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# Severe Weather – Mid-Atlantic

**Situation:** Overnight, a severe weather event impacted portions of FEMA Region III. Widespread power outages due to downed trees and electrical lines have been reported, mainly in the Richmond, Washington D.C., and Philadelphia metropolitan areas. Last night power outages peaked at 655k (5% of customers) but have subsided to 261k (2%), currently. The severe weather is no longer a threat as the event has shifted eastward. All storm related watches and warnings have since expired. Local recovery efforts are ongoing and there are no current request for FEMA assistance.

**Impacts:**

*Energy (Eagle-1, as of 7:30 a.m. ET)*

- Pennsylvania – 159k (3%) customers without power
  - o Montgomery County – 48k (15%) customers countywide
  - o Bucks County – 42k (17%) customers countywide
  - o Delaware County – 42k (18%) customers countywide
- Virginia – 50k (1%) customers without power
  - o Henrico County – 13k (8%) customers countywide
  - o Fairfax County – 12k (3%) customers countywide
- Maryland – 44k (2%) customers without power
  - o Cecil County – 22k (37%) customers countywide
  - o Anne Arundel County – 9k (4%) customers countywide

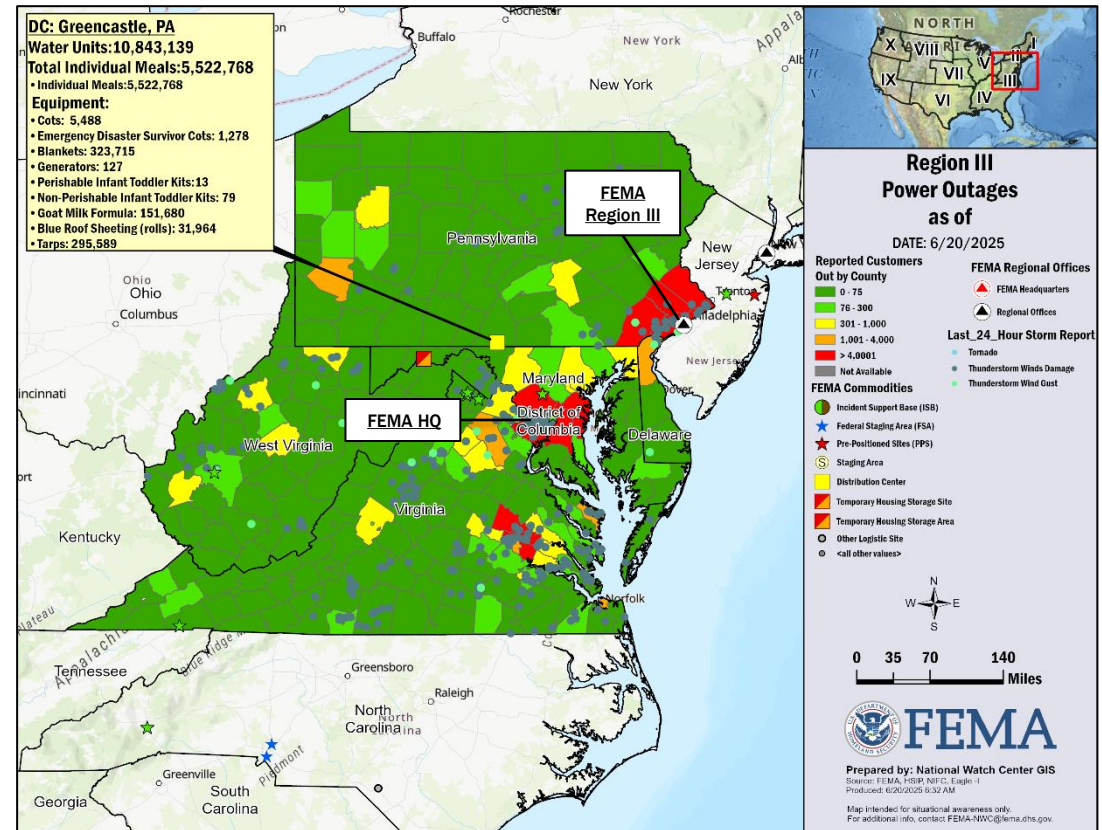

Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) reports the Maryland Area Rail Commuter (MARC) Brunswick Line service is cancelled for Friday, June 20, due to the effects of the severe weather.

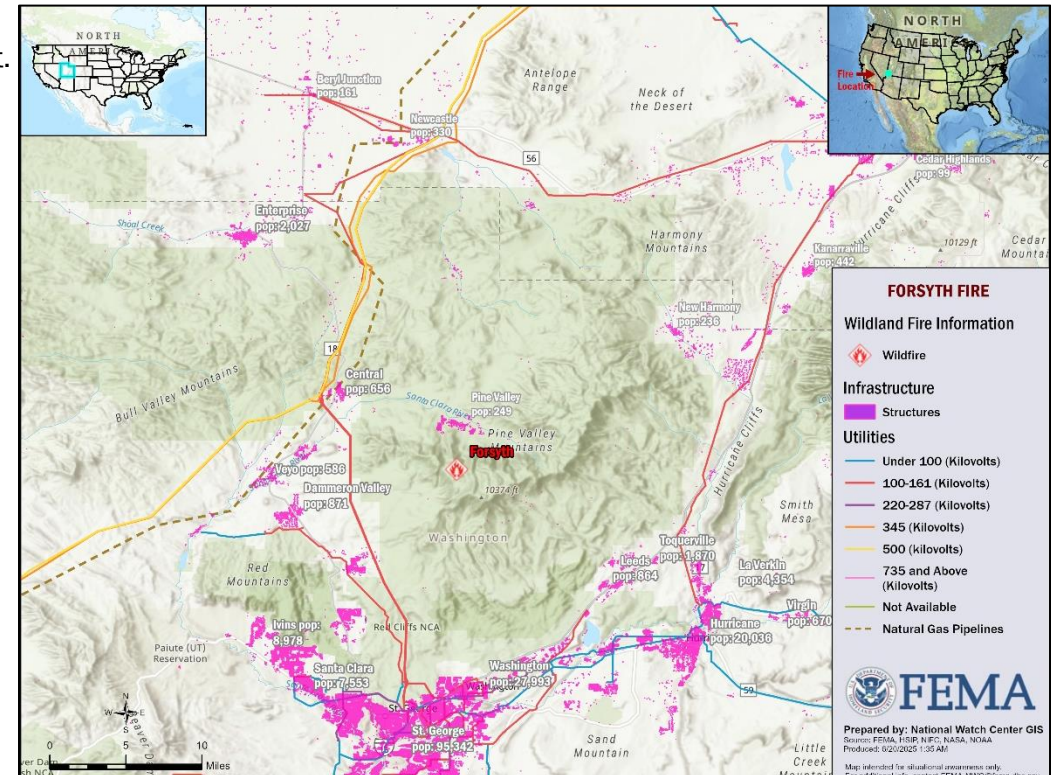
**Situation:** The FEMA Region VIII Regional Administrator has approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Forsyth Fire, which has burned 500 acres with 0% containment. The fire is burning on federal and private land in the community of Pine Valley (est. pop 249). Aside from the FMAG approval, no additional federal assistance has been requested.

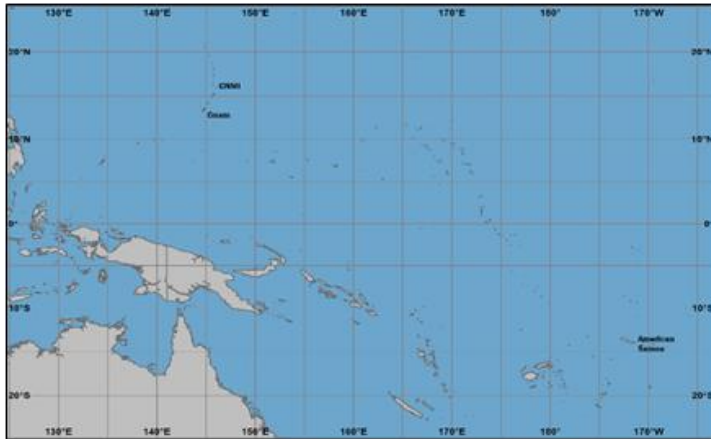


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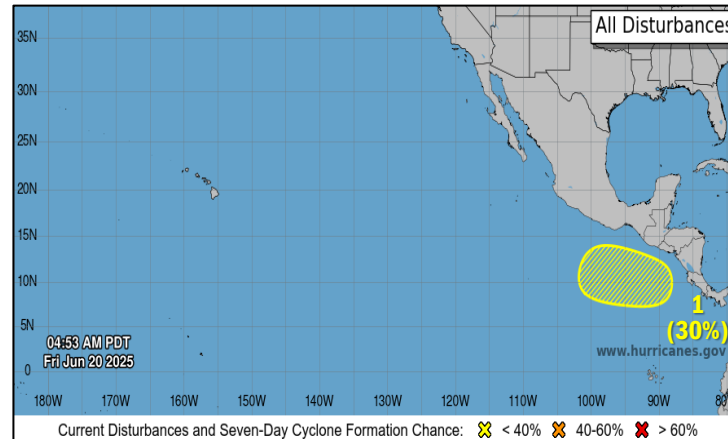

- No tropical cyclones threatening the U.S. territories are expected during the next 7 days

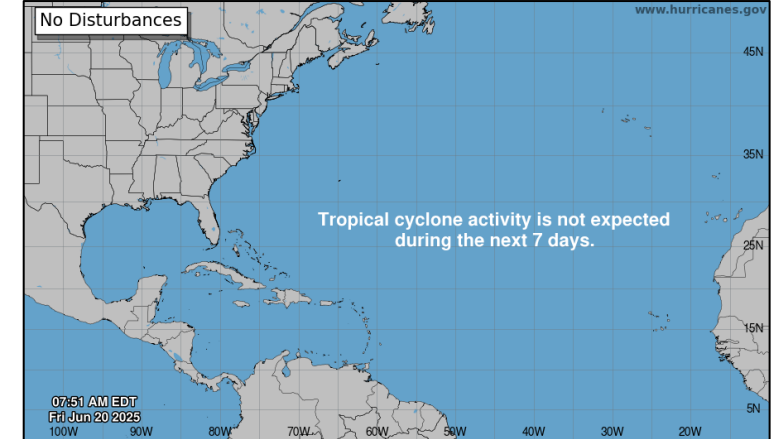
## Central and Eastern Pacific
