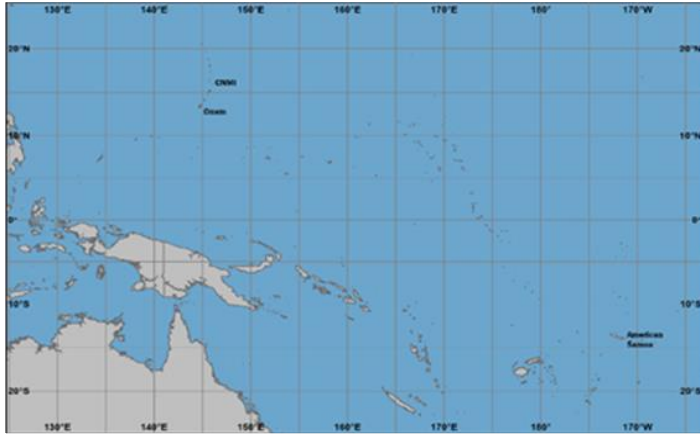

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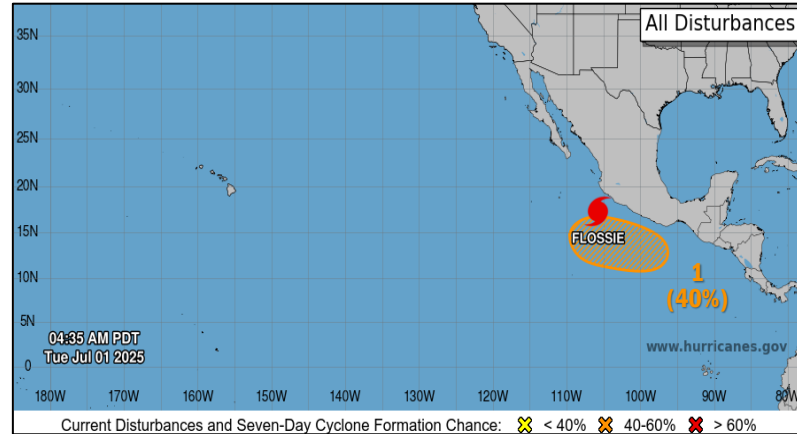

Central and Eastern Pacific



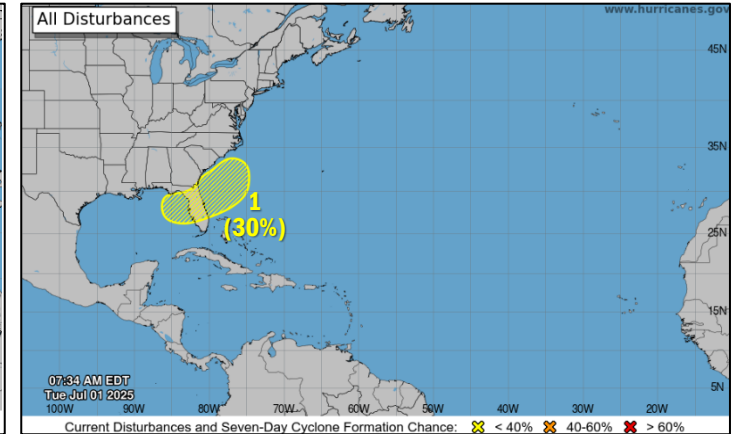
Hurricane Flossie (CAT 1): (Advisory #9, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 155 miles SSW of Zihuatanejo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph
- Forecast to track NW just off the coast of Mexico this week
- Steady to rapid strengthening is forecast during the next day or so, with weakening starting by late Wednesday

Disturbance 1: (As of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- An area of low pressure could form several hundred miles offshore of southwestern Mexico
- Some gradual development of this system is possible thereafter and a tropical depression could form over the weekend
- Formation chance: 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Med (40%)

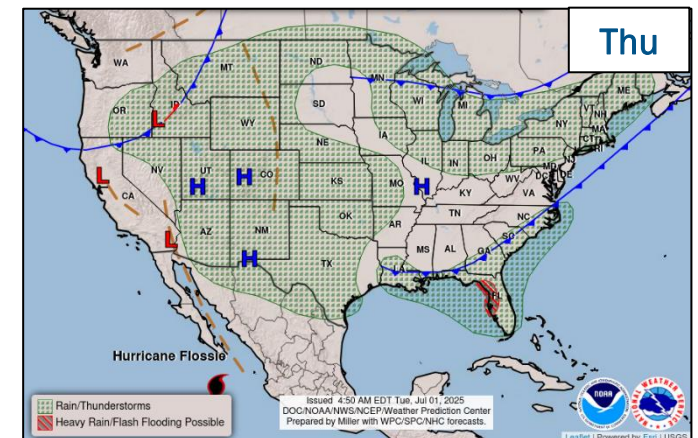
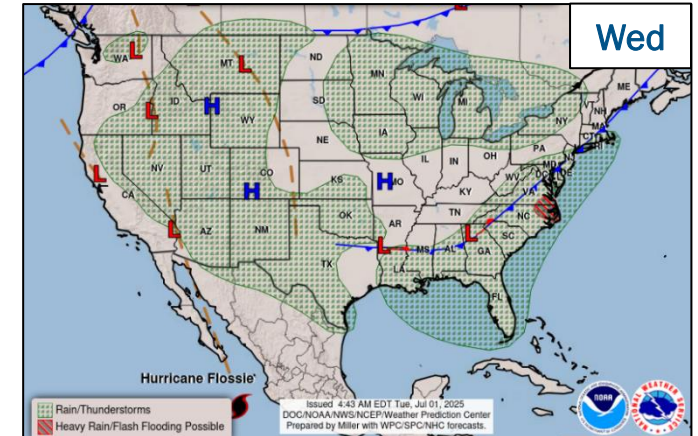
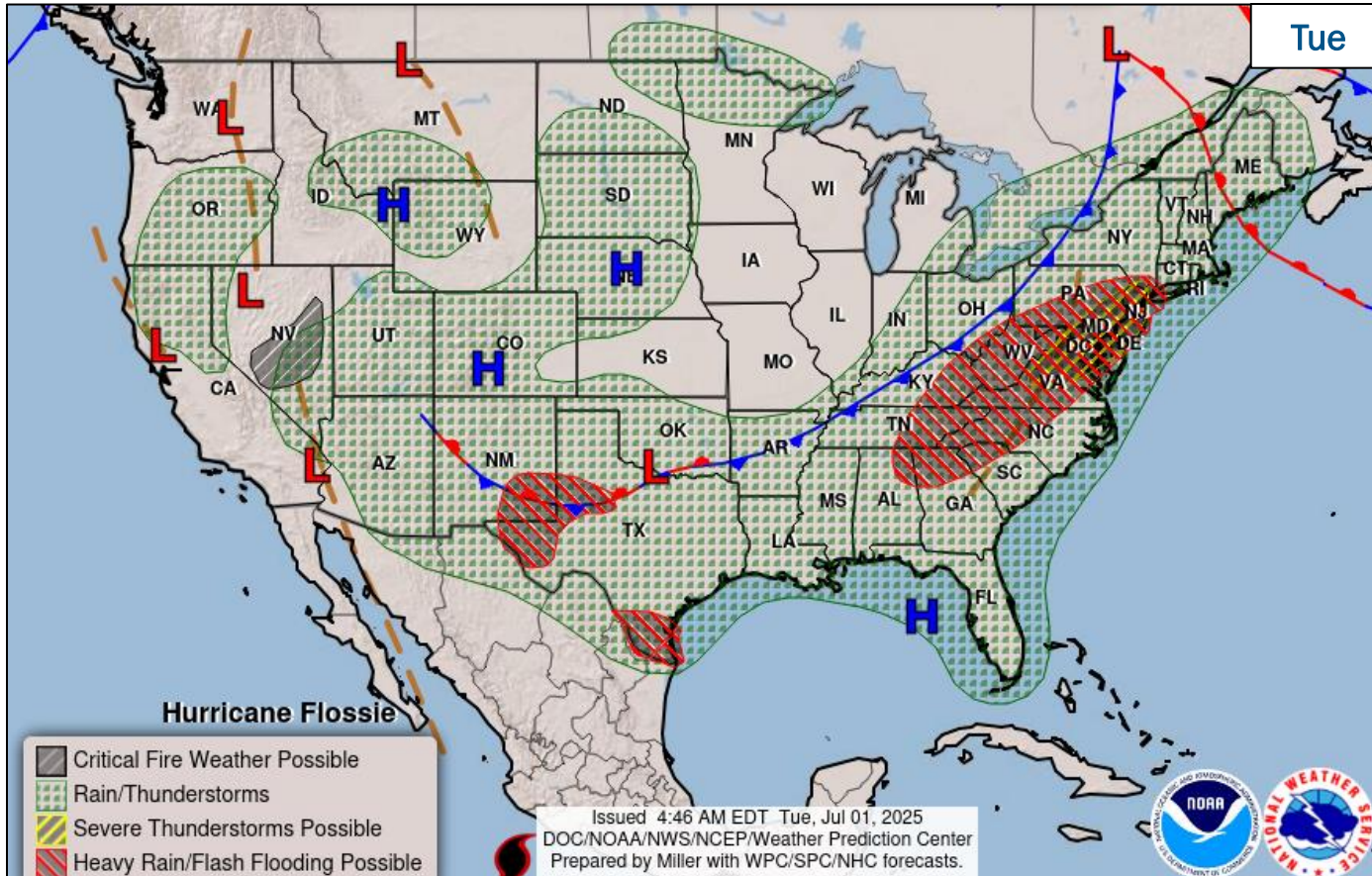
Disturbance 1: (As of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Some gradual tropical or subtropical development could occur thereafter
- Formation chance: 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (30%)



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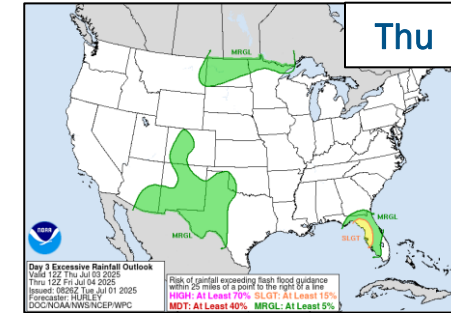
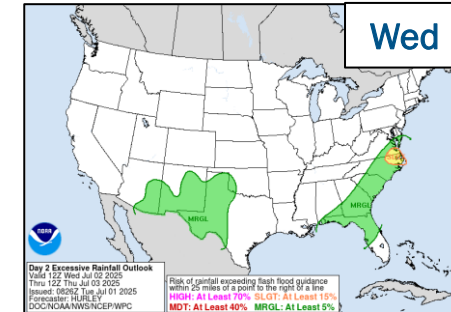
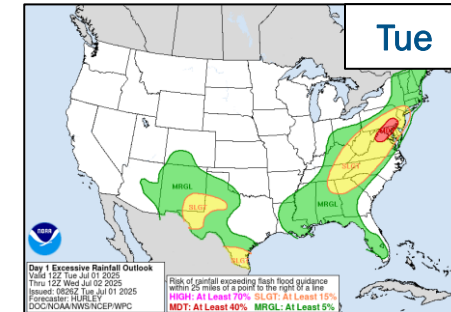
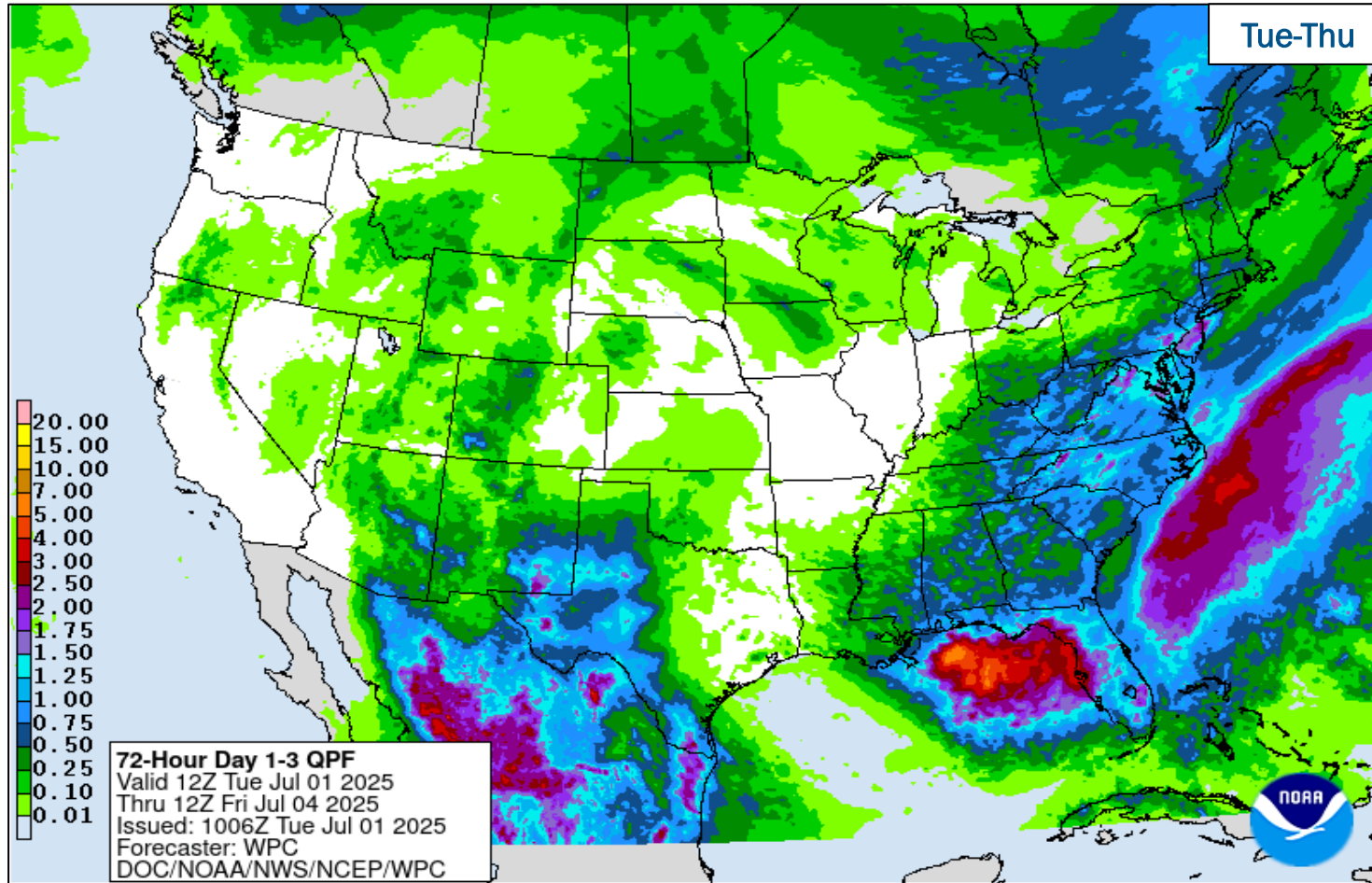

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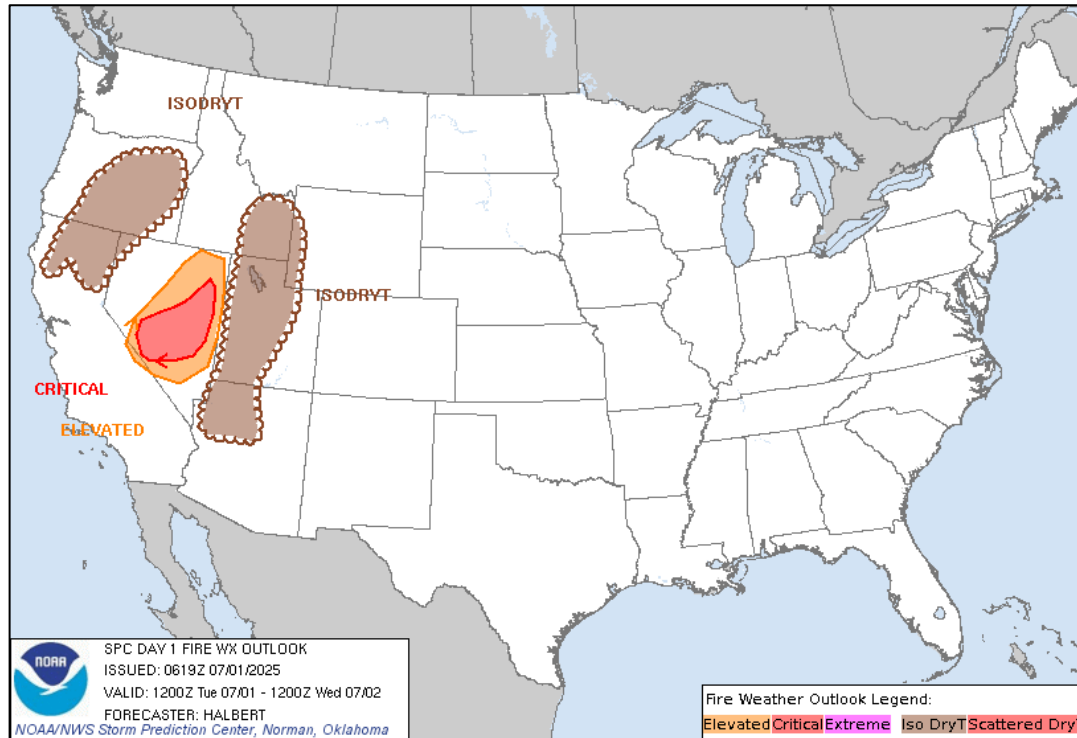
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Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

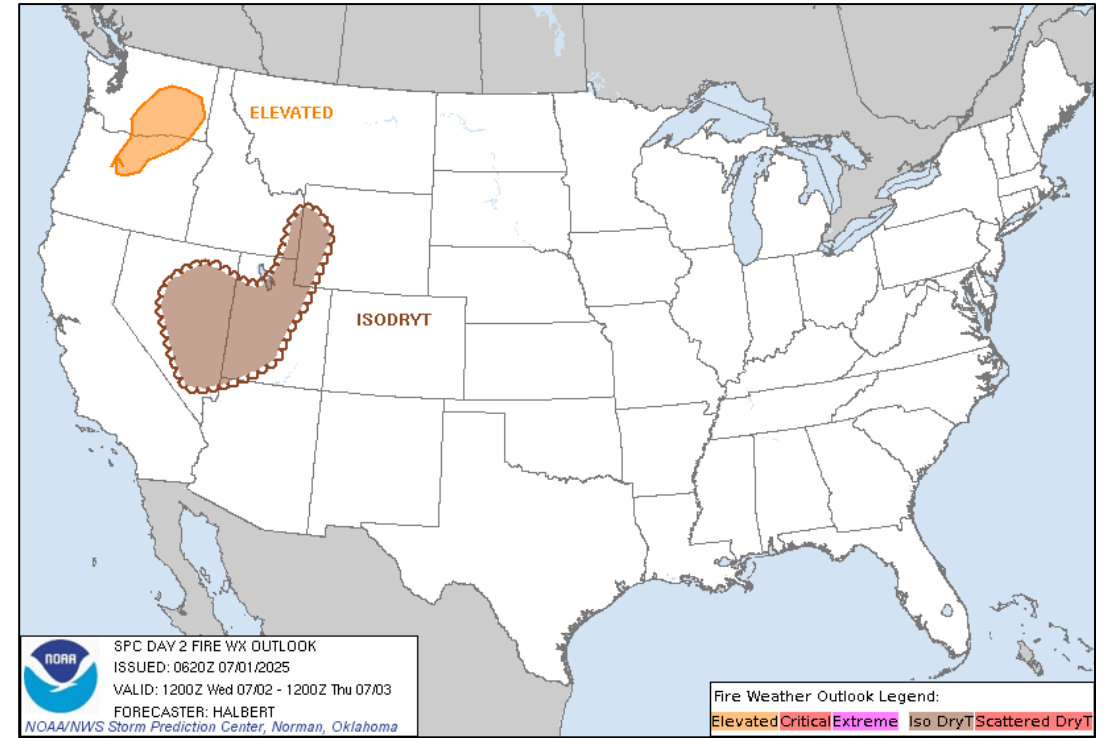


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Fire Weather Outlook

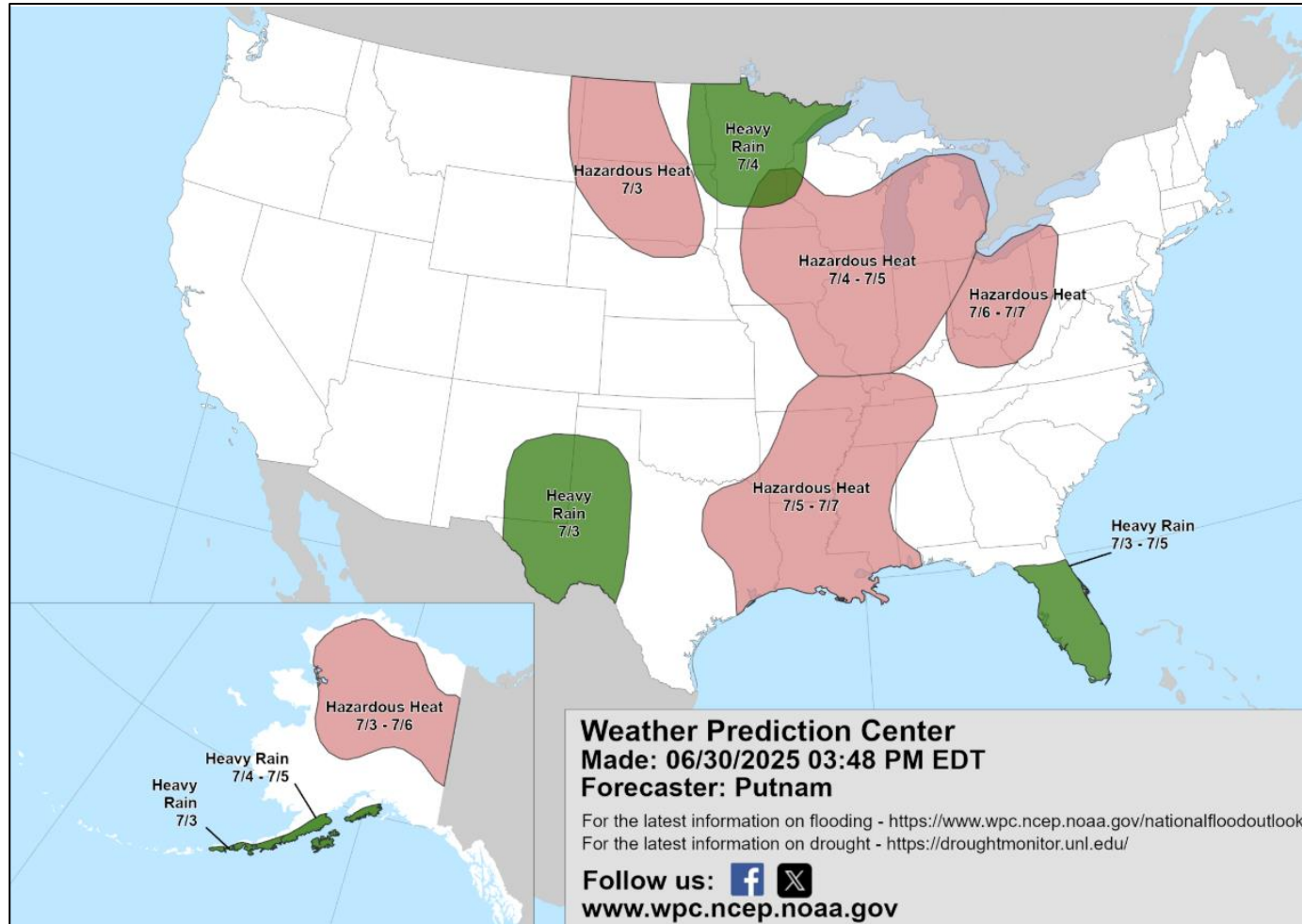
