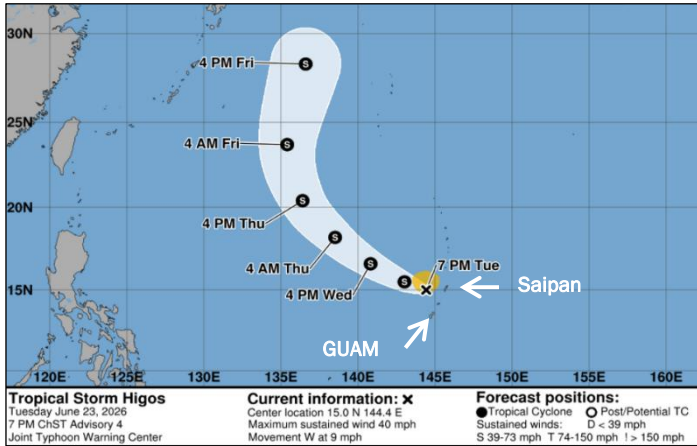

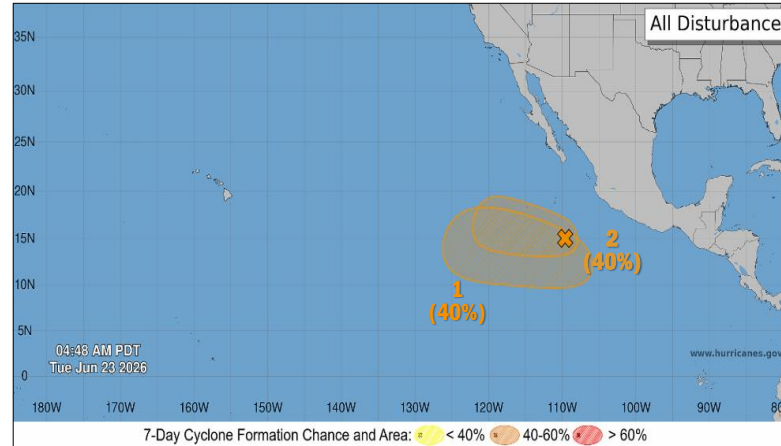
Western Pacific



Tropical Storm Higos: (JTWC Advisory #4, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 90 miles W of Saipan
- Moving W at 9 MPH
- Maximum sustained winds of 40 mph
- Tropical Storm Warning remain in effect for Saipan and Tinian

Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (EP94): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a few hundred miles SSW off the coast of southwestern Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10–15 mph
- Some development is possible
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Med (40%); 7-day: Med (40%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles offshore of the coast of southwestern Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10–15 mph
- Some development is possible; could become a tropical depression this weekend or early next week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Med (40%)

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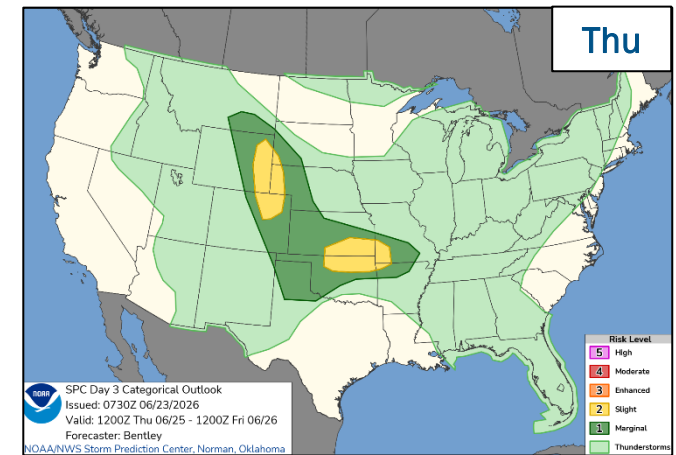
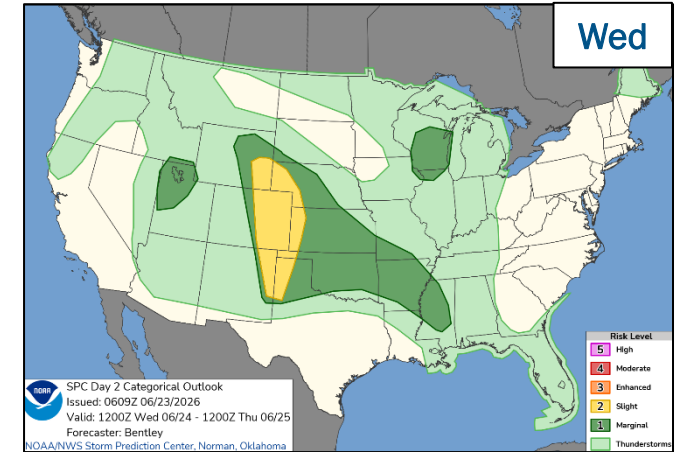
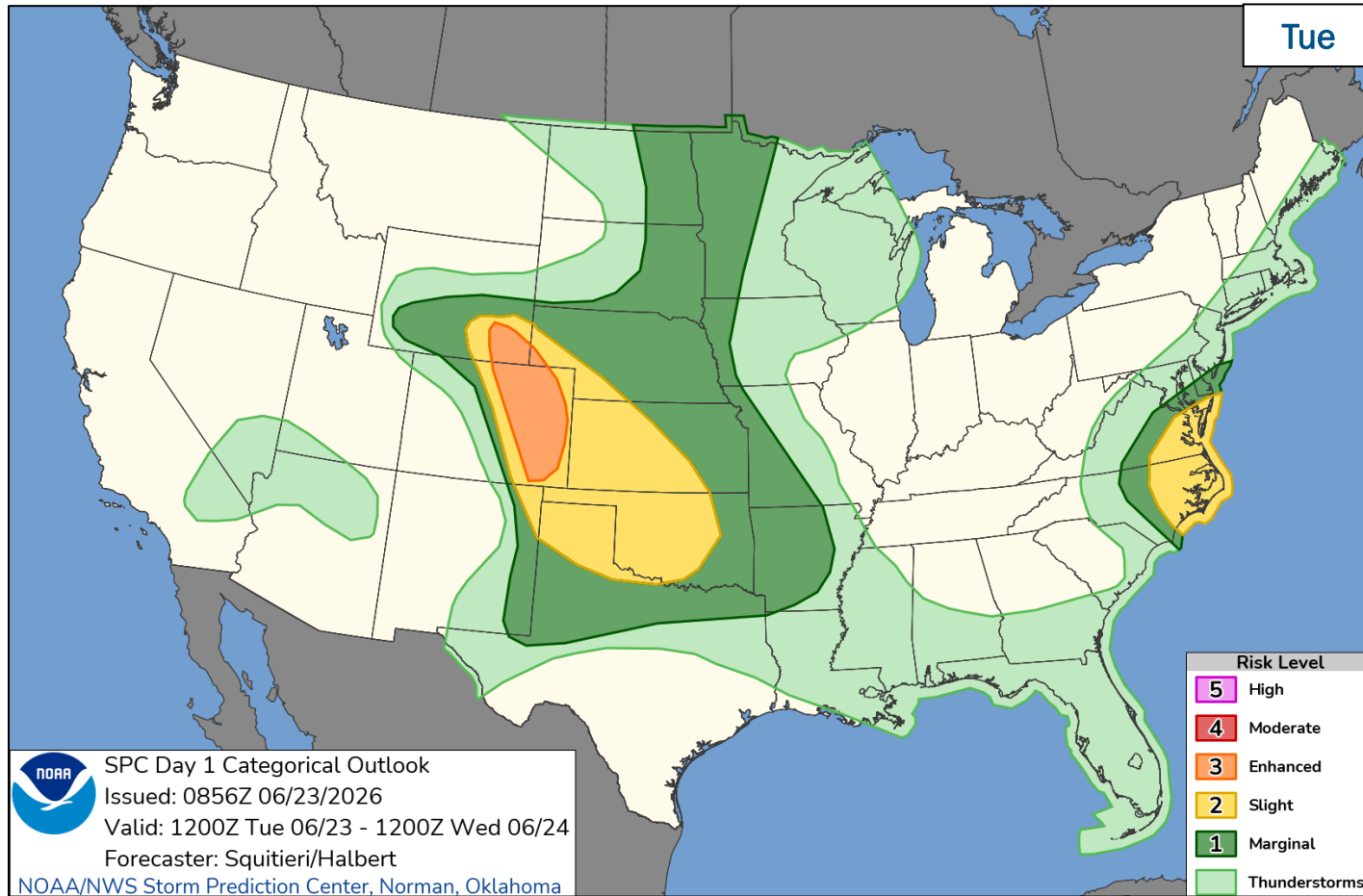
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National Weather Forecast



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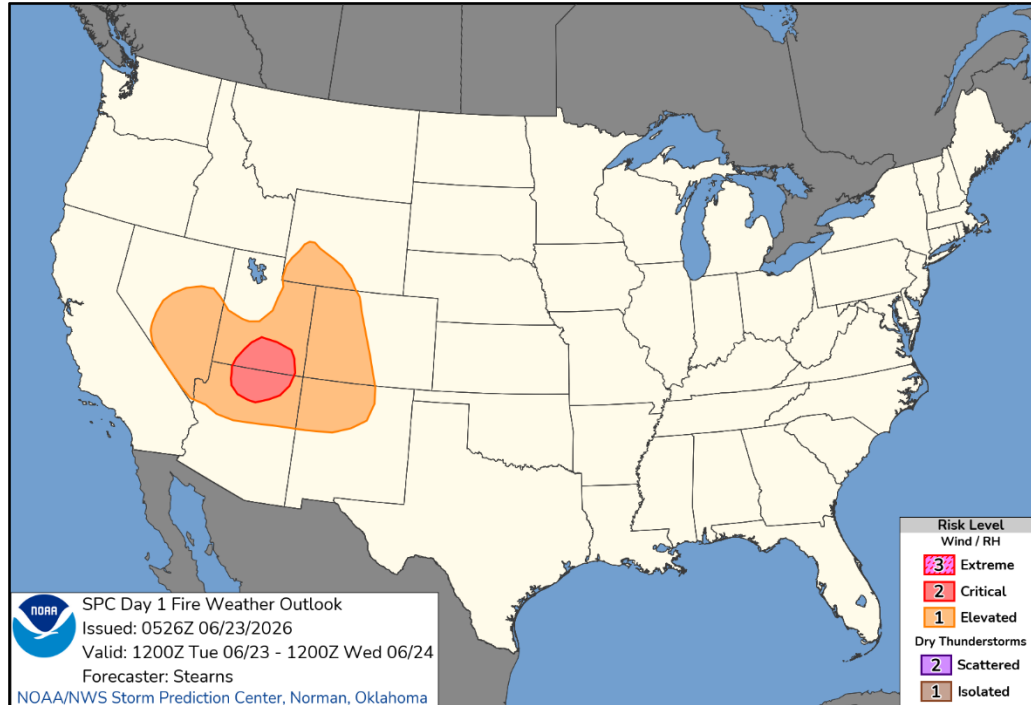
Severe Weather Outlook



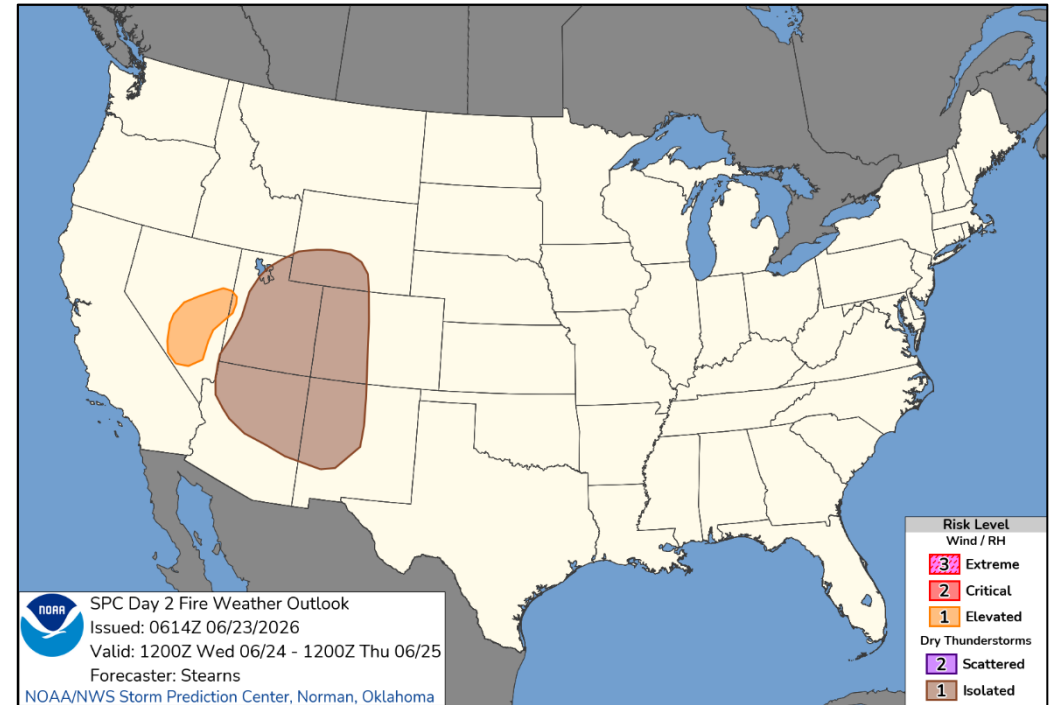
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Fire Weather Outlook

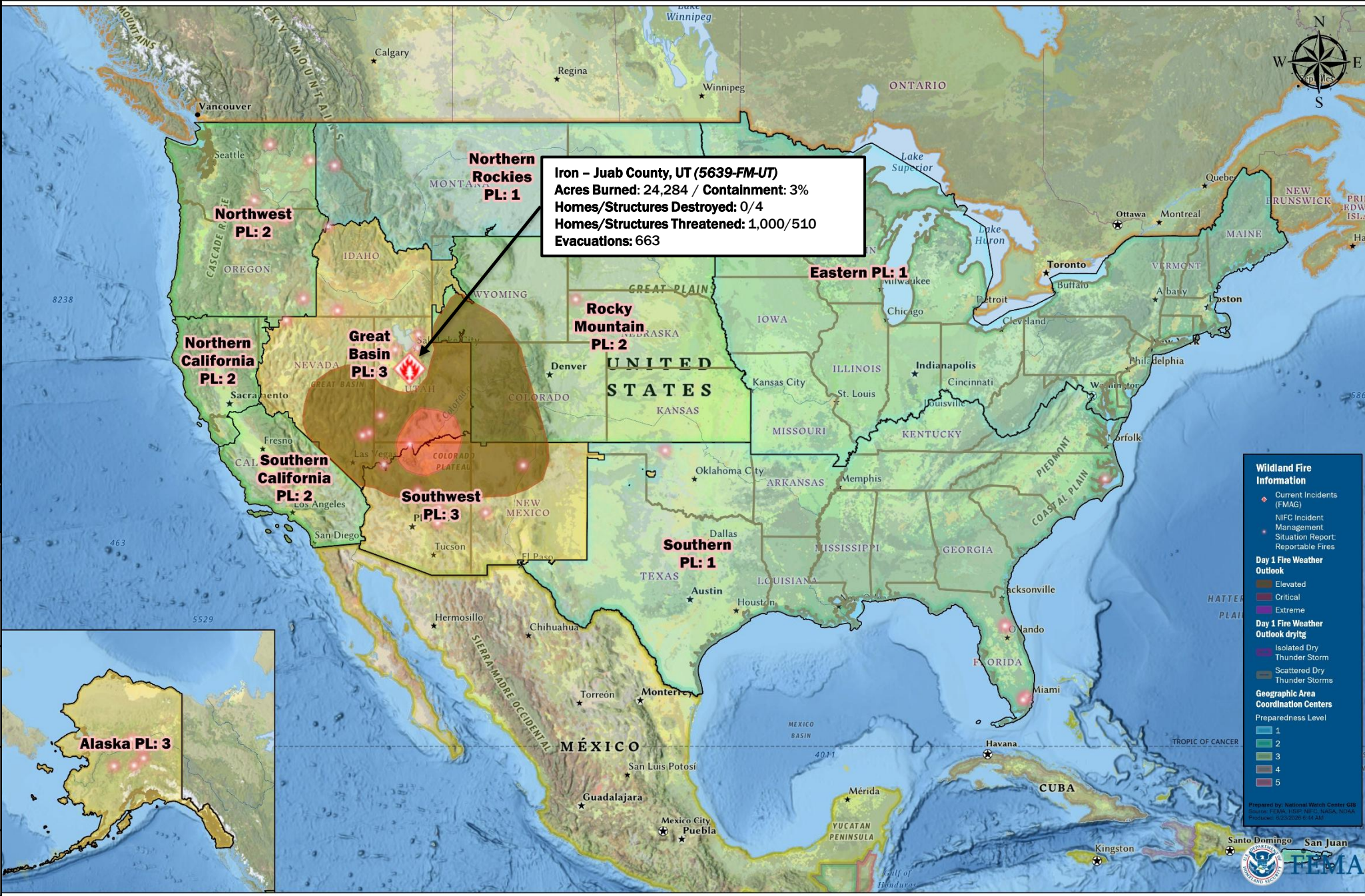

PL 3	Wildfire activity ongoing throughout 25% of country; National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC) sets priorities, allocates resources, and mobilizes assets at national level
PL 4	High levels of fire activity and areas are competing for firefighting resources; 60% of the nation's wildland firefighting resources committed
PL 5	Extremely high levels of fire activity; 80% of nation's firefighting resources committed
