Severe Weather - Northern Intermountain to Southern Plains


Current Situation: Severe weather impacted portions of the Northern Intermountain to the Central Plains. Preliminary reports of 26 tornado touchdowns (13 in WY, 4 in CO, 4 in KS, 3 in NE, 1 in ID, 1 in OK), 110 wind, and 83 hail reports. There were initial reports of 8 injuries and 1 missing due to a tornado touchdown at the North Antelope Rochelle Mine in Campbell County, WY. As of this morning, media reported that all workers have now been accounted for. Across the impacted areas some homes were damaged, there were downed trees and power lines, but minimal power outages. Tornado Watches and Warnings have expired. Damage assessments continue.

State / Local Response:

- NE, KS and ID EOCs at Normal Operations
- WY and CO EOCs at Monitoring

FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region VII RWC and Region X continue to monitor
- Region VIII at Enhanced Watch (Flooding)
- NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with Regions VII, VIII and X; however, no further reporting is anticipated






Tropical Storm Bret - Atlantic

Tropical Storm Bret. (Advisory #20 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 45 miles NNE of Aruba
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Moving W at 18 mph
- Additional weakening is forecast today and tonight, expected to dissipate over the central Caribbean Sea tonight or early Sunday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 140 miles






Tropical Storm Cindy – Atlantic

Tropical Storm Cindy. (Advisory #9 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 675 miles E of the Lesser Antilles
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Moving WNW at 15 mph
- On the forecast track, expected to remain well east and northeast of the northern Leeward Islands through early next week
- Some gradual weakening is forecast into early next week
- Tropical storm force winds extend 60 miles







Tropical Outlook - Seven Day

 No new tropical cyclones are expected during the next seven days




Disturbance 1 (As of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles S of the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Moving WNW parallel to the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Tropical depression is expected to form early to middle part of next week
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (30%);7-day: High (90%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Area of low pressure could form early next week several hundred miles south of El Salvador, Guatemala, and southern Mexico
- Moving slowly WNW
- Some gradual development is possible
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (30%)






National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall







Severe Weather Outlook





Fire Weather Outlook




