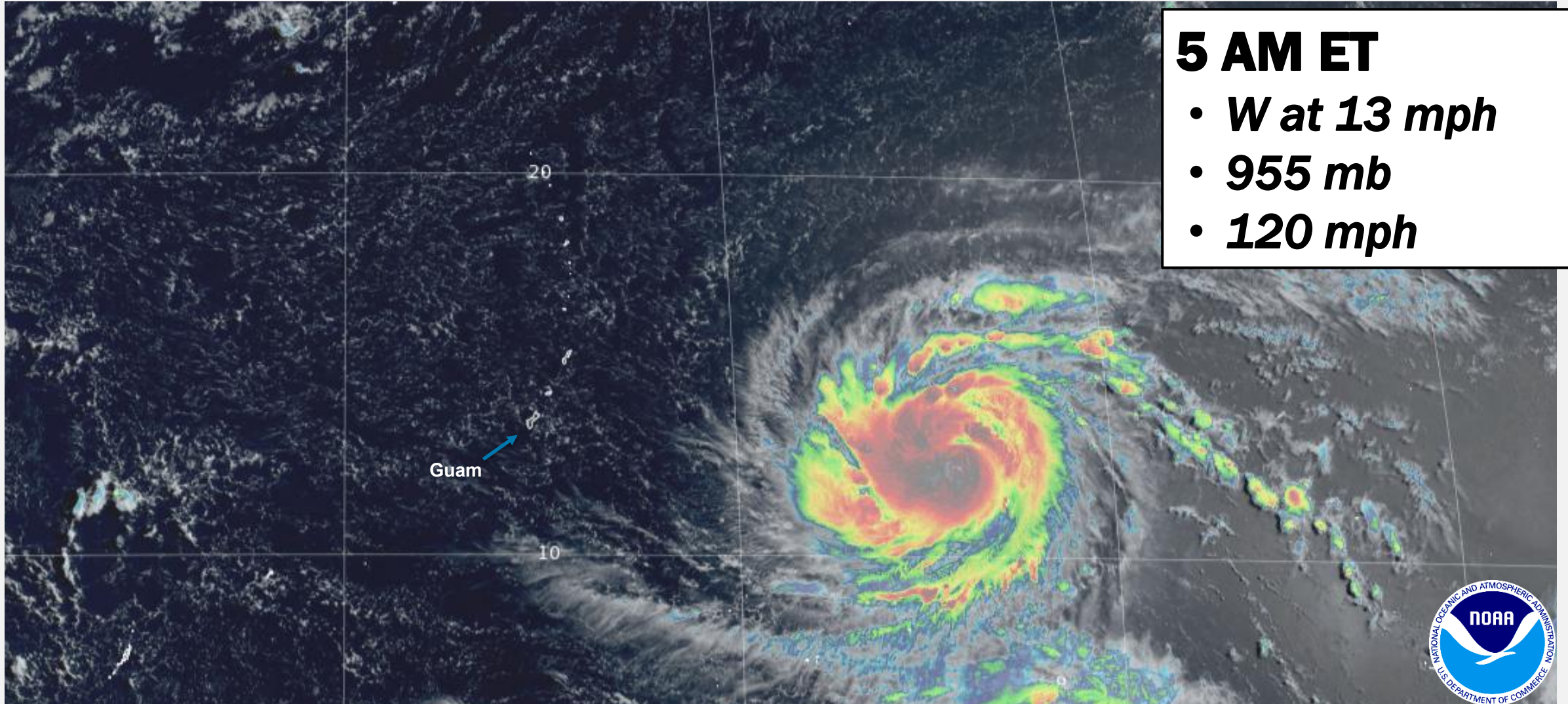

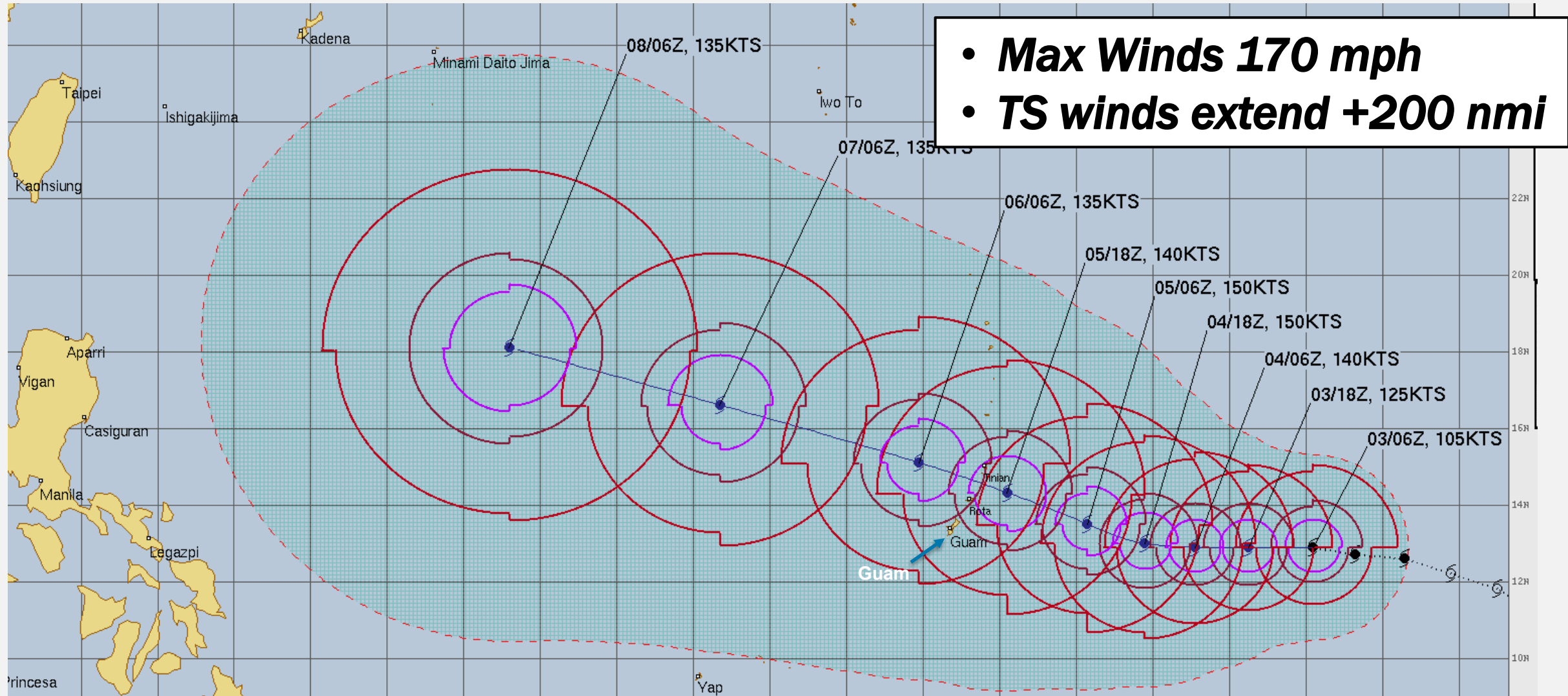

SATELLITE LOOP



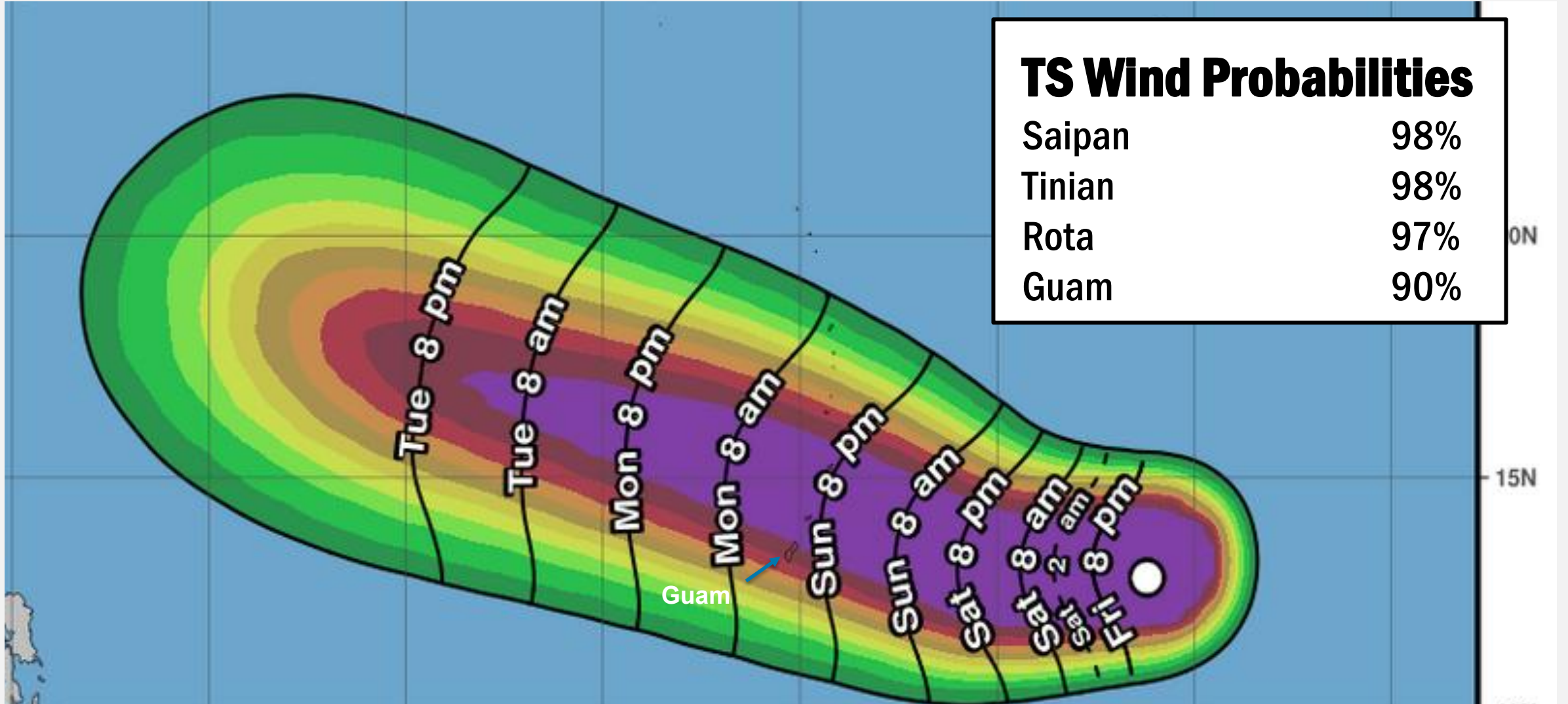

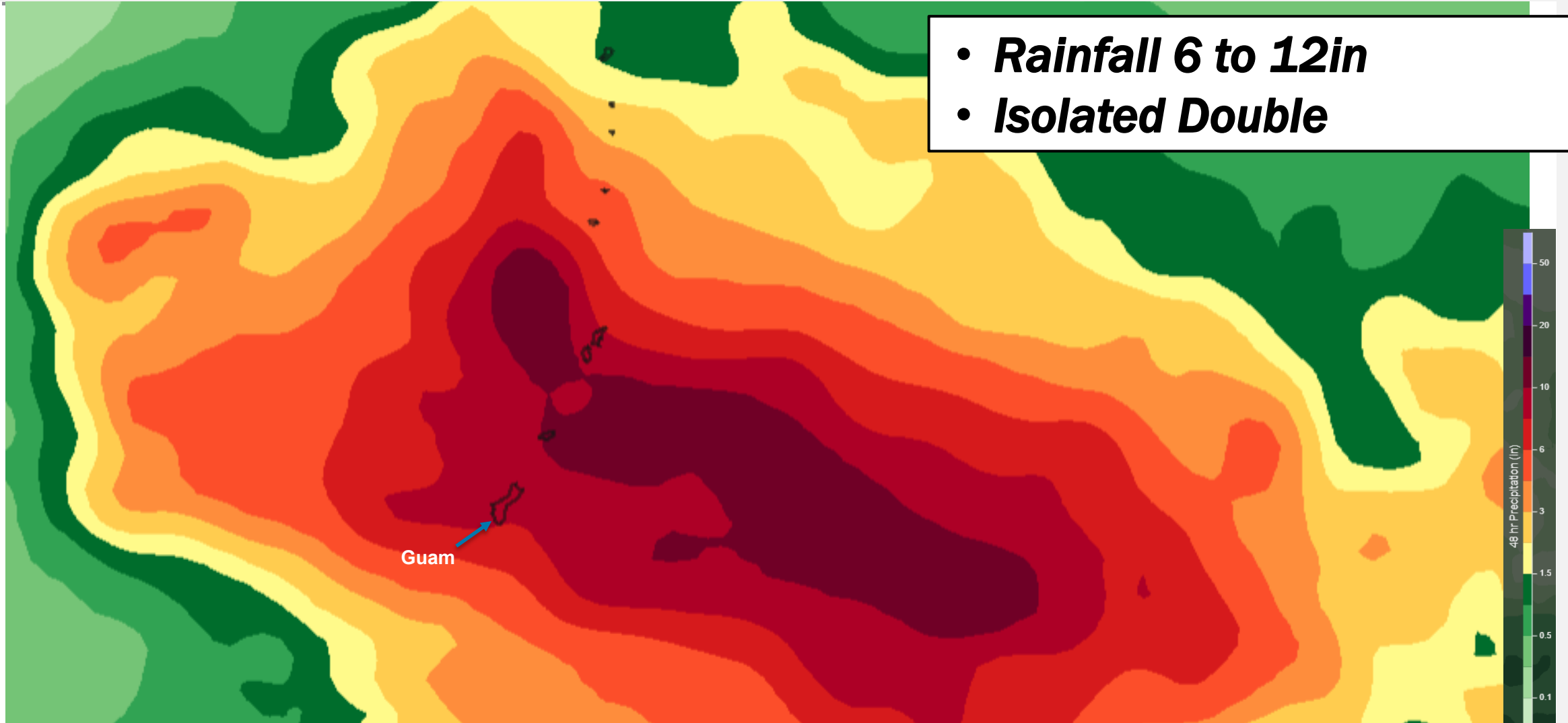
MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS

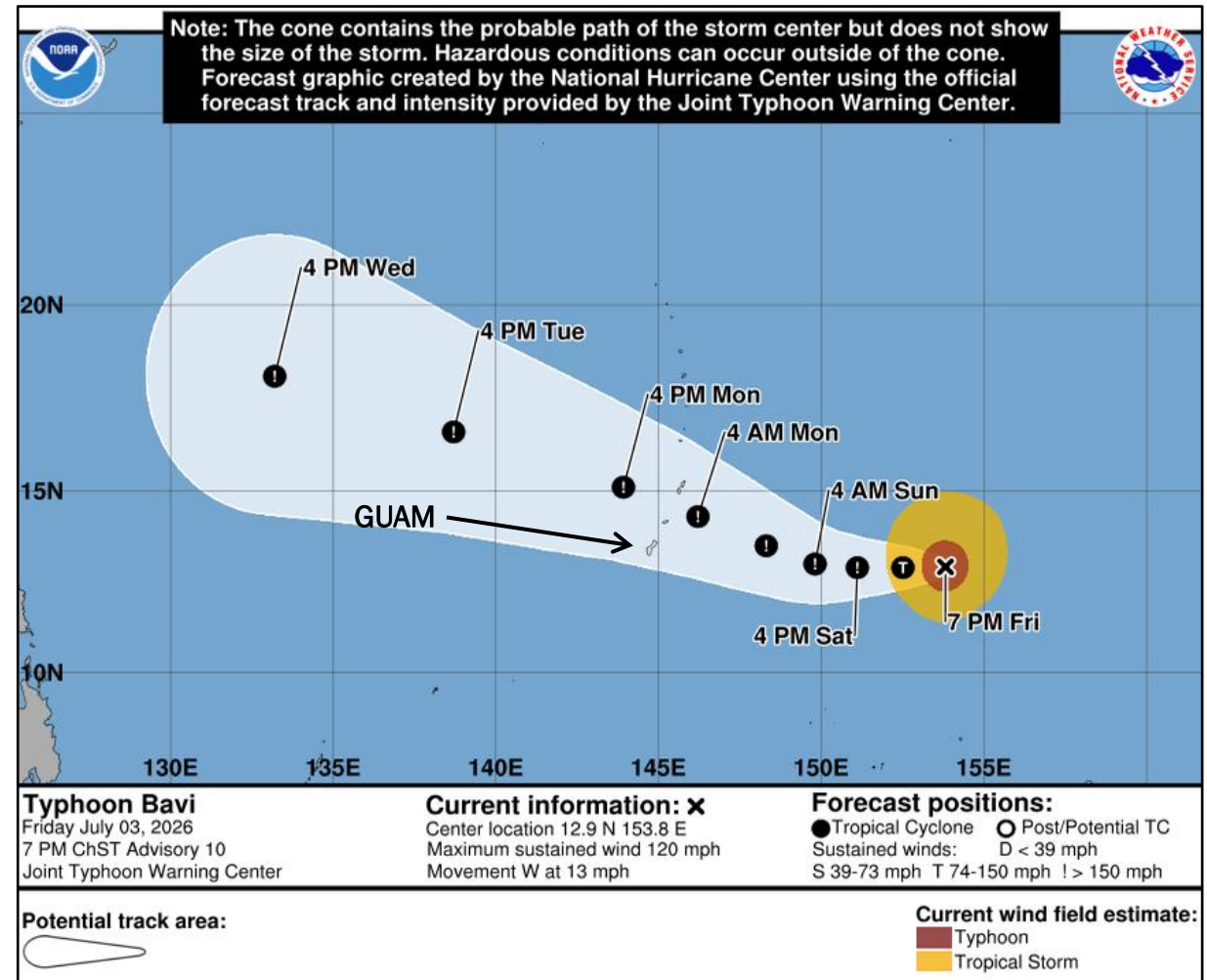
Typhoon Bavi (CAT-3) – Western Pacific

Situation: (JTWC, Advisory #9A, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 605 miles E of Guam
- Moving W at 13 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 120 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward from the center up to 160 miles
- Typhoon force winds of 74 mph
- Bavi is expected to maintain this course with a decrease in forward speed through the weekend

Hazards Affecting Land:

- WIND: Strong and damaging winds could arrive as early as Saturday evening, but most likely to arrive Sunday morning. Typhoon Watches will be issued where winds are possible within 48 hours.
- RAIN: Totals of 6-11" possible, locally up to 15" near the center
- STORM SURGE: Coastal inundation is likely, with heights potentially exceeding 7 feet over wider reefs

Situation and analysis: Tropical Cyclone Bavi has strengthened into a Typhoon. Strong and damaging winds could arrive on the islands as early as Saturday evening (ET) but are most likely to begin Sunday morning (ET). Typhoon Watches will be issued when these winds are possible starting in 48 hours. Typhoon watches are in effect for Guam, Rota, Tinian, and Saipan. FEMA Region 9 and HQ assets, to include IMATs, Logistics, and Disaster Emergency Communications, are deployed and enroute to Guam, CNMI, and Hawaii to support any emerging response requirements. The Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands requested an Emergency Declaration on Jul 2.

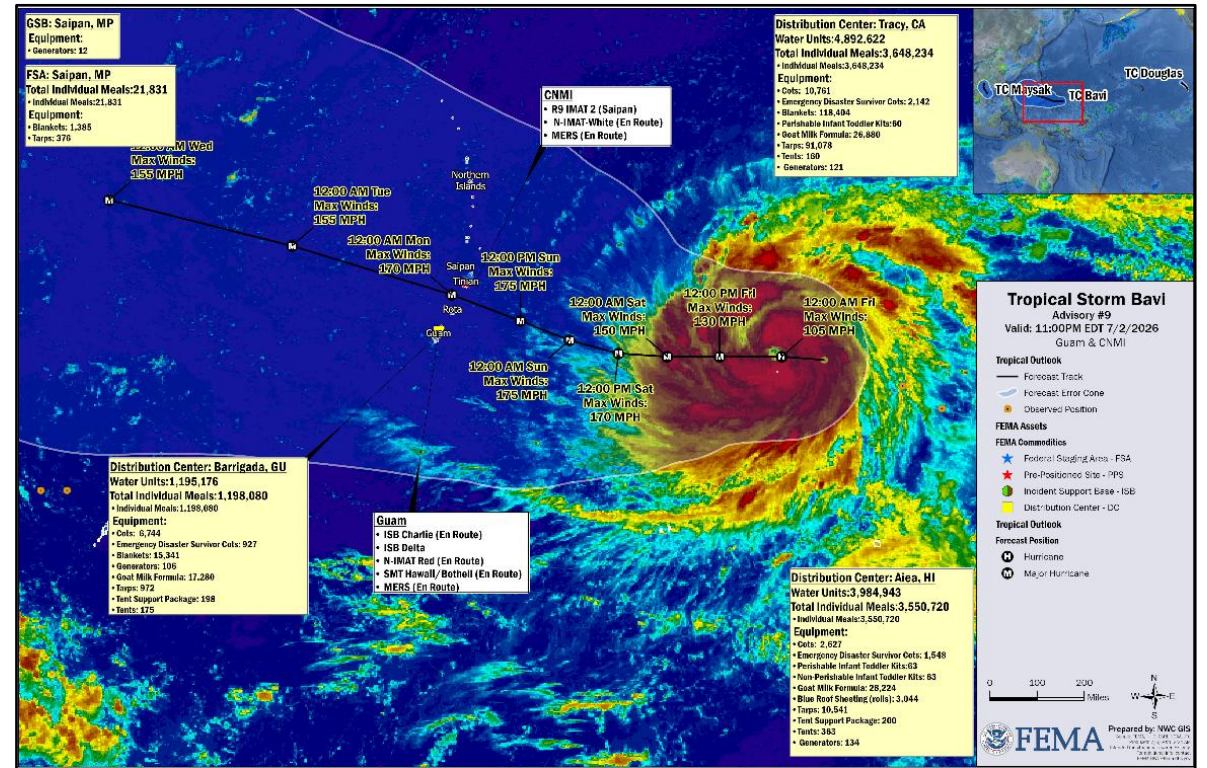

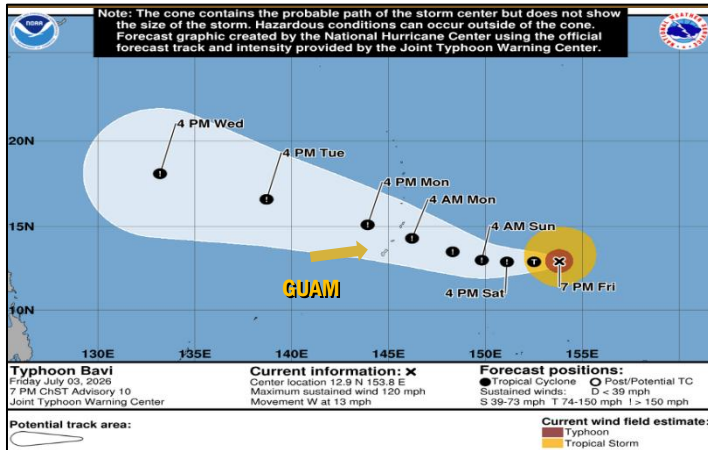

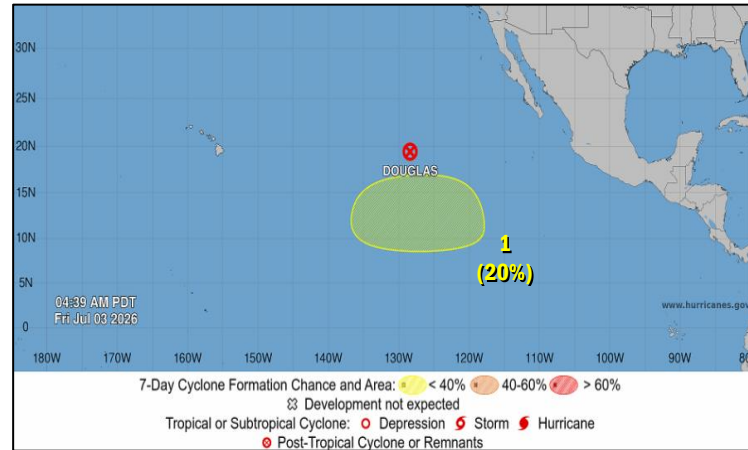

Eastern and Central Pacific



Post-Tropical Cyclone Douglas: (Advisory #9 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,210 miles W** of the Southern tip of Baja California
- Moving NNW at 8 mph**
- Maximum sustained winds near 40 mph**
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 120 miles from the center**
- Douglas is forecast to weaken over the next couple of days and dissipate by Sunday**
- This is last public advisory issued by the National Hurricane Center**

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located SW of the Baja California Peninsula**
- Moving W at 10-15 mph**
- Conditions conducive for gradual development**
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)**

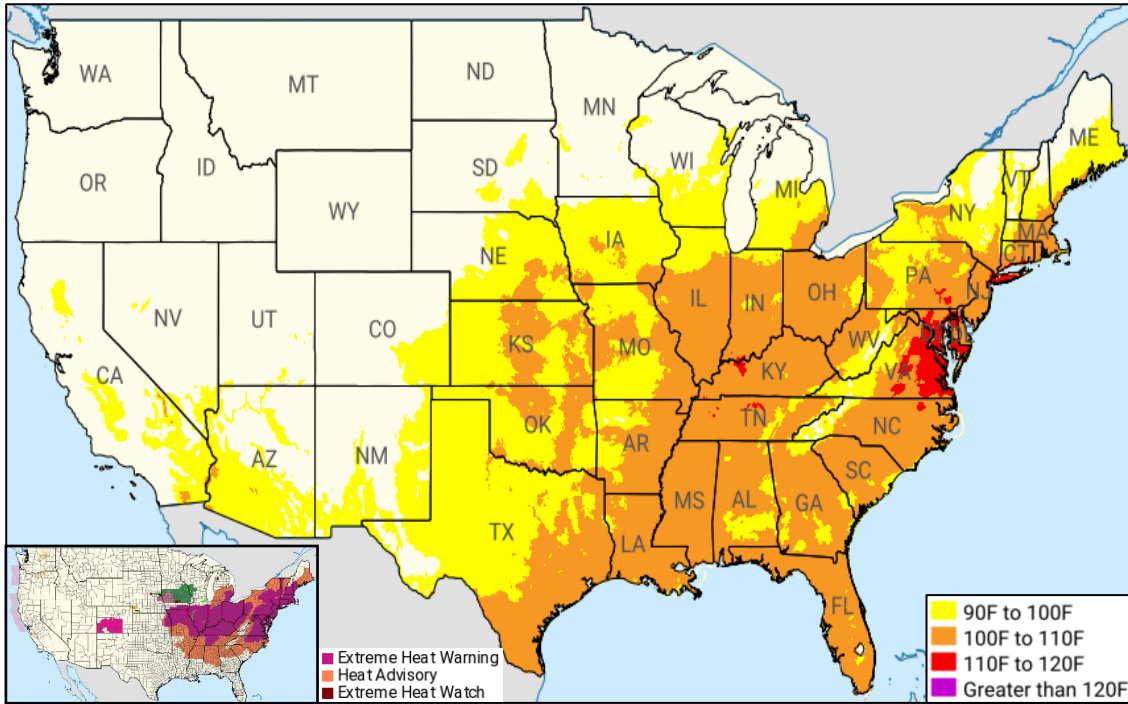
Severe Weather Outlook



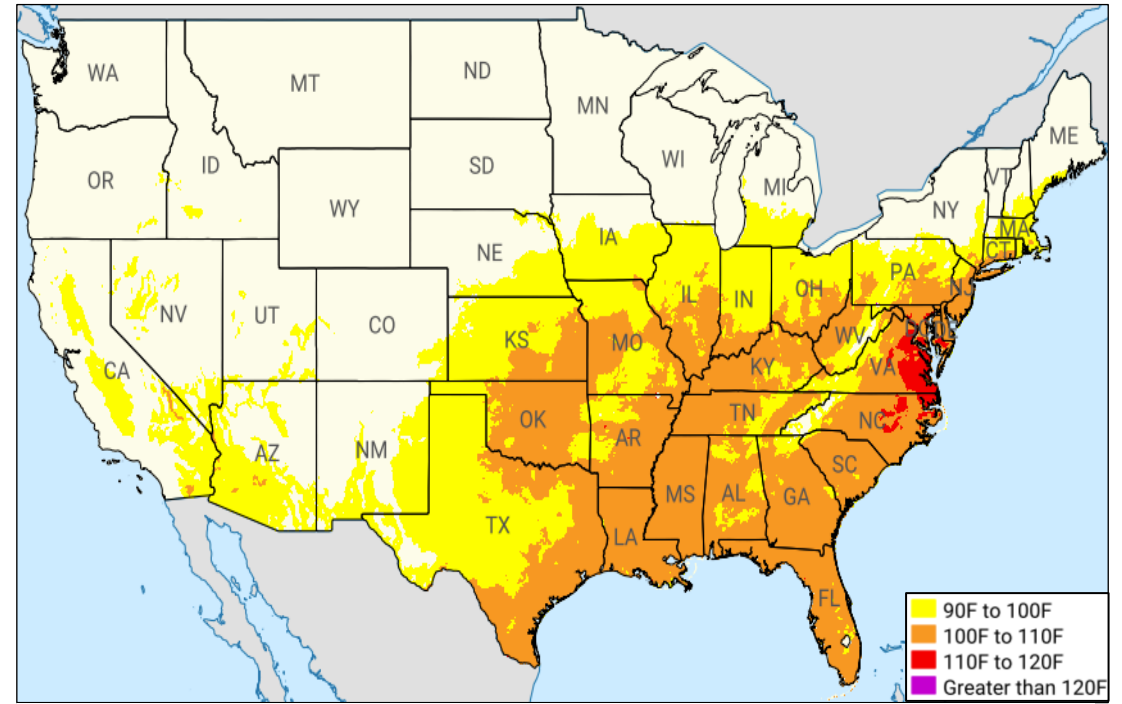
