**Situation:** On June 20, the FEMA Region IX Regional Administrator approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Conner Fire, which has burned in excess of 200 acres of tribal land with 0% containment. The fire is burning on Washoe Tribal Land (Douglas County, NV est. Pop. 49k). Aside from the FMAG approval, no additional federal assistance has been requested.

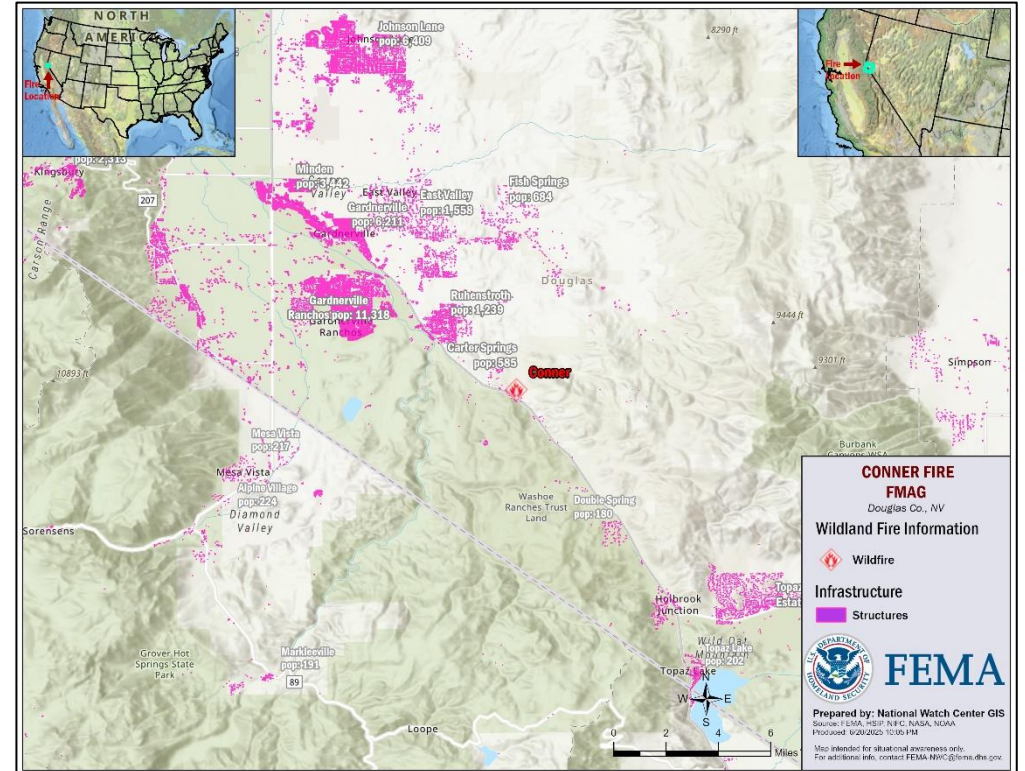

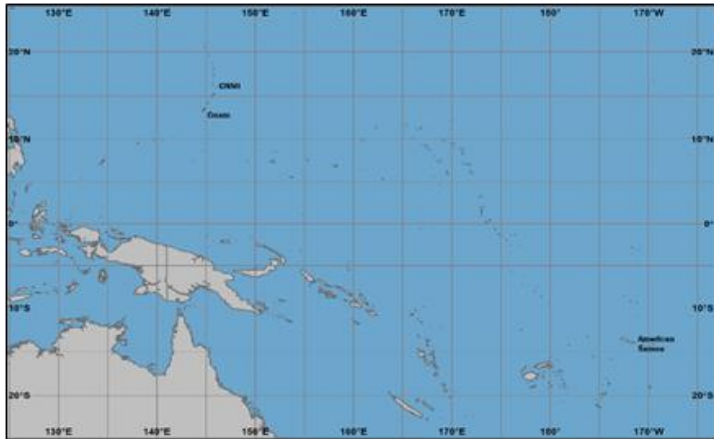

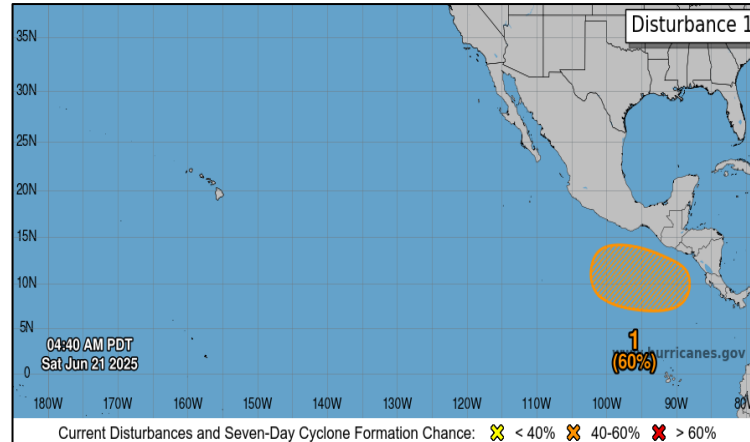
# Tropical Outlook

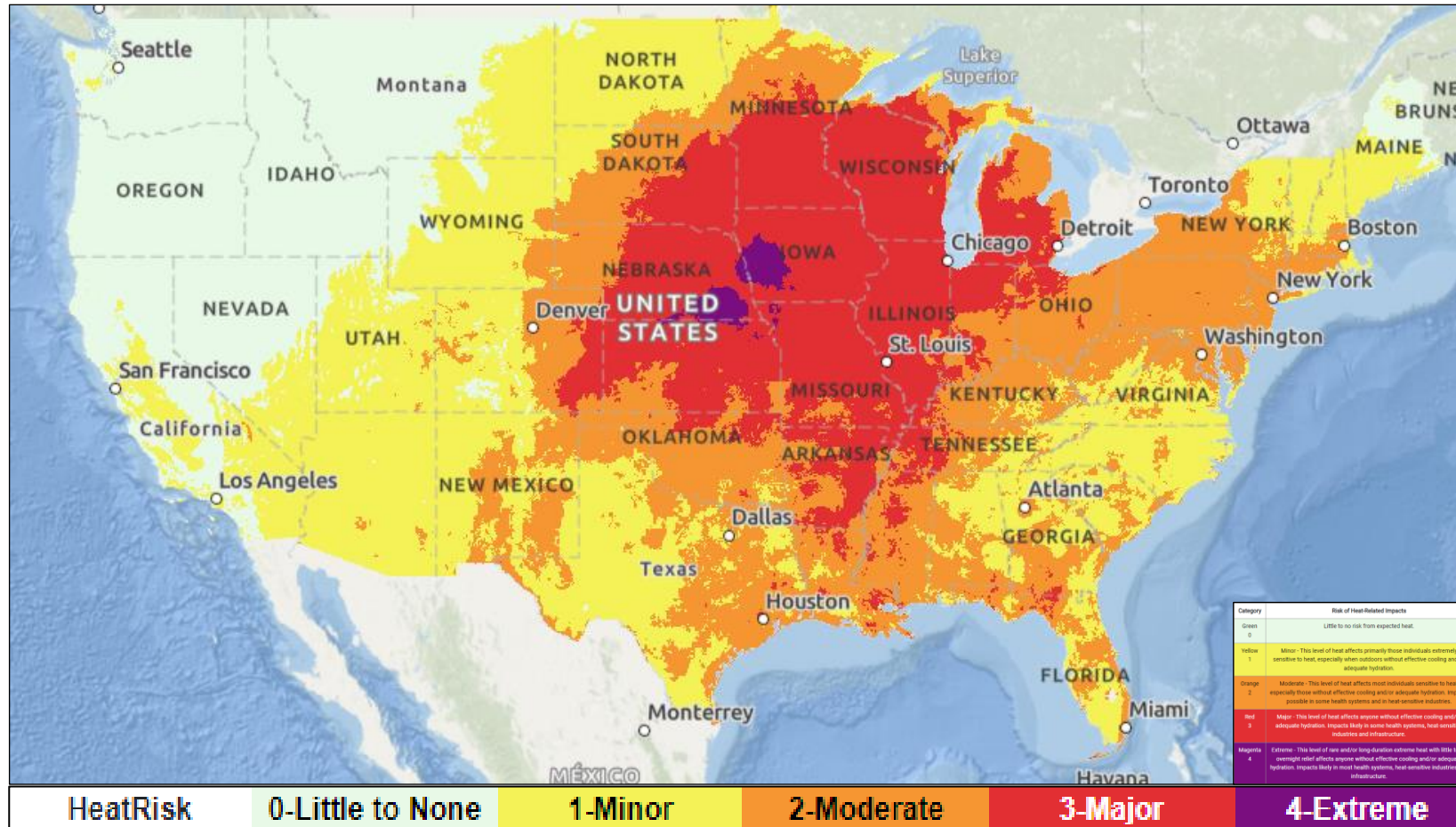

# Severe Weather Outlook



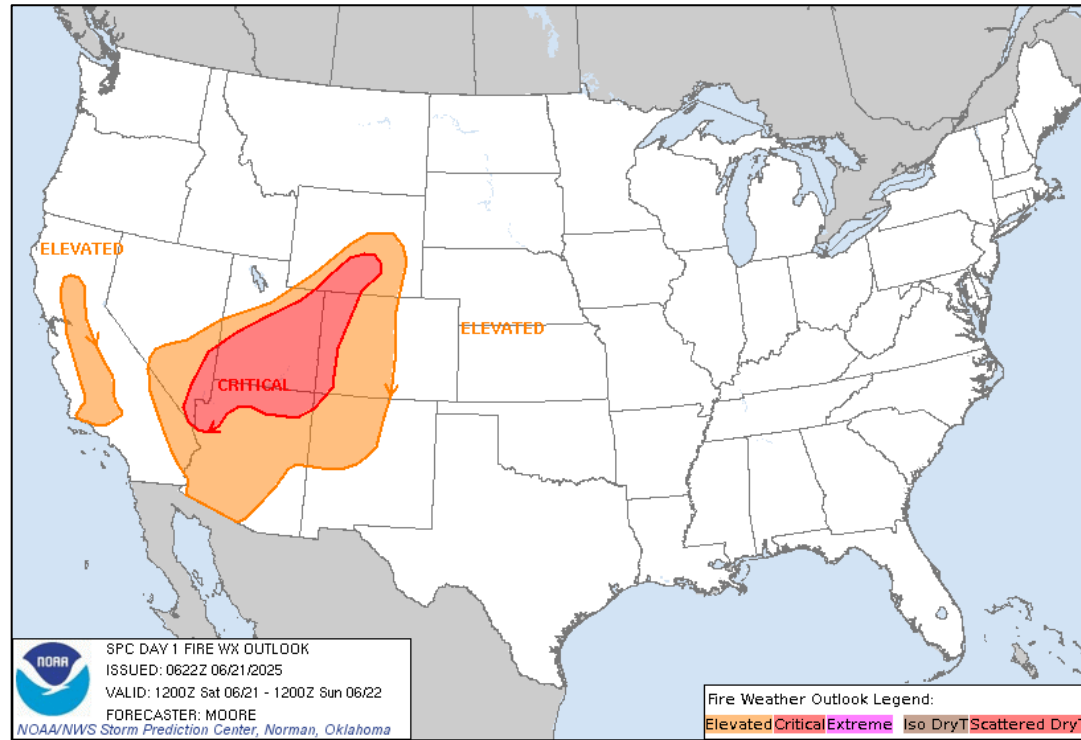

# National Heat Risk – June 21

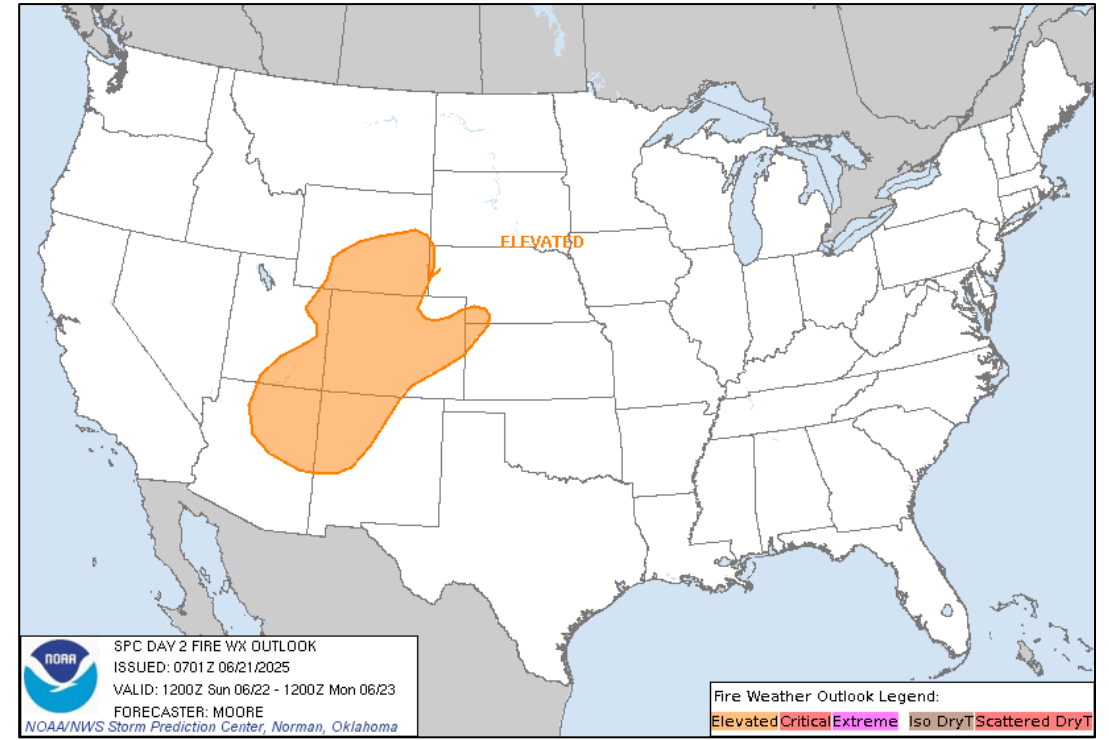

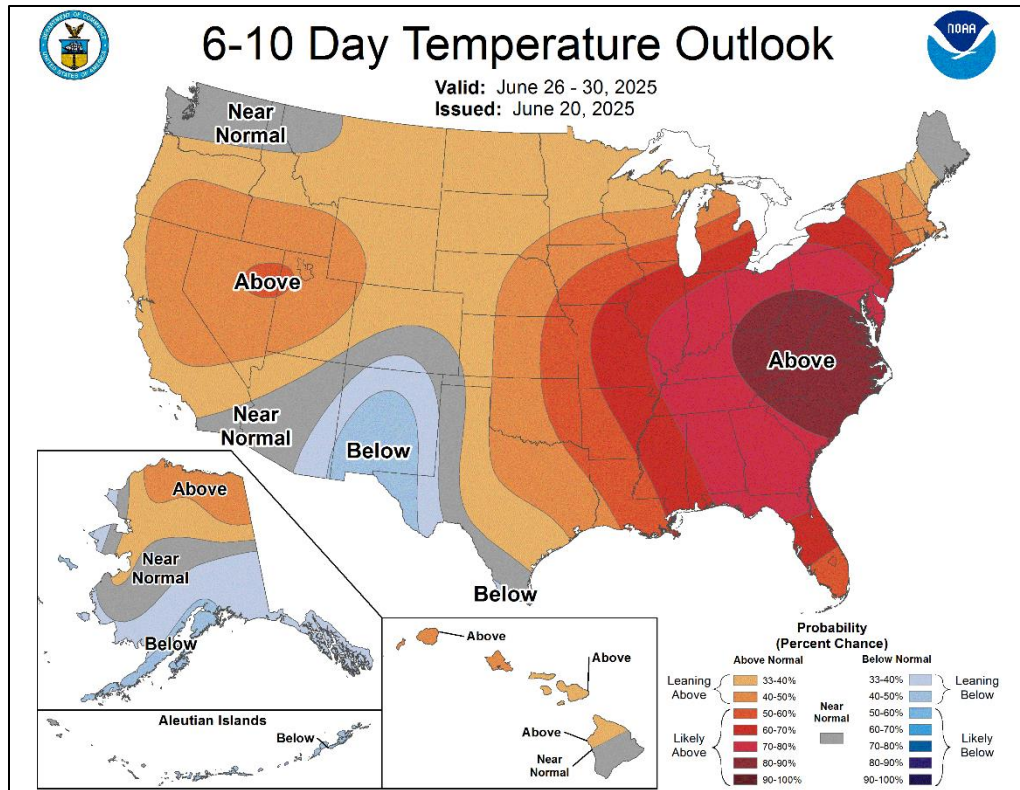

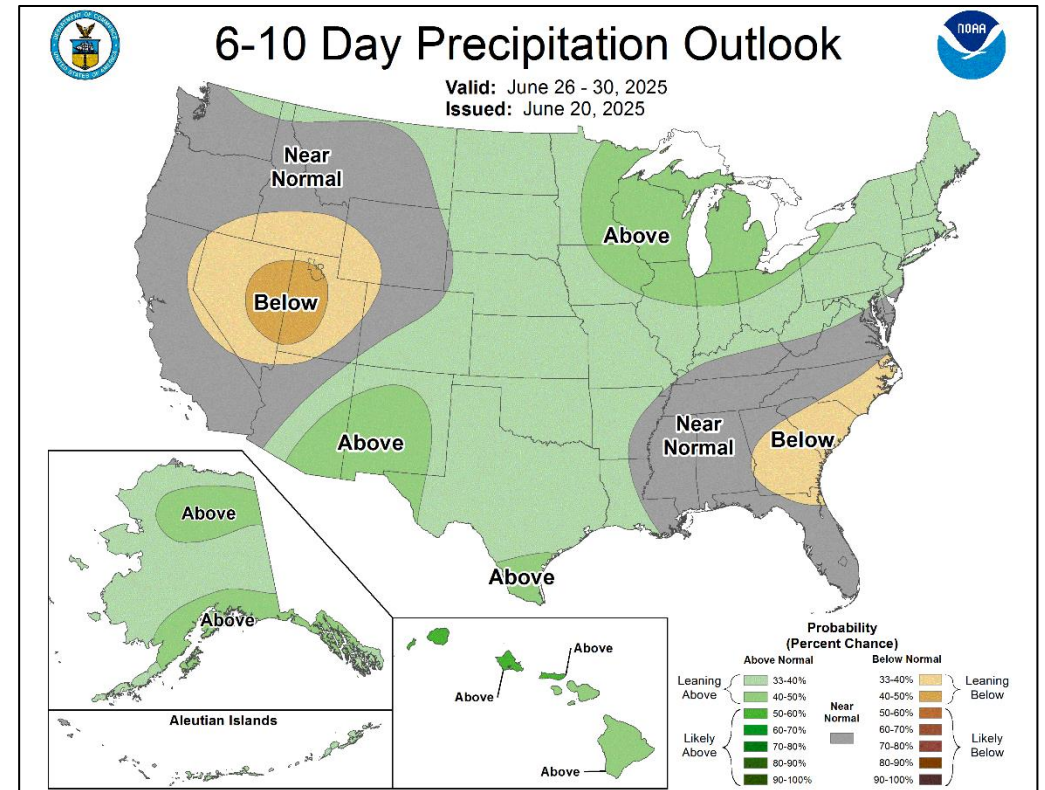
