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Flooding – Upper Midwest



Situation: In Minnesota, excessive rainfall since Sunday, June 16, has caused river and lake levels to crest and hold at or above major flood stage for several days. Strong to severe storms are currently moving east across the state and expected to increase in intensity over the next 24 hours. Debris build up from higher waters caused erosion leading to a breach on the Rapidan Dam, and the dam is expected to fail causing a 2-foot surge mainly impacting agricultural land. In Iowa, heavy rainfall since June 20 has led to increased flooding in northwestern Iowa, as locations upriver have seen 6+ inches of rain. There are currently sixteen river flood gauges at major flood stage, and as the flood surge progresses down stream in the next couple of days, it will affect locations along the Missouri and Mississippi Rivers.

Situation: The South Fork and Salt wildfires persist in New Mexico, posing ongoing threats to homes, businesses, and other structures in the Ruidoso area. Mandatory evacuations remain in effect. [There are lower fire weather concerns over the next several days as upper-level high pressure settles into the region, however any rain that falls on recent burn scars could lead to flash flooding.](#)

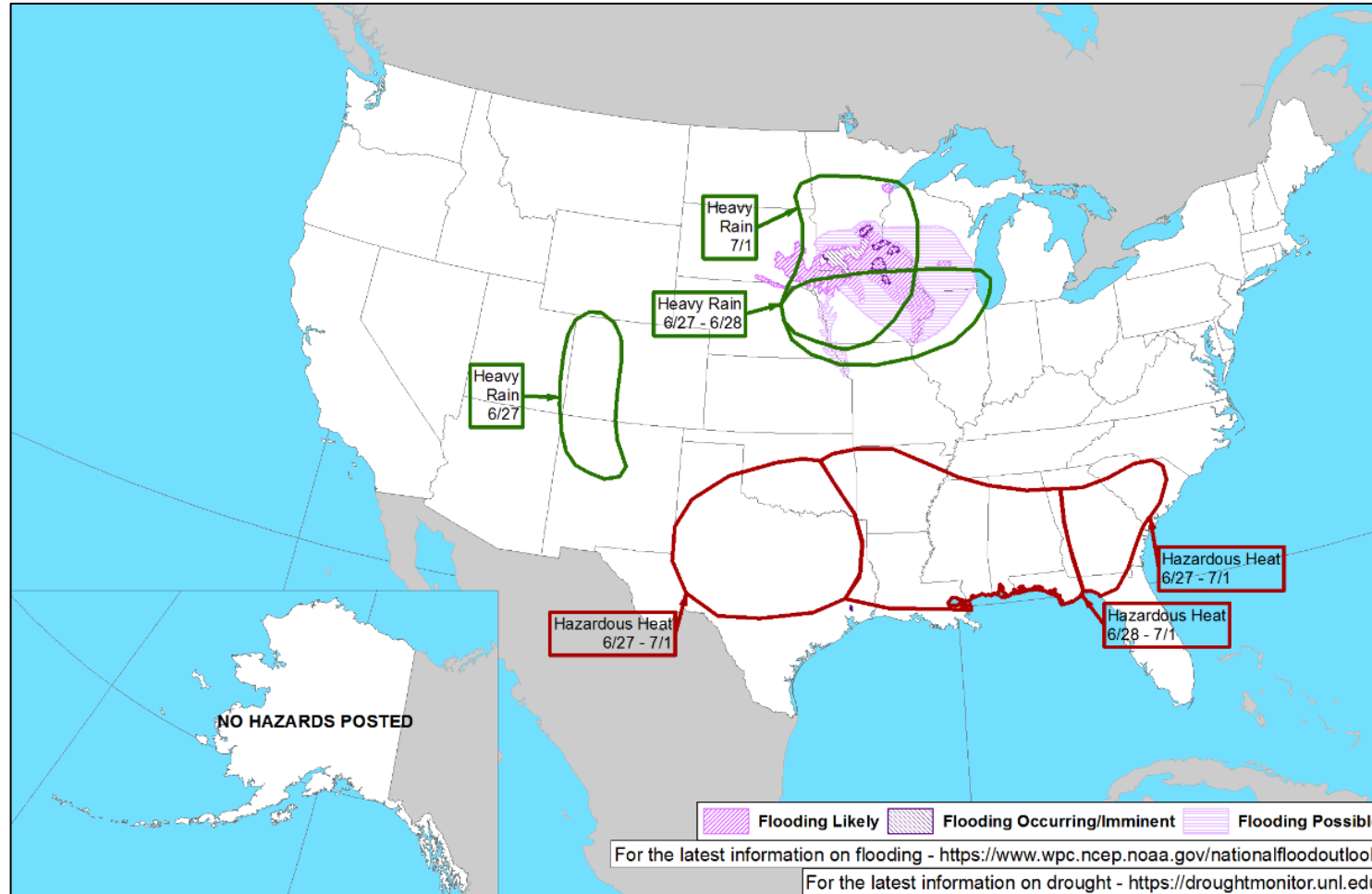
Severe Weather Outlook

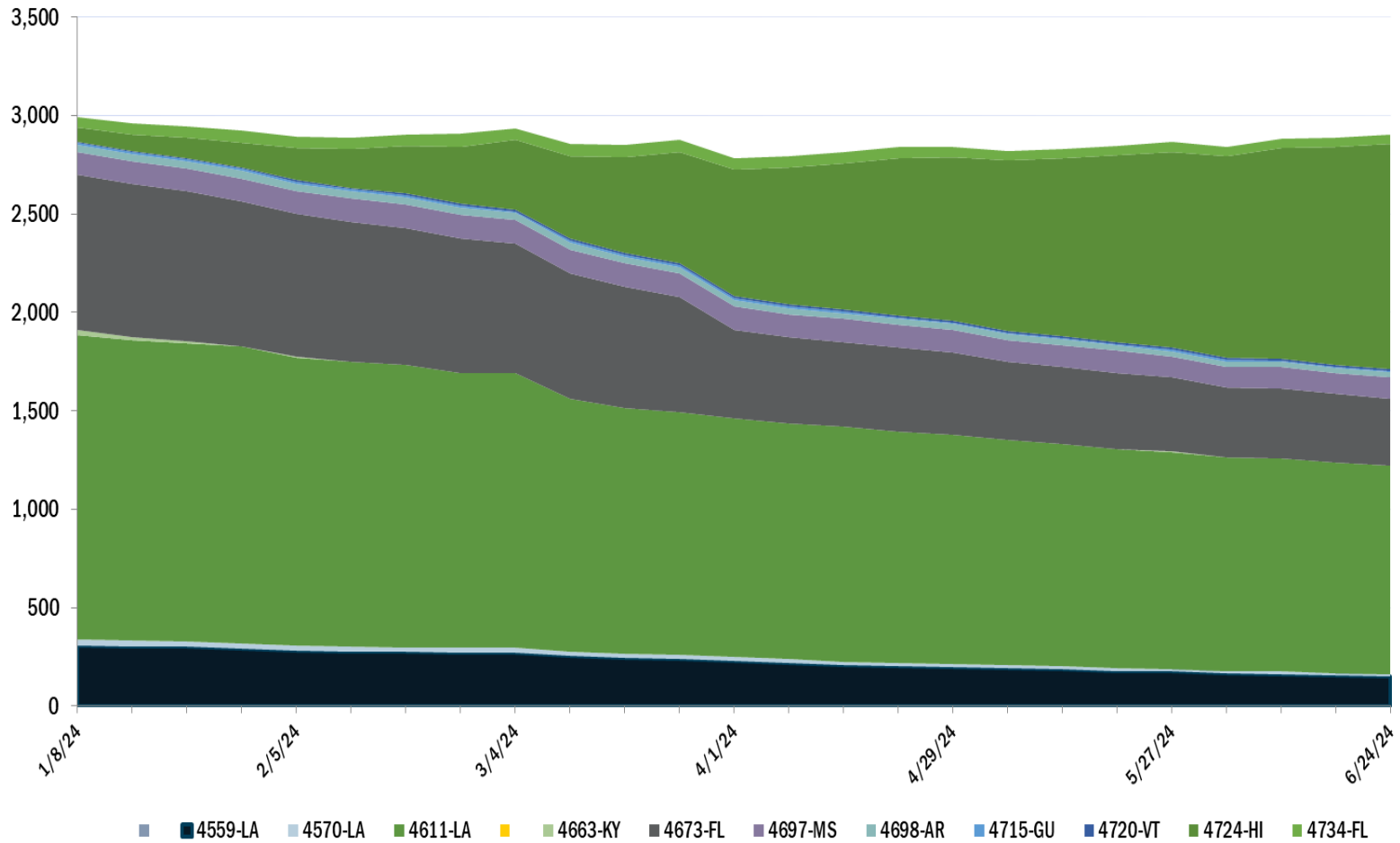

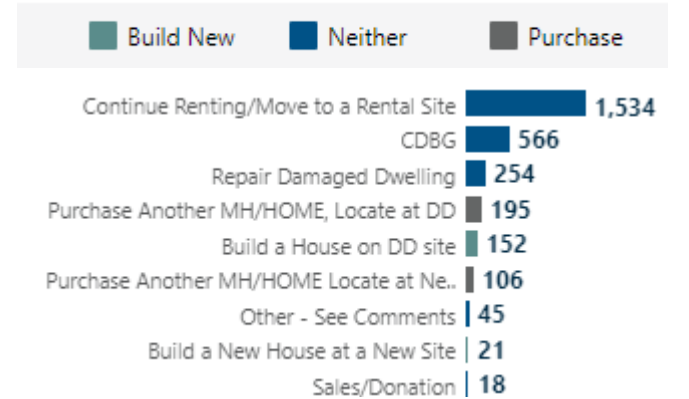
