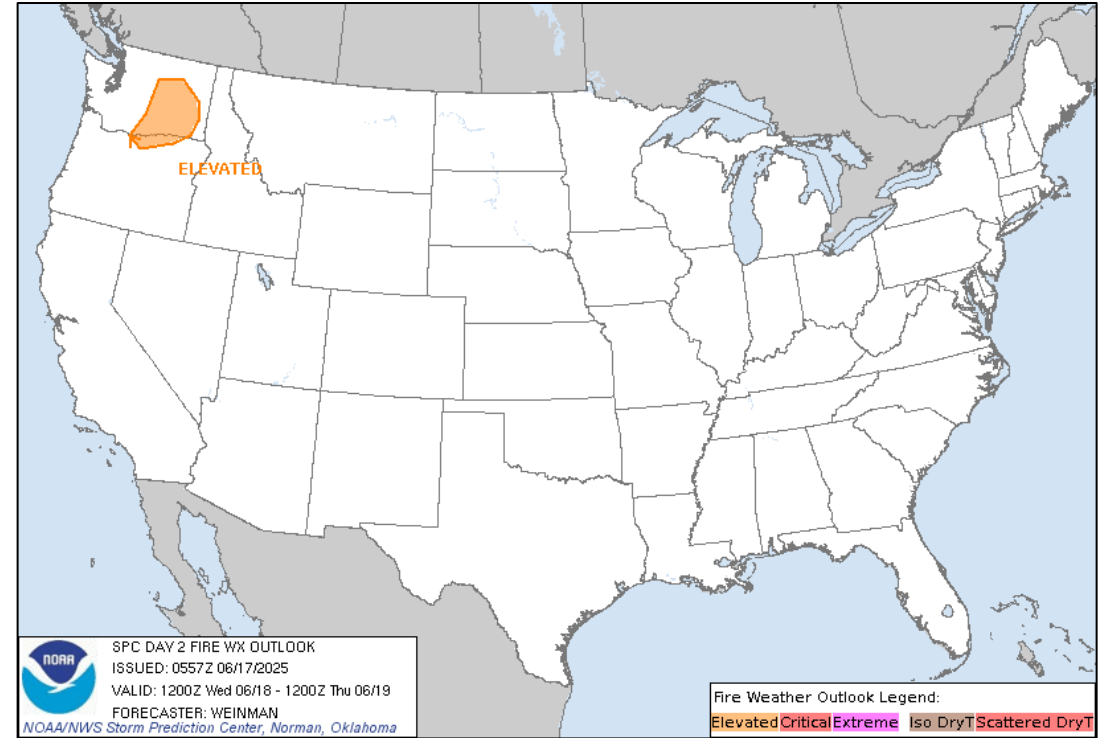

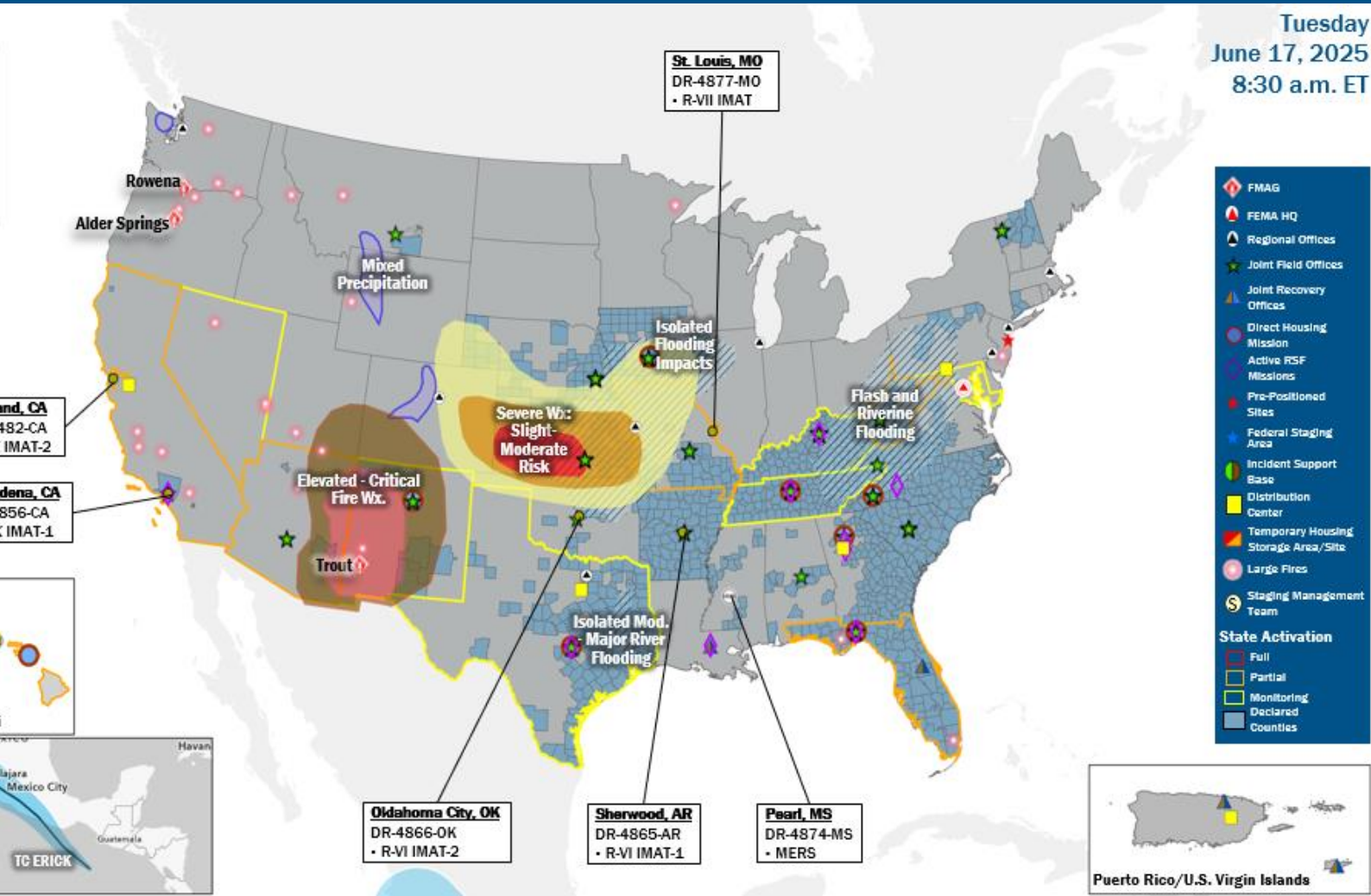
