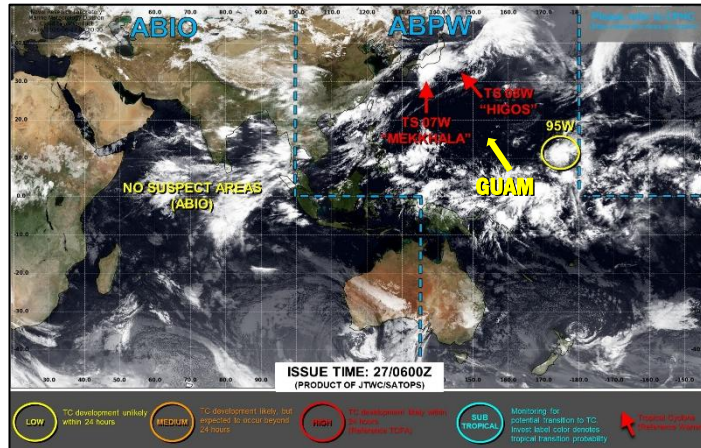

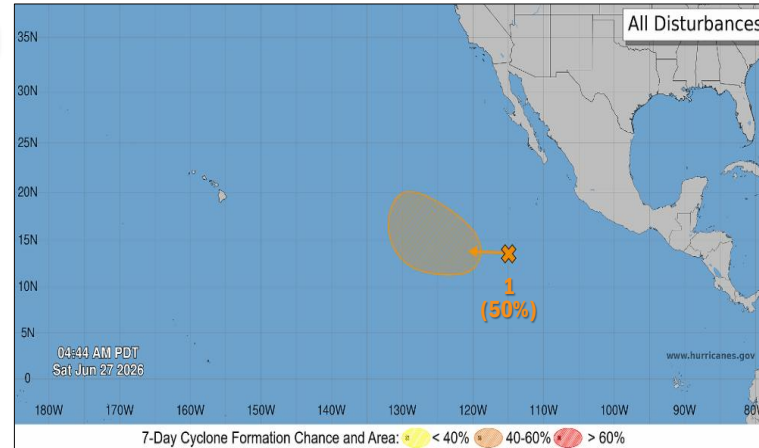
Western Pacific



Invest 95W: (JTWC as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Approximately 1,850 miles ESE of Guam
- Maximum sustained winds 15-21 mph
- Gradual development over the next 48-72 hours
- Formation chance – 24-hour: Low

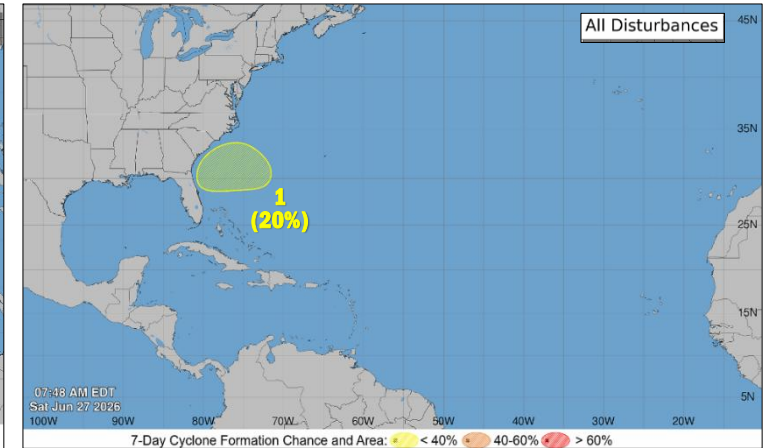
Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles SSW of the southern tip of Baja, California
- Gradual development is possible during the next few days
- Conditions are forecast to become less conducive for development by the second half of next week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 10%); 7-day: Med (50%)

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

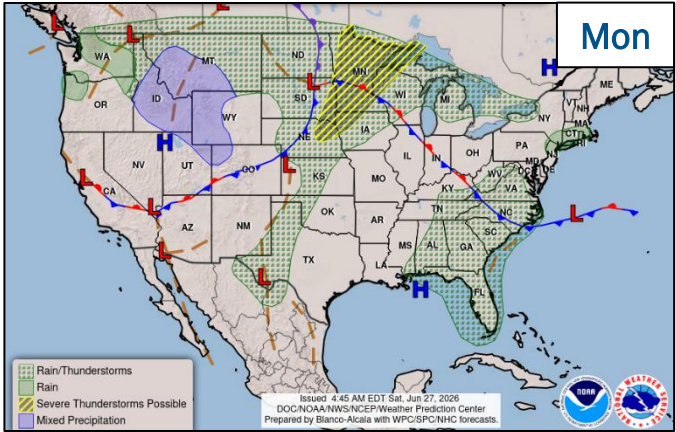
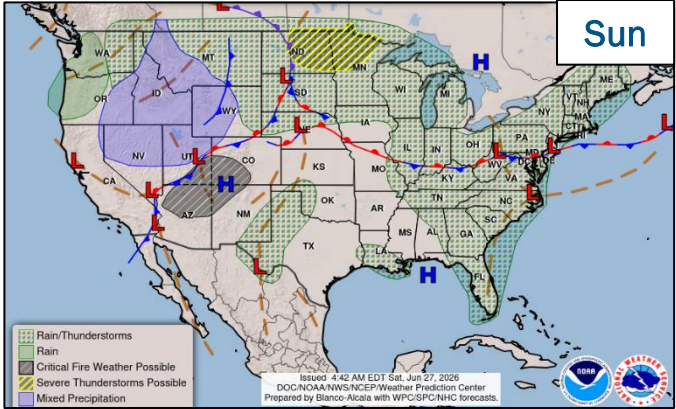
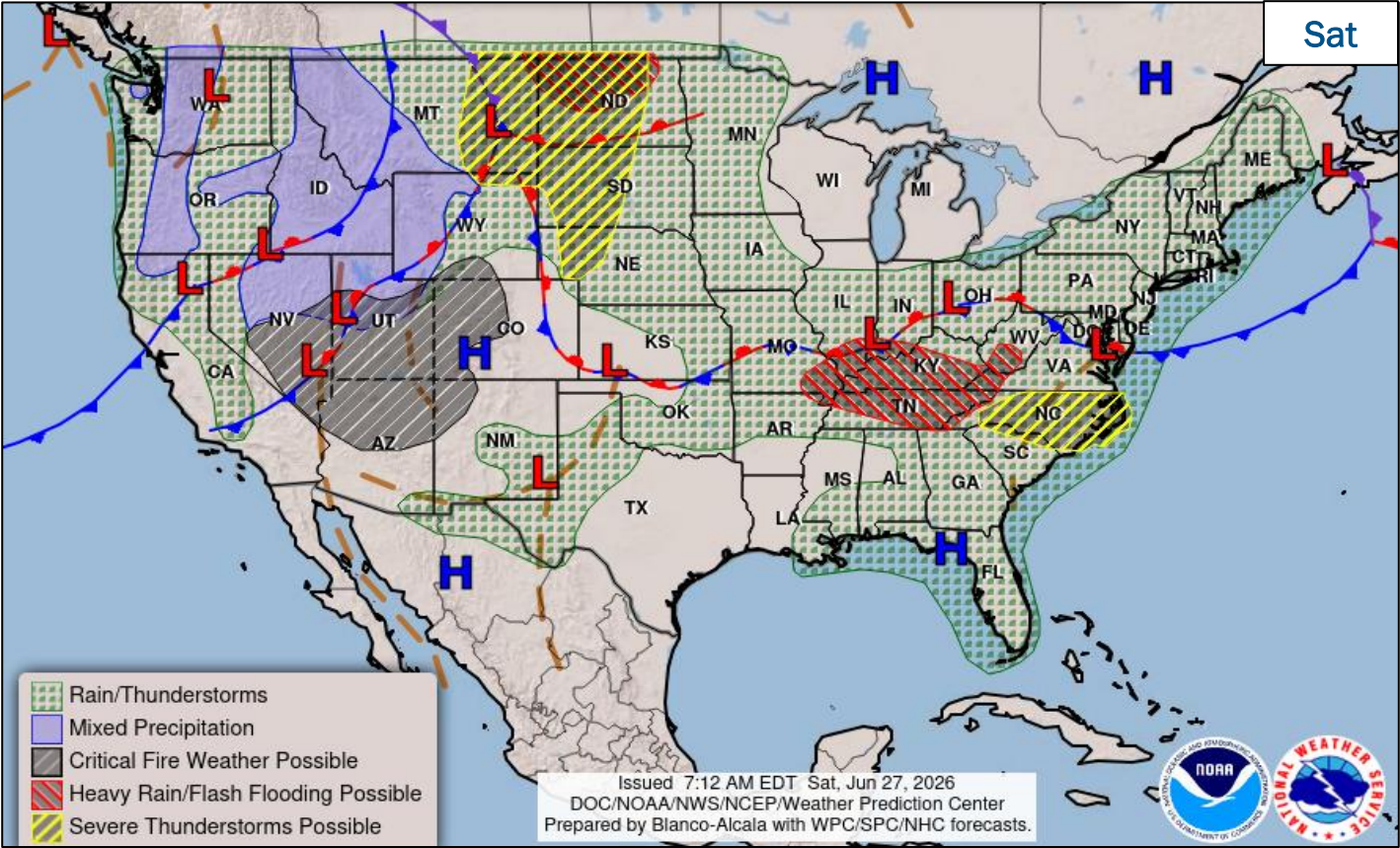
- Located offshore of the southeastern US coast

- Formation chance – 48-hour Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)



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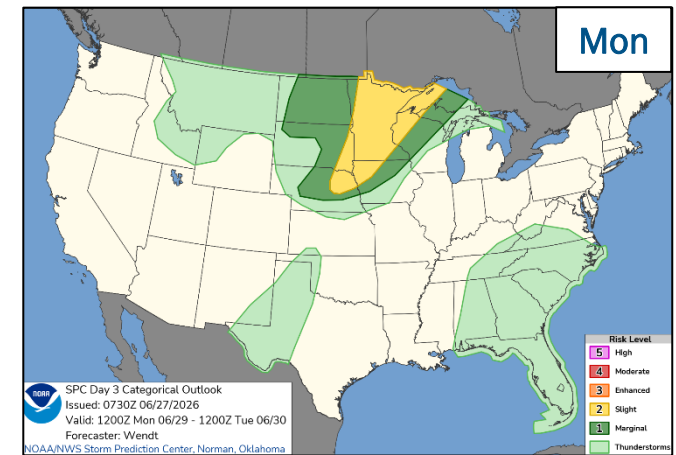
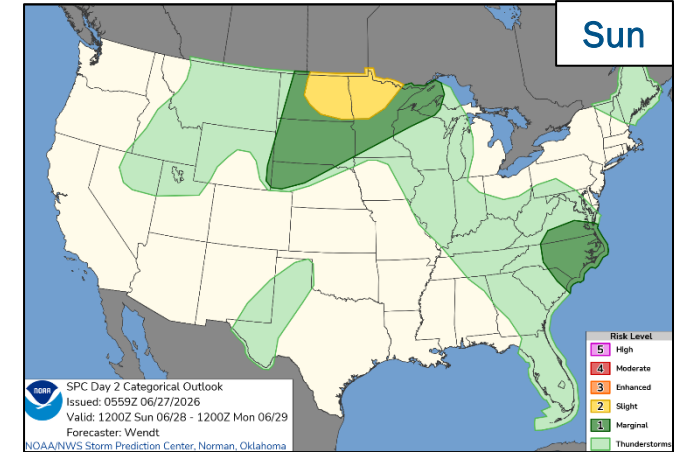
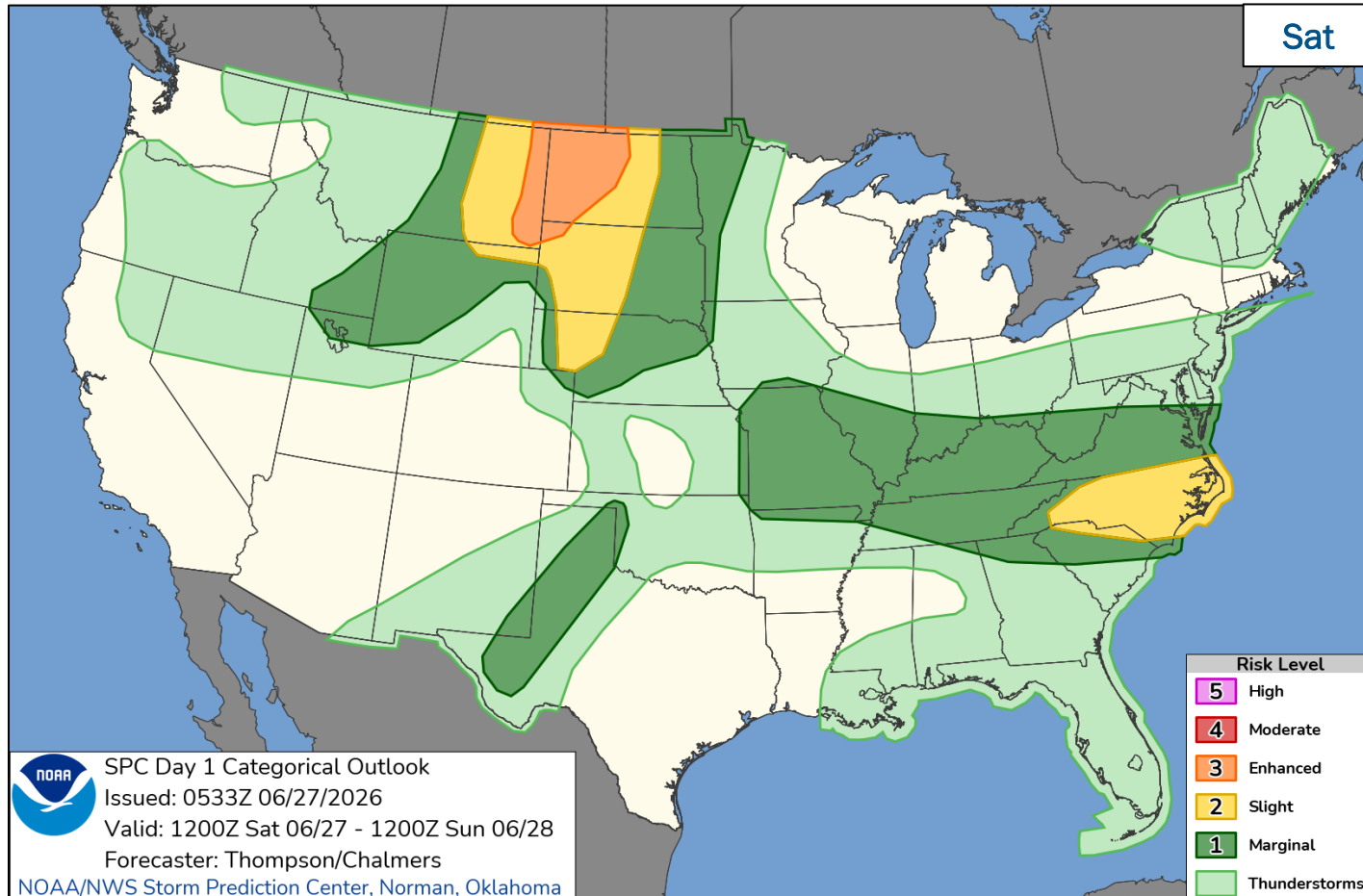

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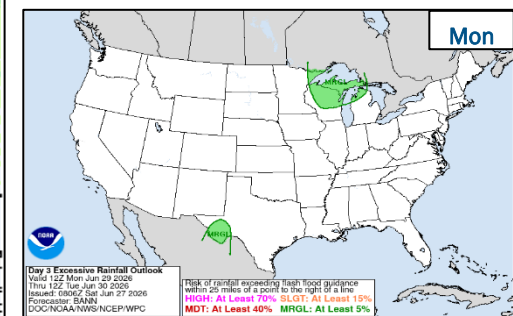
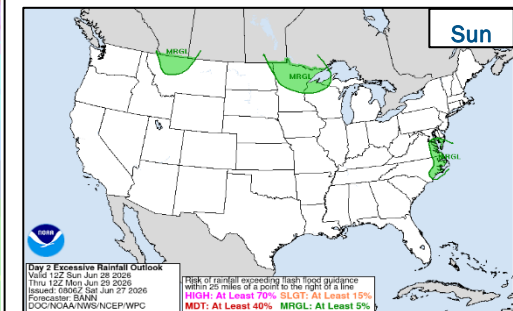
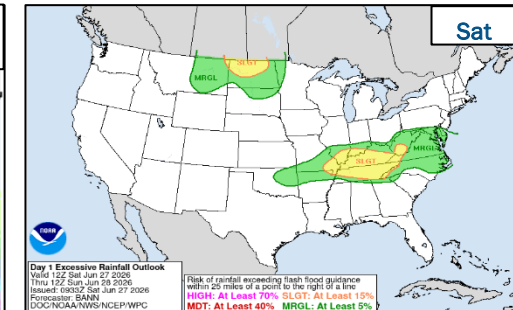
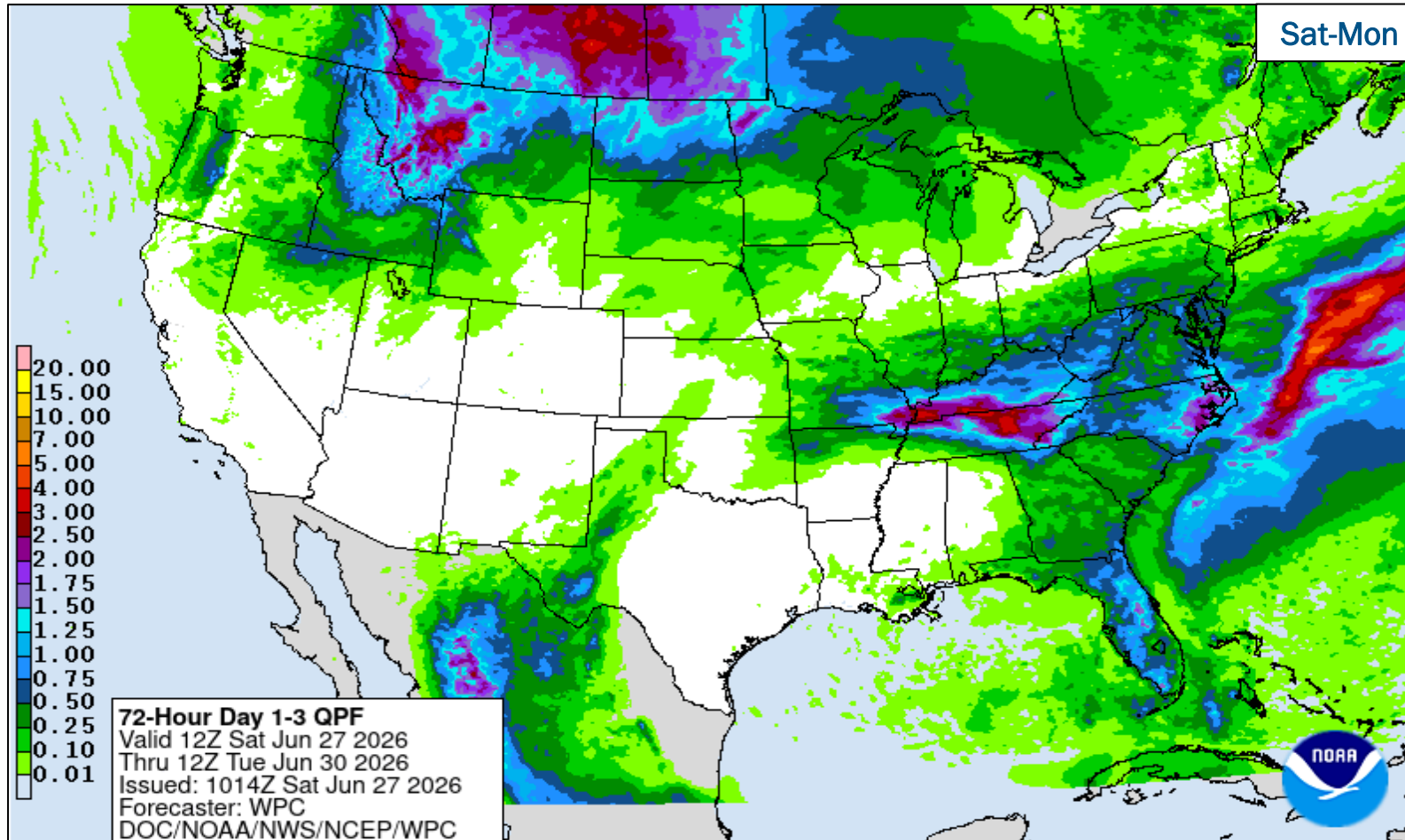
Severe Weather Outlook



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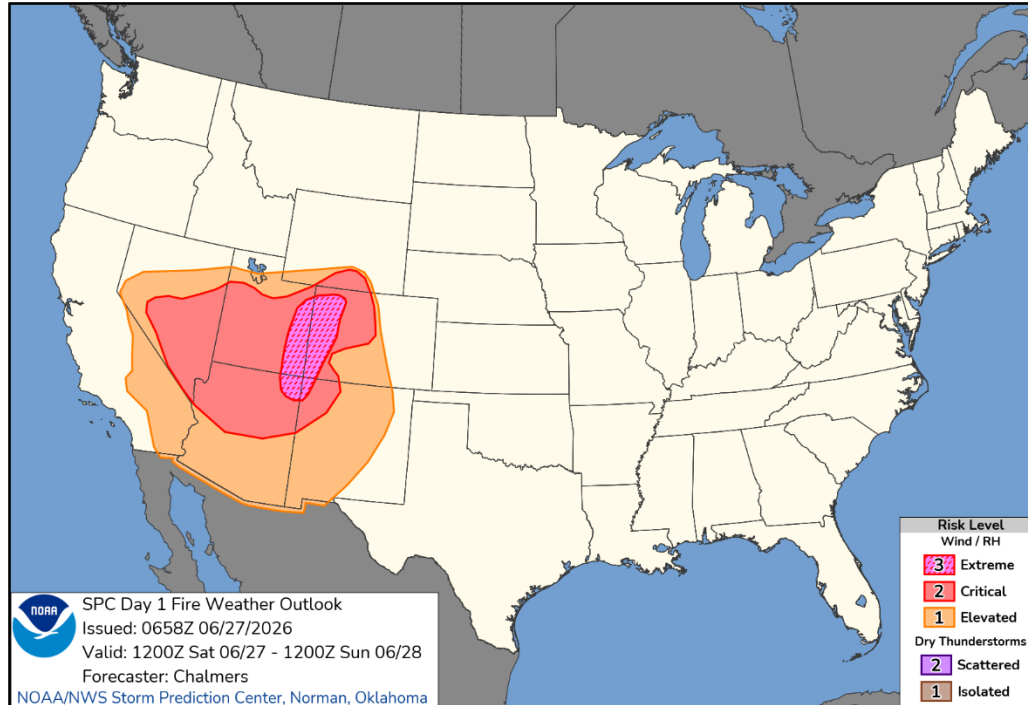
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



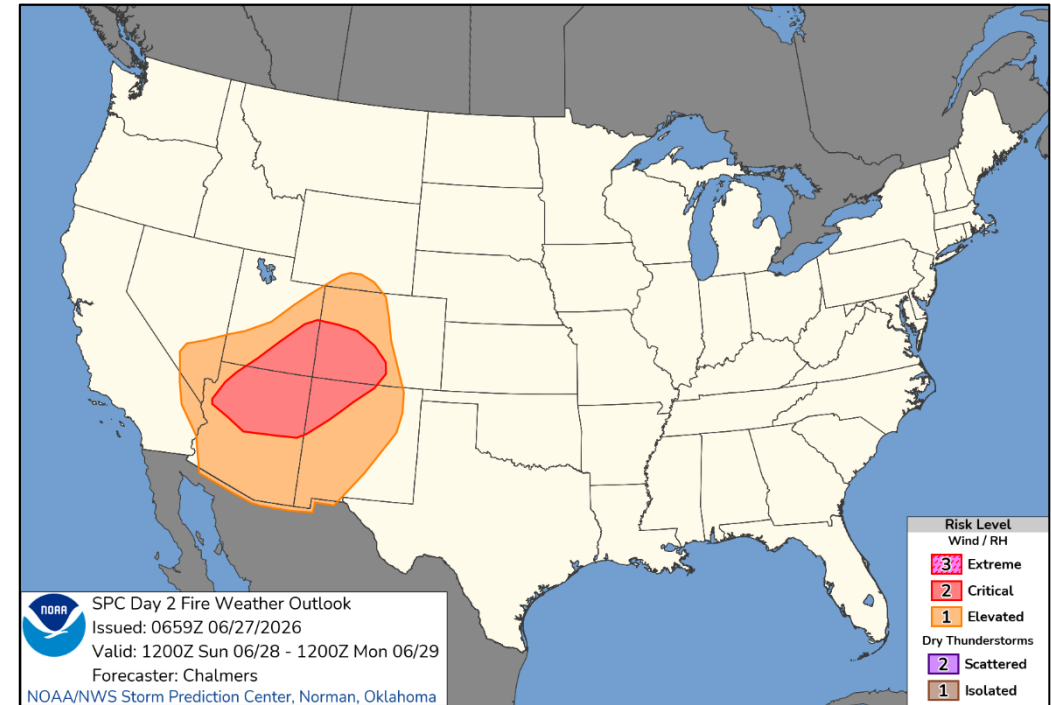
