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Tropical Storm Beryl Preparation – South Texas

Situation: Tropical Storm Beryl has weakened and moved into the Gulf of Mexico. Region VI in coordination with SLTT partners prepares for potential impacts.

- TX SEOC at Monitoring (Ongoing threats)

FEMA / Federal Response:

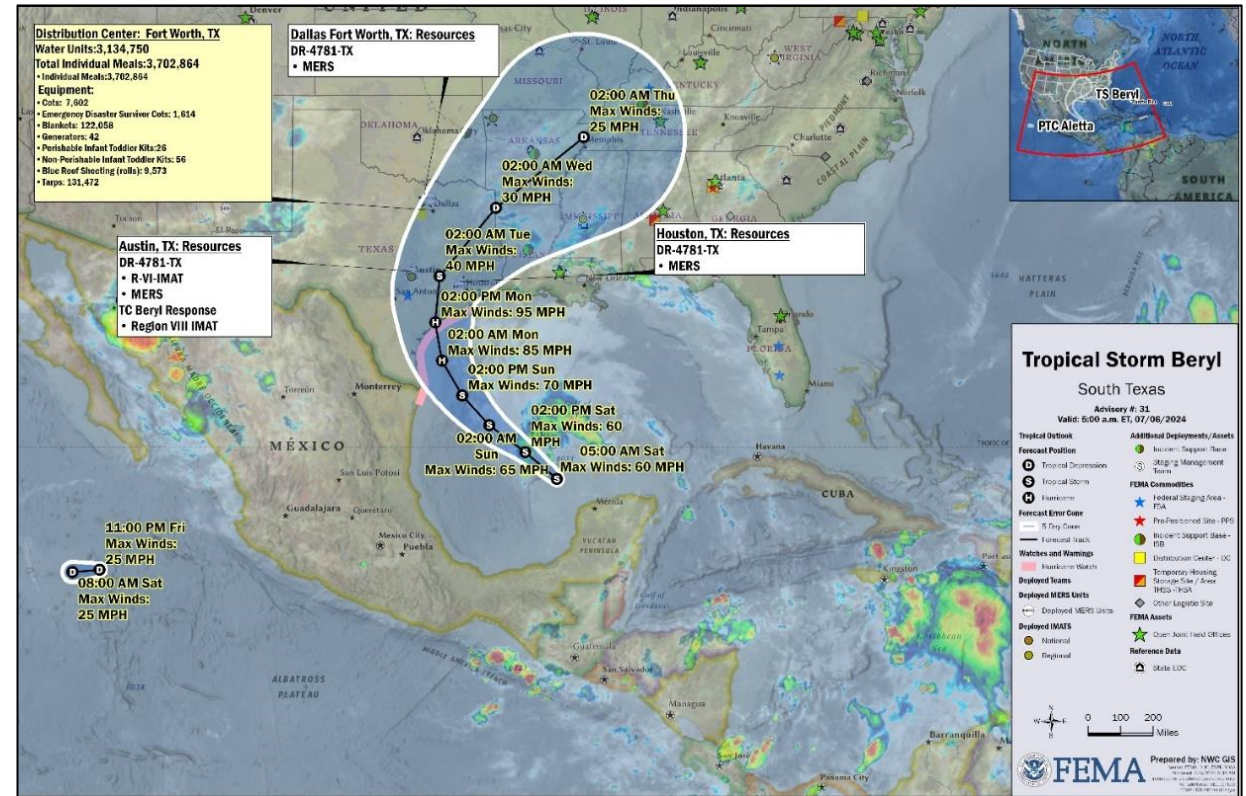
FEMA Region VI: (Region VI IAB, as of 2:30 p.m. ET, Jul 5)

- RWC is Monitoring (24/7); RRCC is Rostered (activates to Level III, at 9:00 a.m. ET, Jul 6, **activated to Level II with select ESFs**)
- IMAT-2 deploying to Austin, TX for DR-4781-TX

HQ:

- NWC is Monitoring; NRCC will activate to Level III day shift, Jul 7 at 8:00 a.m. ET
- Region VIII IMAT deploying to Austin, TX; arriving no later than Jul 7, 9:00 a.m. ET
- SMT Tracy and ISB Delta are deploying to Seguin, TX
- US&R Red Incident Support Team (IST), 2 Type-3 US&R Task Forces, and 2 ESF #9 Group Supervisors deploying to College Station, TX

FEMA NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with FEMA Region VI, with continued reporting twice daily in the FEMA National Situation Report (5:00 p.m. ET / 3:00 a.m. ET) and the FEMA Daily Operations Briefing (8:30 a.m. ET).

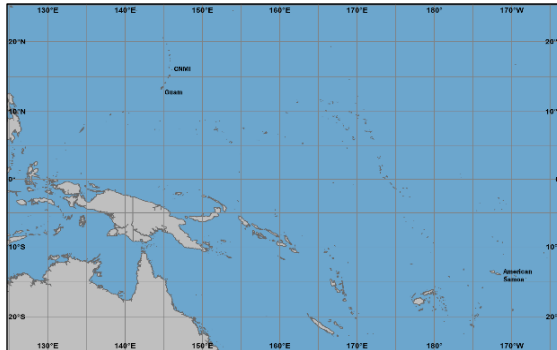


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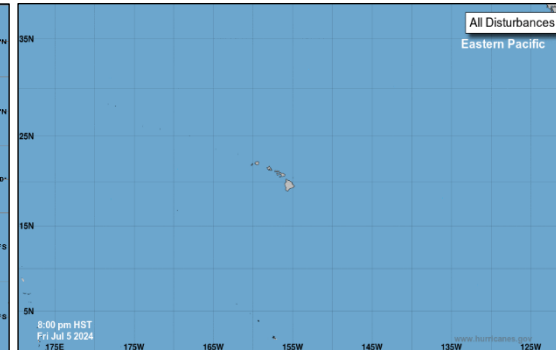

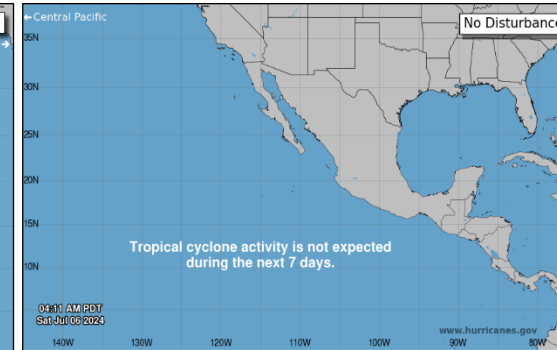

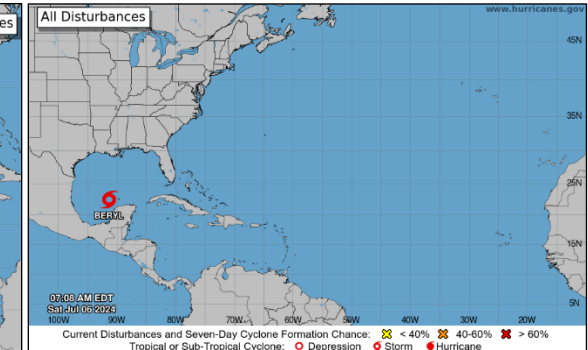

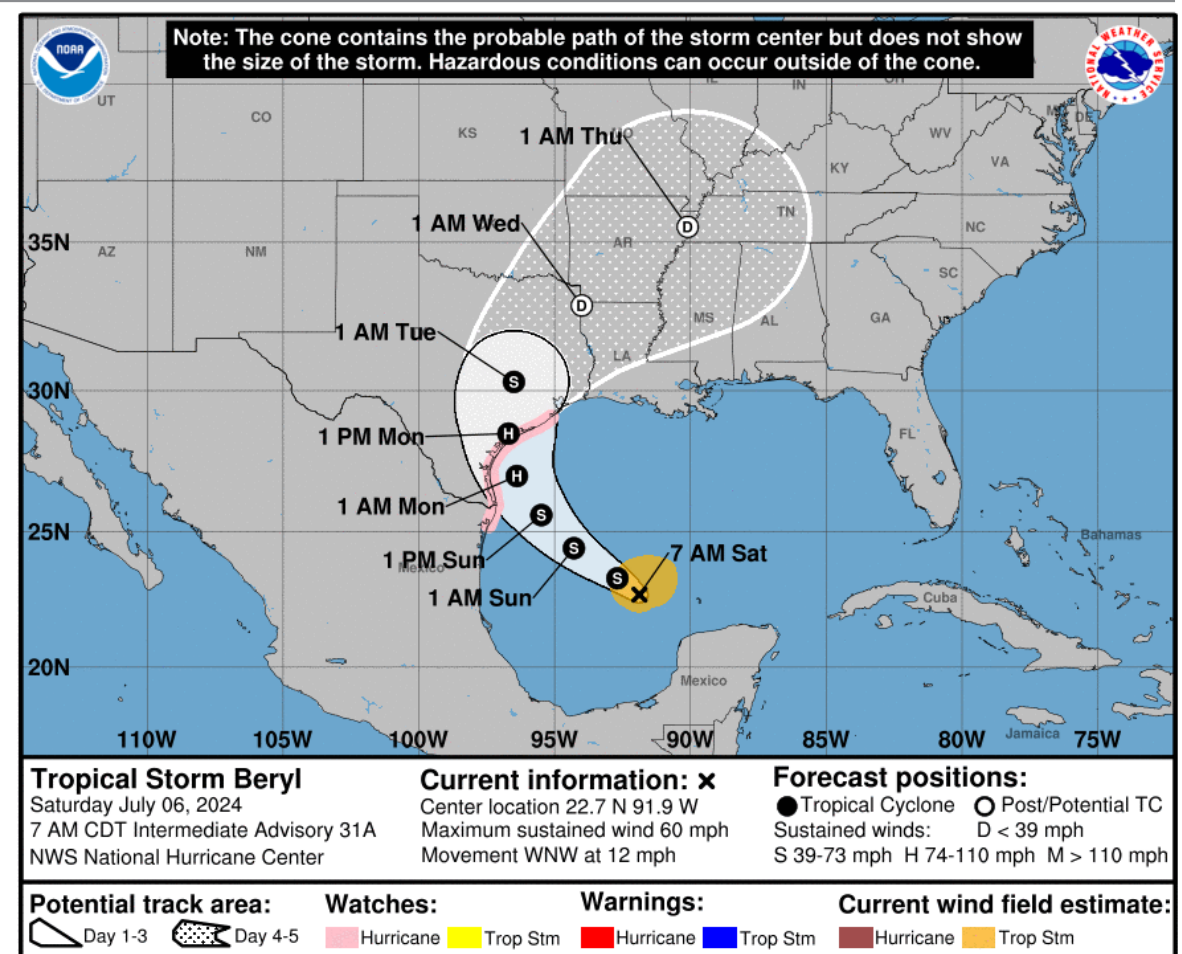


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Tropical Storm Beryl – Atlantic

Situation: (Advisory #31, as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

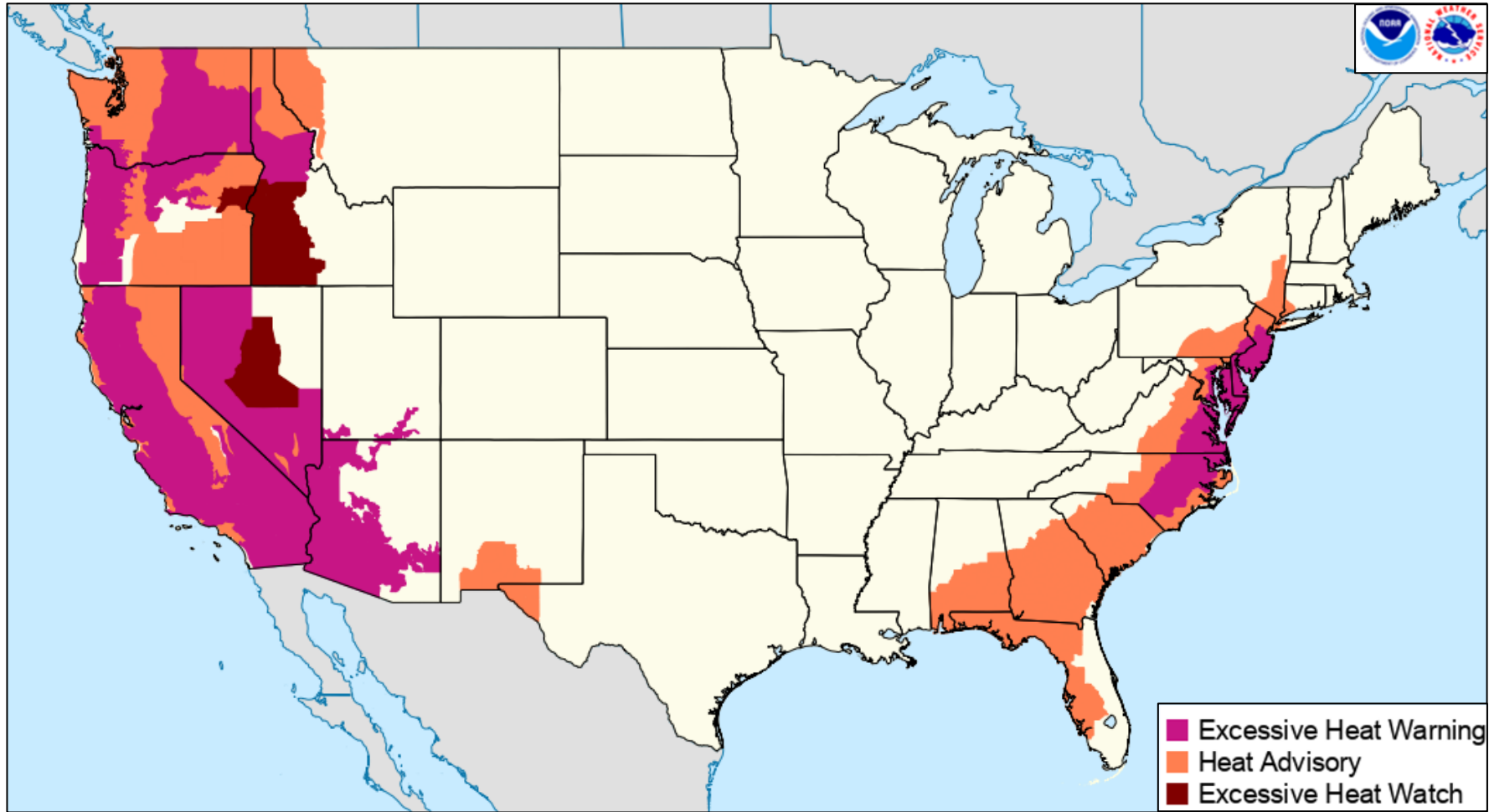
- Located 545 miles SE of Corpus Christi, Texas
- Moving WNW at 12 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 115 miles
- Strengthening is expected to begin by Sunday, and Beryl is forecast to become a hurricane before it reaches the Texas coast



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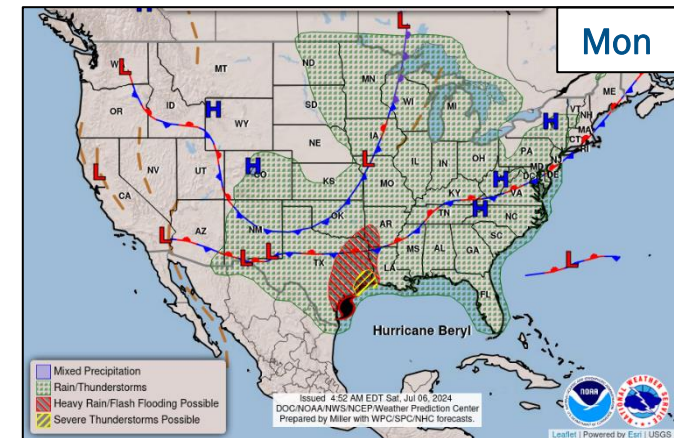
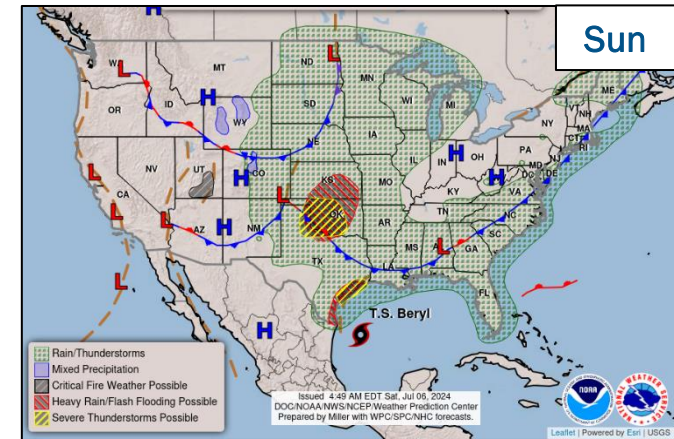
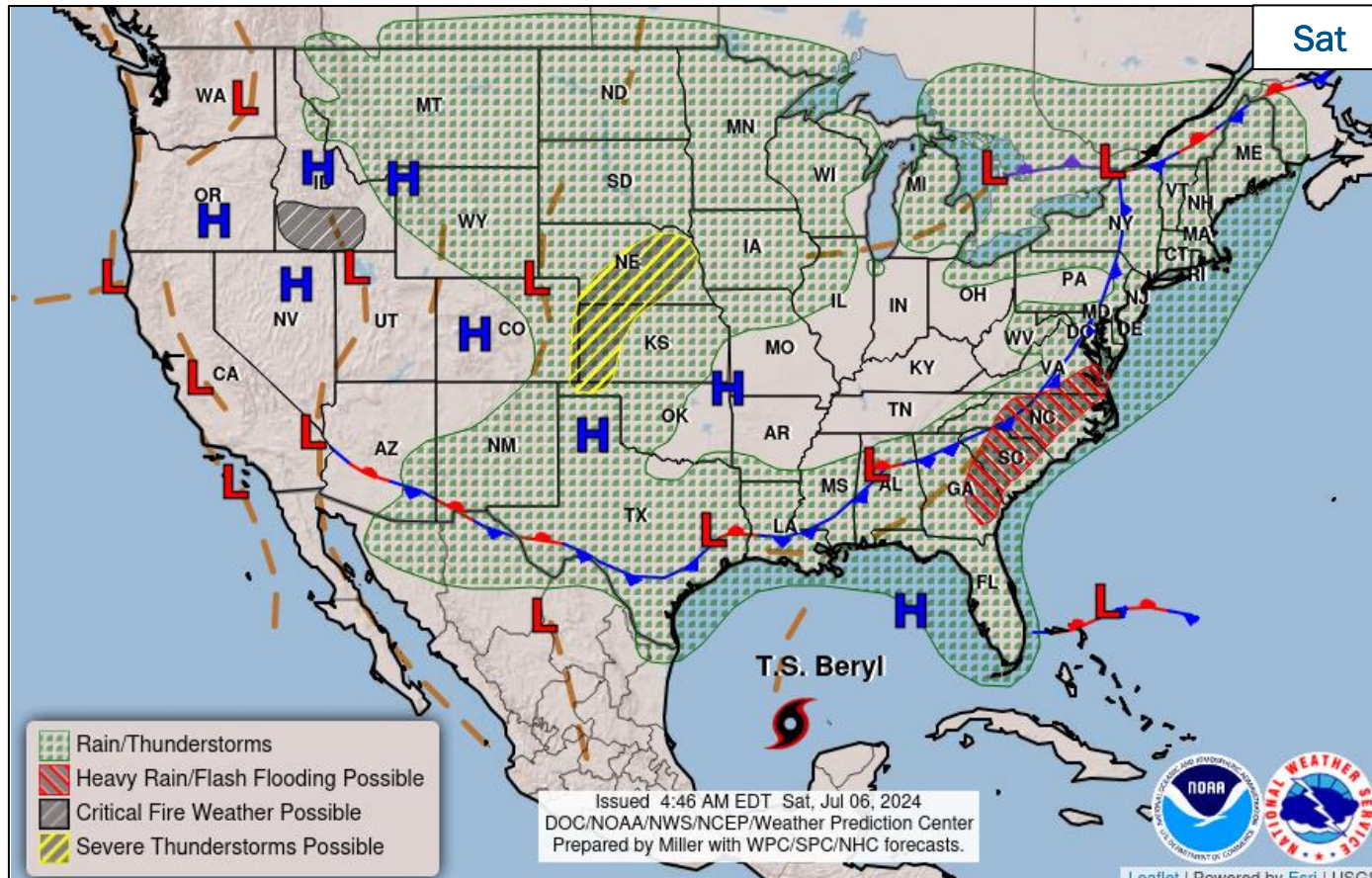

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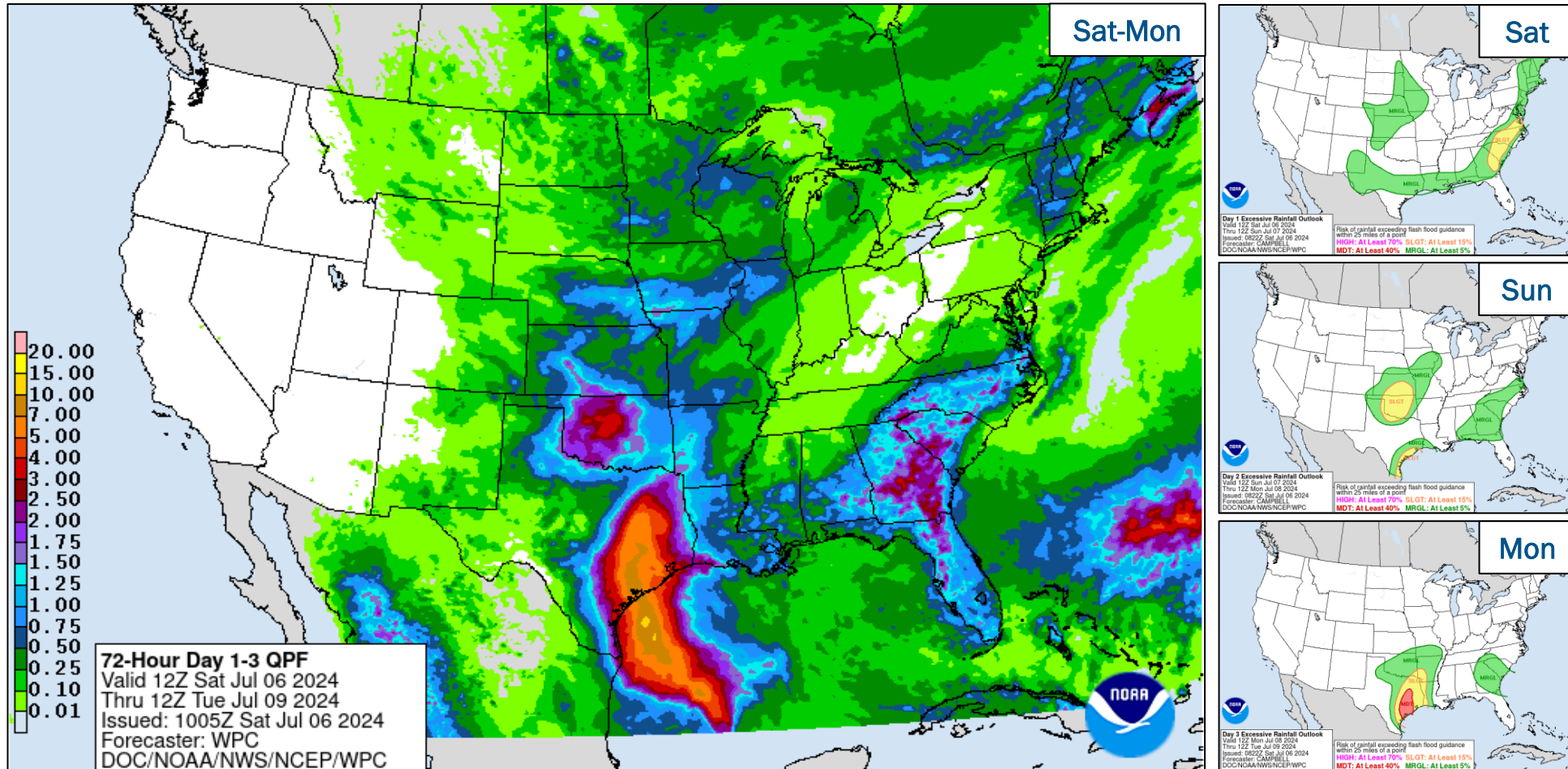
National Weather Forecast



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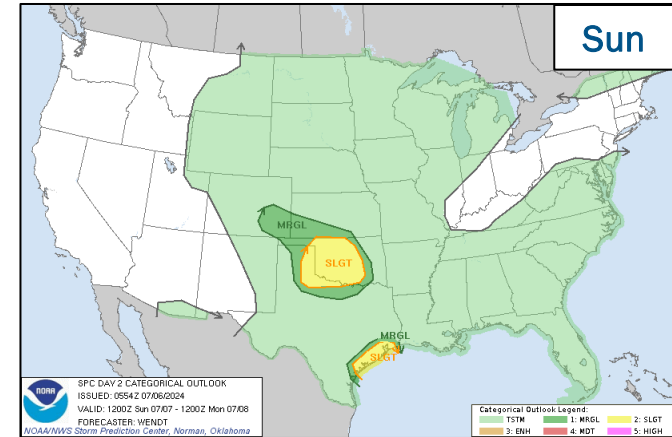
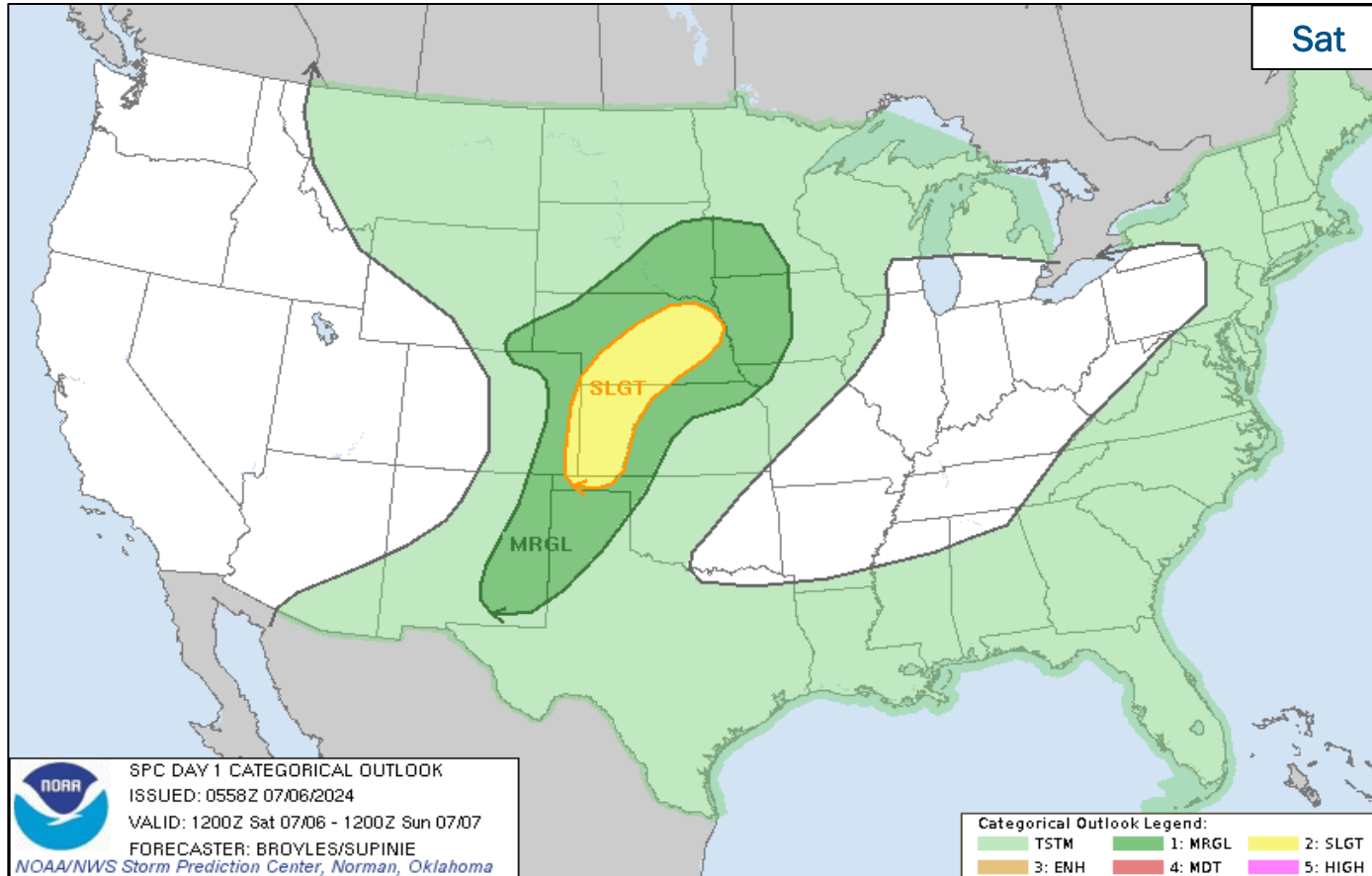
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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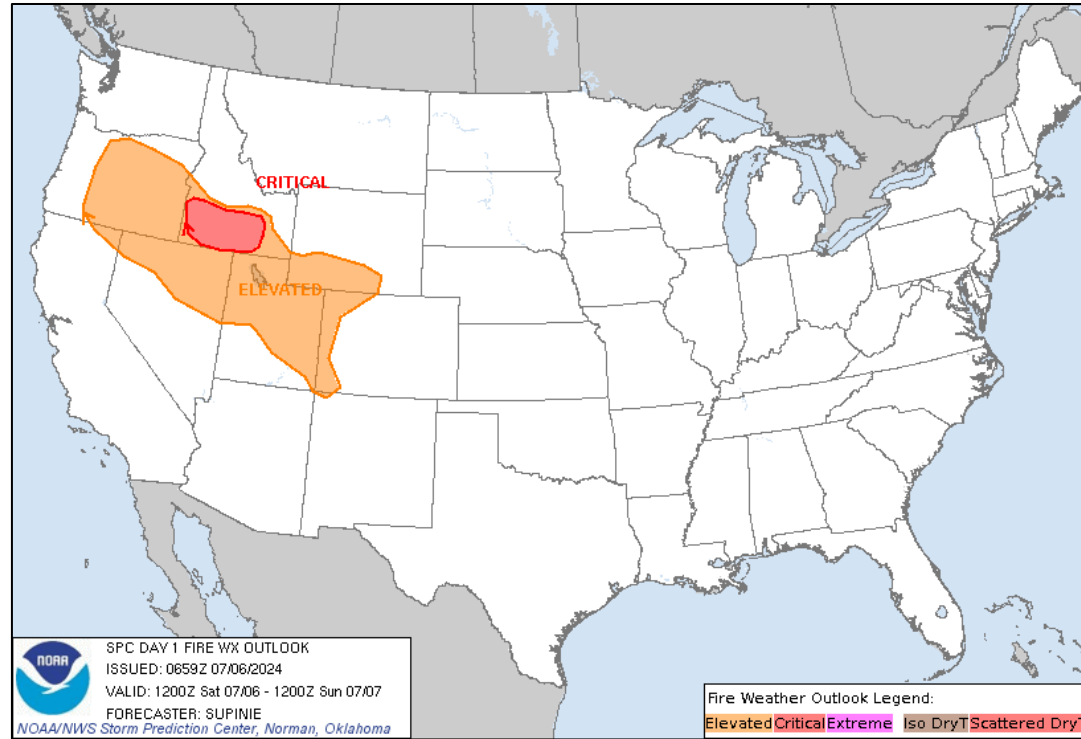
Severe Weather Outlook



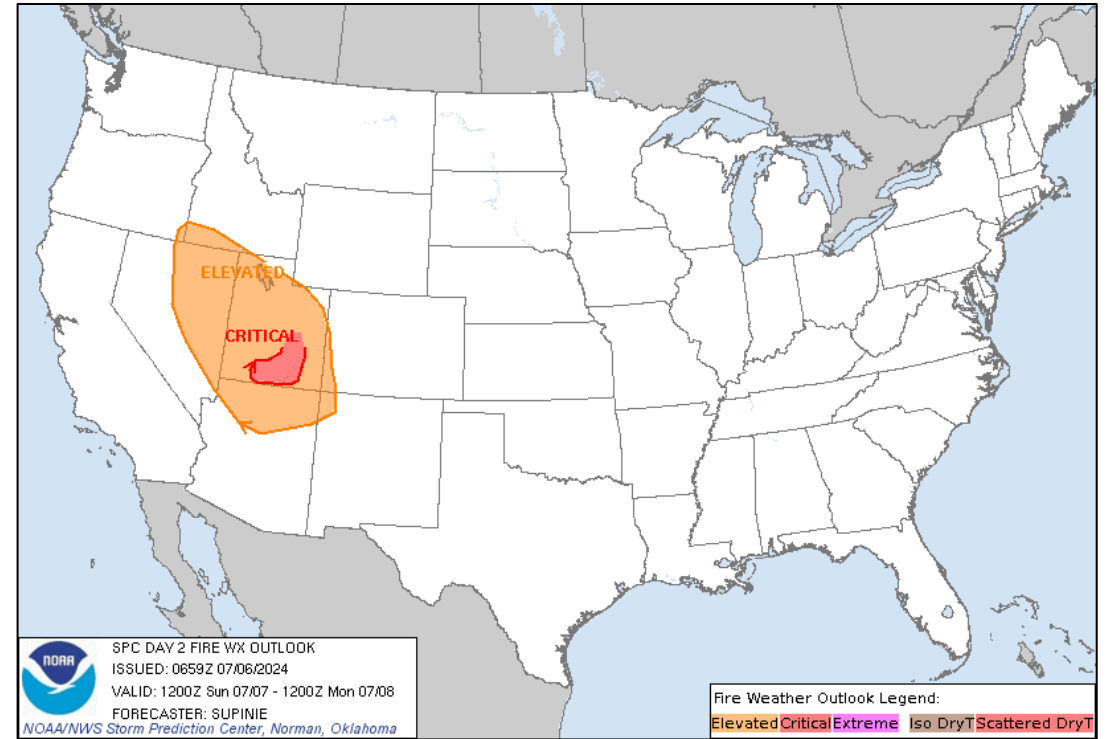

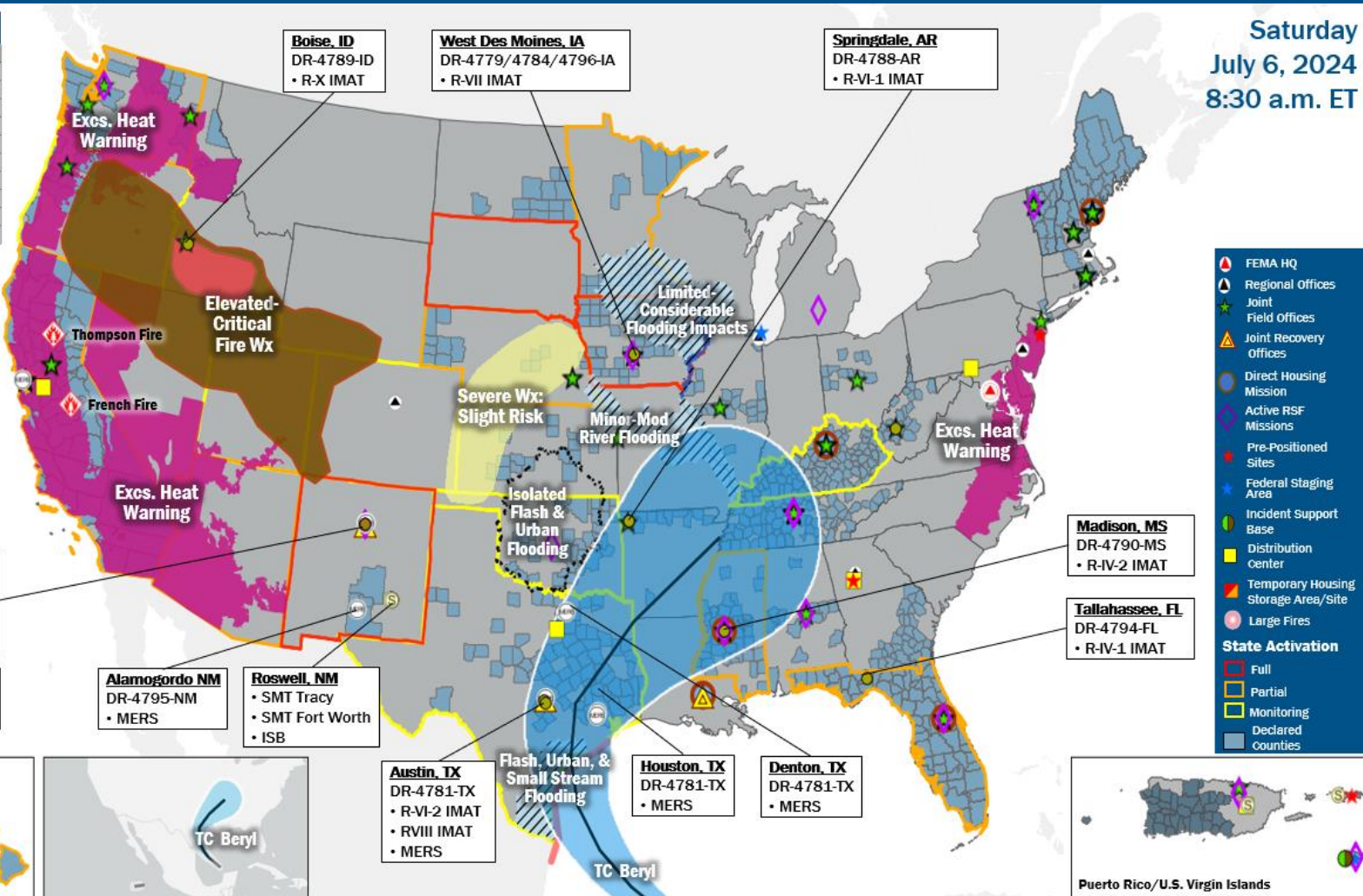
