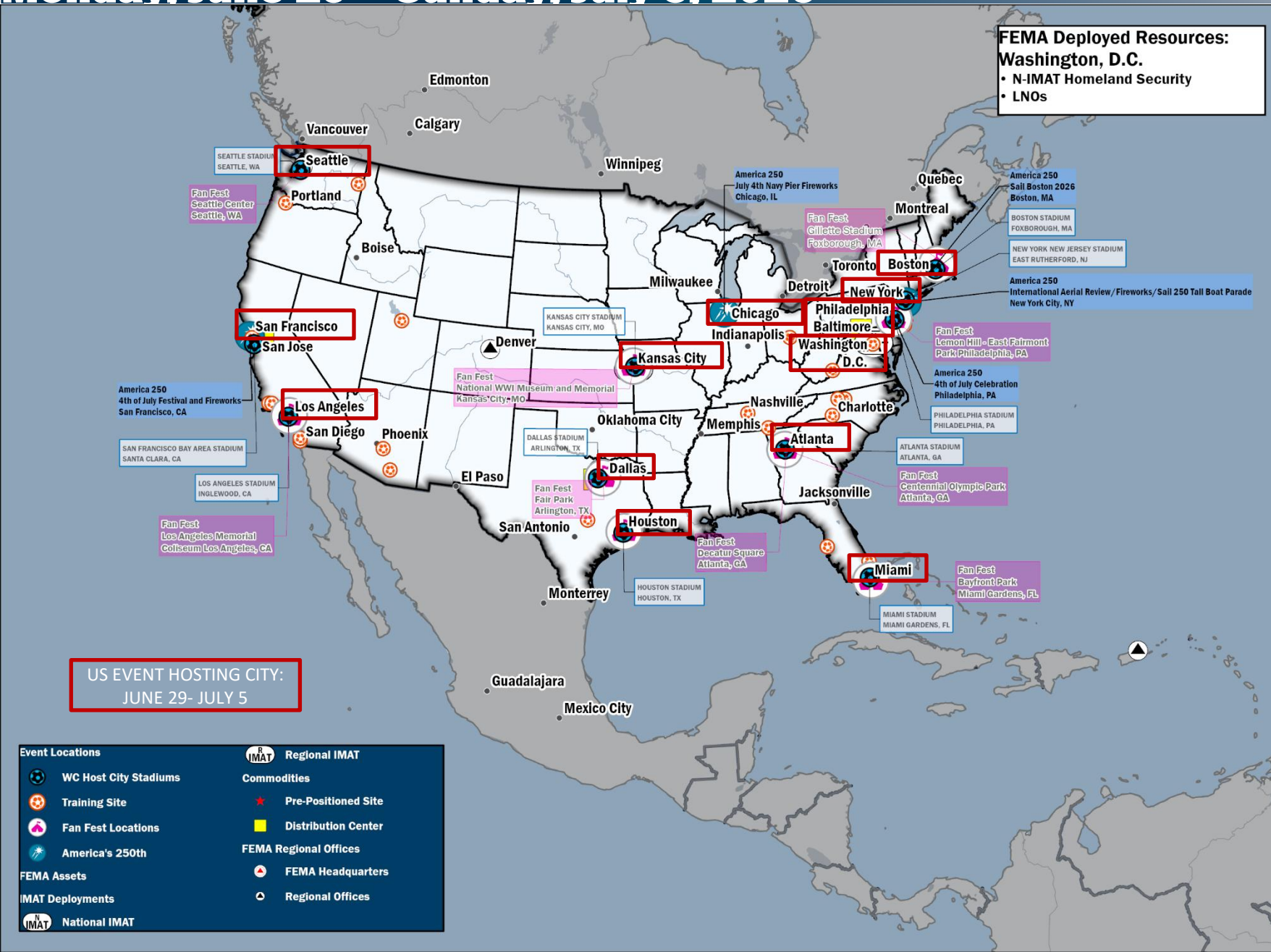

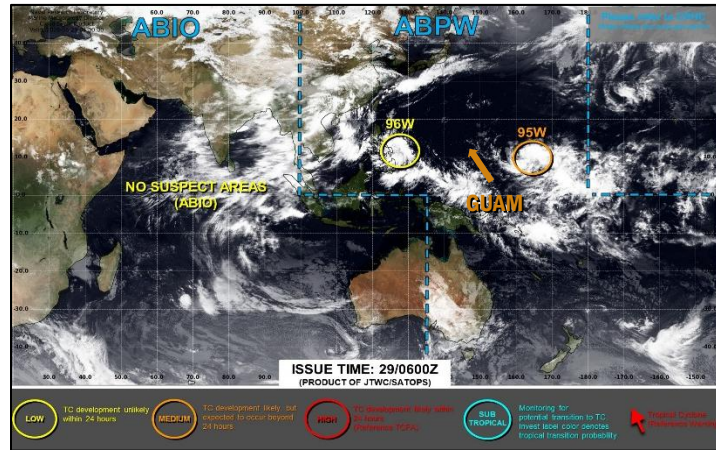

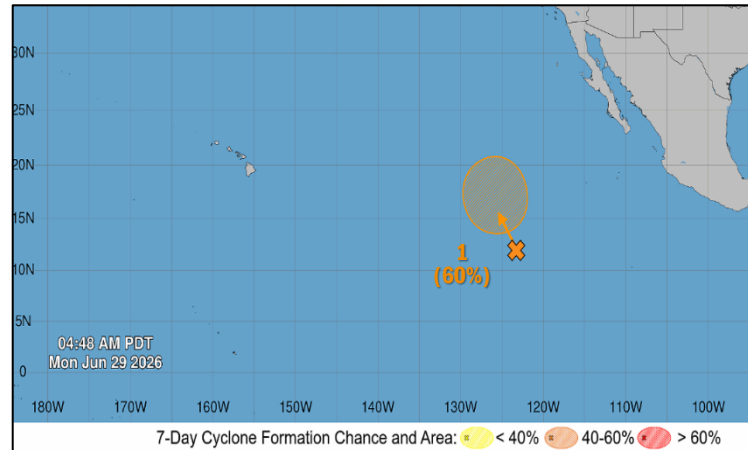
Western Pacific



Invest 95W: (JTWC, as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Approximately 1,510 miles ESE of Guam
- Maximum sustained winds 23-29 mph
- Favorable environmental conditions for development
- Formation chance – 24-hour: Medium

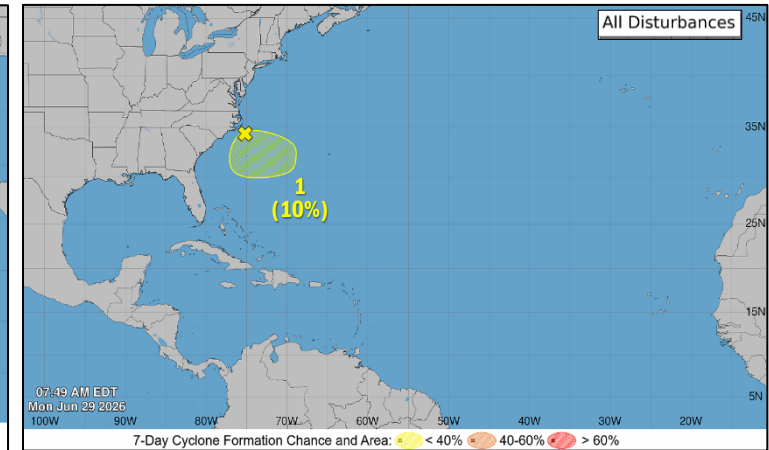
Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well SW of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula
- Gradual development is possible during the next couple of days, and a tropical depression could form by the middle of this week
- Environmental conditions are forecast to become less conducive by the end of the week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Medium (50%); 7-day: Medium (60%)

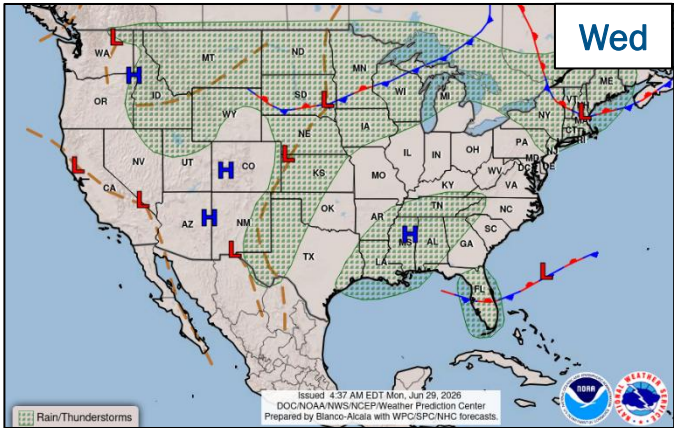
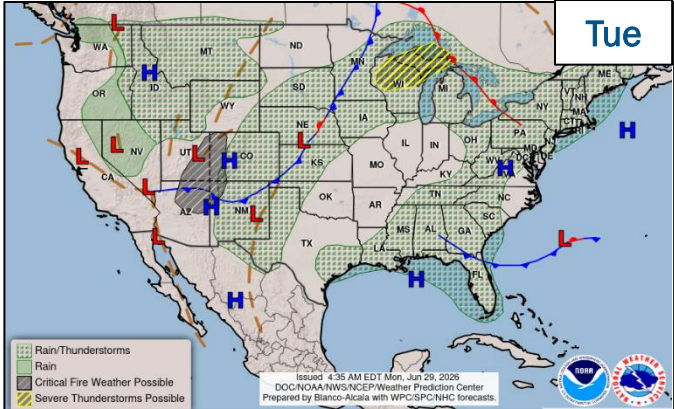
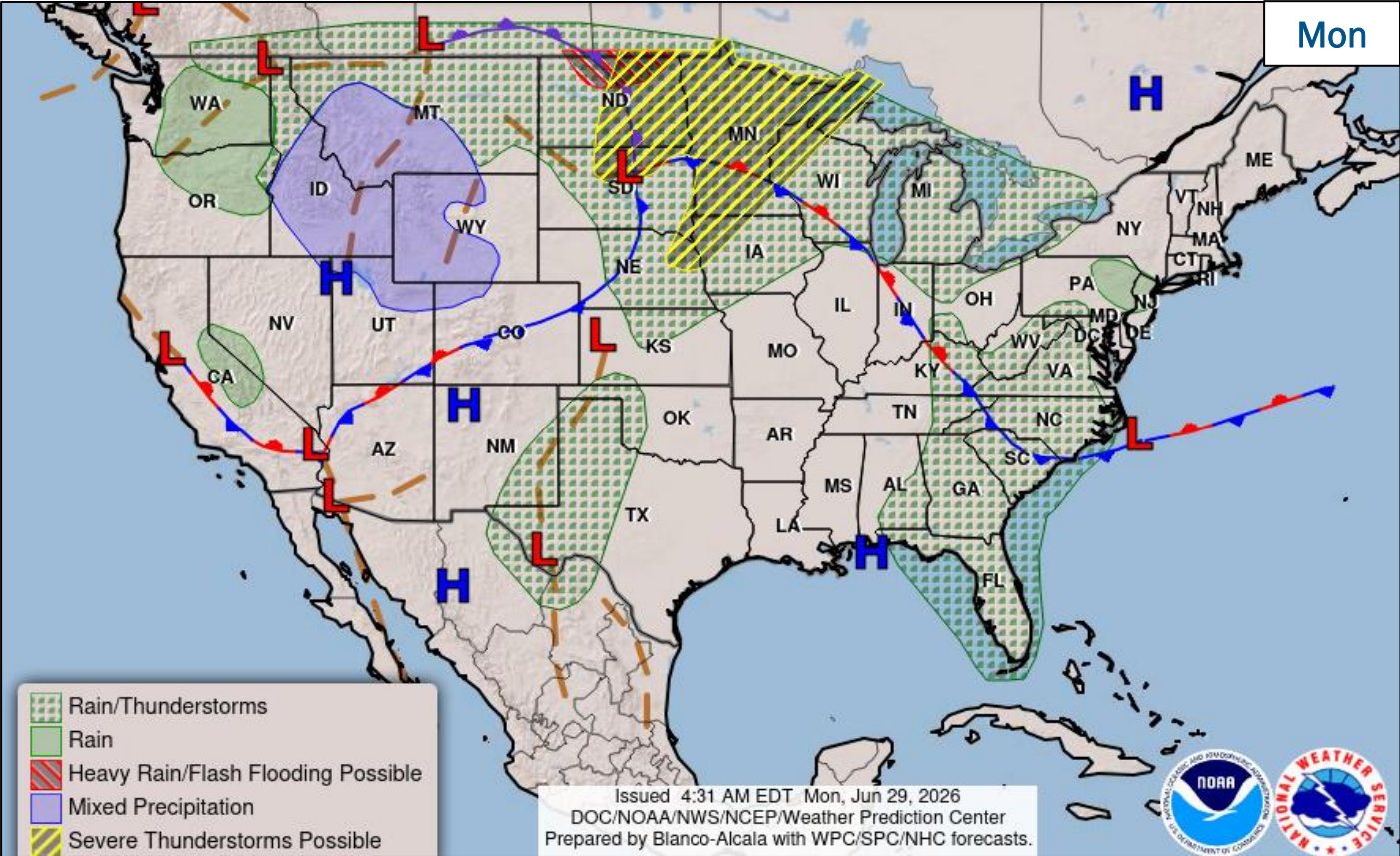
Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located offshore the southeastern U.S. coast
- Gradual development of this system marginally favorable for some development over the next day or two
- Conditions expected to become less favorable later this week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (10%)



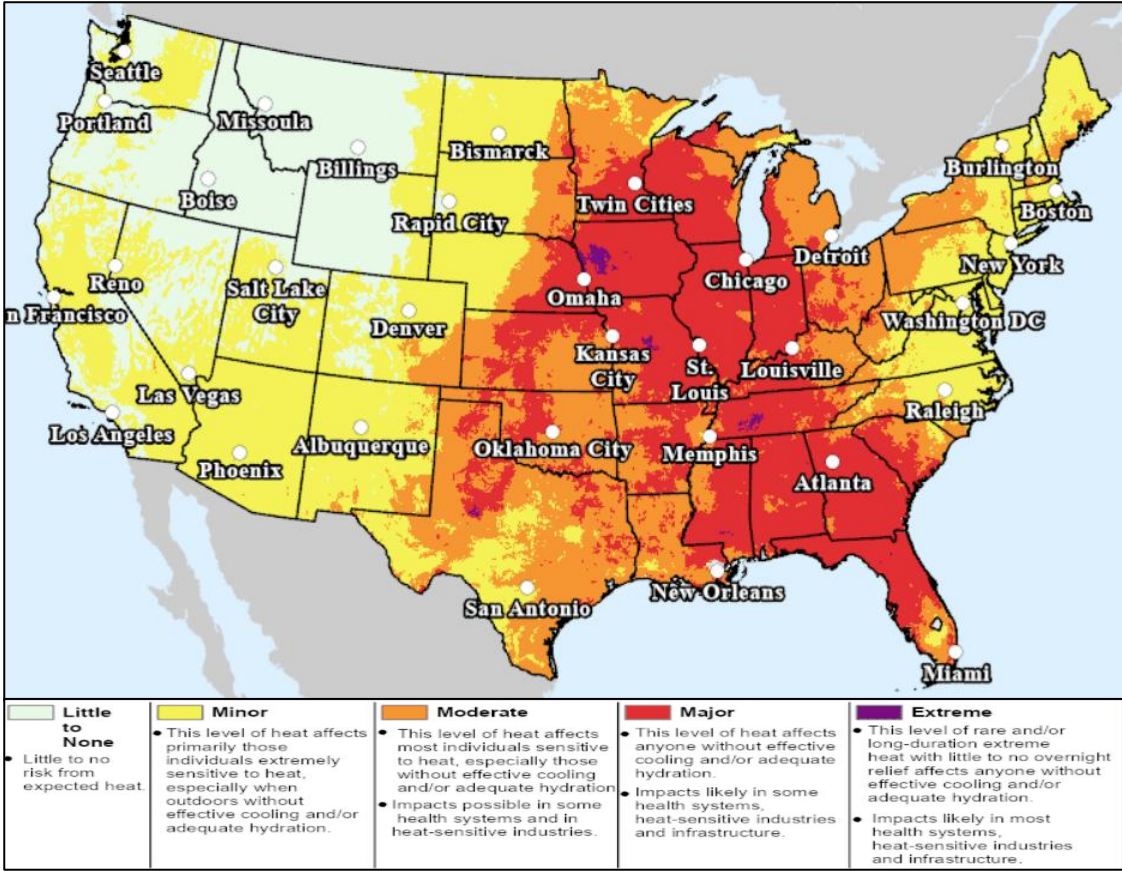
