




Tropical Outlook - Five Day




No tropical cyclones are expected during the next 5 days



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Area of low pressure located several hundred miles SW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Additional development unlikely
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 5-day: Low (near 0%)



Tropical Storm Bonnie (Advisory #19A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 45 miles ESE of Liberia, Costa Rica
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Moving W at 14 mph
- Tropical storm force winds extend 70 miles

<u>Tropical Storm Colin</u> (Advisory #1A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- 50 miles SW of Myrtle Beach, SC
- Moving NE at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- On the forecast track the center is expected to move along or just inland of the SC and NC coasts through Sunday, then emerge over the western Atlantic Ocean late Sunday
- Tropical Storm Warning for South Santee River, SC to Duck NC and Pamlico Sound

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Tropical wave located over the eastern Caribbean Sea
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (10%); 5-day: Low (10%)






Severe Weather Outlook







Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall


