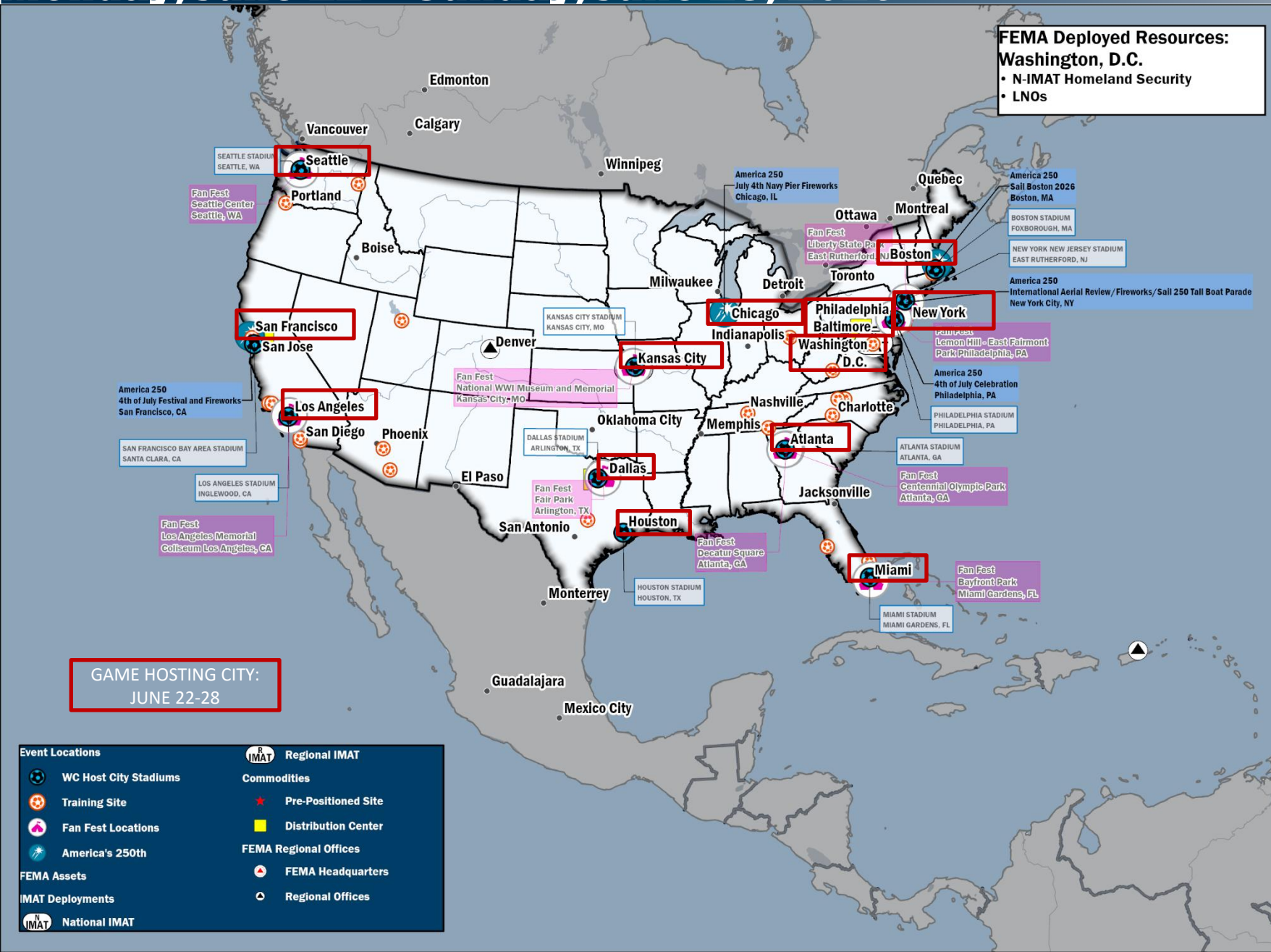

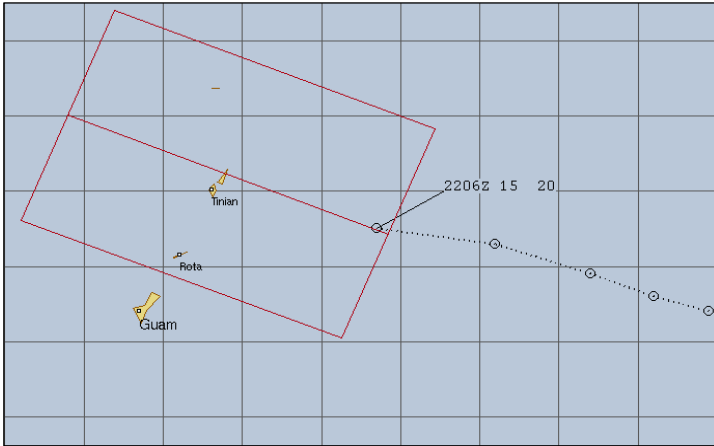

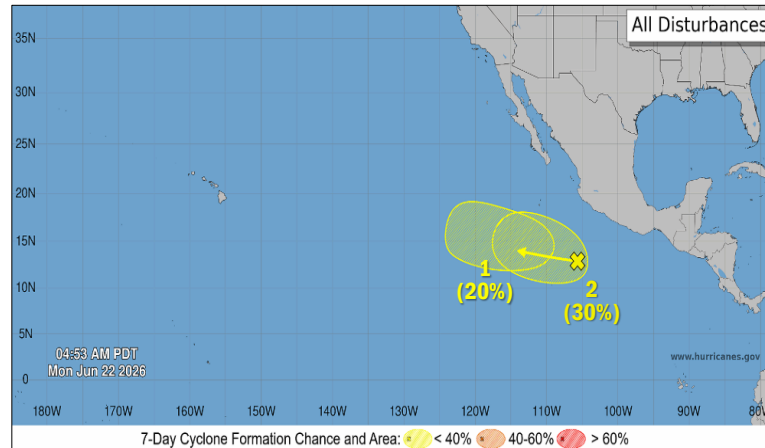
Western Pacific



Invest 94W: (JTWC, as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- 216 miles ENE of Guam
- Gradual development over the next 24-36 hours
- Maximum sustained winds of 21-26 mph
- Potential for significant tropical cyclone development within the next 24 hours is High

Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1: (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form well SW of the Baja California peninsula **late this week**
- Slow development is possible as it moves **W** 10–15 mph
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (**near 10%**); 7-day: Low (20%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles offshore of the coast of southwestern Mexico
- Slow development is possible as it moves WNW 10–15 mph
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (30%)

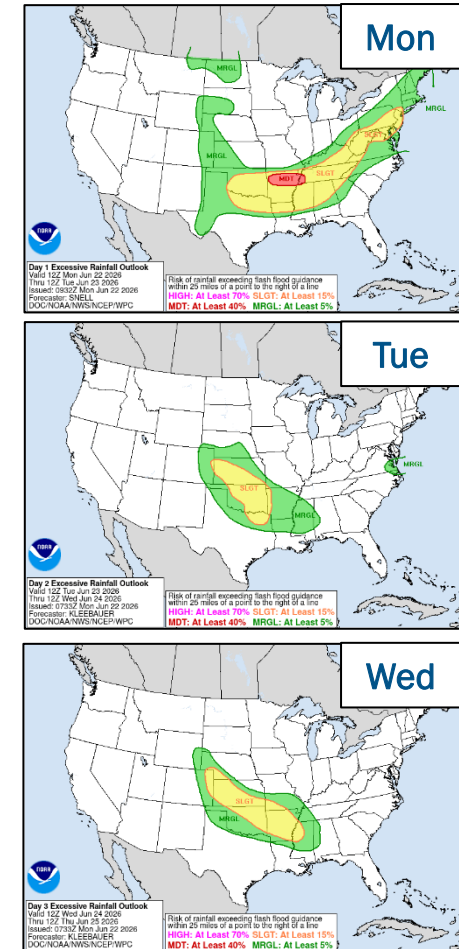

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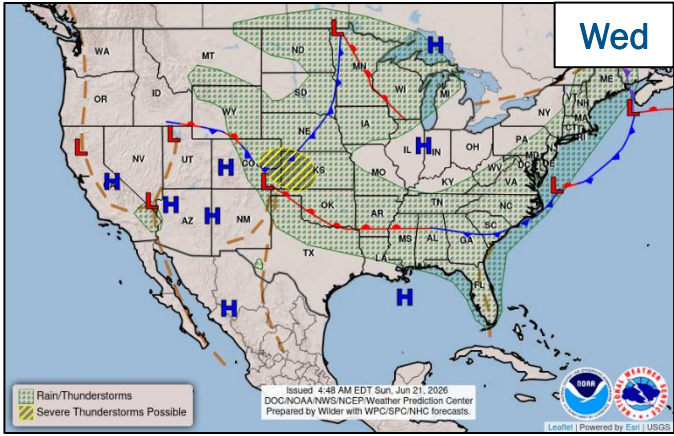
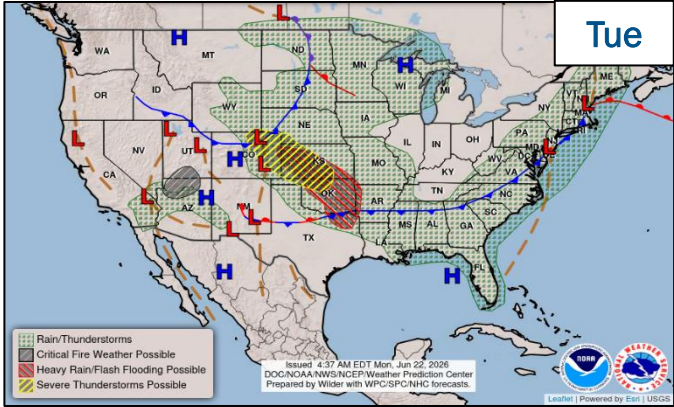
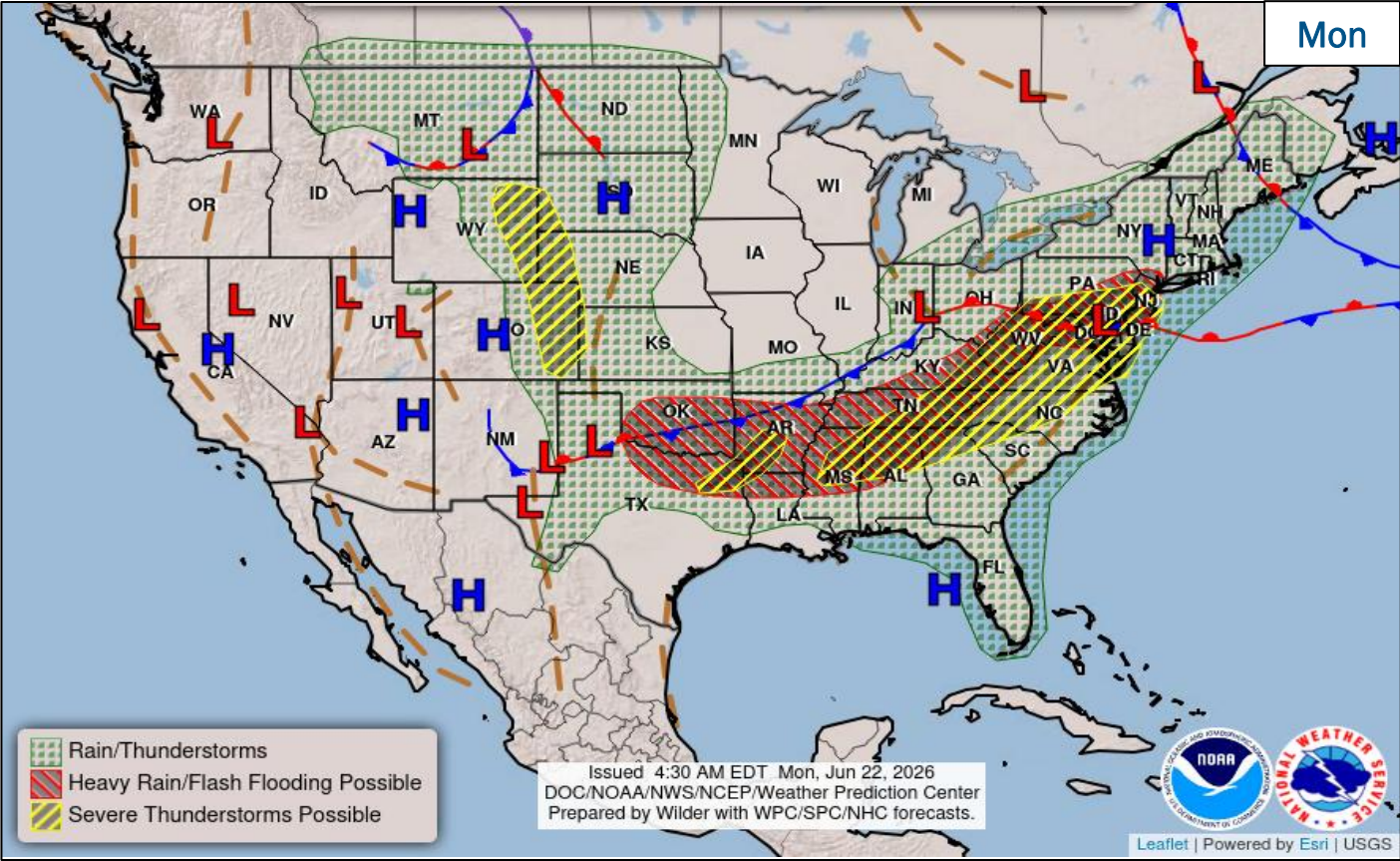
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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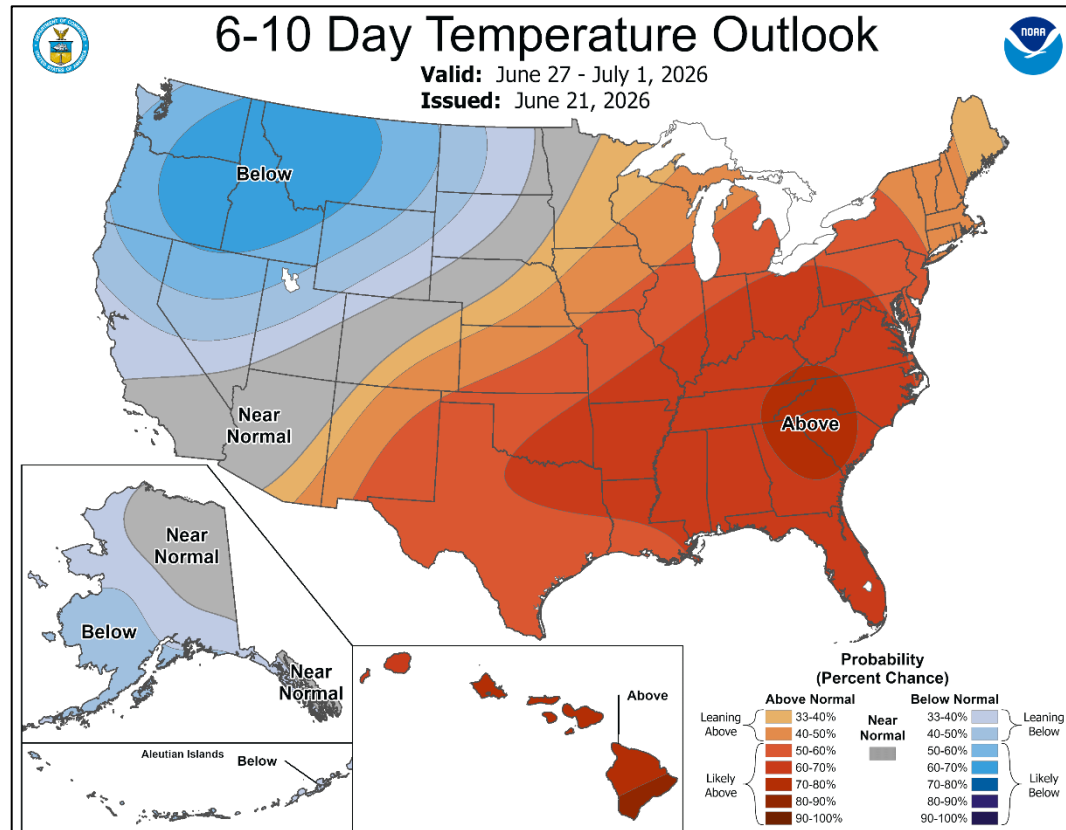

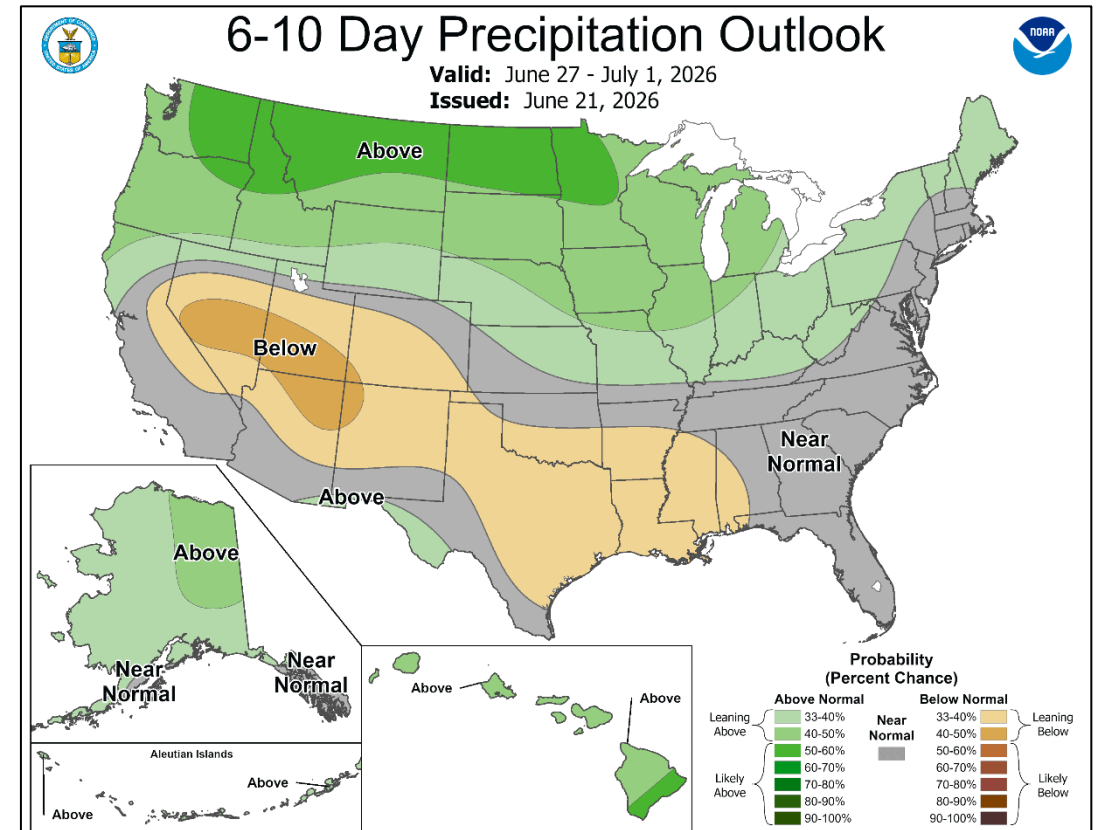


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Long Range Outlooks – Jun 27-30

6-10 Day Precipitation Probability

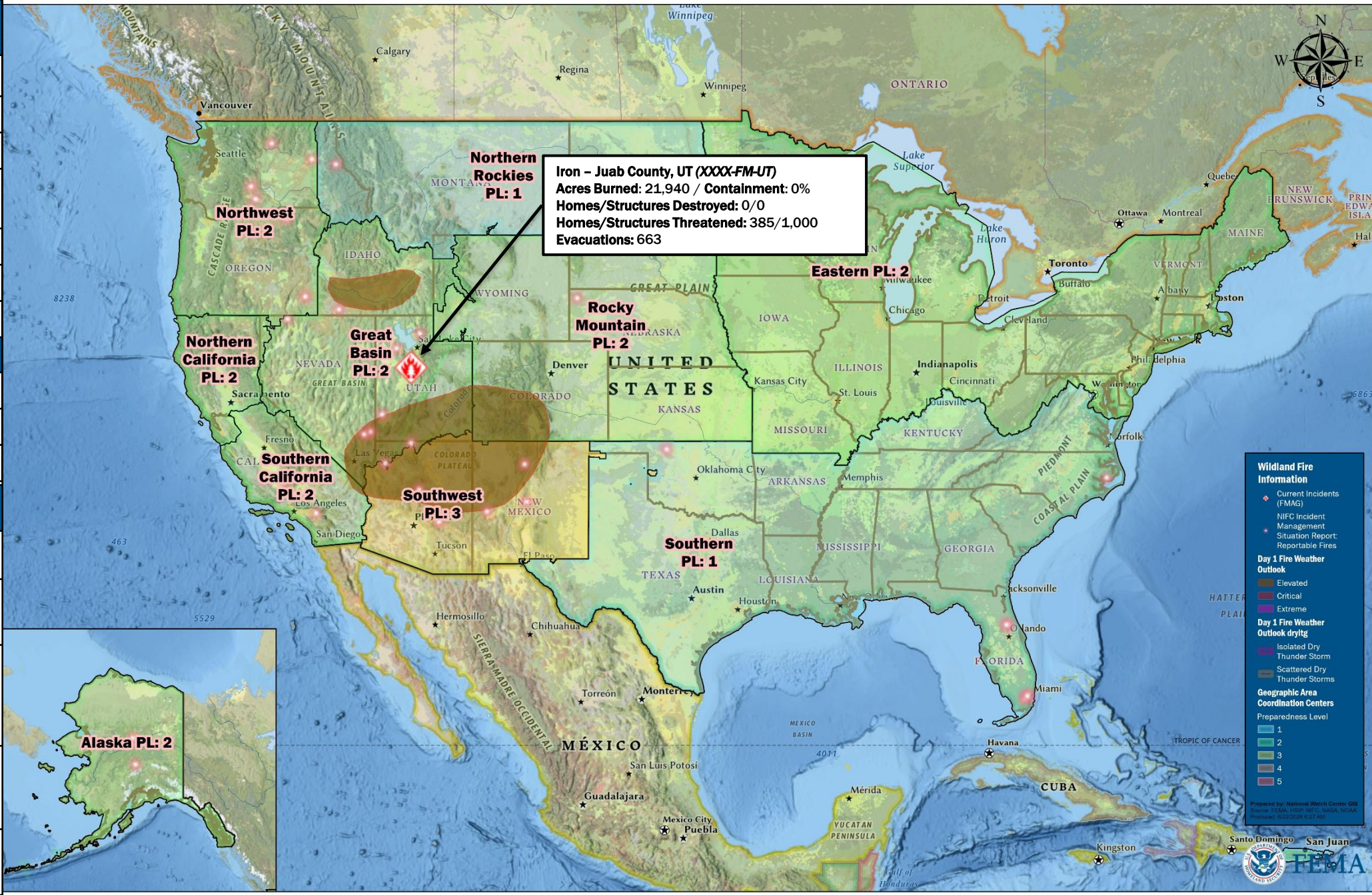

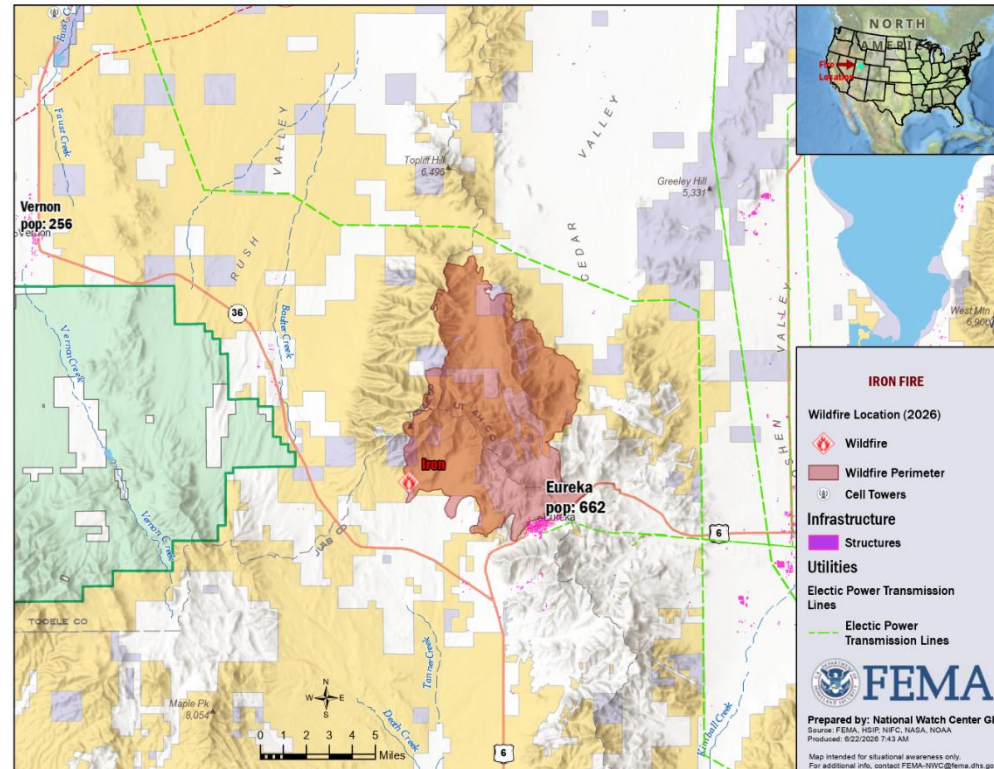
Preparedness Level: 3

PL 4	High levels of fire activity and areas are competing for firefighting resources; 60% of the nation's wildland firefighting resources committed
PL 5	Extremely high levels of fire activity; 80% of nation's firefighting resources committed

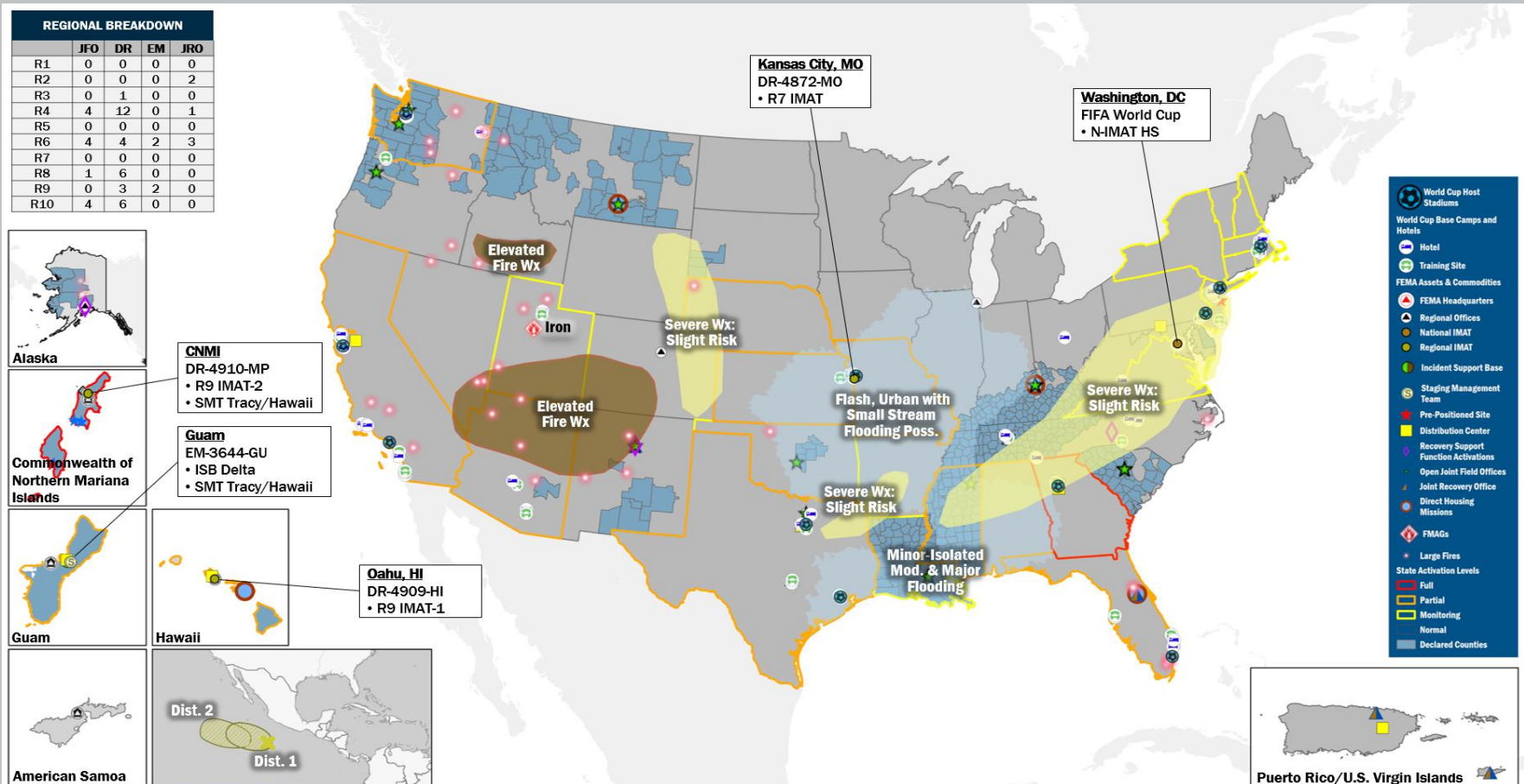
