Situation: On June 21, the FEMA Region VI Regional Administrator has approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Cotton Fire, which has burned 250 acres with 0% containment. The fire is burning on state and private land in the communities of Los Lunas, NM (est. pop 19k). Aside from the FMAG approval, no additional federal assistance has been requested.

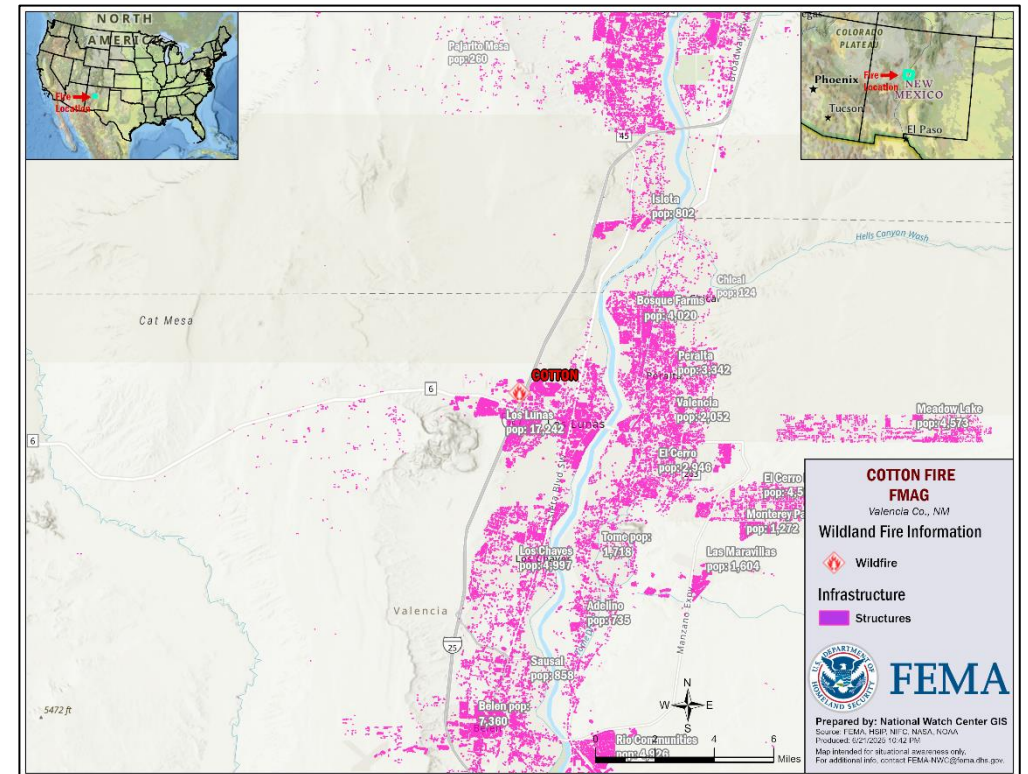

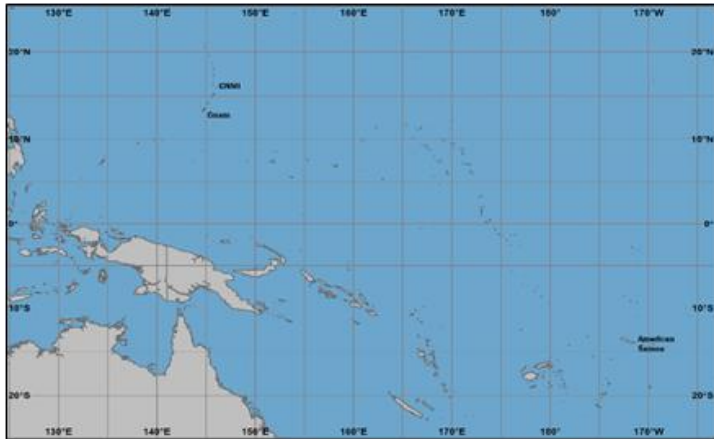

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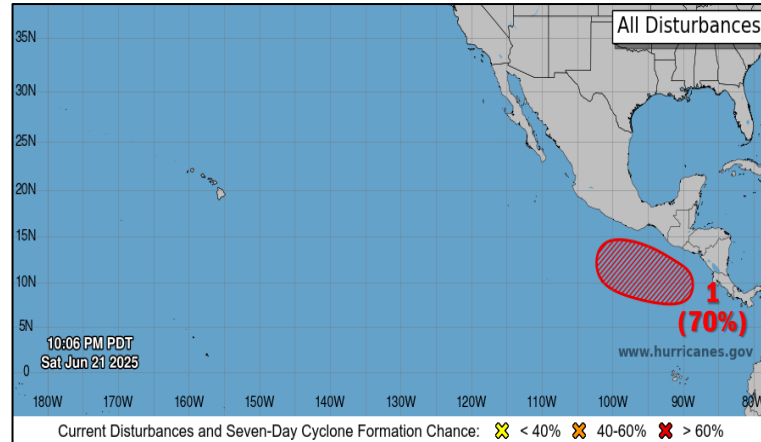
Tropical Outlook

- No tropical cyclones threatening the U.S. territories are expected during the next 7 days

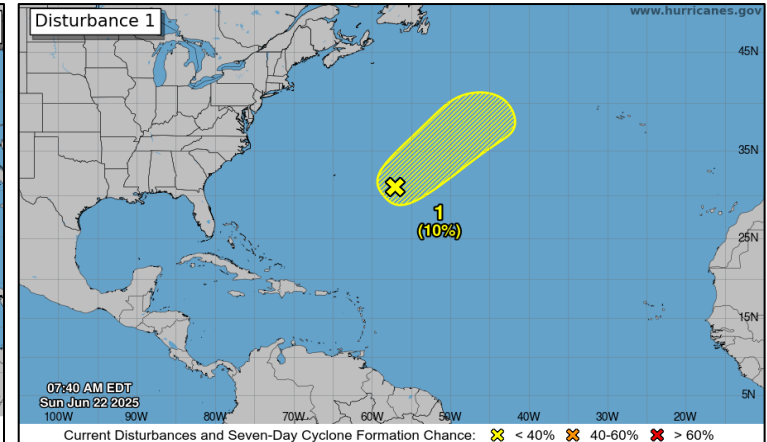
Central and Eastern Pacific

- Forecast to move WNW
- Conditions appear conducive for some gradual development
- Formation chance – 48 hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: High (70%)

Atlantic



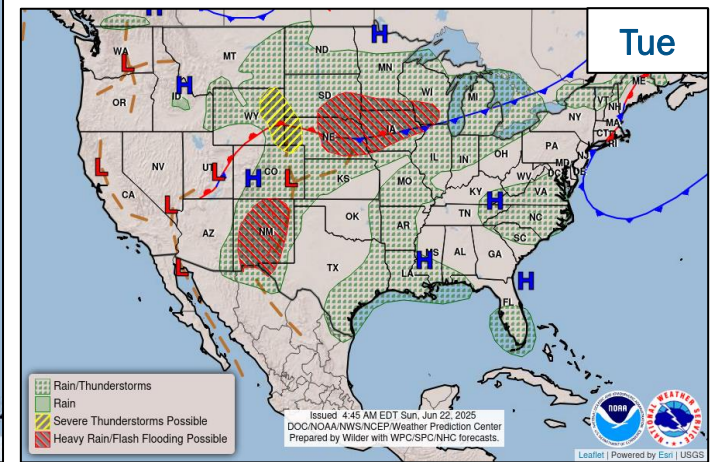
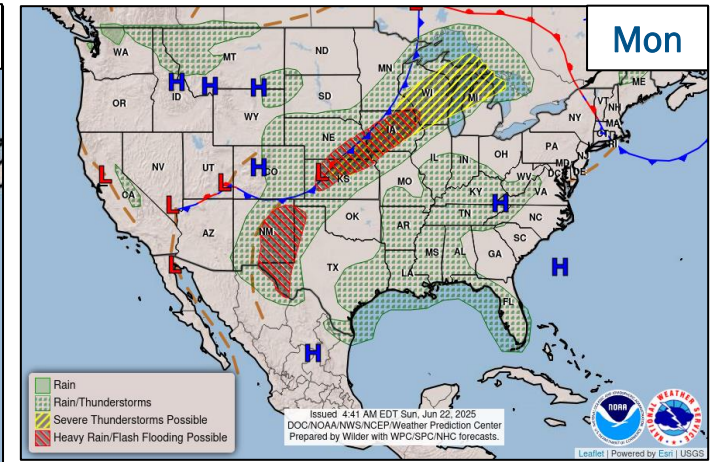
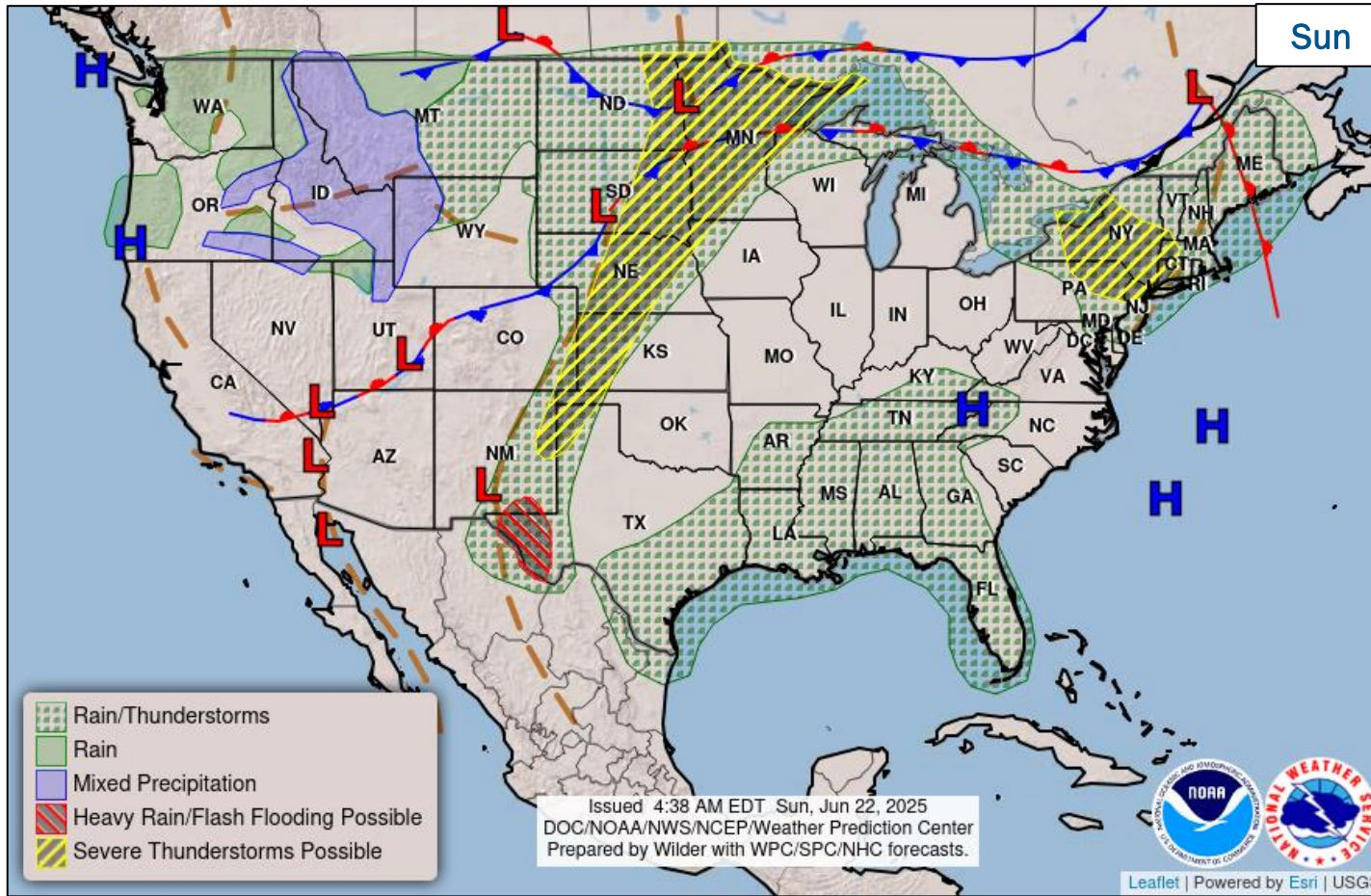
Disturbance 1: (As of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- System is expected to move northeastward over the central Atlantic during the next few days
- Trough of low pressure located about 500 miles east-southeast of Bermuda
- Some slow development of this system is possible during the next couple of days
- Formation chance – 48 hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (10%)



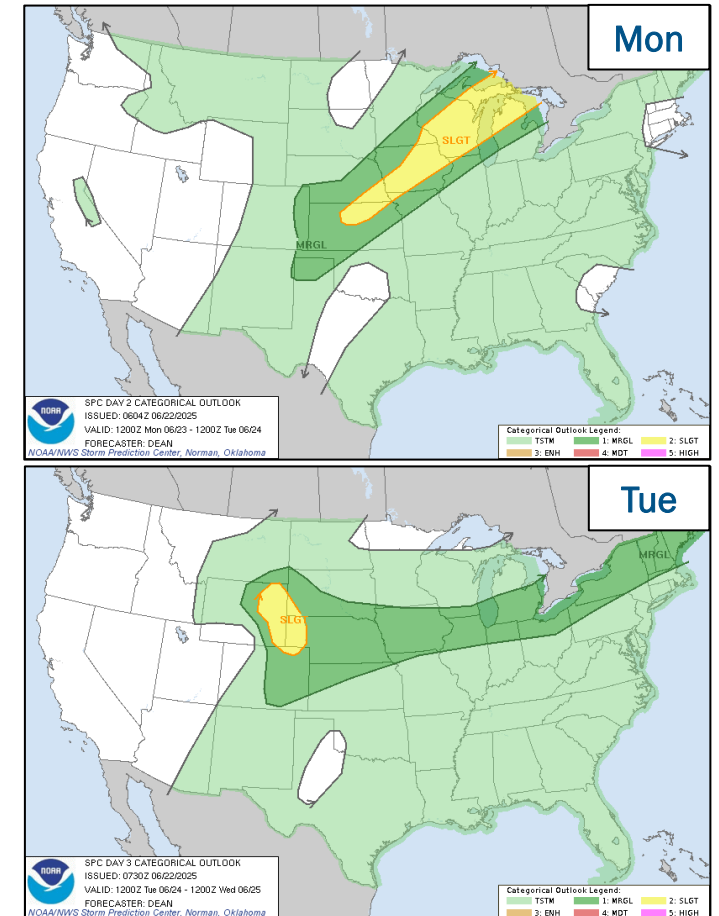
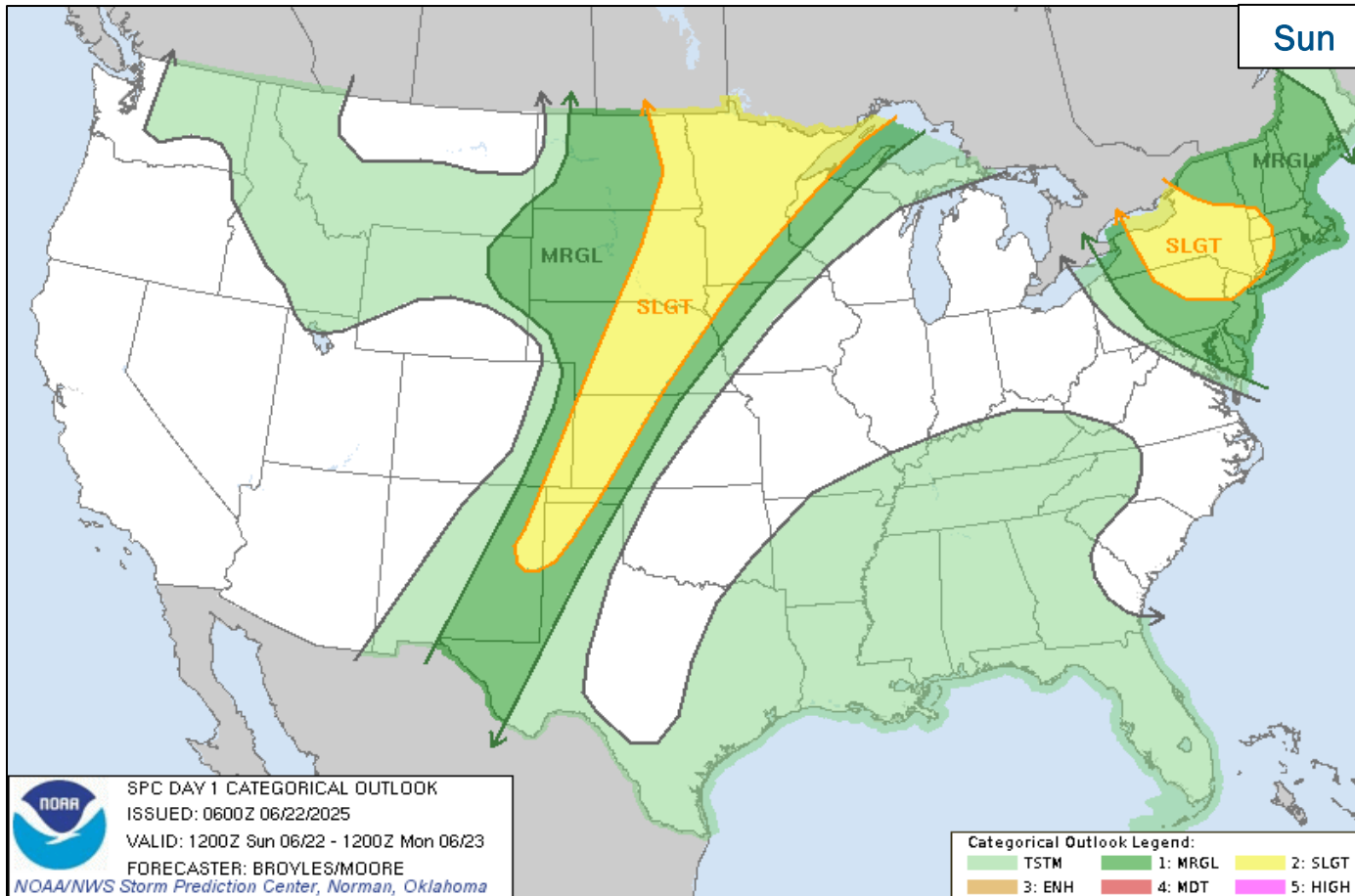

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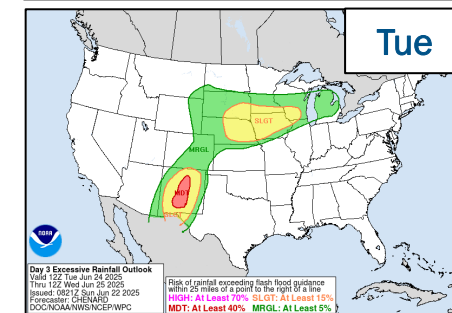
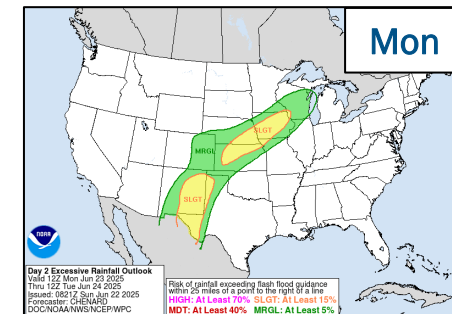
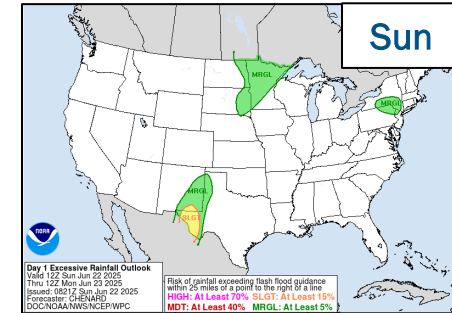
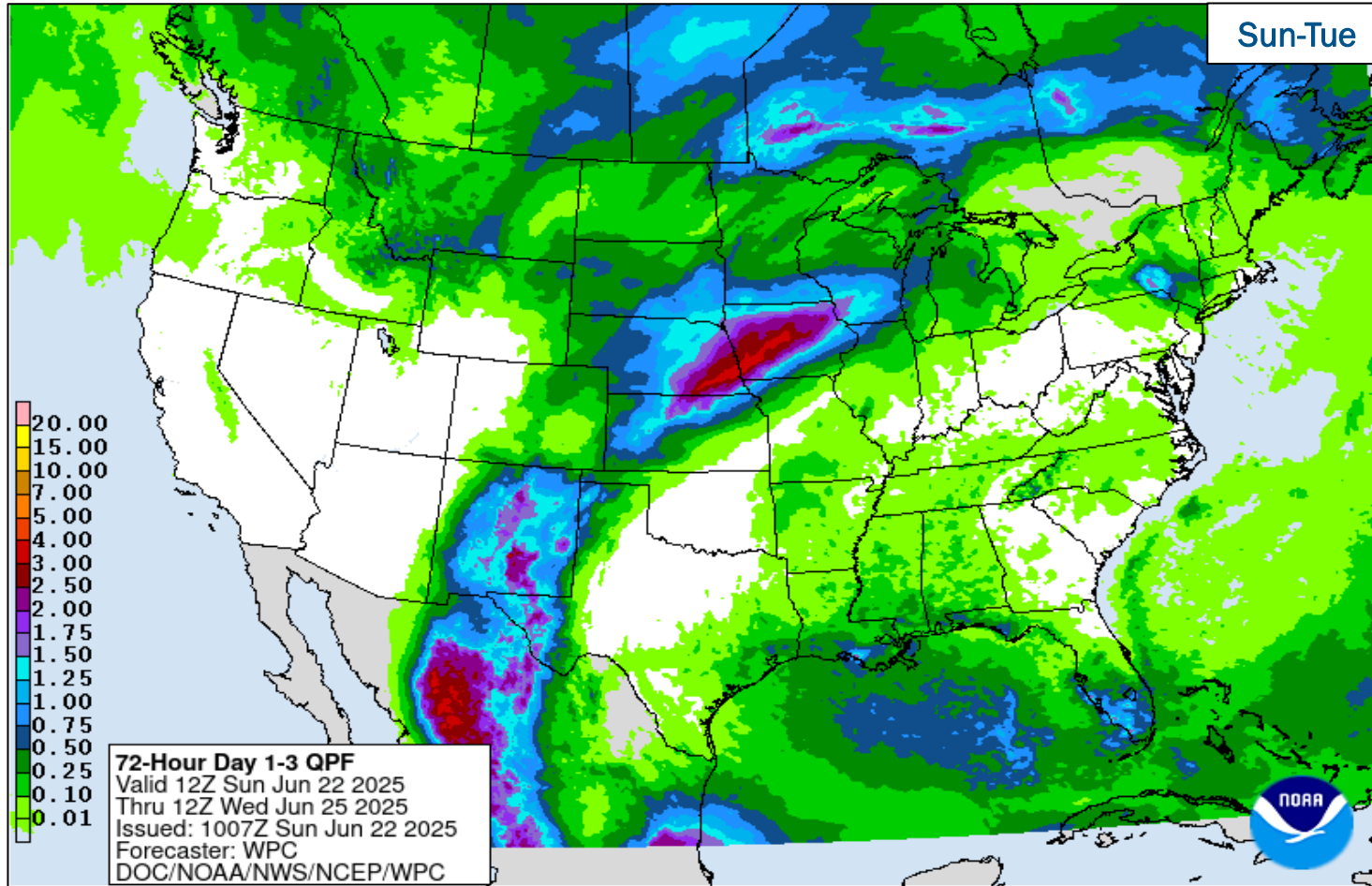
Severe Weather Outlook



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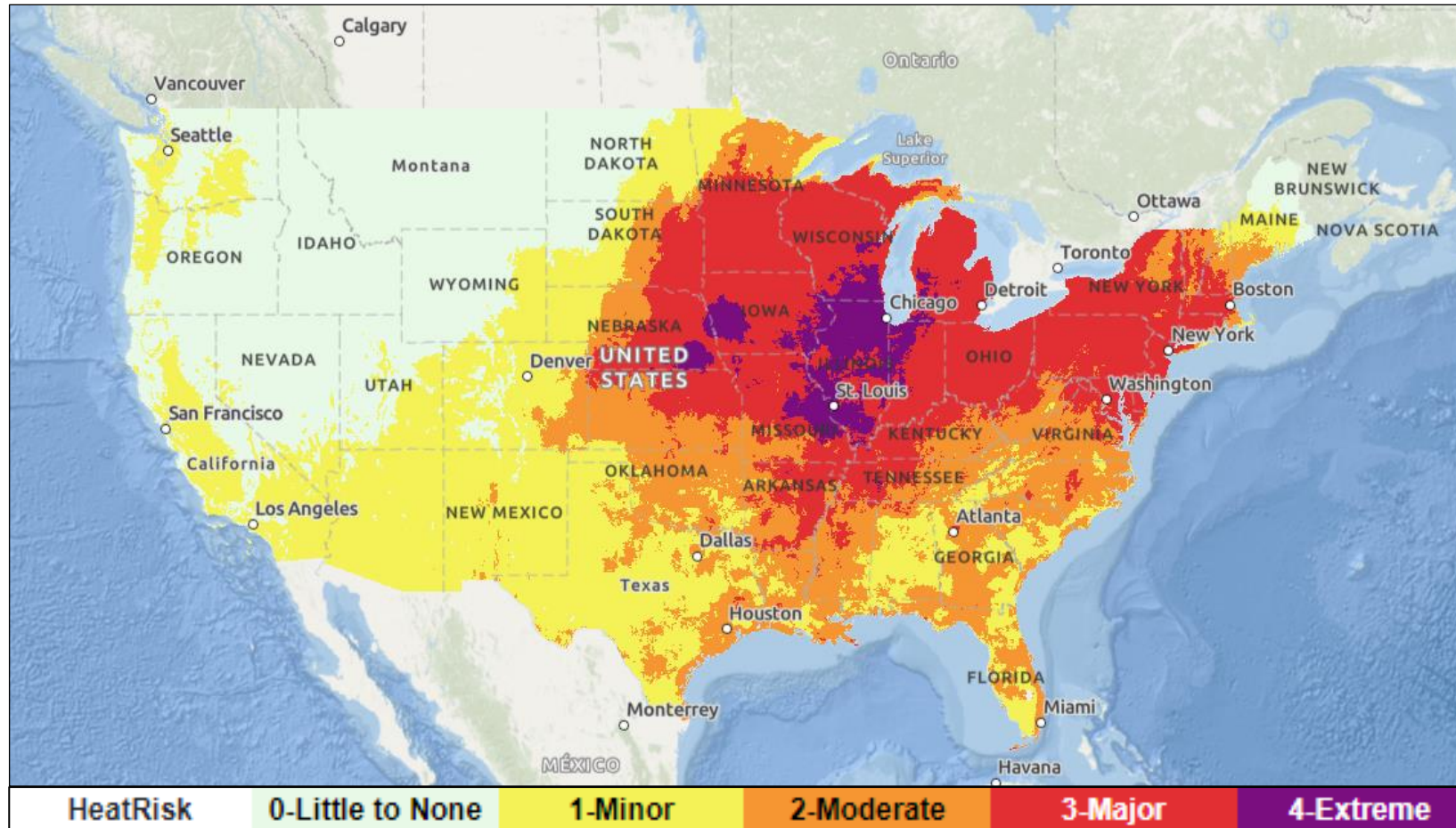
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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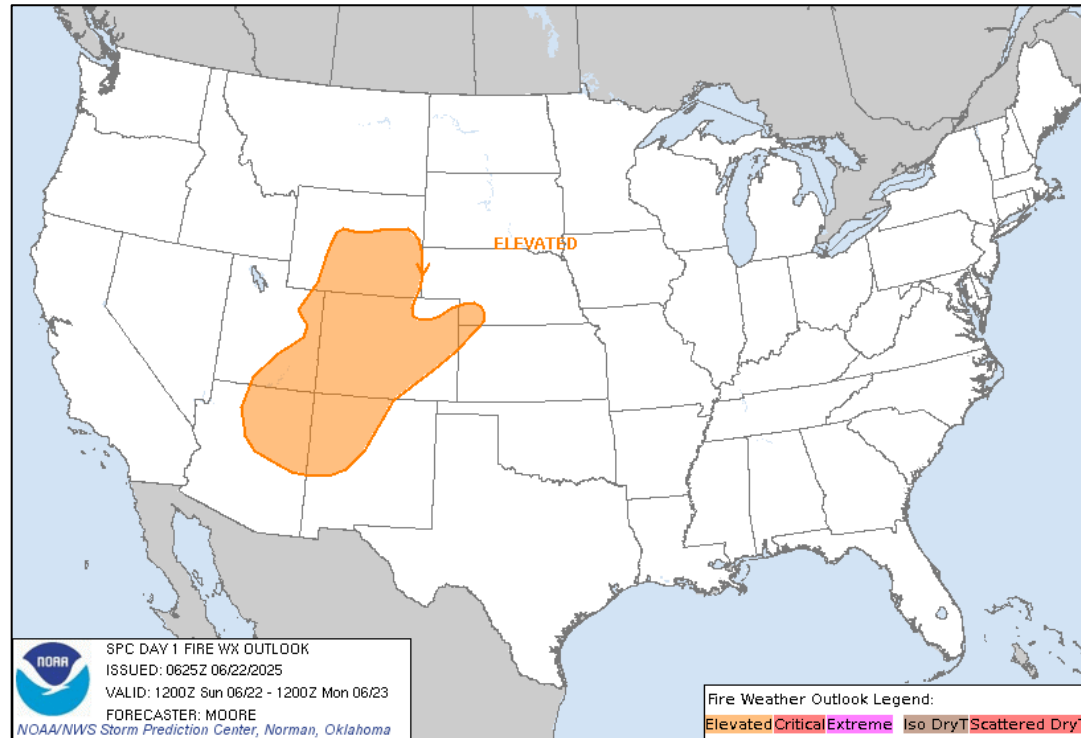
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National Heat Risk – June 22

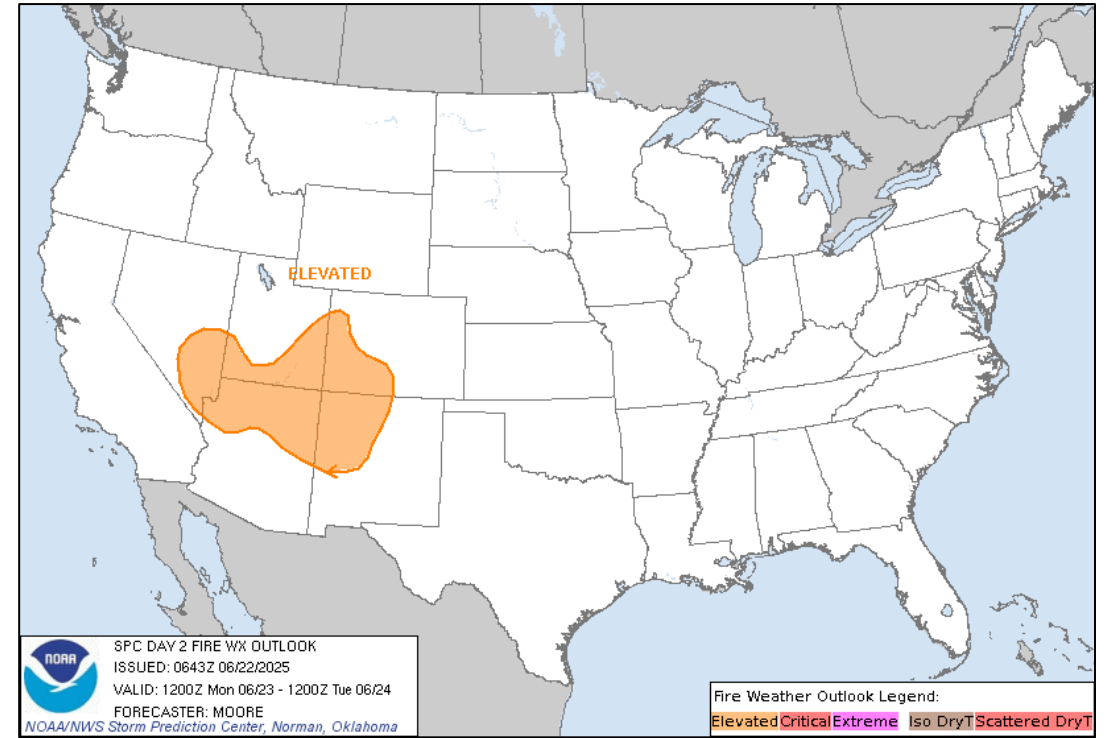

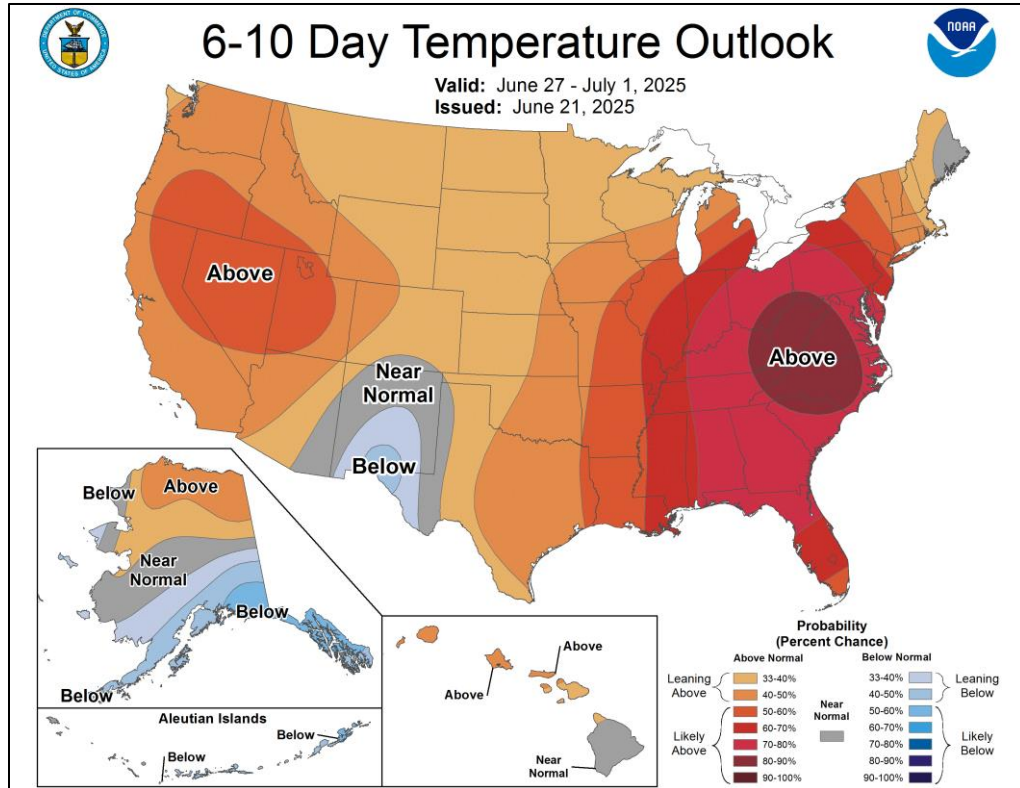

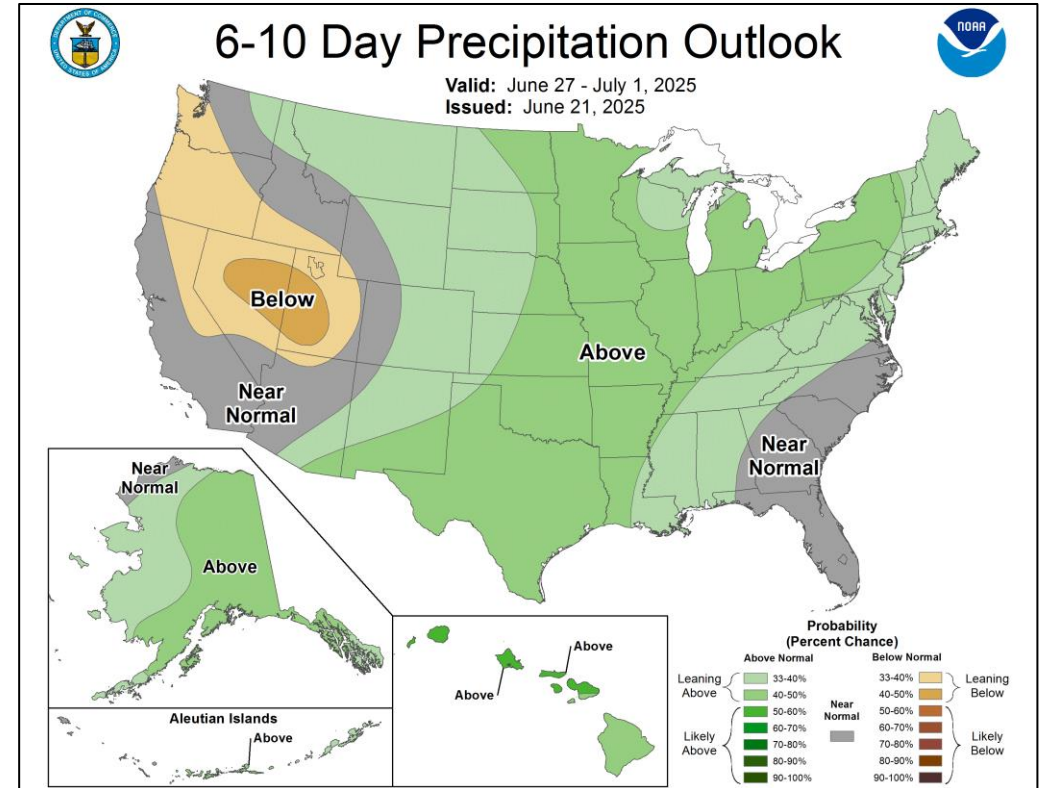
