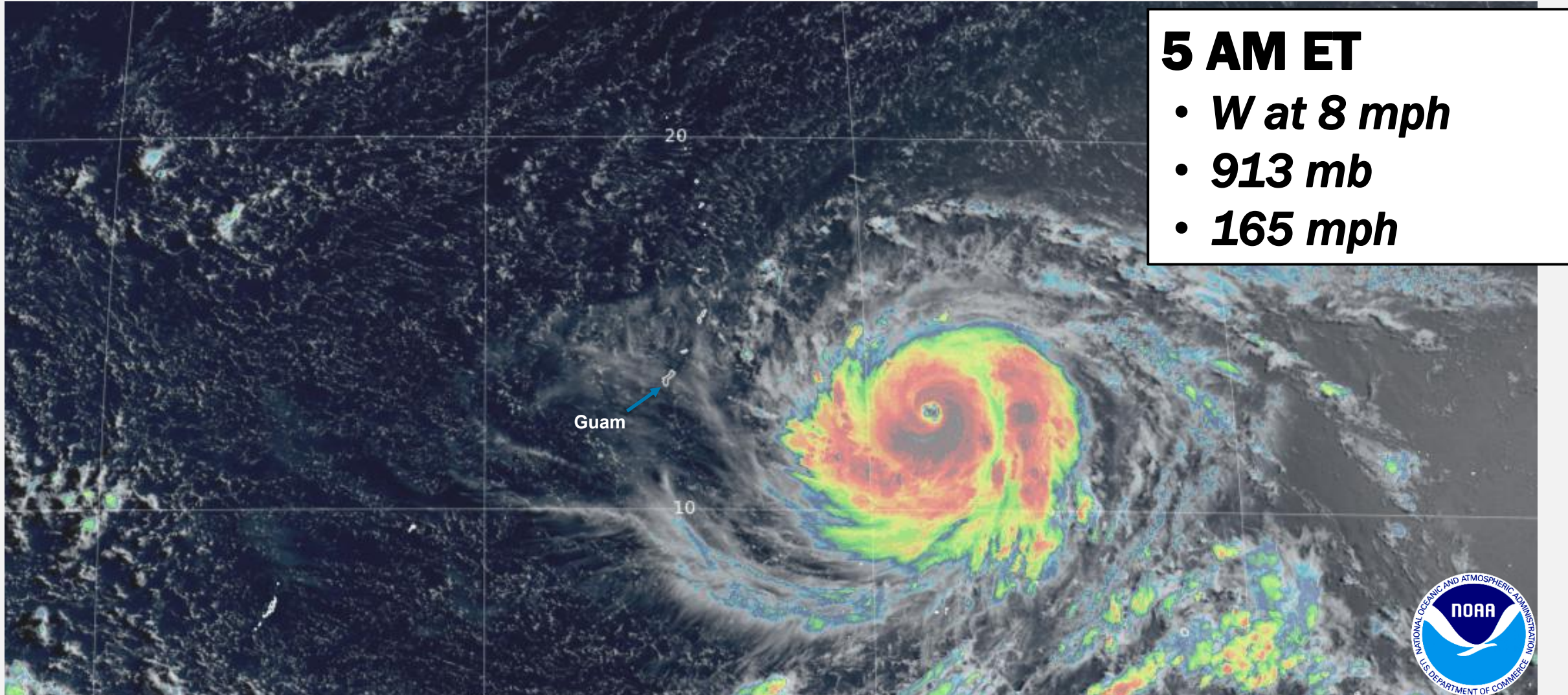

SATELLITE LOOP



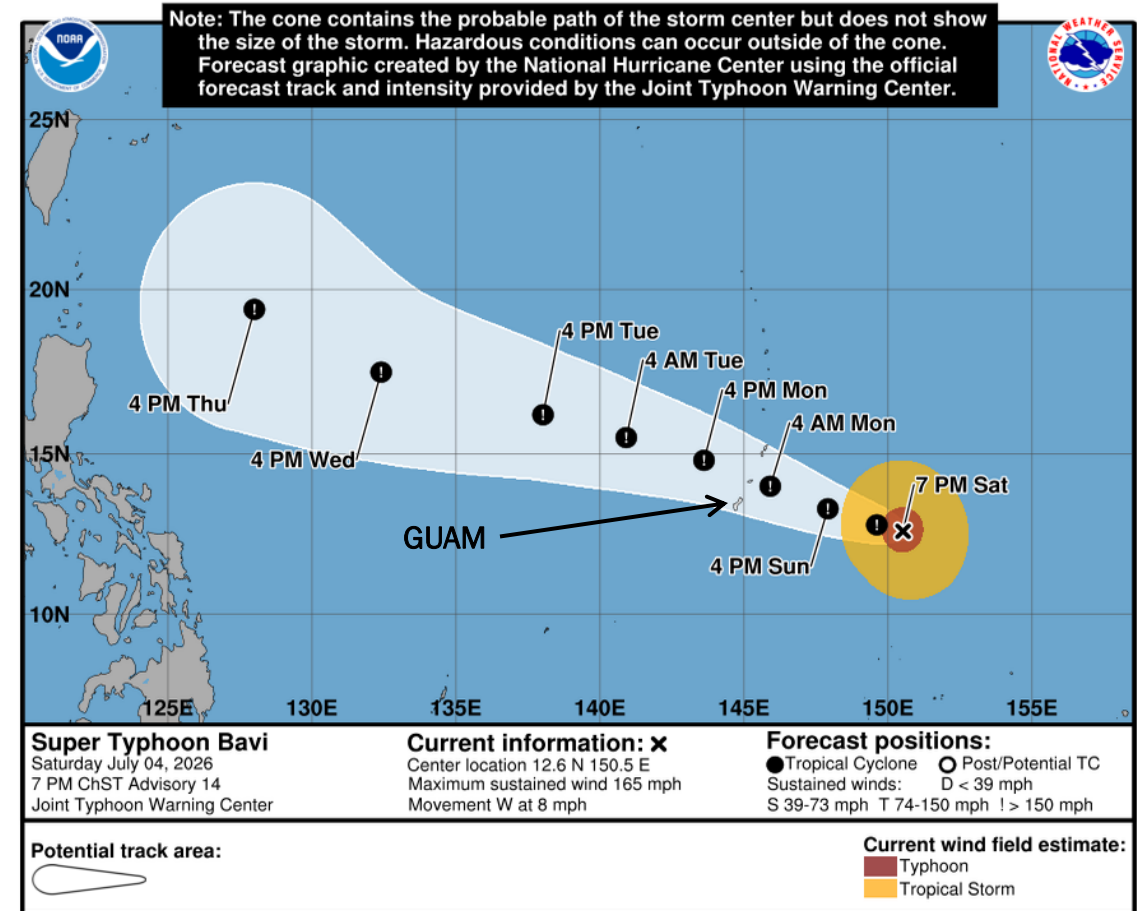
Super Typhoon Bavi (CAT-5) – Western Pacific

Situation: (HLT, NWS Guam, and JTWC Advisory #14, as of 5:20 a.m. ET)

- 390 miles E of Guam
- Moving W at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 165 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward from the center up to 160 miles
- Typhoon force winds of extend outward from the center up to 50 miles
- Bavi is expected to maintain this course with the eye passing between Guam and Saipan Monday morning

Hazards Affecting Land:

- WIND: Tropical Storm force winds most likely to begin Sunday morning; Typhoon Warnings issued in Guam, Rota, Tinian, and Saipan
- RAIN: Typhoon Bavi expected to bring 12 to 20 inches of rain, with locally higher totals
- STORM SURGE: Risk of major coastal flooding and large, dangerous waves; flooding levels will differ across CNMI and could exceed 7 feet in some places; exact surge forecasts not yet available

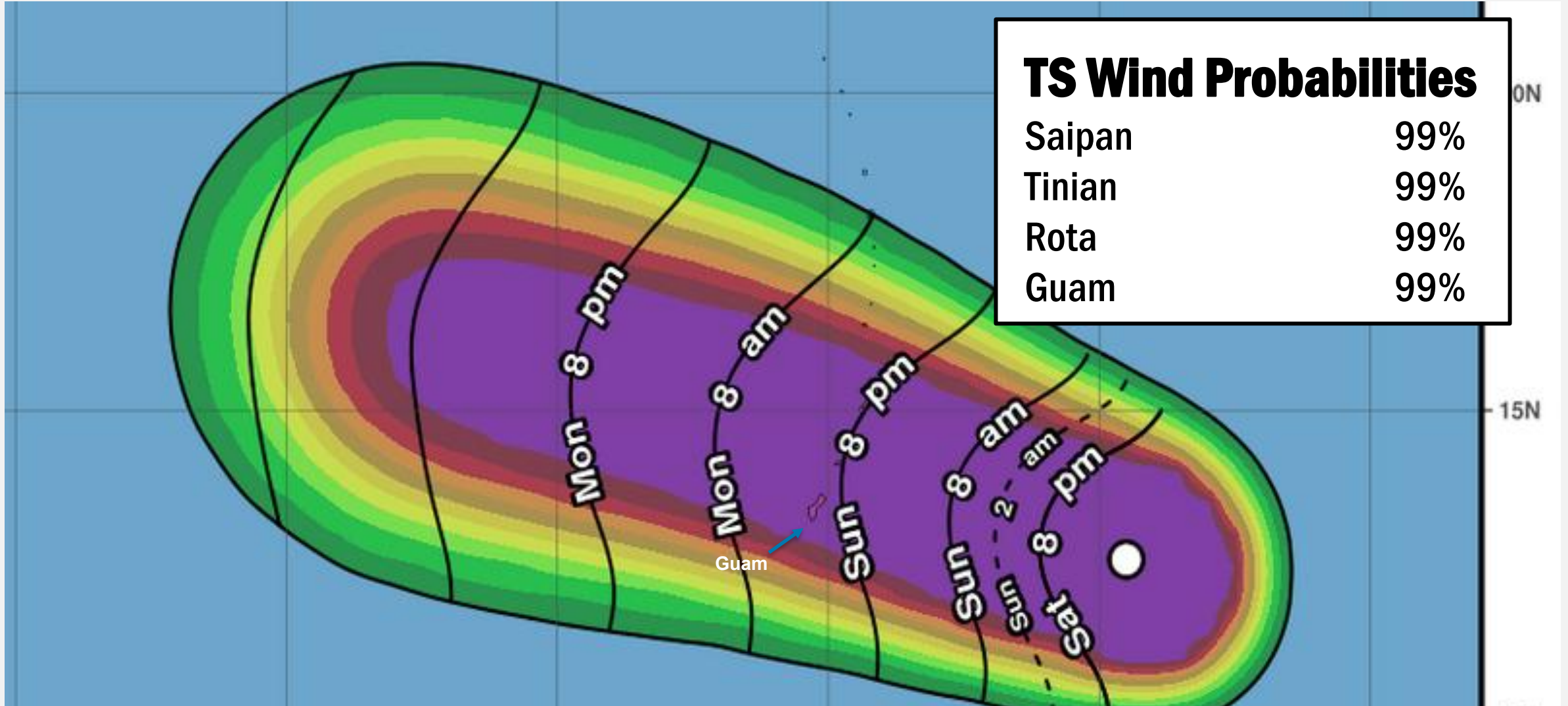


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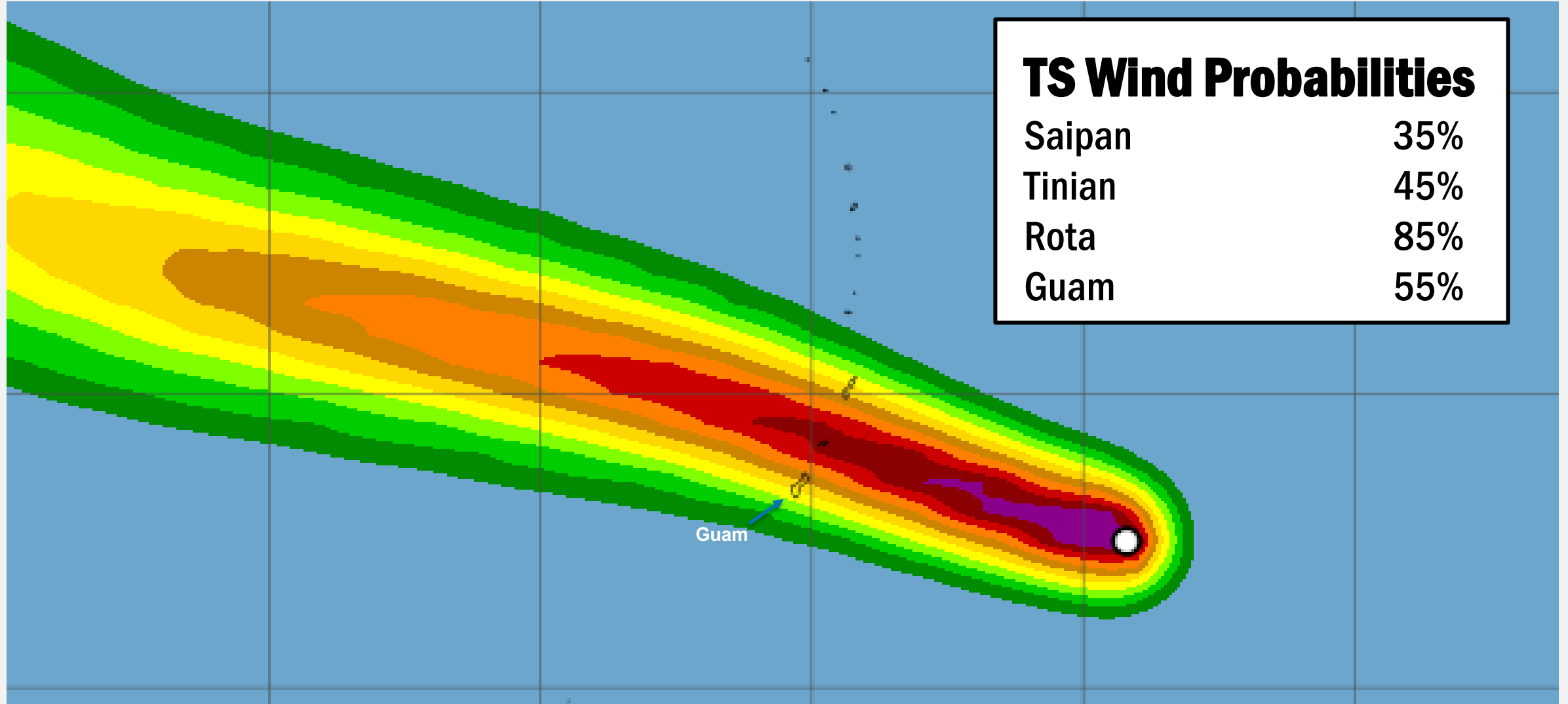

MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS



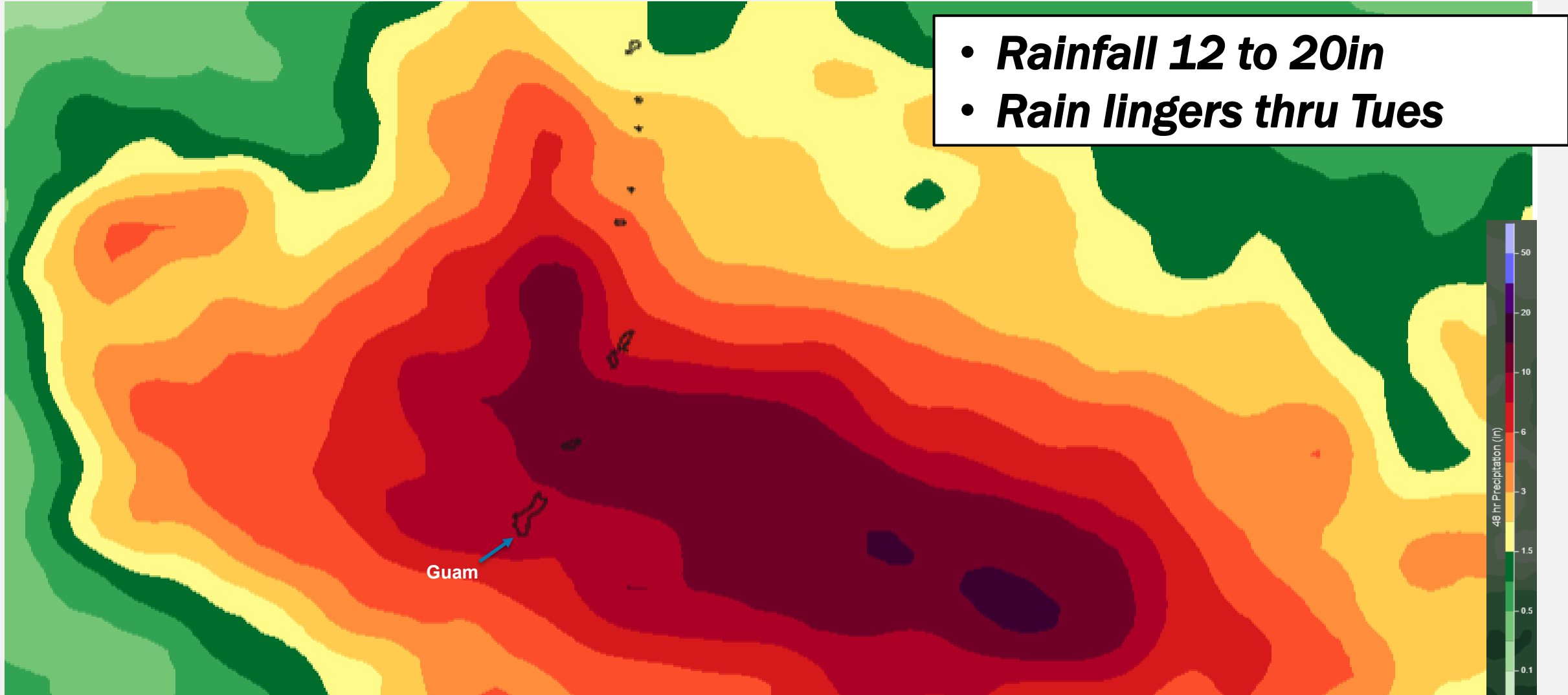

Situation and analysis: Super Typhoon Bavi is approximately 390 miles east of Guam, moving west at 12 mph with sustained winds of 160 mph (Category 5). The storm is expected to intensify further today. A Typhoon Warning is in effect for Guam, Rota, Tinian, Saipan, and surrounding waters. Bavi will remain a dangerous super typhoon as it passes through the southern Marianas through Monday morning. The most significant impacts are expected Monday, particularly near Tinian and Rota, and may extend into Tuesday.

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA R9 SLB #1, as of 10:20 p.m. ET, Jul 3)

Food, Hydration, Shelter:

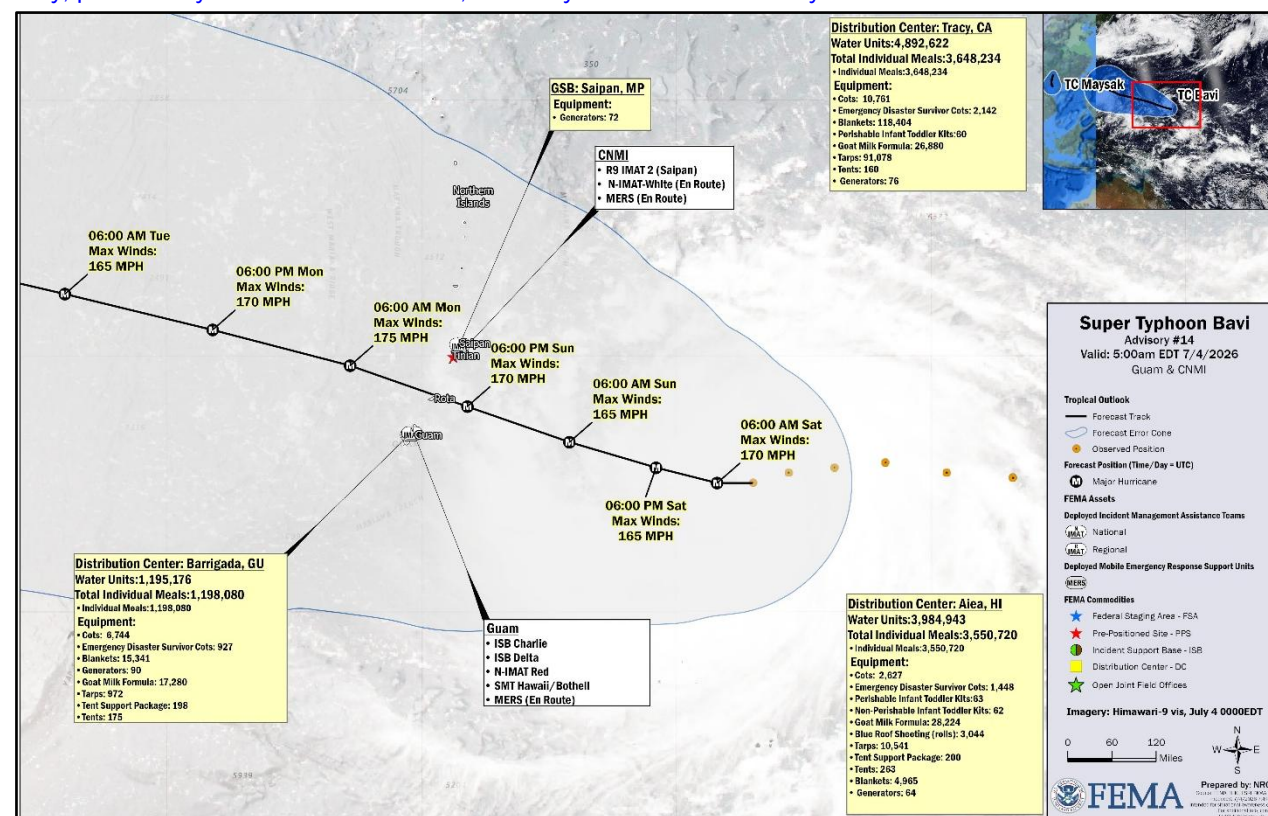
- Volunteers Organization Active in Disaster (VOAD) distributed 320 cases of water in Saipan and Rota
- Nine (9) Shelters open with 292 occupants
 - Saipan: 5 shelters open with 278 occupants
 - Tinian: 2 shelters open with 14 occupants
 - Rota: 2 shelters open with 0 occupants
- Guam will open 5 shelters at 5:00 p.m. ET Jul 4

Energy:

- Power: Saipan Power Plant 3 is offline pending repairs
- Fuel Supply: Islands possess varying levels of fuel reserves
 - Saipan: 20 days of fuel available
 - Tinian: 22 days of fuel available
 - Rota: 9 days of fuel available

Transportation:

- All STAR Marianas (primary inter-island airline) flights in CNMI cancelled for Saipan, Tinian, and Rota
- Maritime: All ports on Saipan, Tinian, and Rota are at Limited Port Condition Yankee

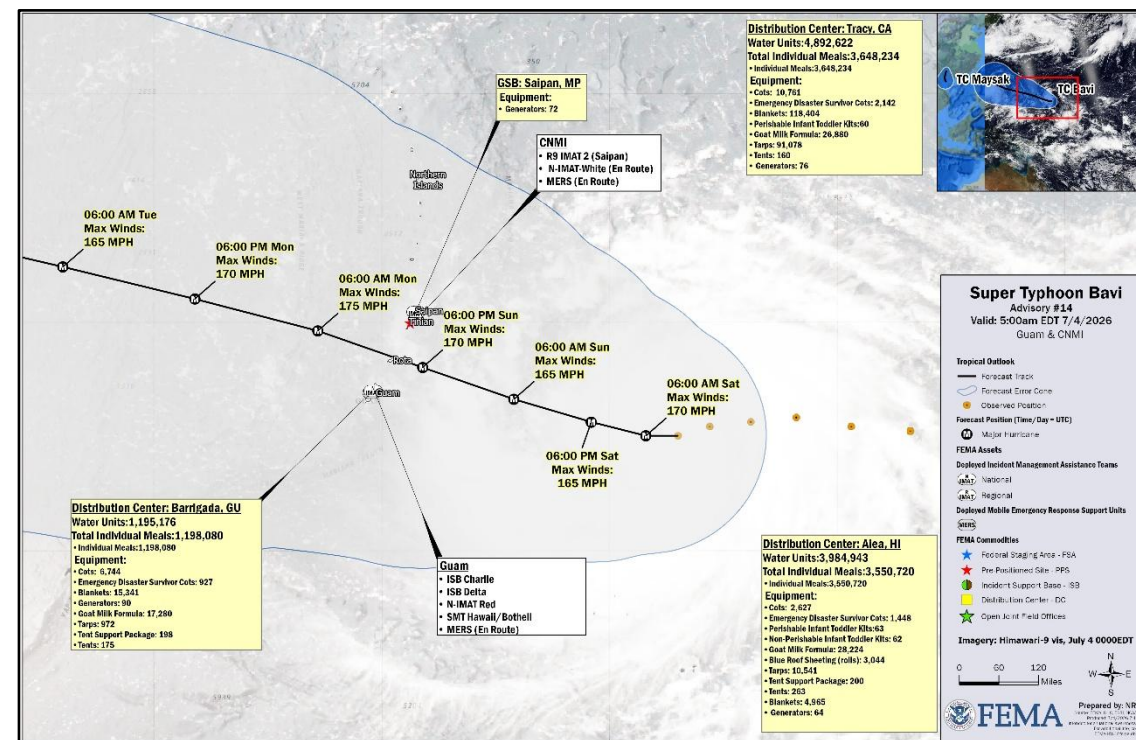

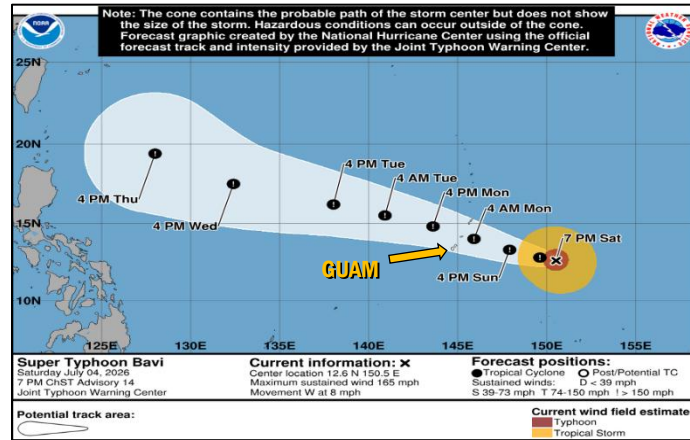

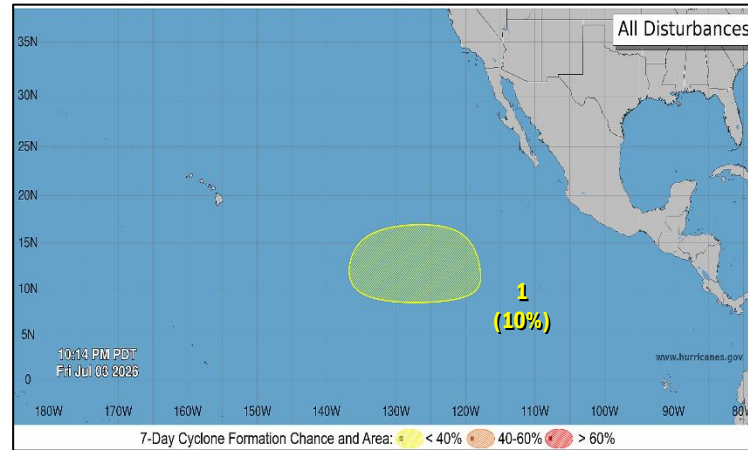

Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1: (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located SW of the Baja California Peninsula
- Moving W
- Environmental conditions are forecast to become less conducive for development by the middle of next week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (10%)

Atlantic



- Tropical cyclone activity is not expected during the next 7 days



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Extreme Heat – Central and Eastern U.S.

Situation and Analysis: A prolonged and dangerous heat wave is impacting the central and eastern U.S. through the Independence Day weekend. Temperatures are expected to reach up to 115°F. The extreme heat caused cancellations and events to be cancelled or delayed due to posing a serious health concern to participants of the Independence Day events, FIFA Fan Zones, and other events throughout the National Capitol Region. Many daily, monthly, and possibly all-time temperature records may be broken. Heat-related watches and warnings will remain in effect for the affected areas throughout the weekend. FEMA's National Watch Center is closely monitoring the situation and coordinating with regional offices for any additional impacts or reports.

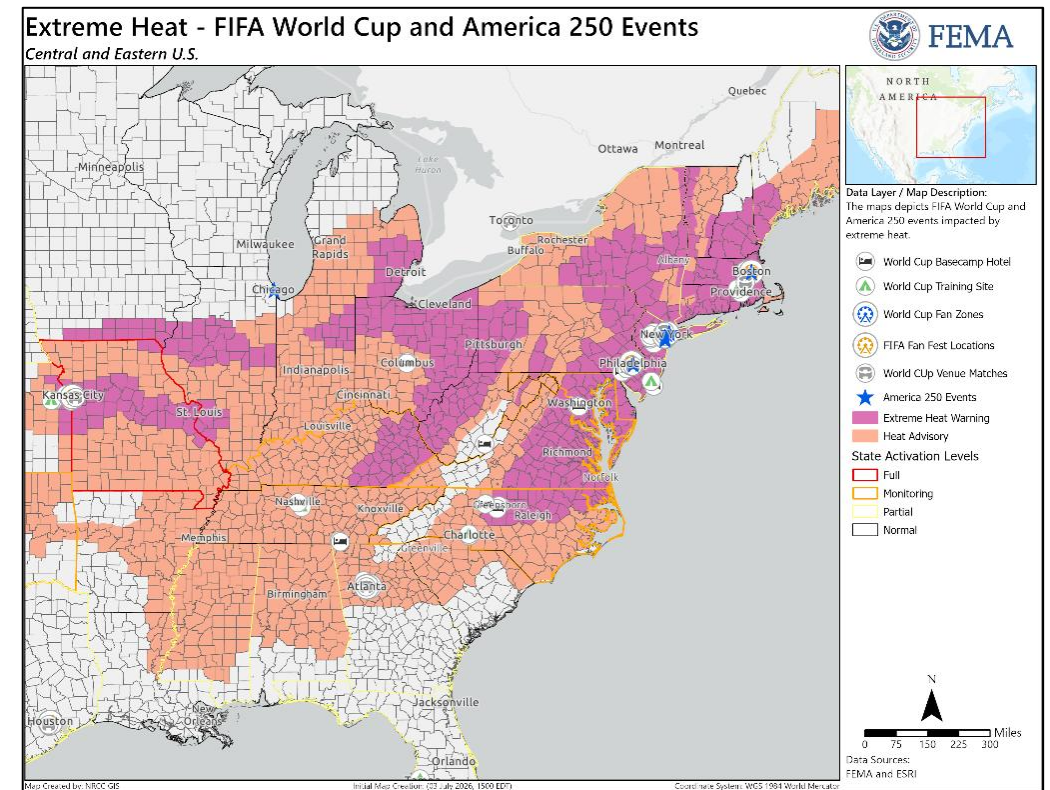
