

Tropical Storm Bret - Atlantic

Tropical Storm Bret (Advisory #8A, as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- 505 miles E of Barbados
- Moving W at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 60 miles
- Expected to bring strong winds and heavy rains to portions of the Leeward Islands Thursday and Thursday night
- Tropical Storm Watches issued for the portions of the Lesser Antilles






Tropical Outlook - Seven Day

Central Pacific Eastern Pacific Atlantic




 No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next seven days



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Likely to form this weekend a few hundred miles off the coast of southwestern Mexico
- Moving WNW parallel to coast of Mexico
- Conditions appear favorable for development of this system and a tropical depression could form early next week
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%);7-day: Medium (40%)



Tropical Storm Bret (Advisory #8A, as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located mid way between the west coast of Africa and the Lesser Antilles
- Moving W at 10-15 mph
- Tropical depression will likely form during the next couple of days
- Formation chance 48-hour: High (70%);7-day: High (80%)



Tropical Storm Bret - Preparations

Current Situation:

Preparations for Tropical Storm Bret continue as the system moves westward toward the Lesser Antilles.

Territorial Preparation:

- PR EOC at Normal Operations
- USVI EOC activated virtually as of 8:00 a.m. ET, Jun 21

FEMA/Federal Preparation:

Region II Office:

- RWC deactivated the Enhanced Watch
- RRCC with ESFs 1/2/3/8/12/13/14 and DCE is activated, day shift only

USVI:


- RII IMAT: Operational as of 8:00 a.m. ET, Jun 21
- LNOs, pre-designated FCO, DCE and ESFs 2/3/8/9/12/13/14 in place and operational

PR:

- LNOs, pre-designated FCO, DCE, MERS and ESFs 1/2/3/8/12/13/14 in place and operational
- USACE: One (1) Type 4 power team deploying to PR


FEMA HQ:

- NWC in coordination with Region II will continue to monitor; next update will be in the 5:00 p.m. ET National Situation Report






National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Severe Weather Outlook





Hazards Outlook – Jun 23-27






