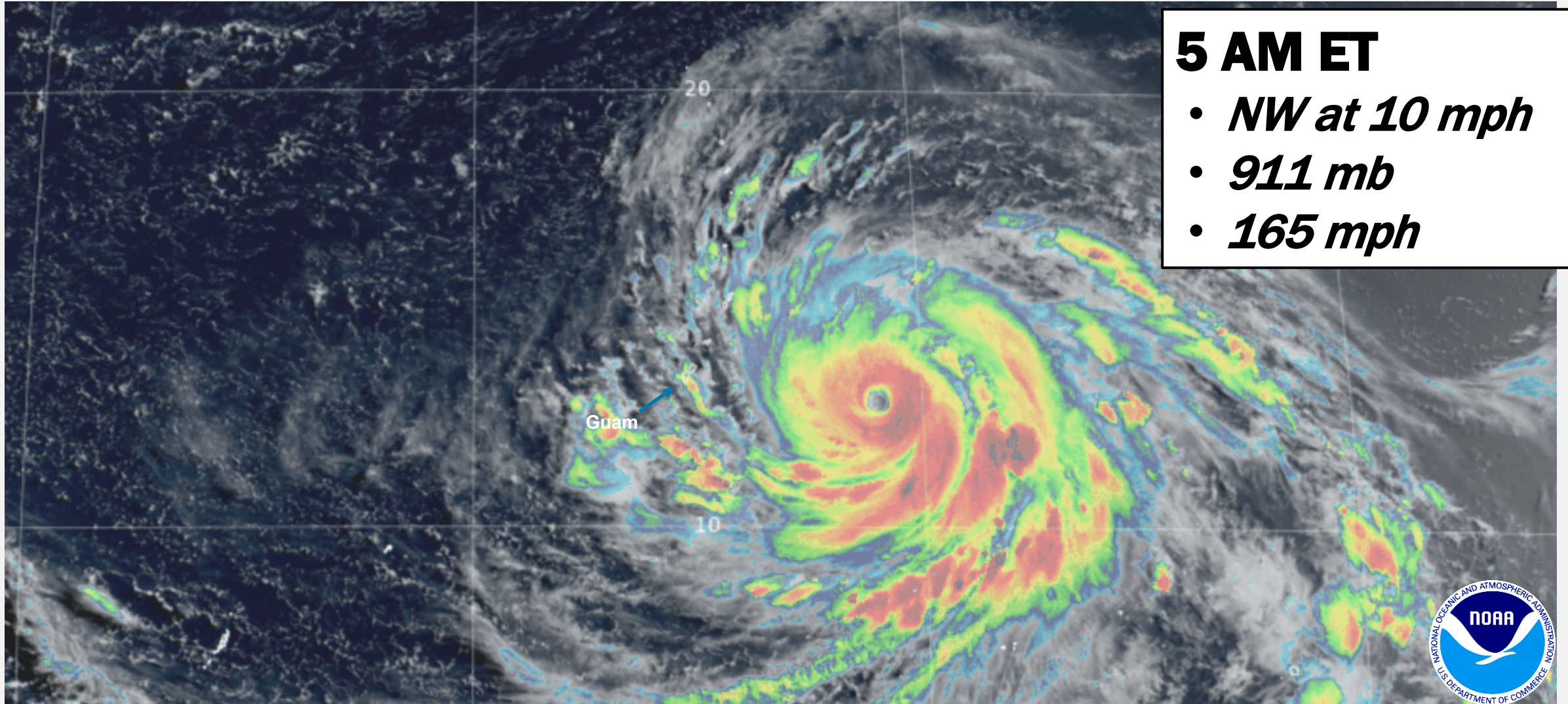

SATELLITE LOOP



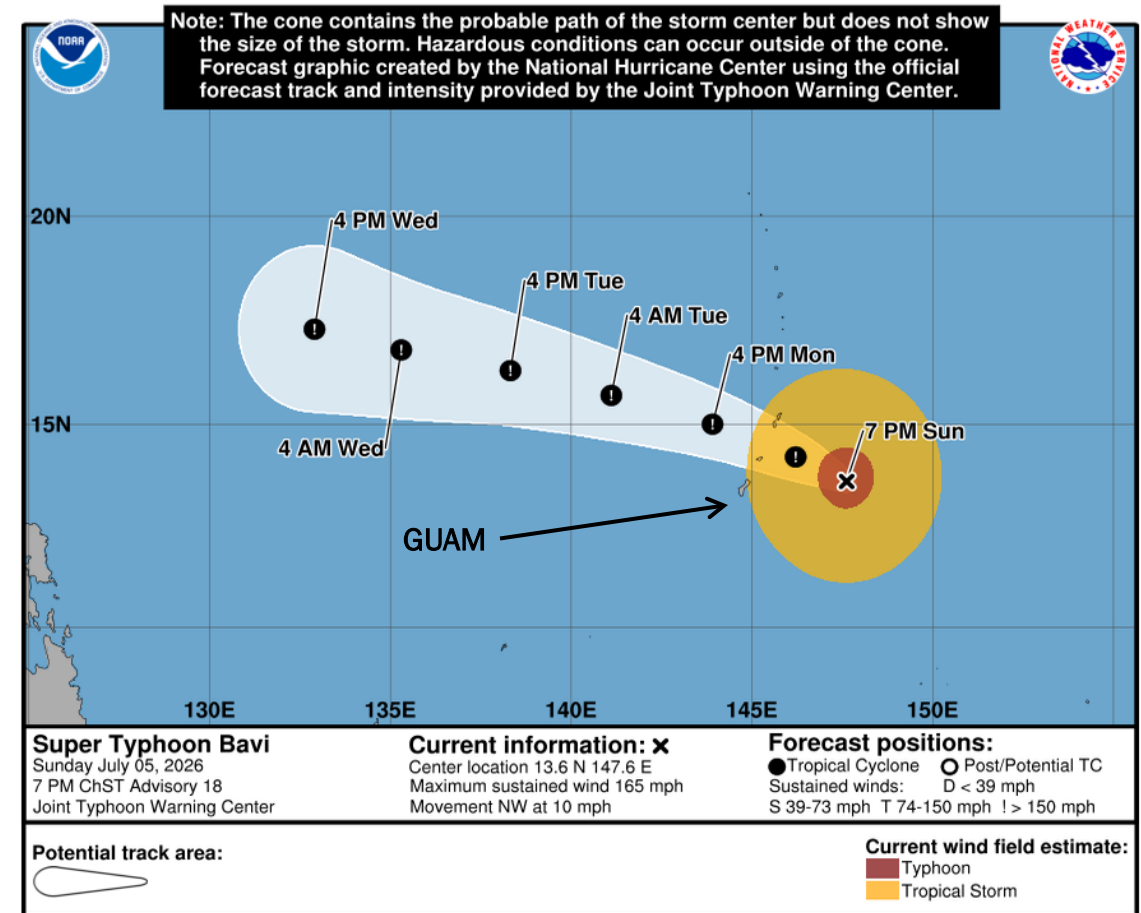
Super Typhoon Bavi (CAT-5) – Western Pacific

Situation: (NWS Guam and JTWC Advisory #18, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 190 miles E of Guam
- Moving NW at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 165 mph; expect 175mph before reaching the islands
- Tropical Storm force winds extend outward from the center up to 195 miles
- Typhoon force winds extend outward from the center up to 60 miles
- Bavi is expected to maintain this course with the eye passing between Rota and Tinian this evening

Hazards Affecting Land: (HLT, as of 6:05 a.m. ET)

- Wind: Tropical Storm force winds are now ongoing; Typhoon force expected beginning this evening; Typhoon Warnings continue in Guam, Rota, Tinian, and Saipan
- Rain: Typhoon Bavi expected to bring 12 to 20 inches of sustained rain, with locally higher totals
- Storm Surge: Risk of major coastal flooding and large, dangerous waves; flooding levels will differ across CNMI and inundation could exceed 15 to 20 feet in some places, with additional flooding from high surf

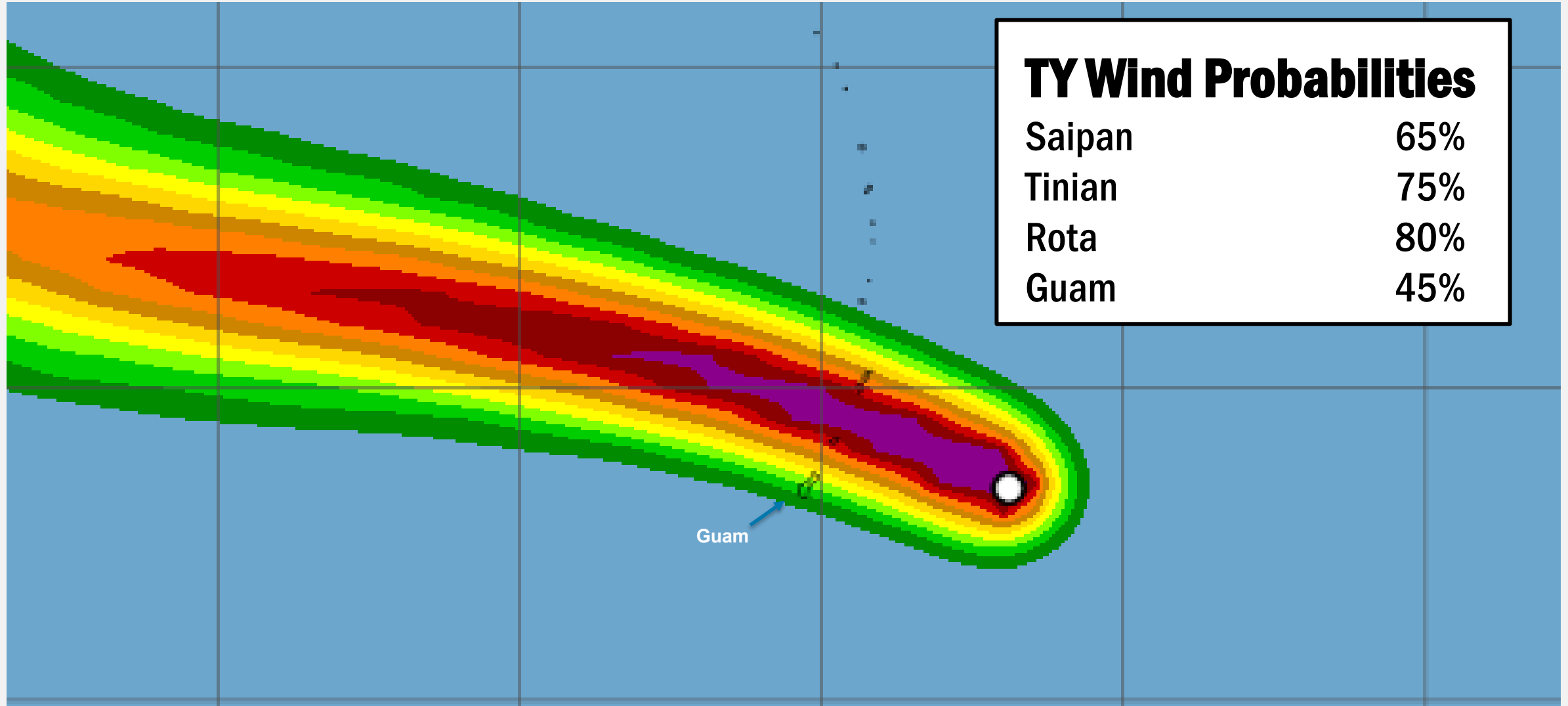

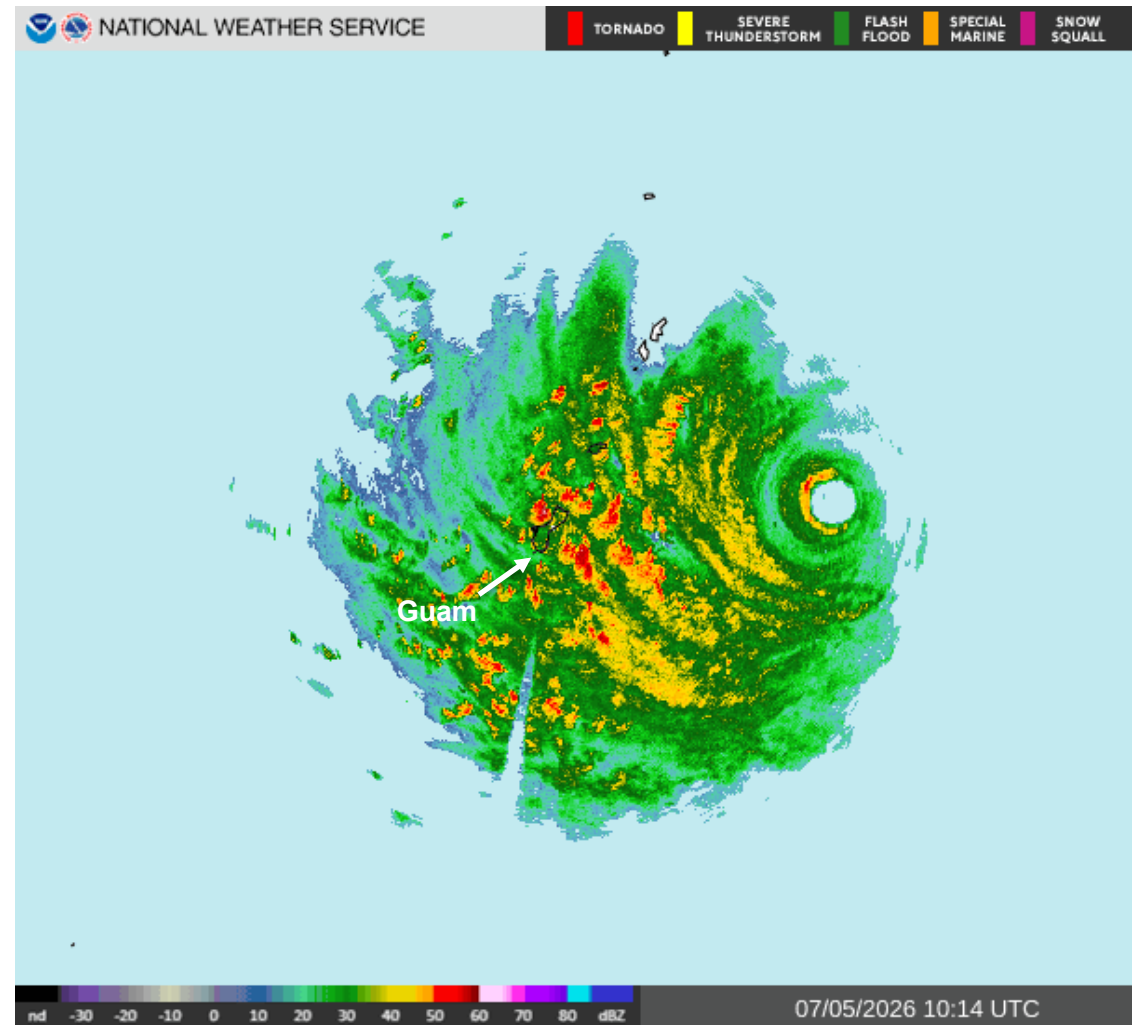
PROBABILITY OF TYPHOON WINDS

Situation and Analysis: Super Typhoon Bavi is approximately 190 miles southeast of CNMI and at CAT-5 intensity and expected to intensify before reaching Guam and CNMI today. The eye of the typhoon is expected to pass between Rota and Tinian, but tropical storm-force winds extend up to 195 miles and destructive typhoon-force winds are expected in CNMI and Guam by this afternoon. (NWS Guam and JTWC Advisory #18, as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Jul 5)

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA R9 SLB #2, as of 10:00 p.m. ET, Jul 4)

Food, Hydration, Shelter:

- Volunteers Organization Active in Disaster (VOAD) distributed 320 cases of water in Saipan and Rota
- CNMI: 8 (-1) shelters open with 413 (+121) occupants
 - Saipan: 5 shelters open with 362 (+84) occupants
 - Tinian: 2 shelters open with 51 (+37) occupants
 - Rota: 1 (-1) shelters open with 0 occupants
- Guam: 5 shelters open with unknown number of occupants

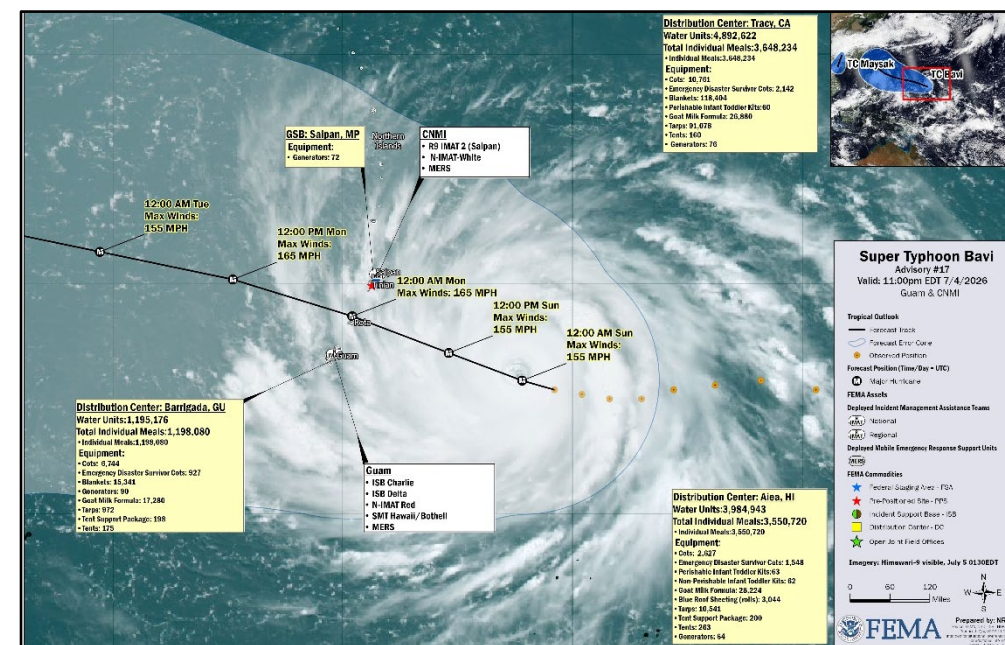
Energy:

- Power: Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) will shut down generation on Tinian, will allow the grid to shut down from faults on Rota and Saipan as the storm approaches
- Generators for DR-4910-MP posture for post-impact needs
- Saipan Power Plant 3 is offline pending repairs to leaking radiator
- Fuel Supply: Unleaded gas supply at Tinian's only gas station has been depleted. Next scheduled fuel deliveries: Jul 7 for Tinian, Jul 17 for Rota. Islands possess varying levels of fuel available:
 - Saipan: 19 (-1) days / Tinian: 21 (-1) days / Rota: 7 (-3) days

Water: In anticipation of Super Typhoon Bavi CUC implemented scheduled shut down of water

Transportation:

- All STAR Marianas (primary inter-island airline) flights in CNMI cancelled for Saipan, Tinian, and Rota
- Maritime: All ports on Saipan, Tinian, and Rota are at Limited Port Condition Yankee

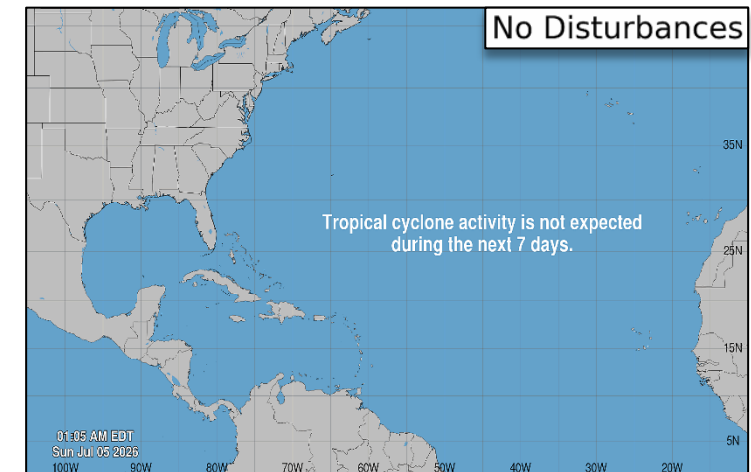

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Extreme Heat – Central and Eastern U.S.

Situation and Analysis: A prolonged and dangerous heat wave continues across much of the eastern U.S. through the remainder of the Independence Day weekend, with high temperatures in the mid-90s to 105°F and heat indices reaching 100–115°F. The most intense heat will gradually shift southward from the Ohio Valley and Northeast into the southern Mid-Atlantic and Southeast late this weekend into early next week as a cold front brings cooler conditions to the northern areas. Major to Extreme Heat Risk will persist through the weekend, with dangerous overnight warmth and high humidity increasing heat-related impacts before relief spreads from north to south. (NWS, as of 1:00 a.m. ET) Heat-related watches and warnings will remain in effect for the affected areas throughout the weekend. FEMA's National Watch Center is closely monitoring the situation and coordinating with regional offices for any additional impacts or reports.

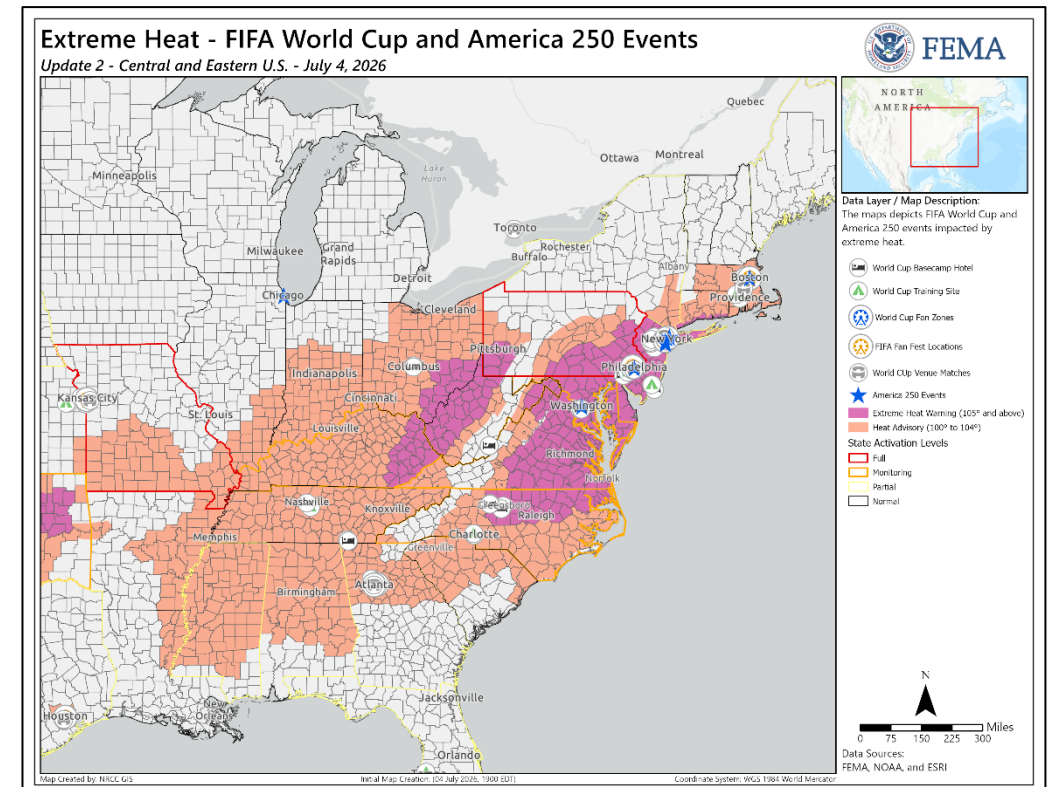

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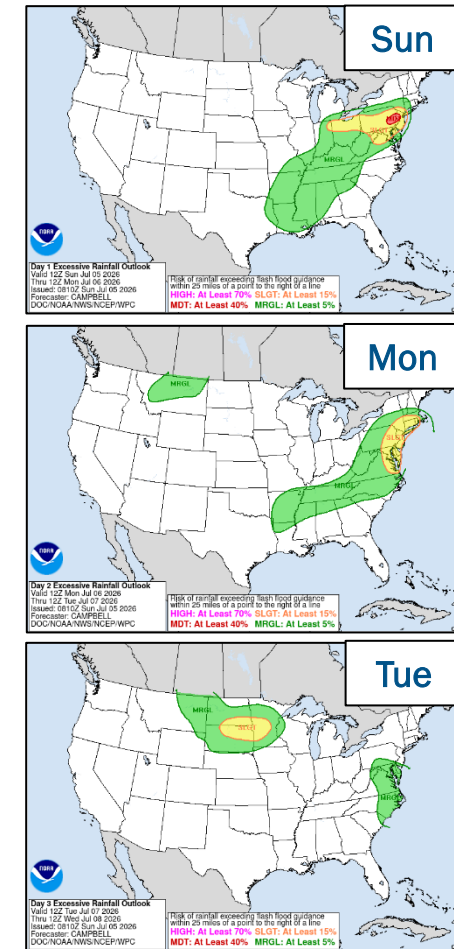
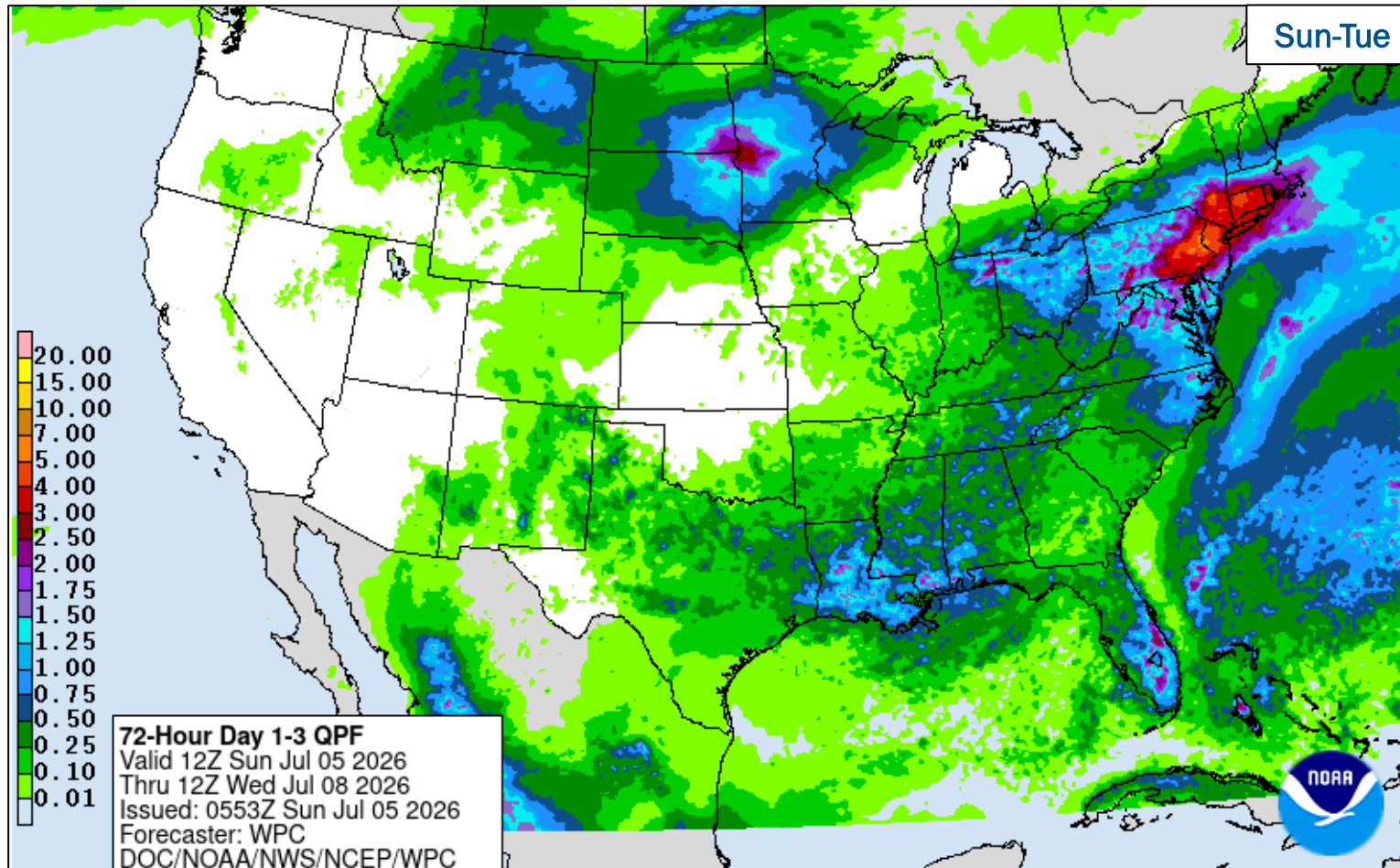
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National Weather Forecast



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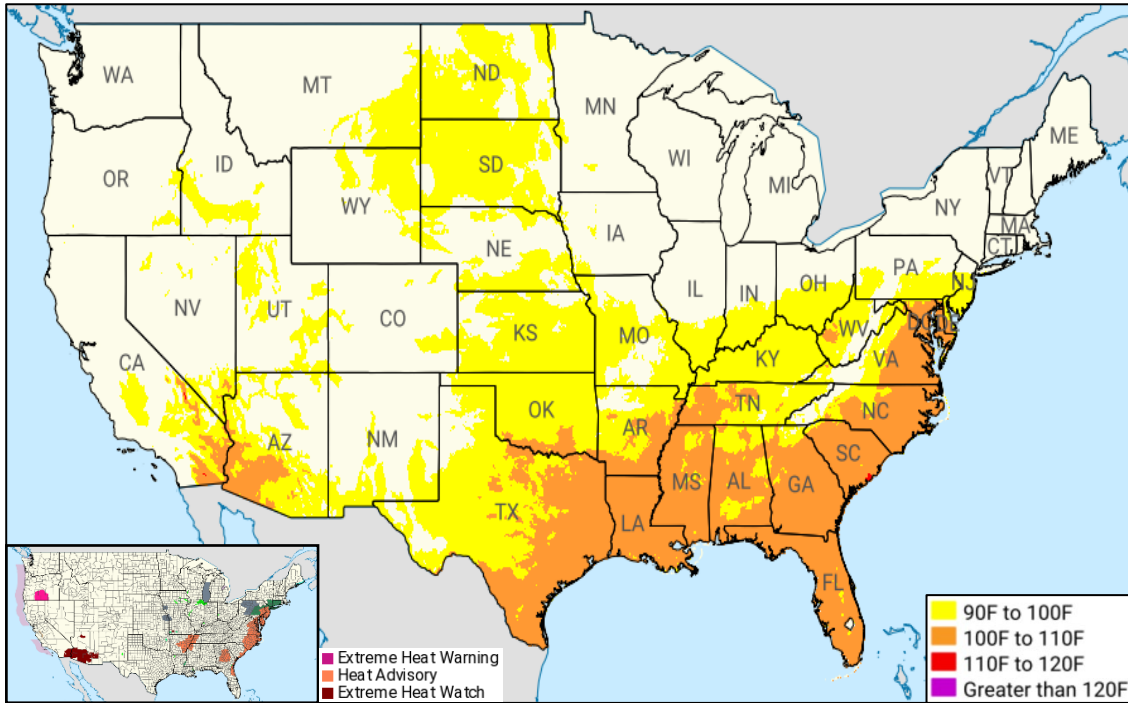
