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Flooding – Lower Mississippi Valley to Southeast

Situation and analysis: Remnants of Post-Tropical Storm Arthur continue to bring multiple rounds of heavy, intense and excessive rainfall increasing the potential for significant flooding across portions of the Southeastern U.S. High rates of excessive rainfall is expected over the weekend and the National Weather Service has issued multiple Flash Flood Emergencies, Flood Warnings and Watches along the Lower Mississippi Valley and the Southeast. (NWS, Watches and Warnings as of 4:30 a.m. ET, Jun 19) Major river flooding is ongoing across portions of Coastal Mississippi and Alabama, some of which has exceeded previous floods of record and likely prompting evacuations. (National Water Center, as of 3:20 a.m. ET, Jun 19) However, there are no reported evacuations in the affected states and the Flash Flood Emergency in Seminary, MS has since expired. There are no requests for FEMA/Federal assistance.

MS: Local law enforcement reports ongoing water rescues in the town of Seminary due to flash flooding emergencies (NWS Flash Flood Emergency, as of 3:30 a.m. ET, Jun 19)

Health and Medical:

MS: 1 unconfirmed fatality in Franklin County (FEMA R4 Update, Severe Weather as of 8:31 p.m. ET, Jun 18)

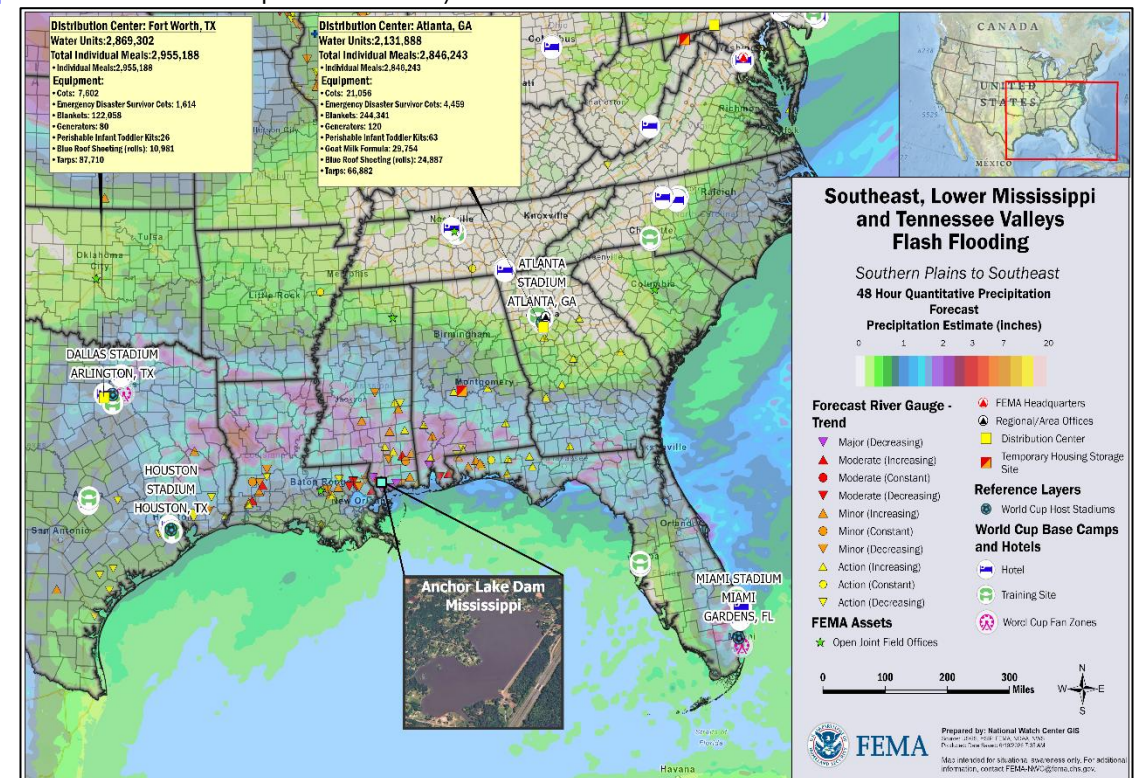
Energy: (Eagle-I, as of 8:00 a.m. ET, Jun 19)

- AL: 13k customers without power (1%)
- GA: 13k customers without power ($\leq 1\%$)
- MS: 1.4k customers without power ($\leq 1\%$)

Transportation:

MS:

- Law enforcement is reporting vehicles becoming stranded in flooded waters (NWS Flash Flood Emergency, as of 3:30 a.m. ET, Jun 19)
- Numerous county roads are flooded in Covington County and impassable

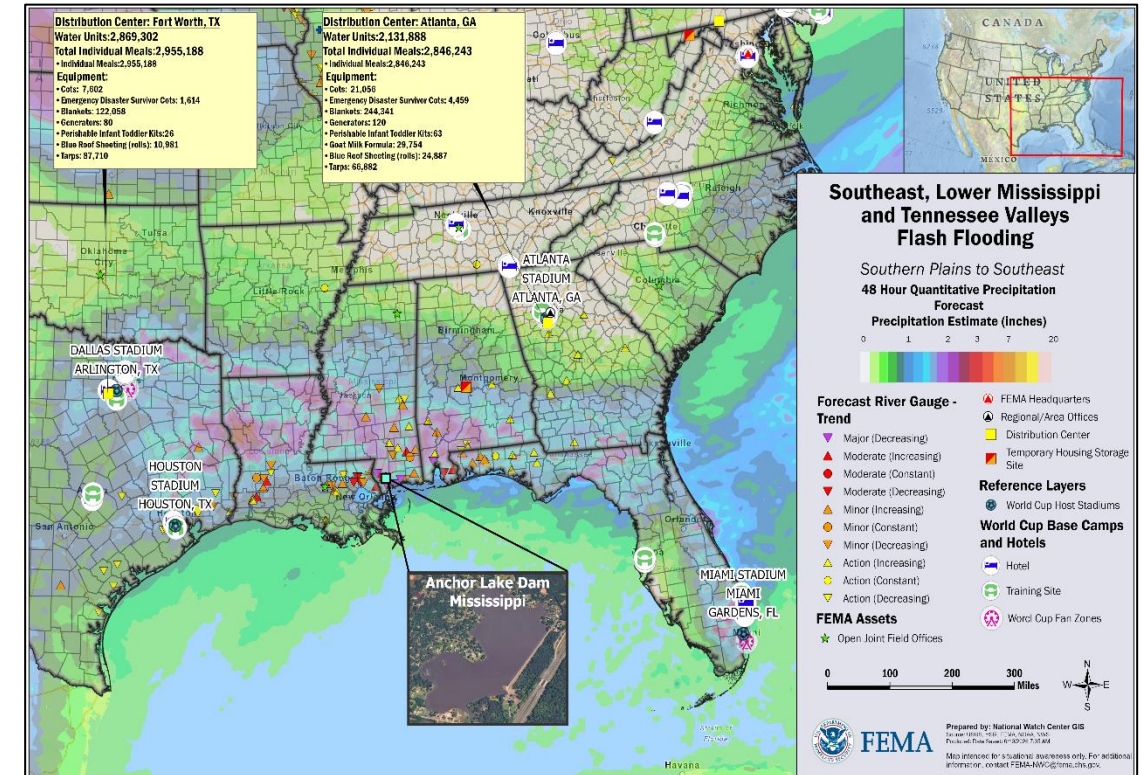

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Severe Weather – Midwest – FINAL

Situation and analysis: Severe Weather impacted parts of the Midwest with reported tornadoes in Indiana and Illinois. FEMA Region 5 reports minimal to no significant impacts to lifelines, however there are reports of at least one injury, including an injury that occurred due to a semi-truck overturning on Interstate 57 in Mattoon, Illinois. National Weather Service (NWS) weather reports assessments and validation is ongoing. All impacts are reported as localized and there are no requests for FEMA/Federal assistance and no unmet needs for lifeline impacts (*FEMA Region 5 Tornado SPOTREP Update #1, as of 1:40 p.m. ET, June 18*)

FEMA Region 5 Lifeline Impacts: (*FEMA R5 Incident Report Update 1, Severe Weather as of 8:22 a.m. ET, Jun 19*)

Safety and Security: Damage assessments and debris removal operations continue

Food/Hydration/Shelter: Three (3) shelters remain open with a total occupancy of 30

Health and Medical: Three storm-related injuries reported, no fatalities

Energy: (*Eagle-I, as of 8:00 a.m. ET, Jun 19*)

- IL: 8k customers without power ($\leq 1\%$)
- OH: 3k customers without power ($\leq 1\%$)
- Utility restoration operations continue

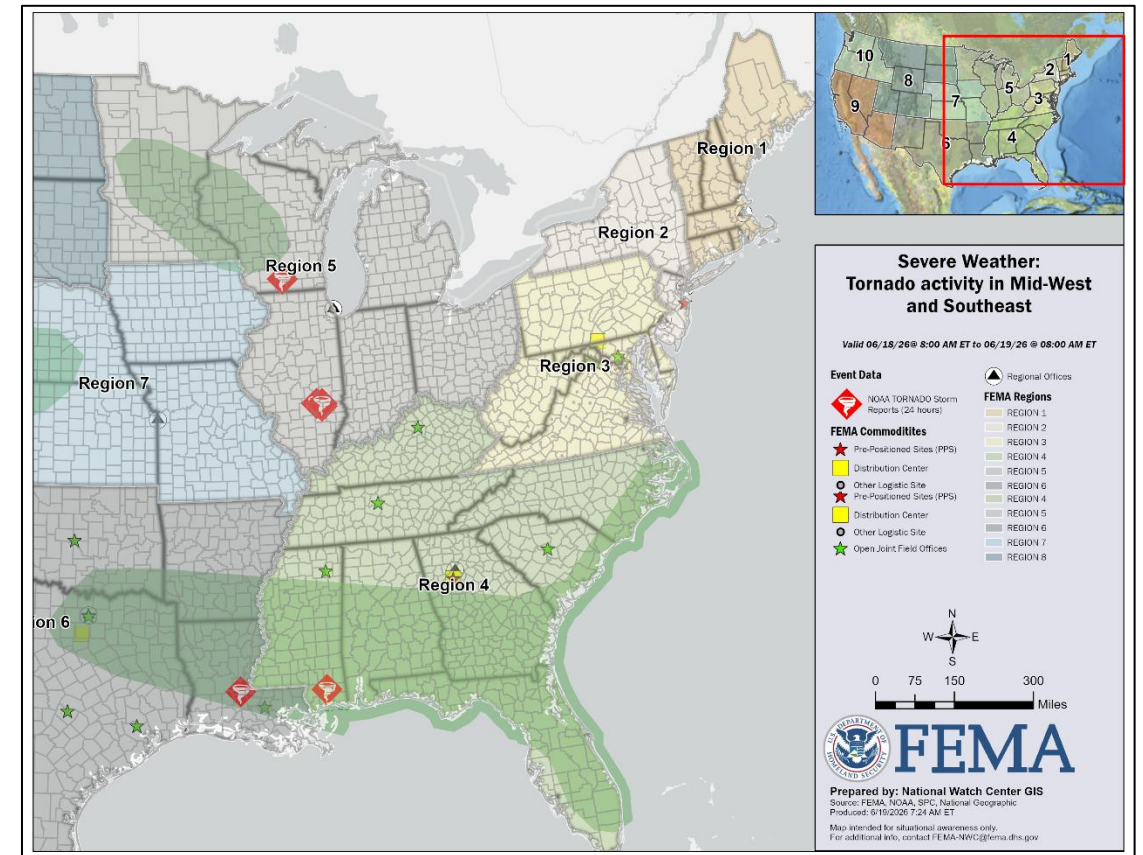
Transportation: Debris removal operations continue to improve roadway impacts and downed utility infrastructure

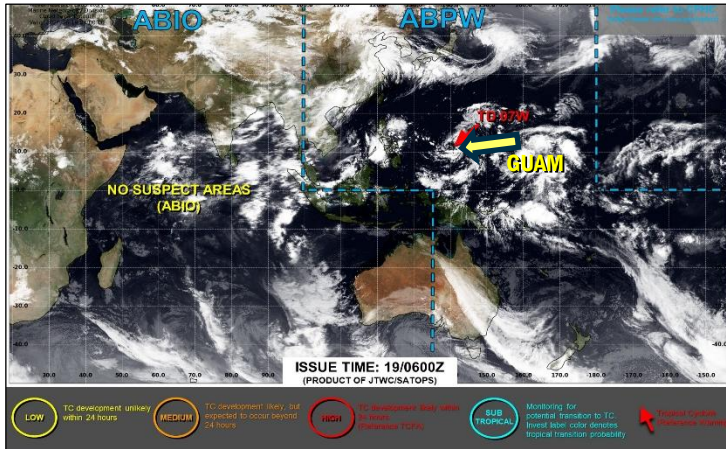

Tropical Depression 07W: (Advisory #1, as of 5:00 p.m. ET)

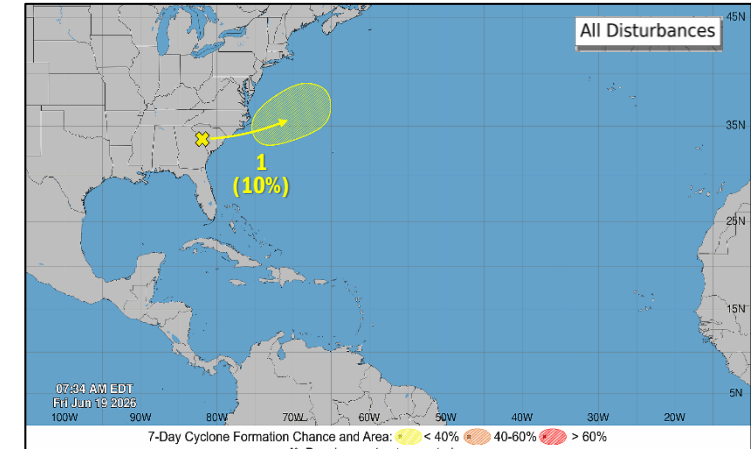
- Located 240 miles W of Andersen AFB, Guam

Disturbance 1: (as of 2:00 a.m.)

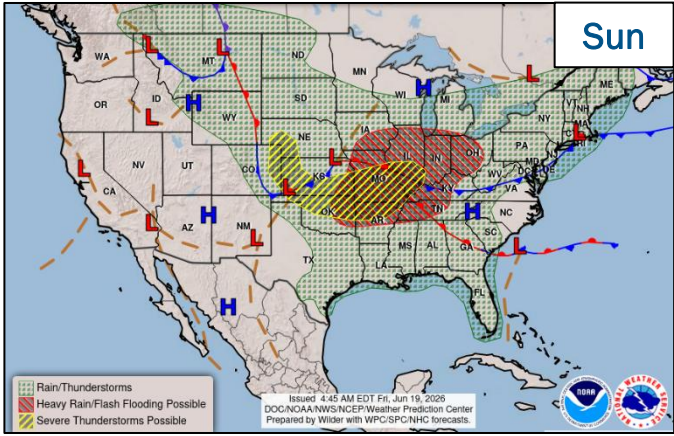
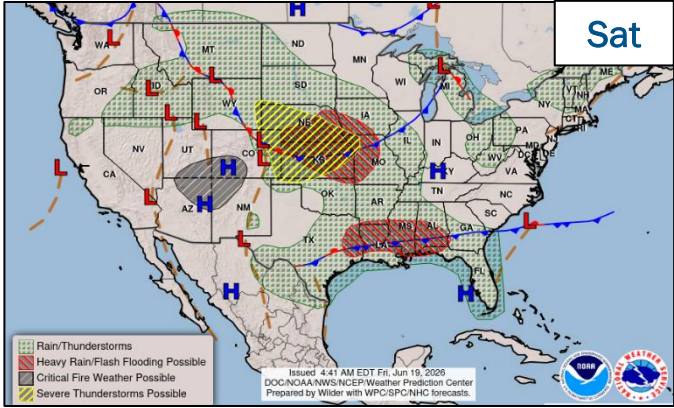
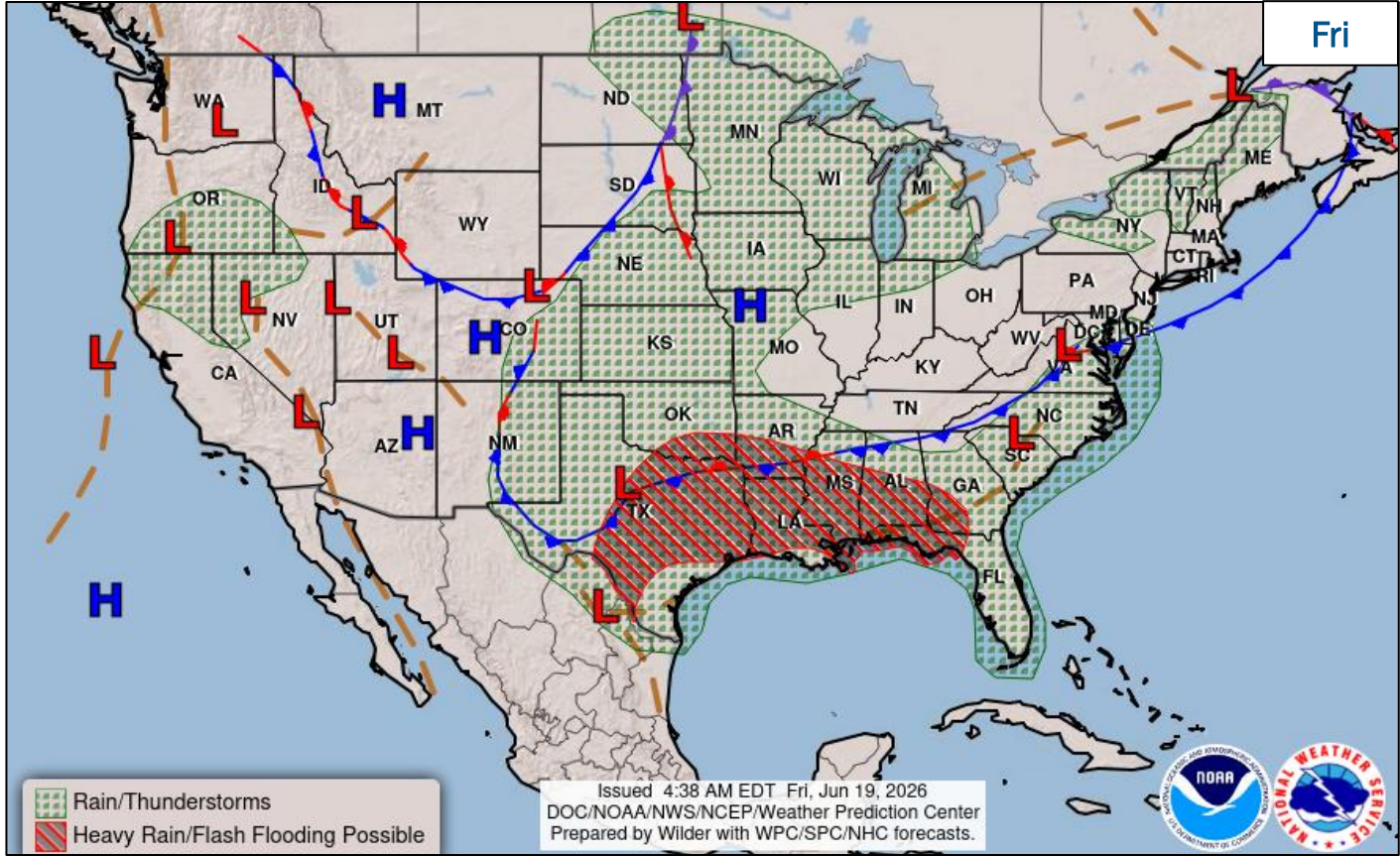
- Located over Southeastern U.S.

- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (10%)



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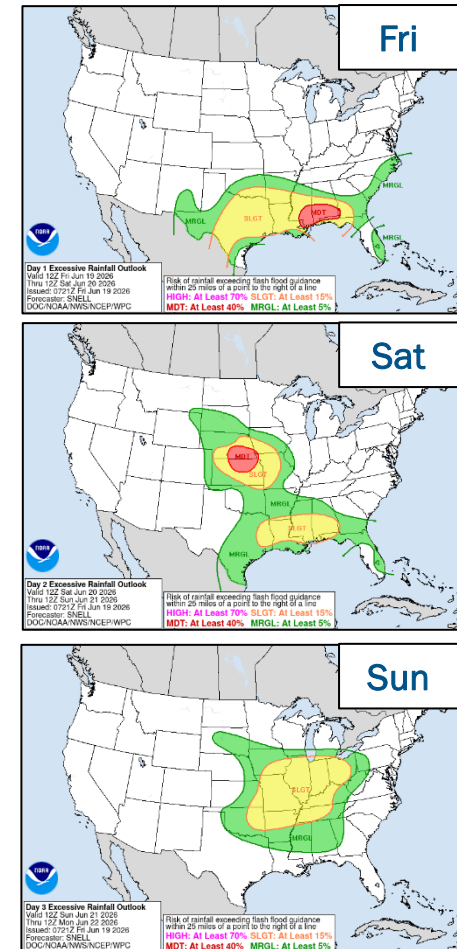
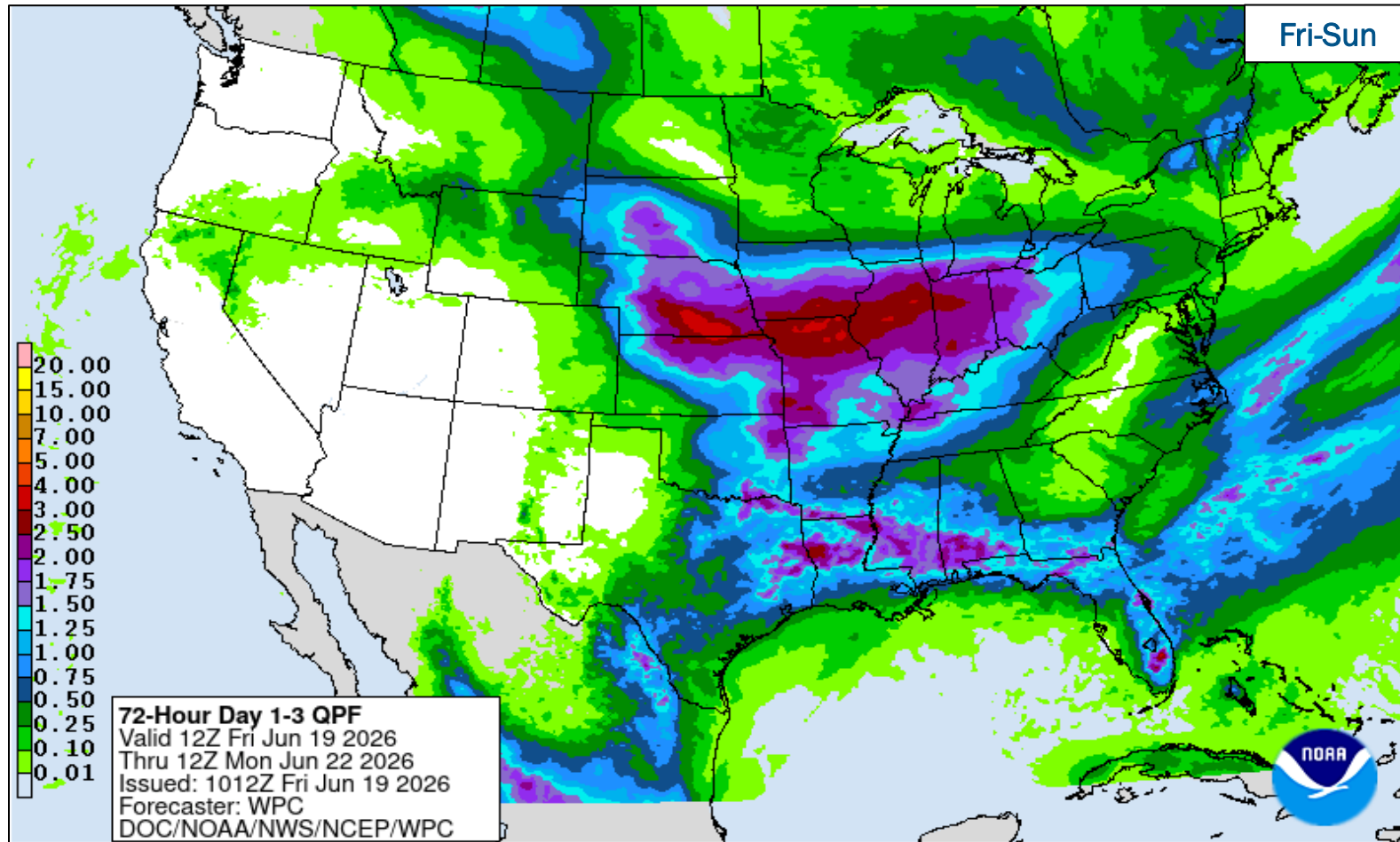
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National Weather Forecast



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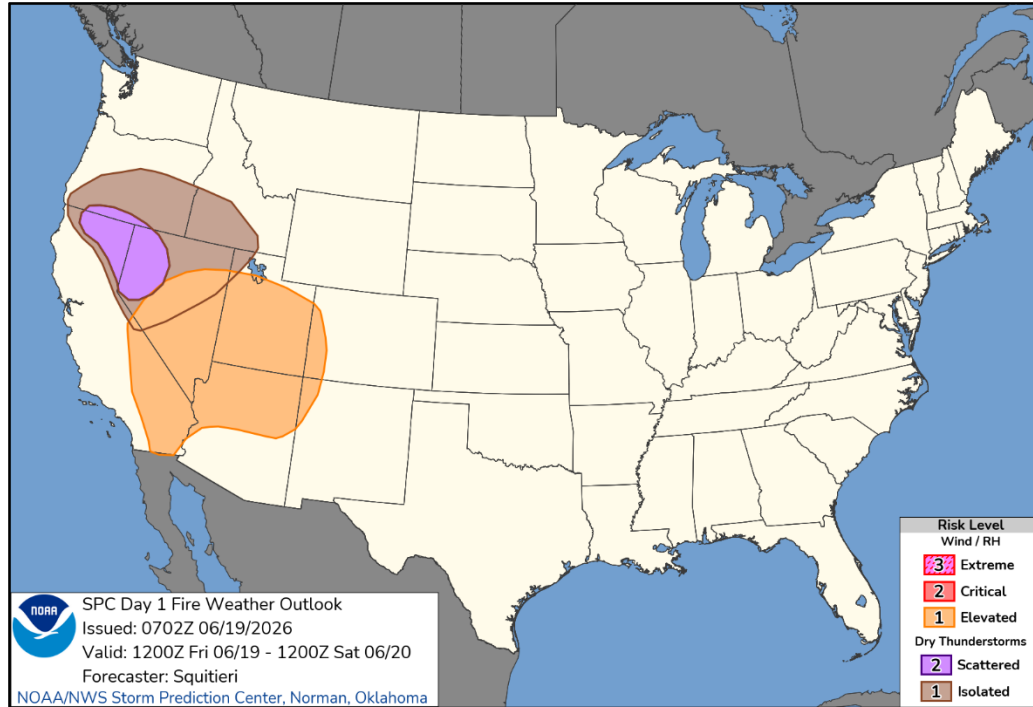
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



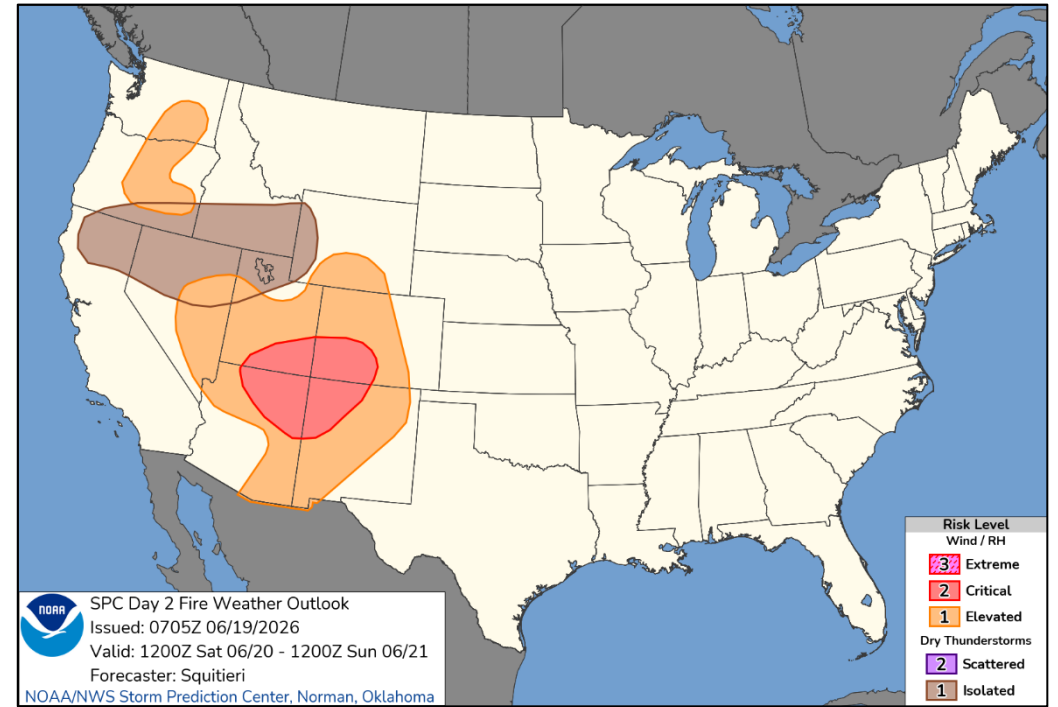
