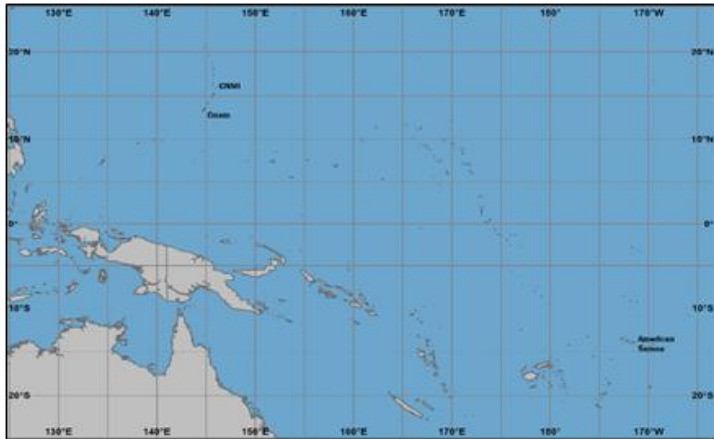

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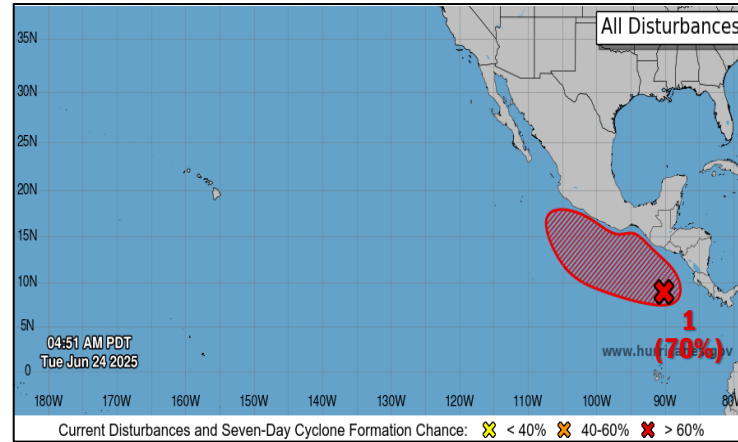

- No tropical cyclones threatening the U.S. territories are expected during the next 7 days

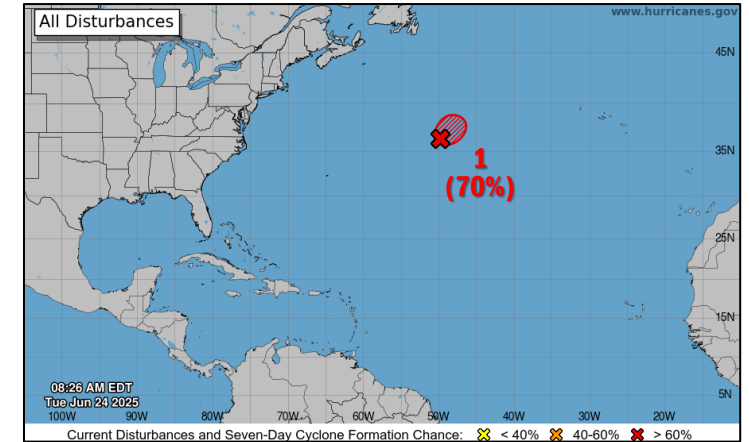
Central and Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (EP95): (As of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located offshore of Central America and Southern Mexico
- Conditions appear conducive for gradual development of this system and a tropical depression is likely to form by late this week or over the weekend
- Formation chance – 48 hour: Low (10%); 7-day: High (70%)

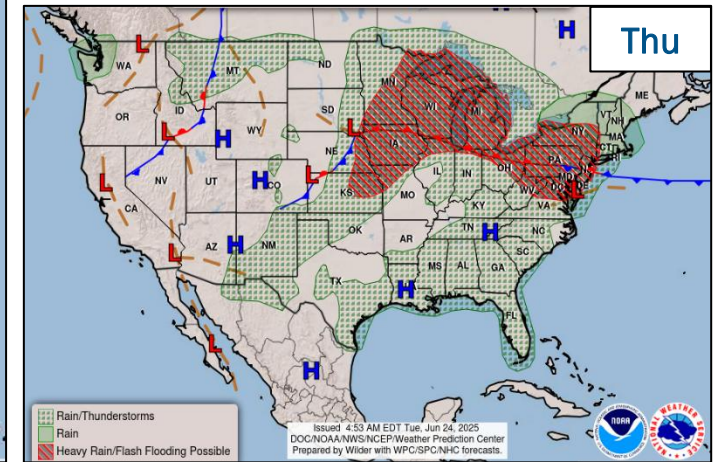
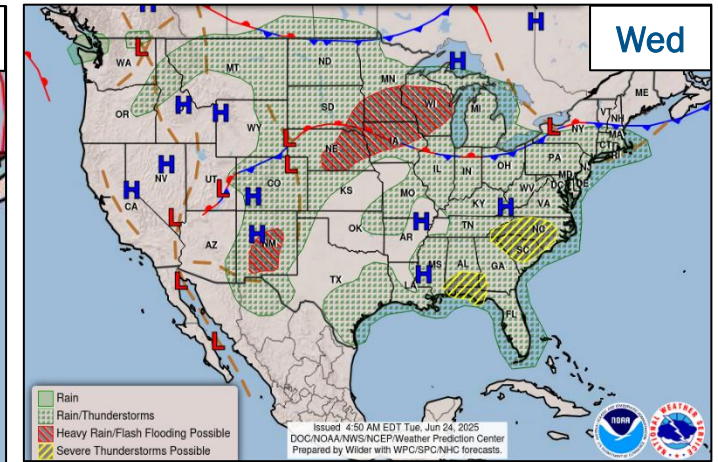
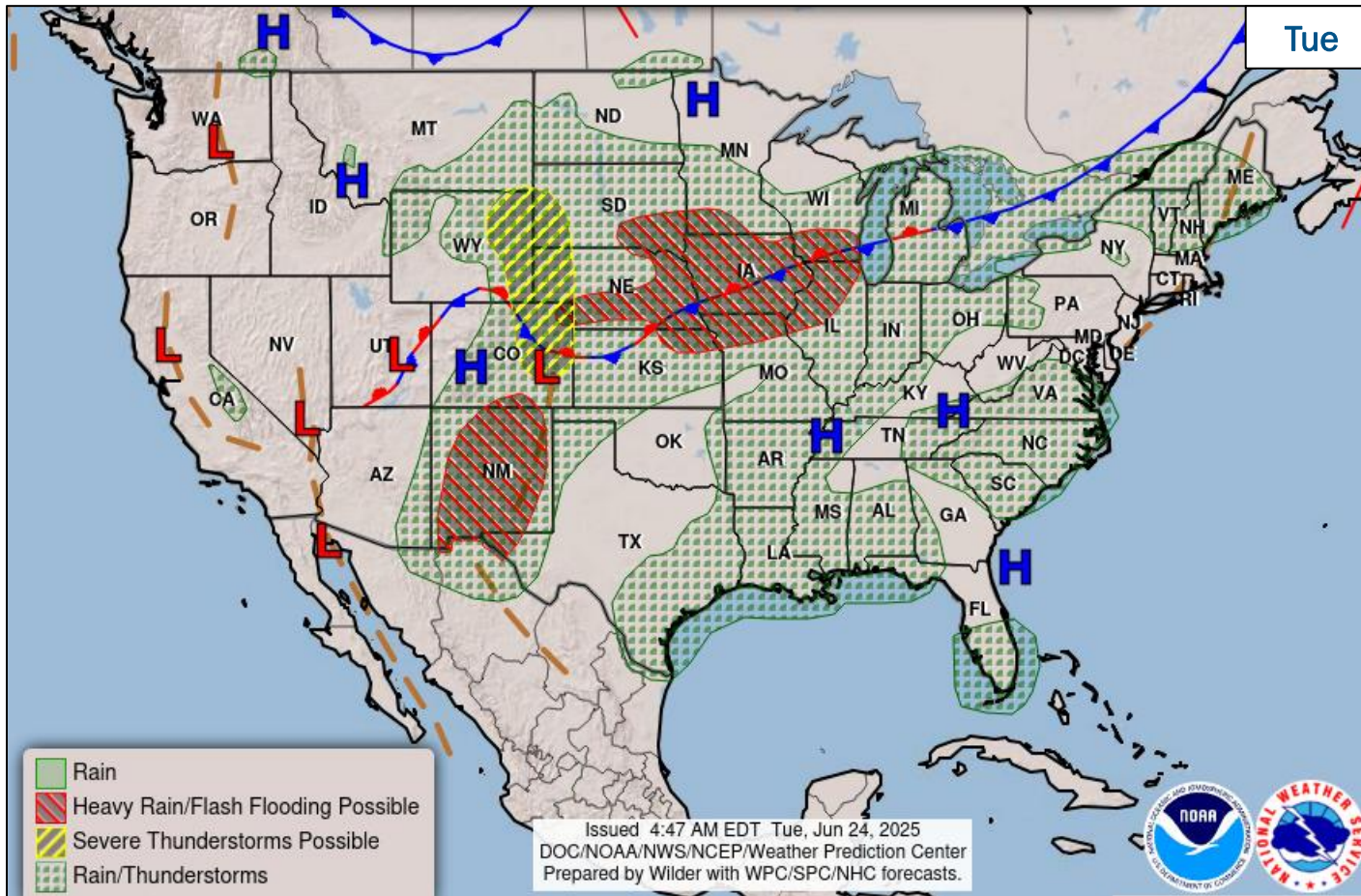
Disturbance 1 (AL90): (As of 8:30 a.m. ET)

- Located about 900 miles ENE of Bermuda
- Moving northeastward at 15 to 20 mph remaining over the open central Atlantic
- Environmental conditions are marginally favorable for the formation of a short-lived tropical depression or storm this morning. By later this evening, the low is expected to encounter hostile environmental conditions, ending its opportunity for development
- Satellite images indicate the shower and thunderstorm activity has become better organized in association with a small gale-force low-pressure system
- Formation chance – 48 hour: High (70%); 7-day: High (70%)



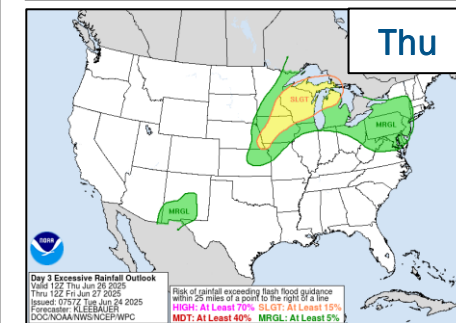
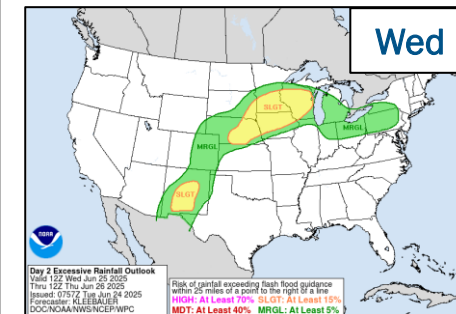
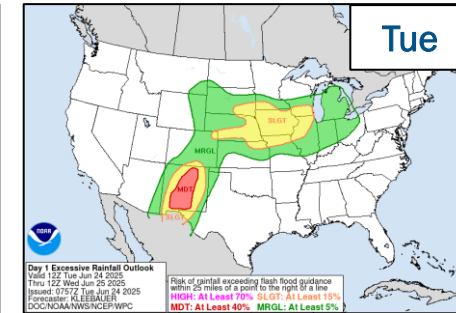
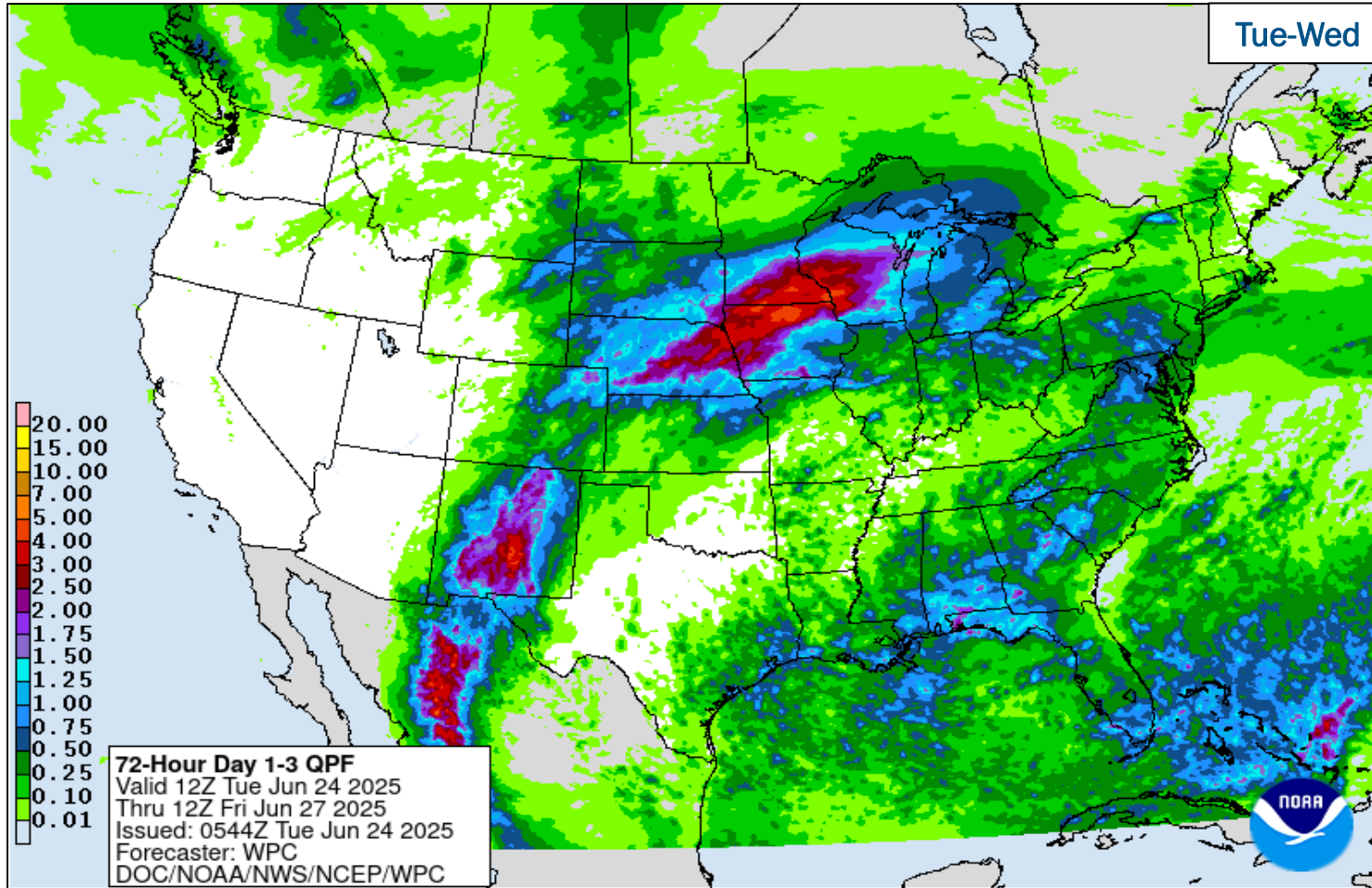

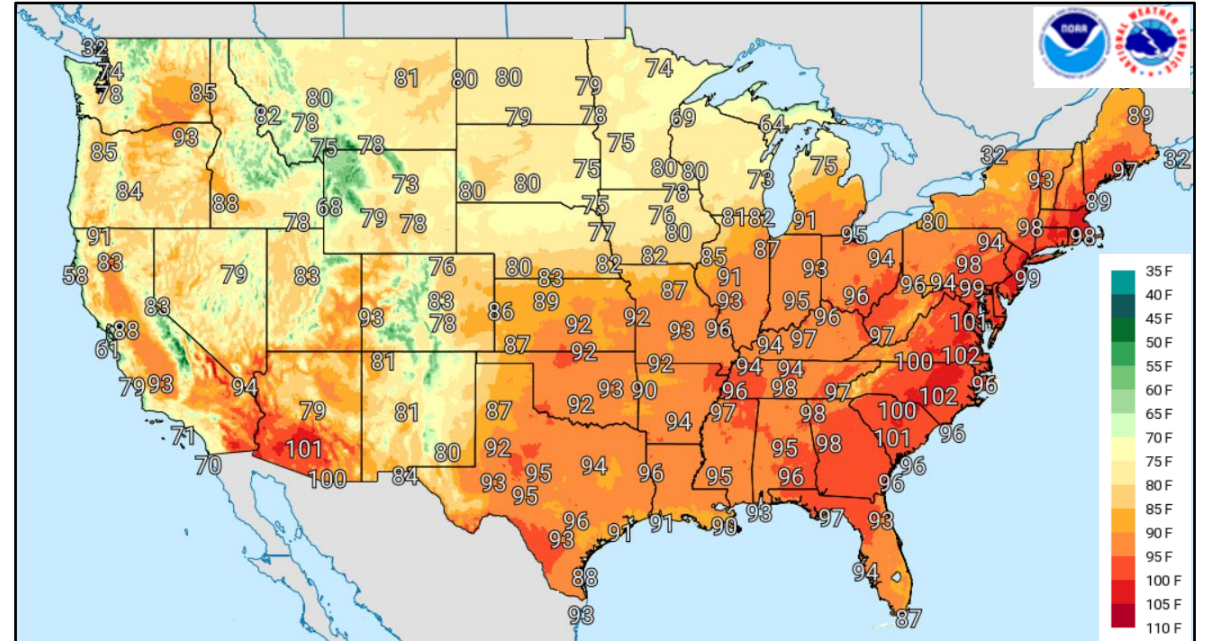
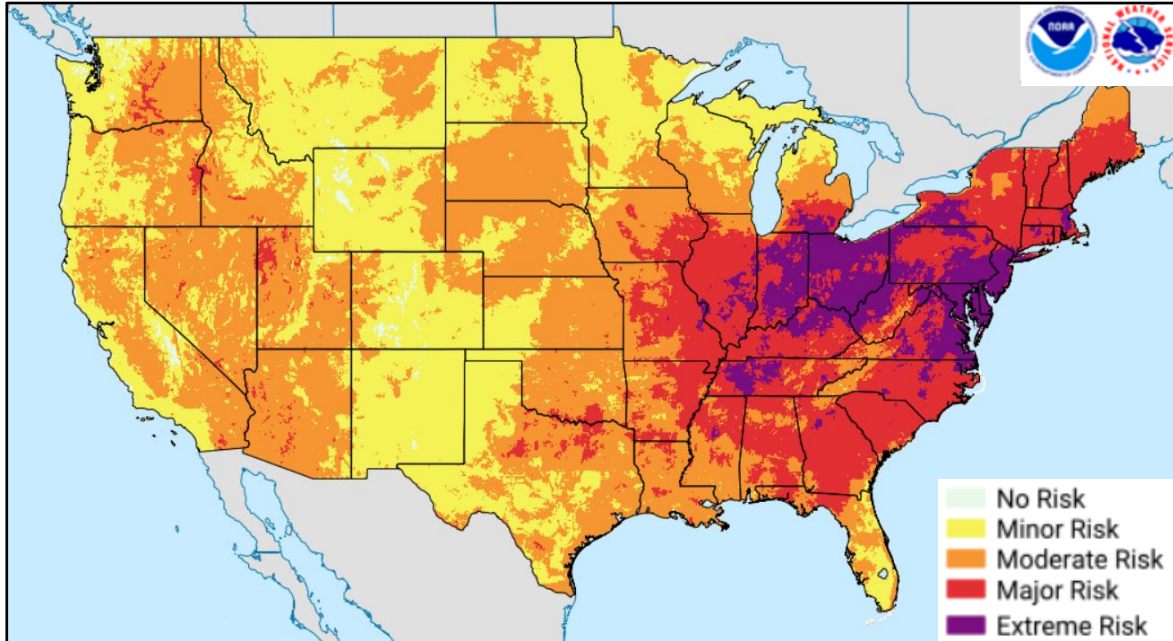
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Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

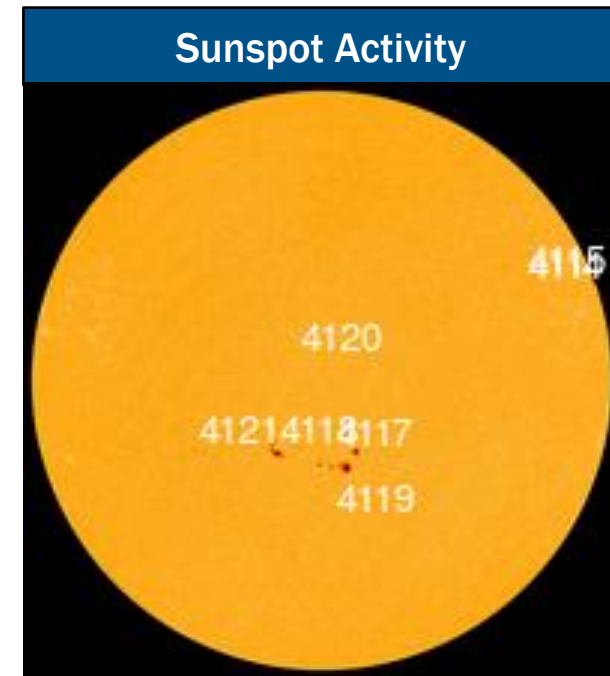
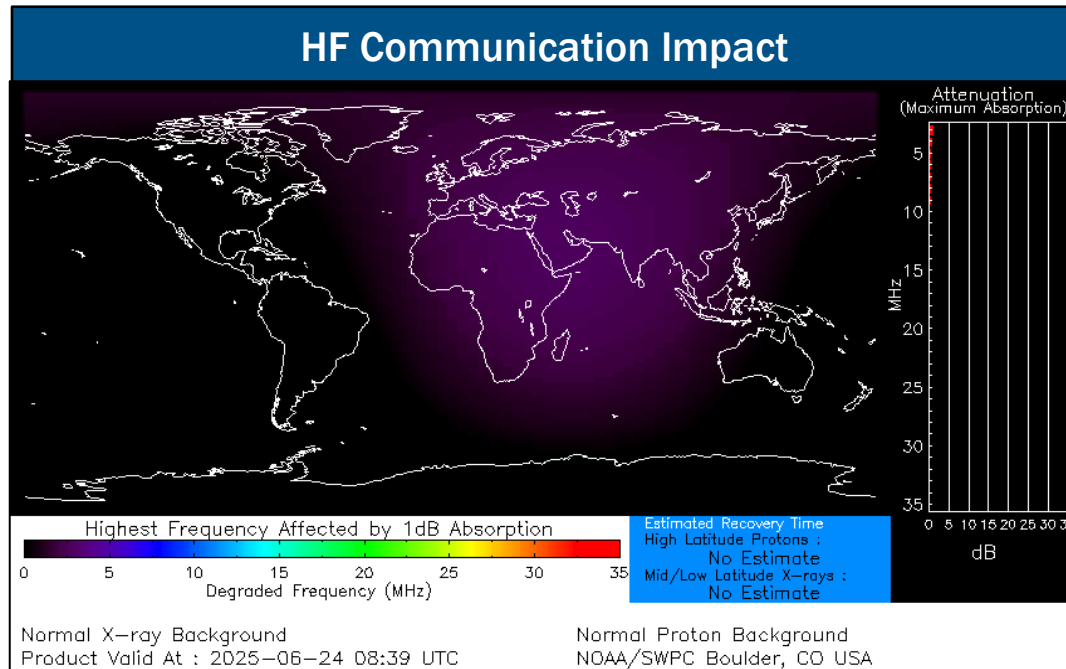

Situation: The FEMA Region X Regional Administrator has approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Himalaya Road Fire, which has burned 3,320 acres with 0% containment. The fire is burning on federal, state and private land in the community of Fairbanks North Star, AK (est. pop 95k). Aside from the FMAG approval, no additional federal assistance has been requested.

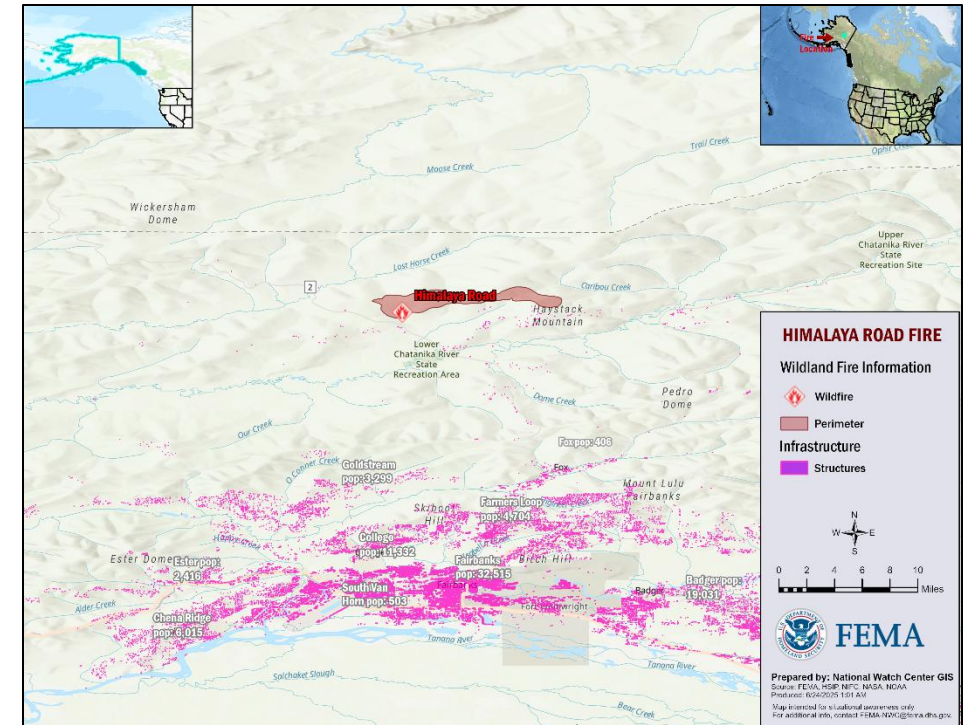

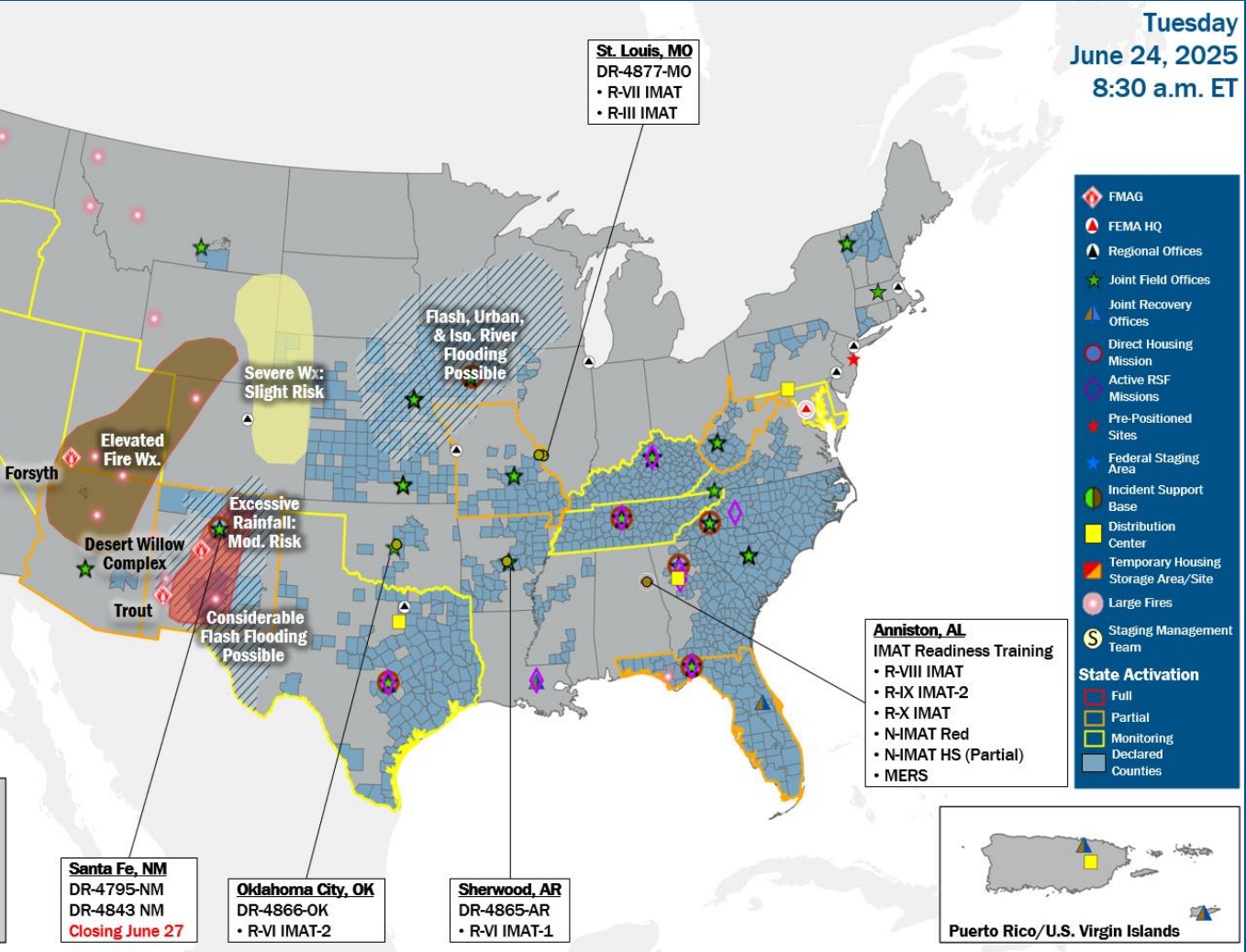

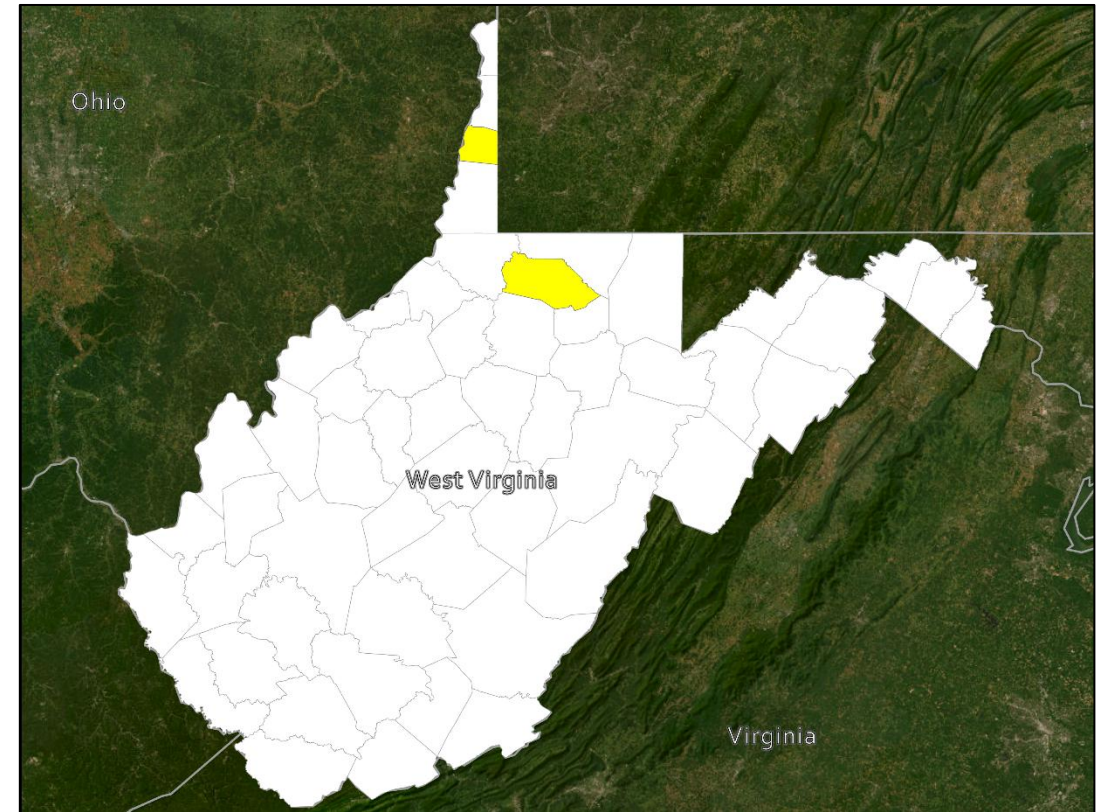
