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M7.5 Earthquake – Venezuela

Situation and analysis: At 6:25 p.m. ET, USGS reported a 7.2 magnitude earthquake (MMI 8 – severe shaking) approximately 18 miles NW of Montalbán, Venezuela (pop. 33k), at a depth of approximately 8 miles. At 7:30 p.m. ET, USGS generated a red PAGER for an additional 7.5 magnitude earthquake (MMI 9 – violent shaking) approximately 22 miles W of Puerto Cabello, Venezuela (pop. 209k), at a depth of approximately 6 miles. The DOS reported 100% accountability for all U.S. staff, 90% for all local staff, and one severely injured local staff member.

Red PAGER:

- Alert for shaking-related fatalities and economic losses. High casualties and extensive damage are probable and the disaster is likely widespread

Impacts:

- Widespread structural damage, fatalities, and injuries reported (*Open-source media, as of 8:00 a.m. ET*)

FEMA / Federal Response:

Department of State:

- Interim President of Venezuela declared a state of emergency and requested U.S. assistance (*State Department*)

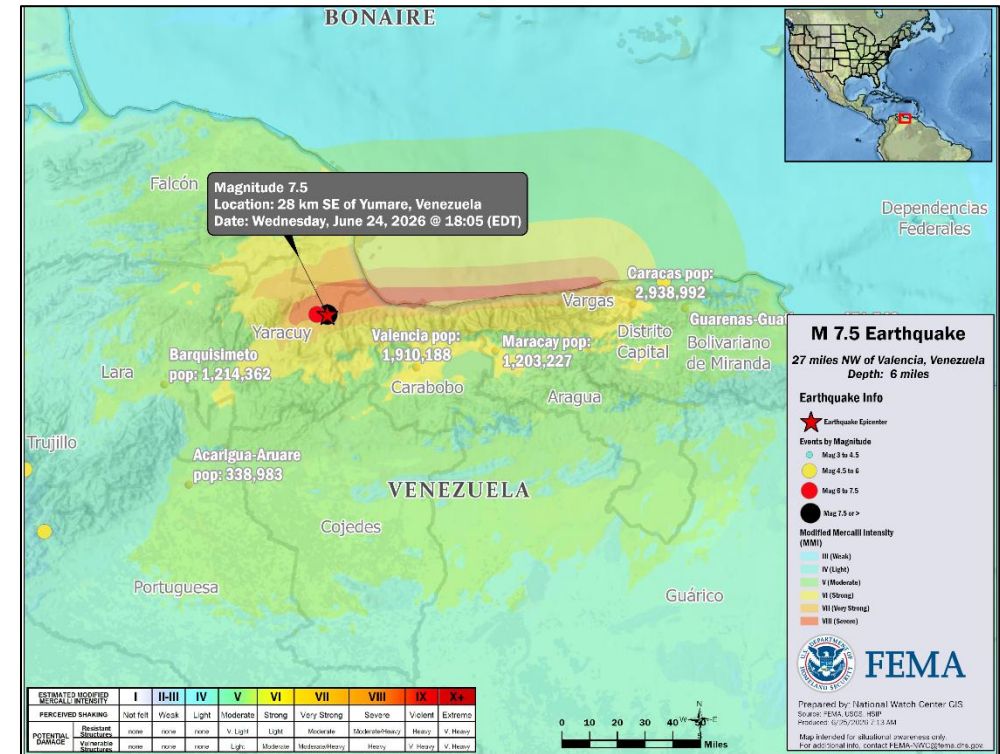
US&R:

- VA-TF1 as USA 1, and CA-TF2 as USA 2, are being deployed to Venezuela by the Department of State

FEMA HQ:

- NWC is Enhanced (FIFA/A250)

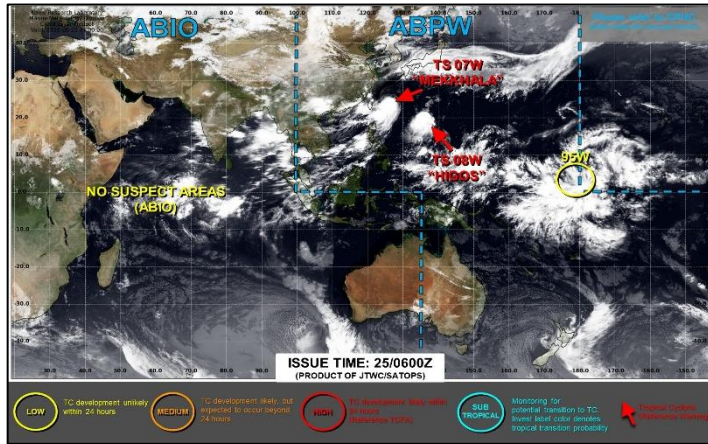
NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with Department of State; barring any significant updates, this will be the final report.



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Tropical Outlook

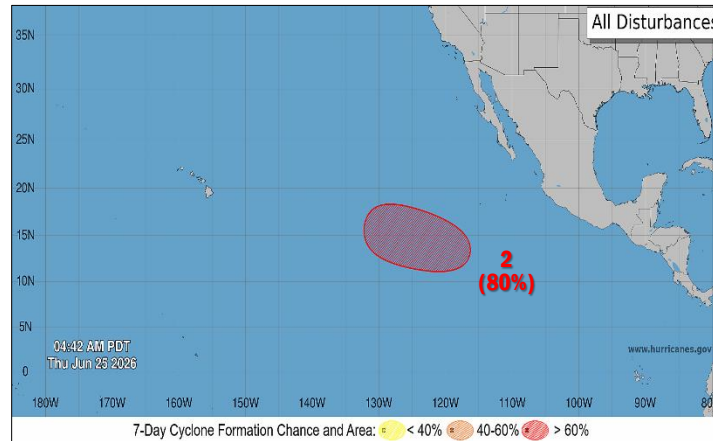
Western Pacific



Invest 95W: (JTWC, as of 3:00 a.m. ET)

- 2,600 miles ESE of Guam
- Moving W slowly
- Environmental conditions are forecast to be conducive for development into a tropical cyclone in the next 24 to 48 hours
- Formation chance – 24-hour: Low

Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles offshore of southwestern Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10–15 mph
- Environmental conditions are forecast to be conducive for gradual development
- Tropical depression likely to form by this weekend or early next week over the central portion of the East Pacific Basin
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: High (80%)

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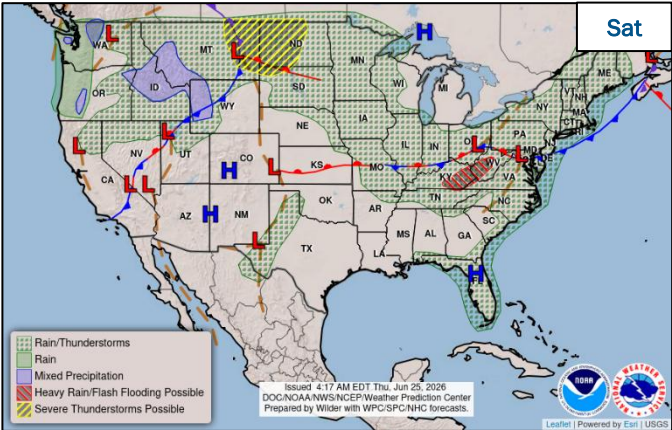
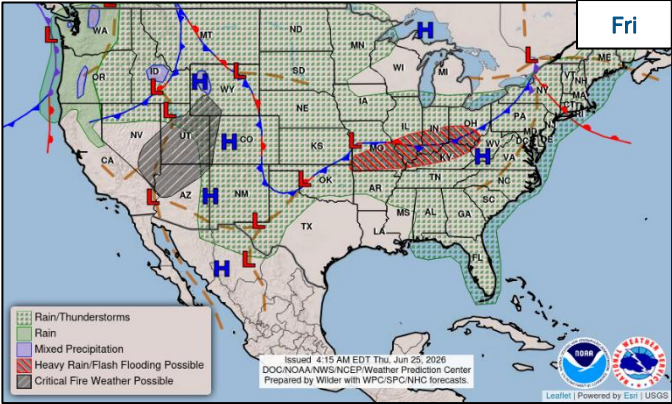
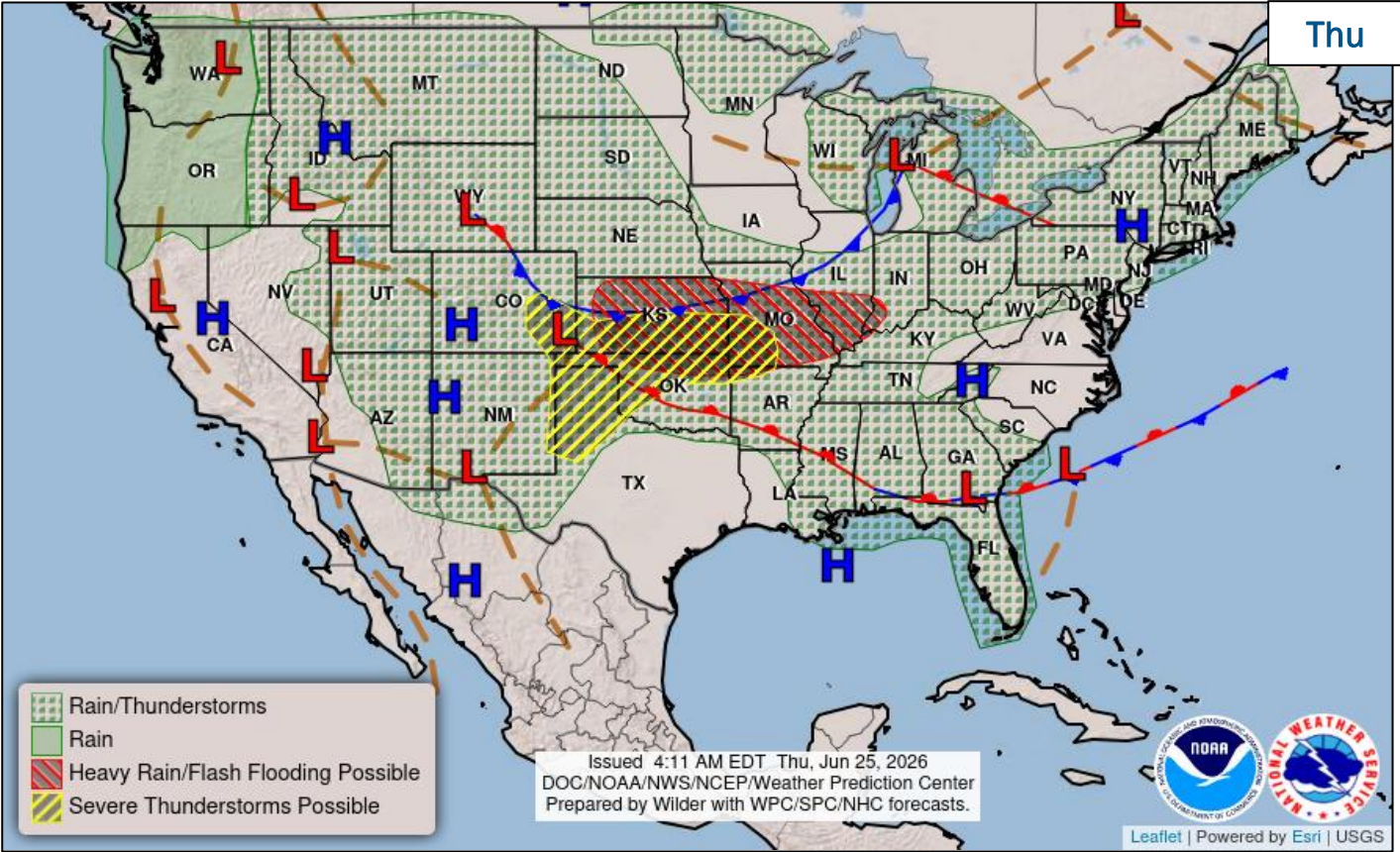
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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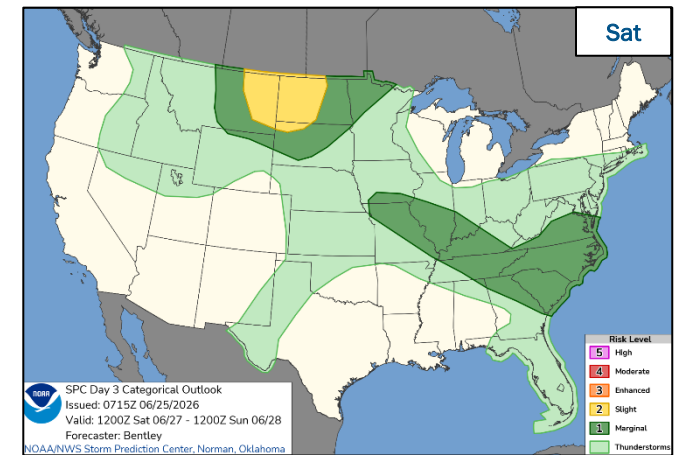
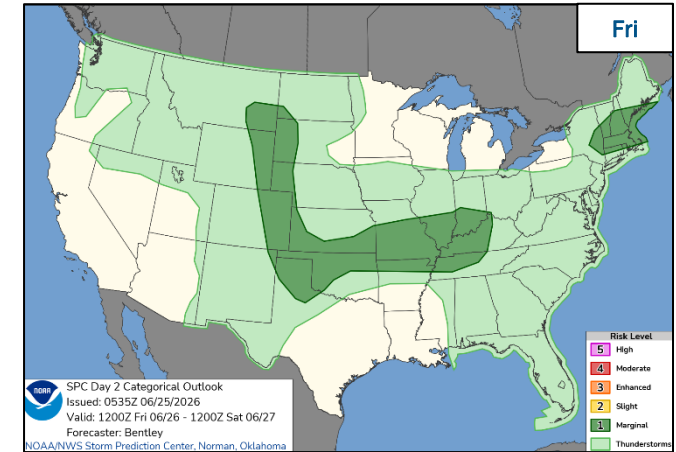
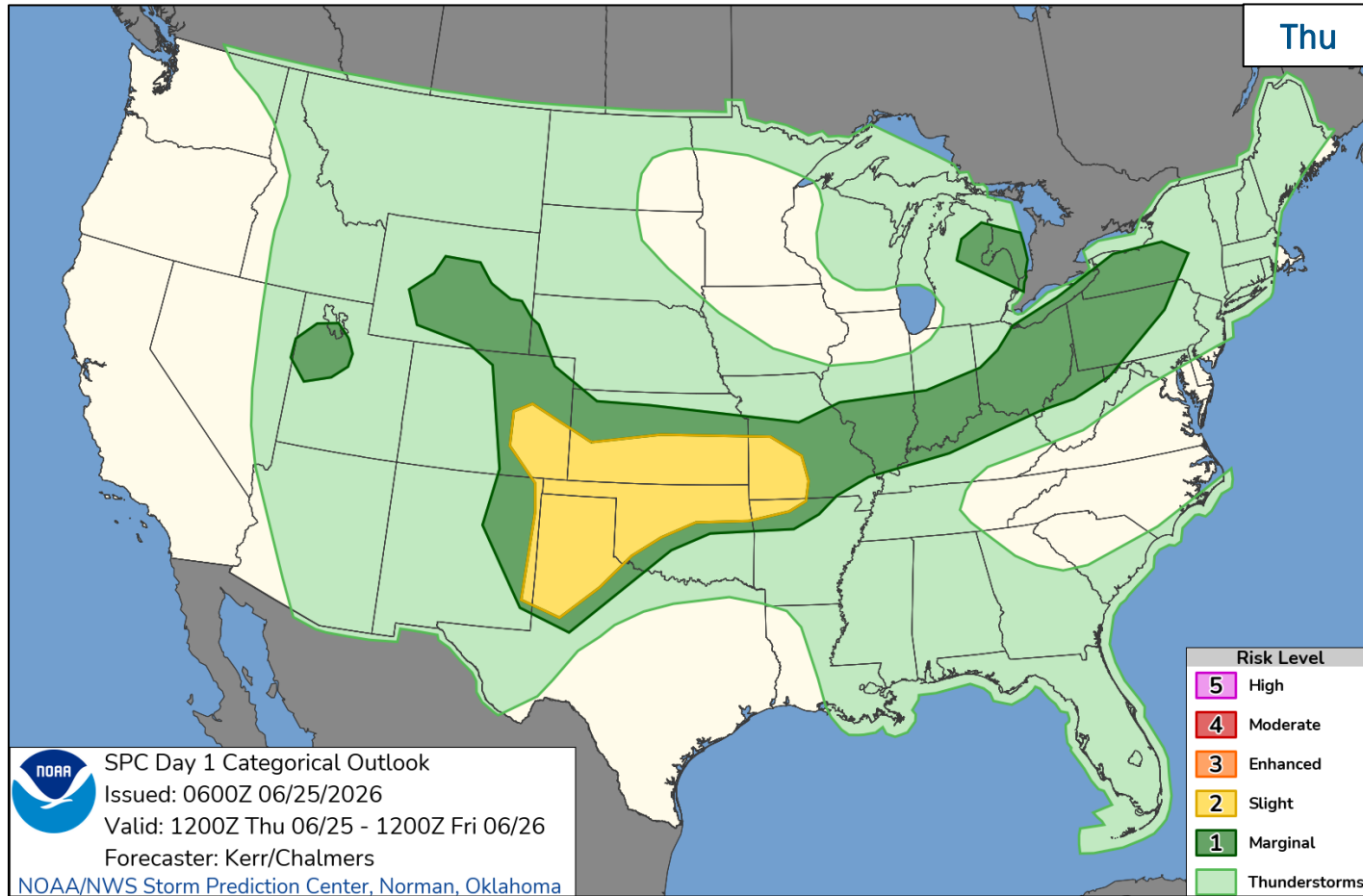

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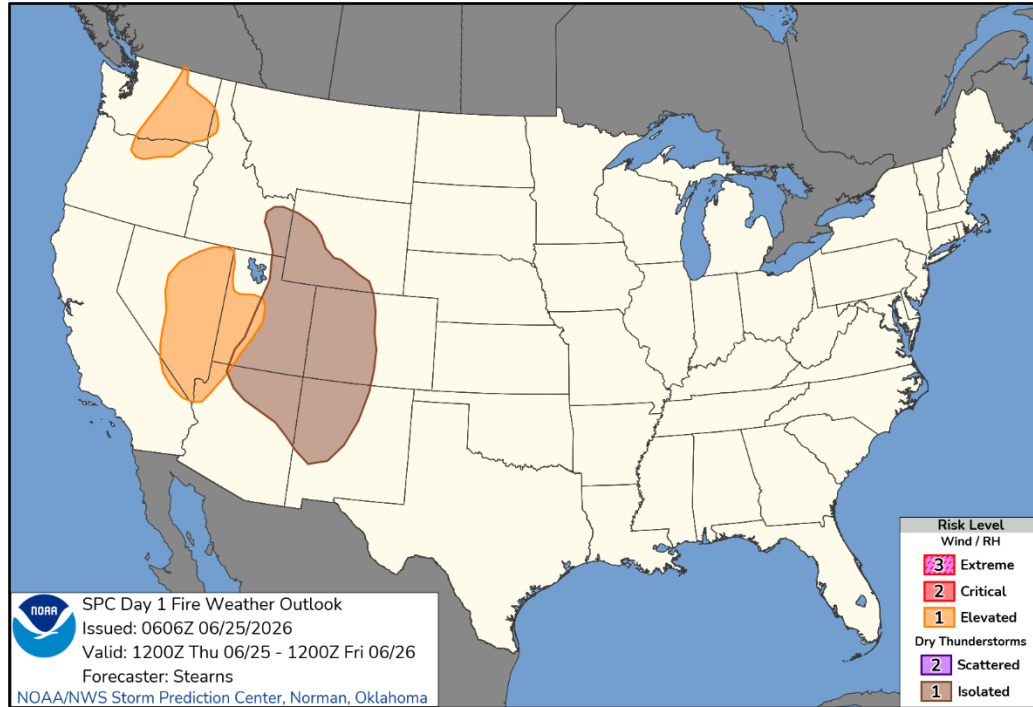
Severe Weather Outlook



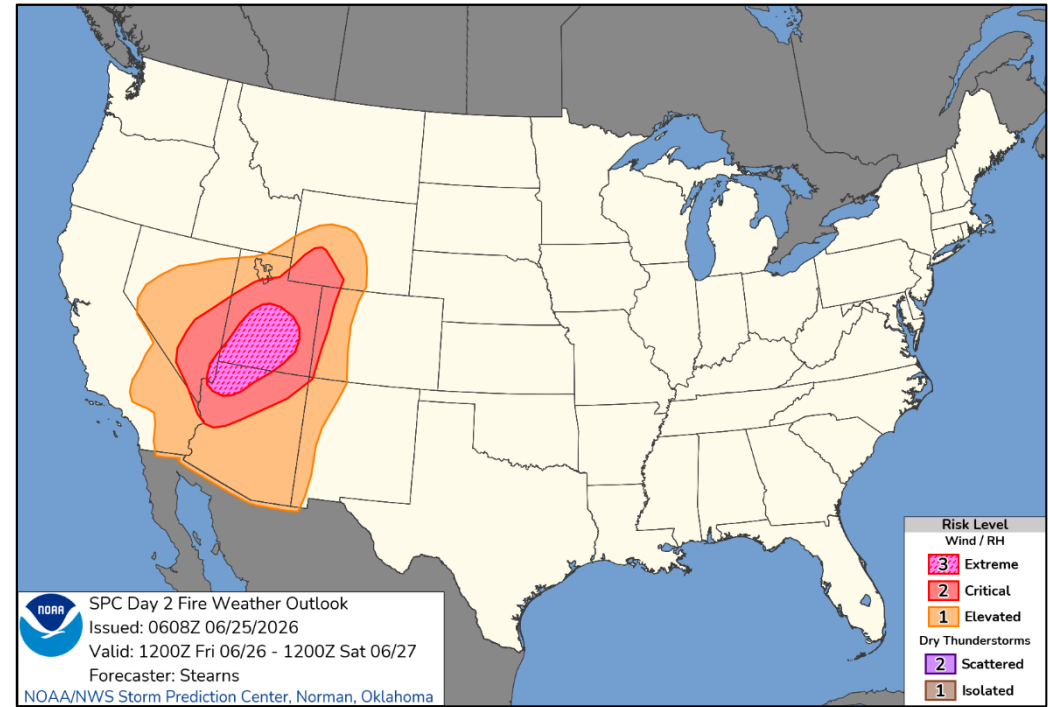
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Fire Weather Outlook

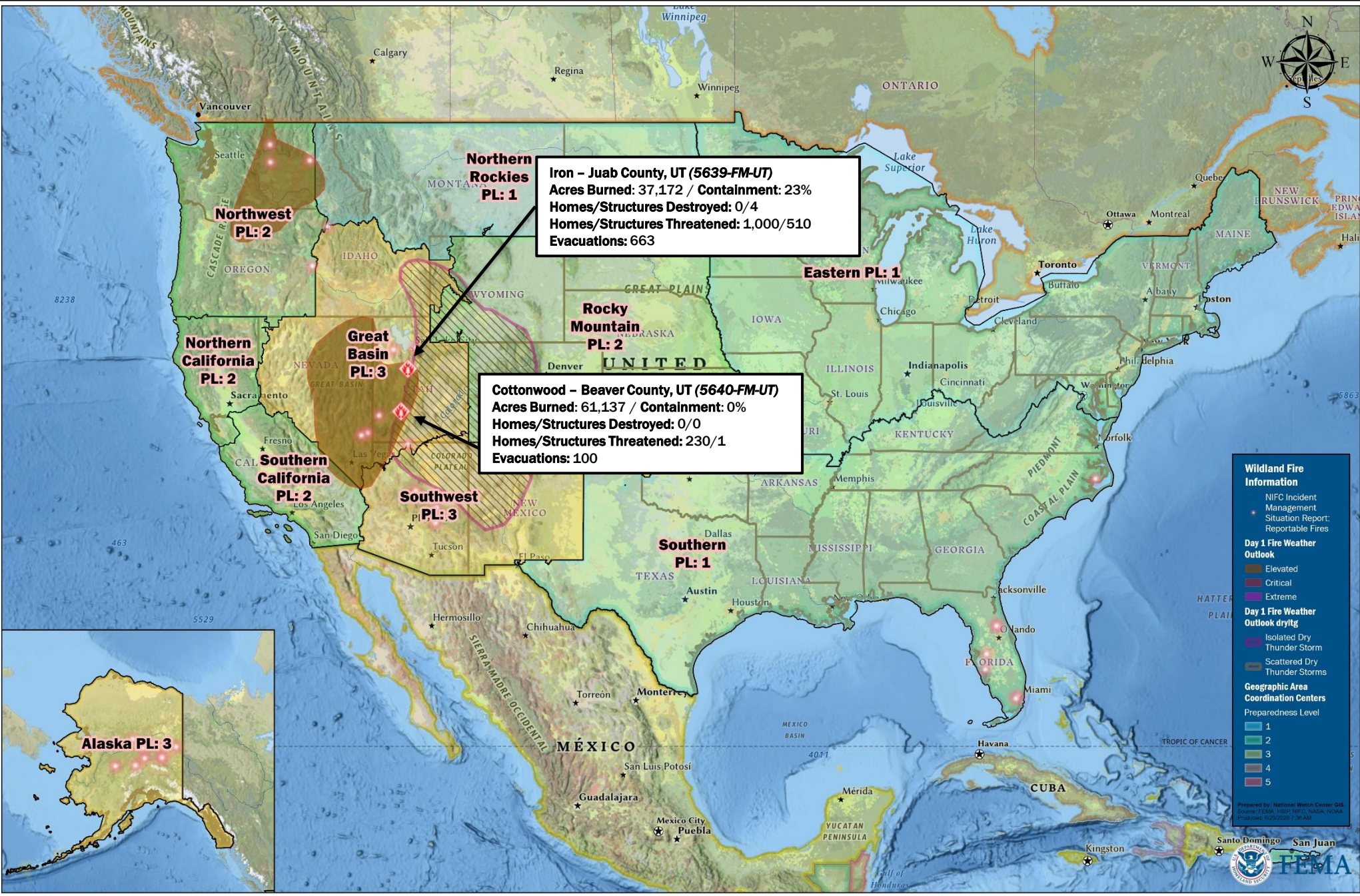

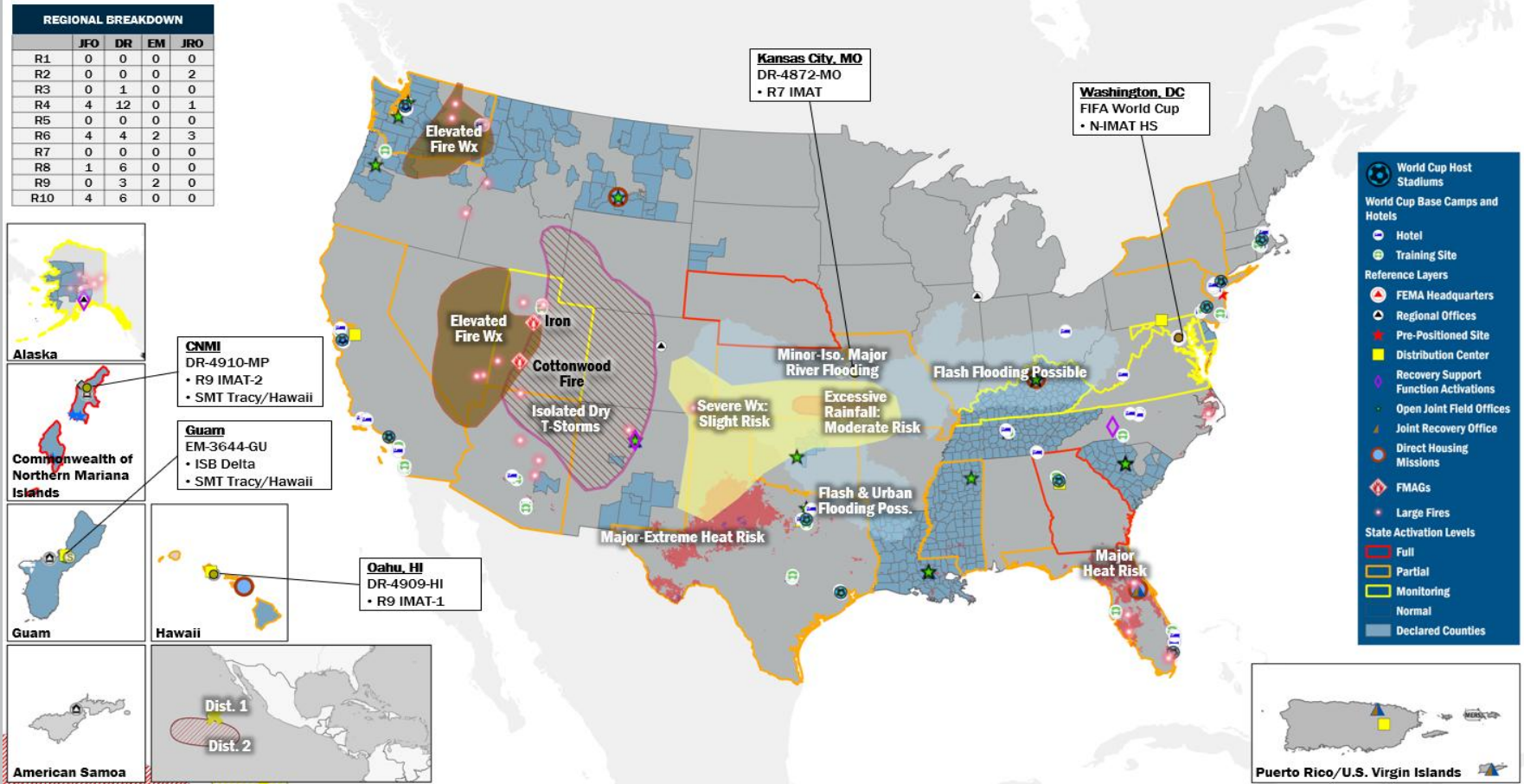
