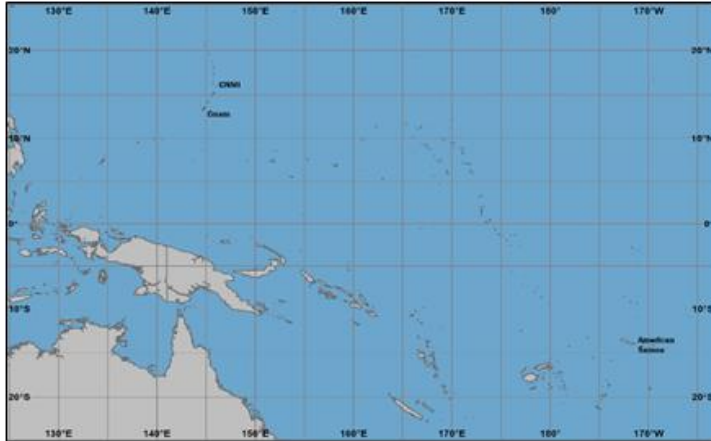

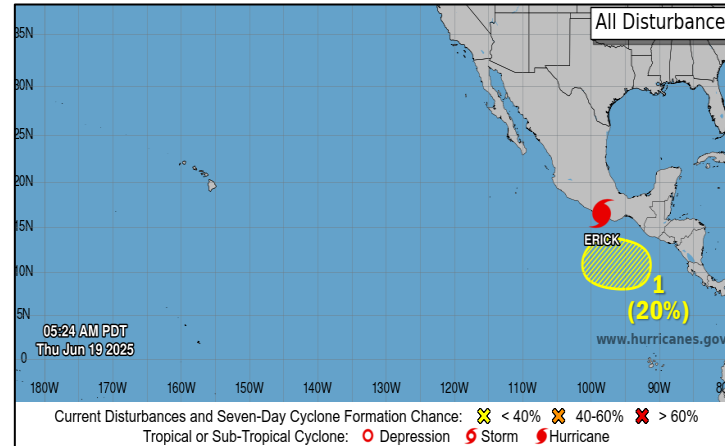
Tropical Outlook

Central and Eastern Pacific



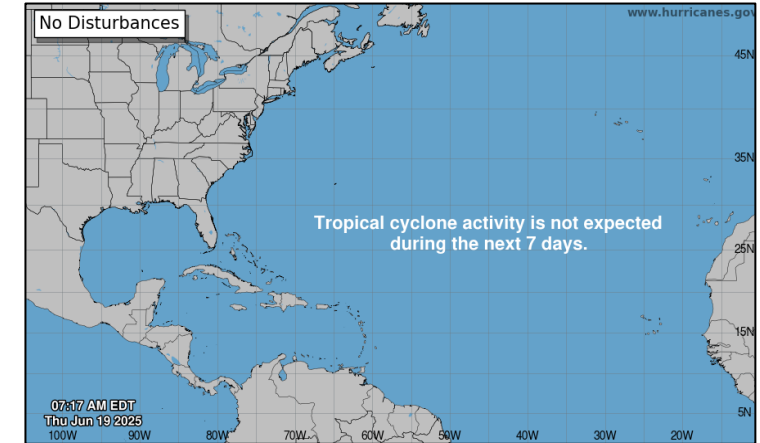
Hurricane Erick (CAT-4); (Advisory #12A, as of 7:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 20 miles E of Punta Maldonado, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 125 mph
- Moving NW at 9 mph
- Tropical storm force winds extend up to 90 miles
- Expected to move inland over southern Mexico throughout the day and rapidly weaken over the mountains. The system is likely to dissipate tonight or early Friday morning

Disturbance 1: (As of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to develop early next week off the coast of Central America
- Conditions appear conducive for some gradual development
- Formation chance – 48 hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)

Severe Weather Outlook

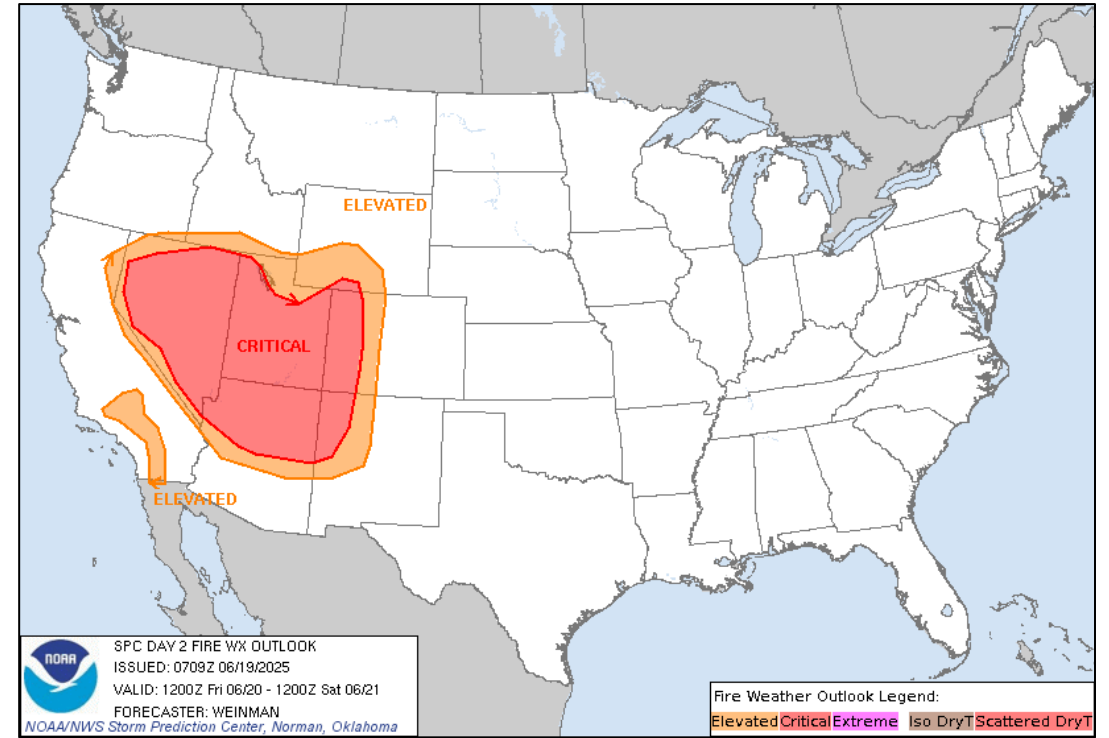

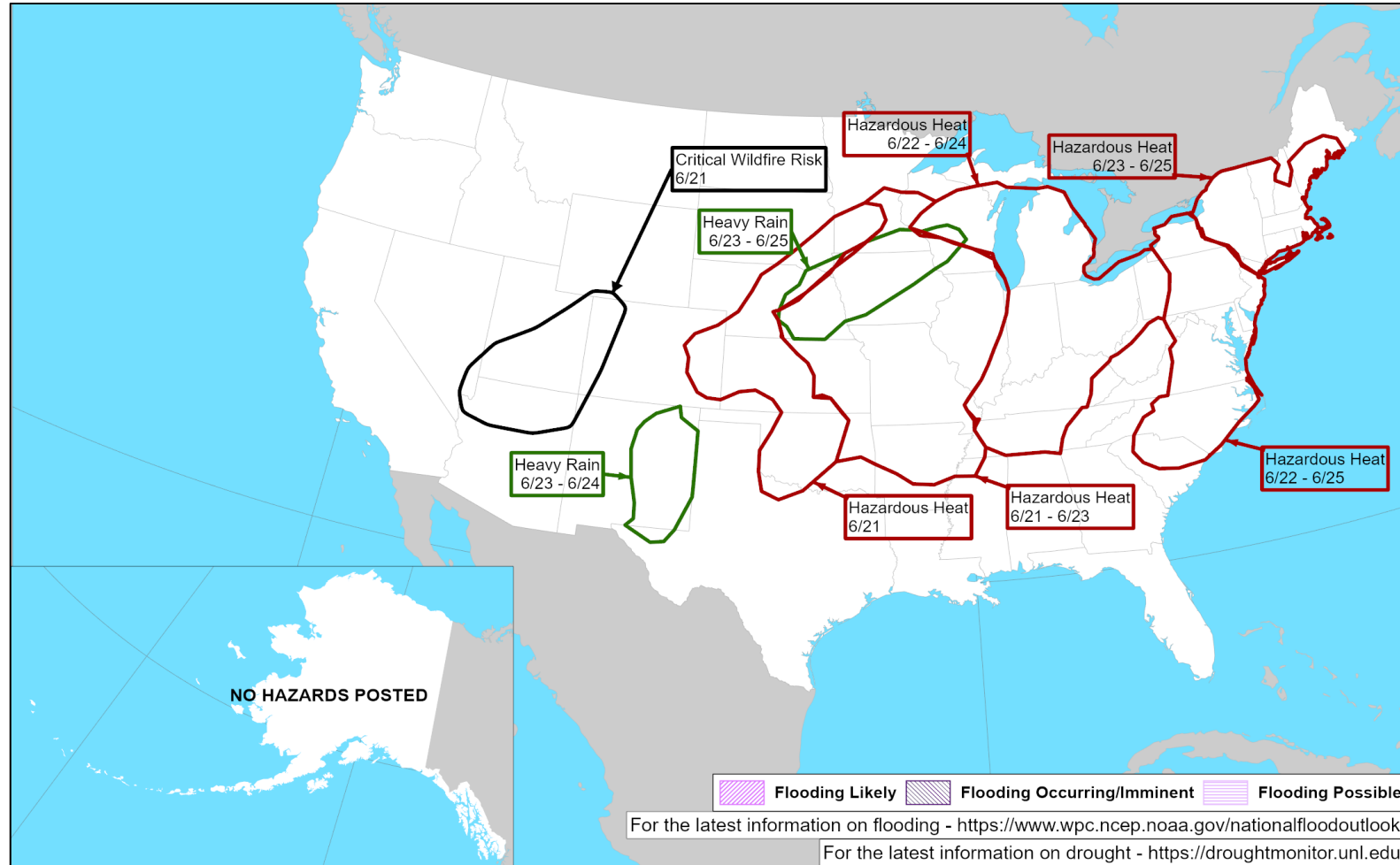

Hazards Outlook – Jun 21-25



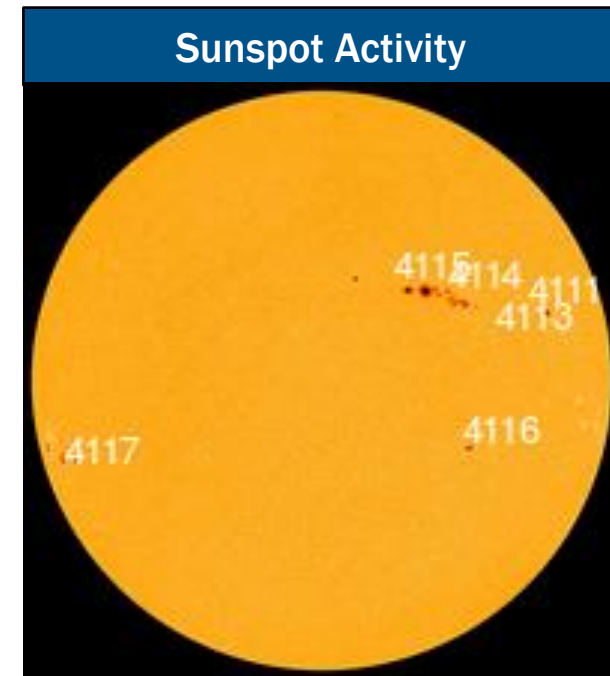
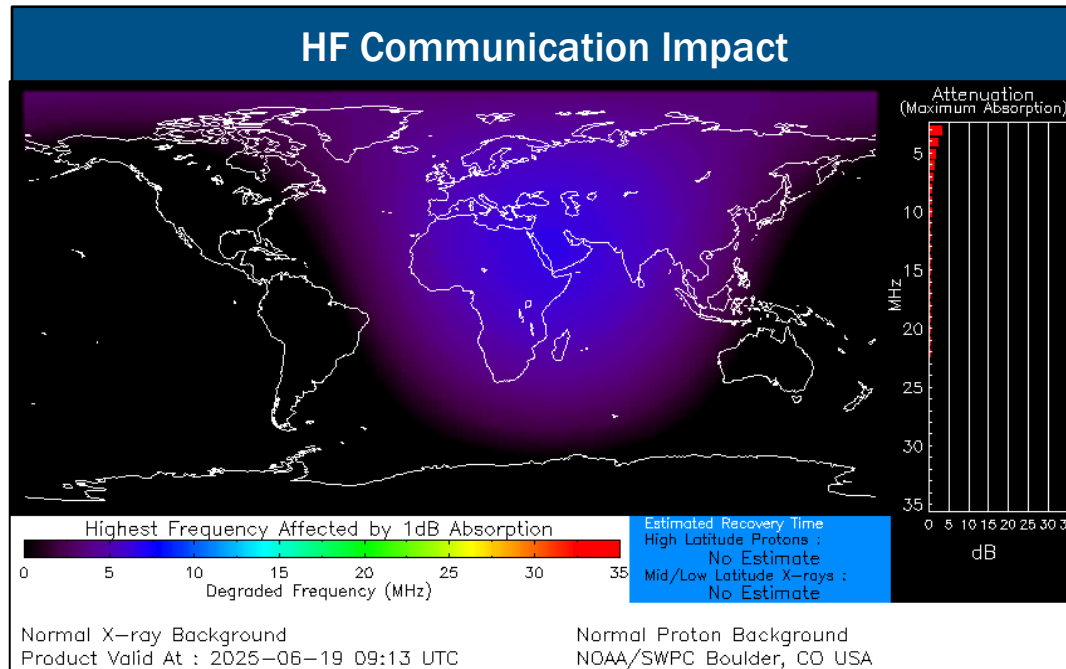

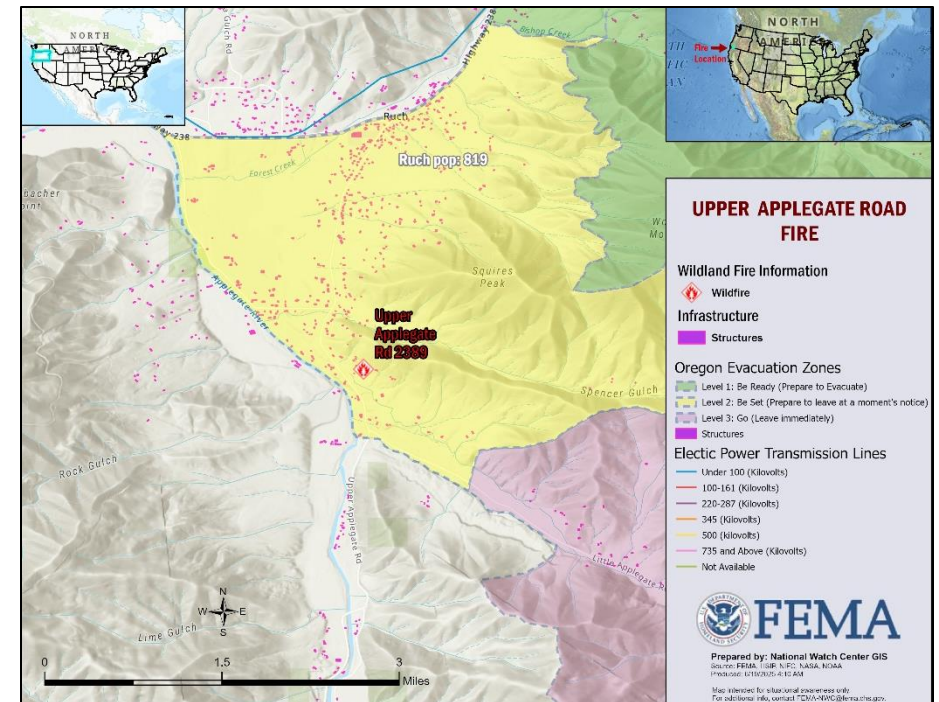
Situation: The Regional Administrator for FEMA Region X has granted a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Upper Applegate Road Fire, which has burned 350 acres with 0% containment. The fire is burning on state and federal land in and around the communities of Upper Applegate, Ruch, and Buncom (*combined est. pop. 14k*). At the time of the request/approval, the fire was threatening 720 residences, with 458 homes under mandatory evacuation orders. The fire also poses a threat to communication infrastructure and electric utilities. Two American Red Cross shelters were established in Jacksonville. No additional federal assistance has been requested.

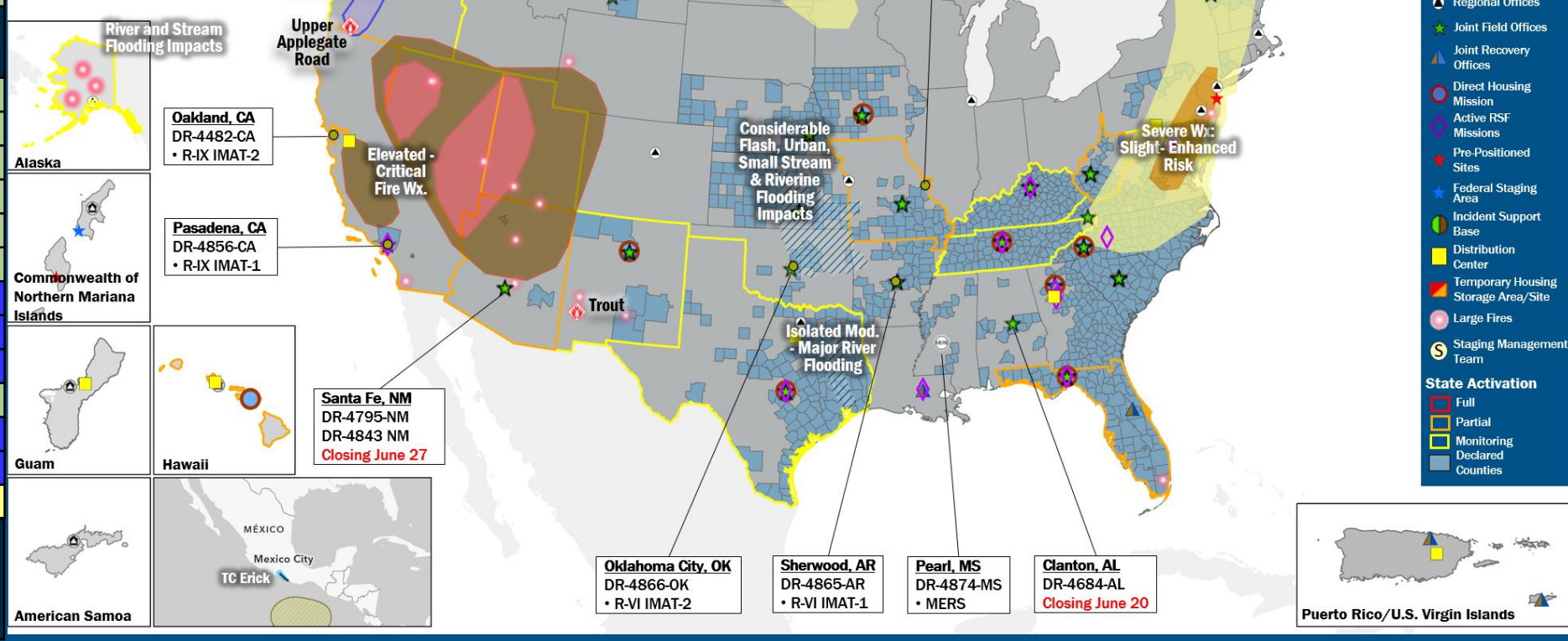

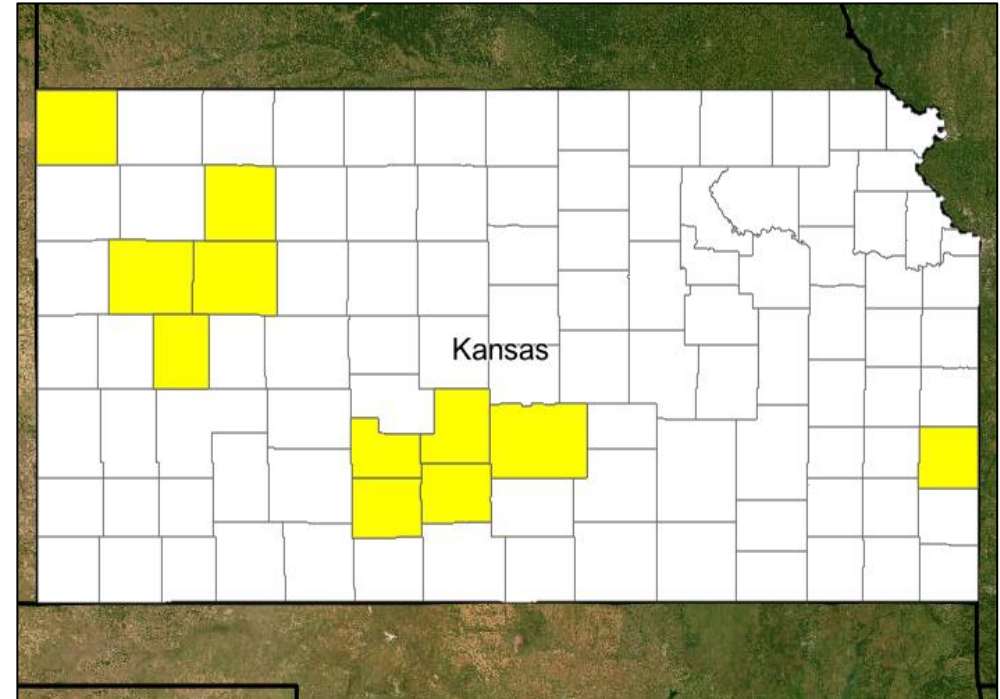
