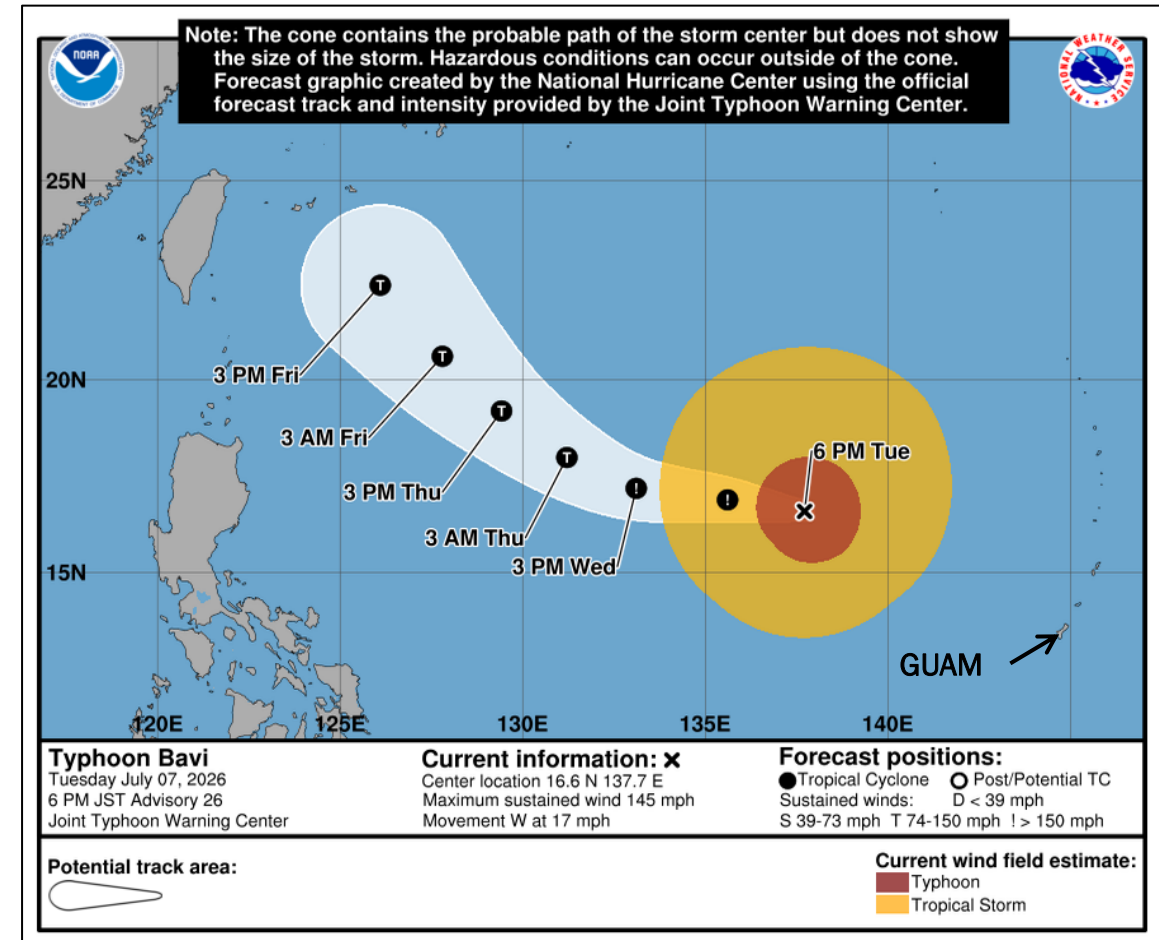


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Typhoon Bavi (CAT-4) – Western Pacific

Situation: (JTWC Advisory #26, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located approximately 520 miles WNW of Guam
- Moving W at 17 mph, continuing to pull away from the Marianas
- Maximum sustained winds of 145 mph
- Tropical Storm force winds extend outward up to 300 miles from center
- Typhoon force winds extend outward from center up to 105 miles

Situation: Typhoon Bavi has downgraded to Category 4 and continues to move away from the Marianas (JTWC Advisory #26, as of 5:00 a.m. ET). Super Typhoon Bavi made landfall as a strong Category 5 storm over Rota on the morning of July 6, with maximum sustained winds of approximately 180 mph on Rota and up to 90 mph on Tinian and Saipan. Deployed personnel are focusing on post-impact response preparations, including establishing geographic divisions for coordinated operations across the islands, developing logistics and resource transportation plans and outlining rapid needs assessments for medical, search and rescue, critical infrastructure, and mass care operations. The Governor declared the "All Clear" for Saipan, Tinian, and Rota on July 7. (FEMA Planning Section ILB, as of 6:05 a.m. ET, Jul 7)

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA R9 SLB, as of 10:00 p.m. ET, Jul 6)

Safety and Security: Law enforcement and other essential government services are ongoing with adaptations for disaster response

CNMI: ESF-13 LNO and IMT supporting CNMI law enforcement from Guam

GU:

- Police command post activated; officers supporting shelter security
- Non-emergency government services remain shut down

Food, Hydration, Shelter: Shelters open; Territories are conducting feeding operations

CNMI: (FEMA Planning Section ILB, as of 6:05 a.m. ET, Jul 7)

- CNMI HSEM delivered 4-5 days' worth of MREs and boxed water to shelter sites on Jul 4/5 (ET); World Central Kitchen mass feeding operations will arrive post-storm
- 10 (+2) total shelters open / 493 (-22) occupants
 - Saipan: 6 (+1) shelters open / 377 (-8) occupants
 - Tinian: 2 shelters open / 53 (-8) occupants
 - Rota: 2 (+1) shelters open / 63 (+11) occupants. Rota HS shelter in need of generator; Rota Aging Center will receive water and toilets when route is clear

GU: 5 shelters open / 865 (-3) occupants; Office of Civil Defense conducting feeding mission

Health and Medical: Hospitals and select clinics are operating with generators

CNMI:

- Rota: Generator power restored at Rota Clinic
- Saipan: CHCC Hospital is on generator power with additional infrastructure resuming operations on Jul 7

GU: Hospitals open on generator power; authorities intend to open clinics and dialysis by this morning (ET)

Energy: Power outages continue. Some fuel availability has been restored.

CNMI:

- Power out across Rota, Tinian, and Saipan; Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) awaiting post-storm assessments to begin repairs
- CUC reports the following fuel reserves for power generation:
 - Saipan: 19 days / Tinian: 21 days / Rota: 7 days
- Generator request process established by FEMA and CNMI
- Select gas stations open

GU:

- Power remains out in southern Guam due to impacted transmission lines
- ESF-3 USACE executing temporary power Mission Assignment (MA)

Water Systems: Water shutdowns continue for Saipan and Rota

CNMI: Water distribution in Saipan continues to be facilitated through tank service areas

- Tinian water system is online, running on generator power
- Boil Water Notices for Rota and Saipan are in effect

GU:

- 67 (-30) of 99 water wells online and on generator power
- Low to no water pressure reported in several regions. Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) and Guam Power Authority (GPA) are assessing power issues that affect water and wastewater services
- Three (3) reports received of possible sewer overflows
- All wastewater treatment plans reliant on generator power

Communications: Communications outages reported across the territory

CNMI:

- ESF-2 plans to deploy satellite terminals once cleared
- Cellular infrastructure:
 - Saipan: 20 of 36 Docomo Cellular sites (56%) out of service
 - Tinian: 3 of 4 Docomo Cellular sites (75%) out of service
 - Rota: 2 of 7 Docomo Cellular sites (29%) out of service

GU: NWS reported radar systems down

Transportation: All ports in CNMI closed

CNMI:

- ESF-3 USACE executing road clearance MA
- Saipan flights expected to resume at 5:00 p.m. ET, Jul 8. Tinian and Rota airport towers remain unmanned
- All ports on Saipan, Tinian, and Rota are at Limited Port Heavy Weather Condition
- Saipan mass transit services suspended until further notice

GU:

- Route 11, providing access to the Port of Guam and other logistics and infrastructure facilities, is currently impassable and a top priority for clearance
- ESF-3 USACE executing road clearance MA
- Airport remains open; flights have resumed as of 8:00 p.m. ET, Jul 6

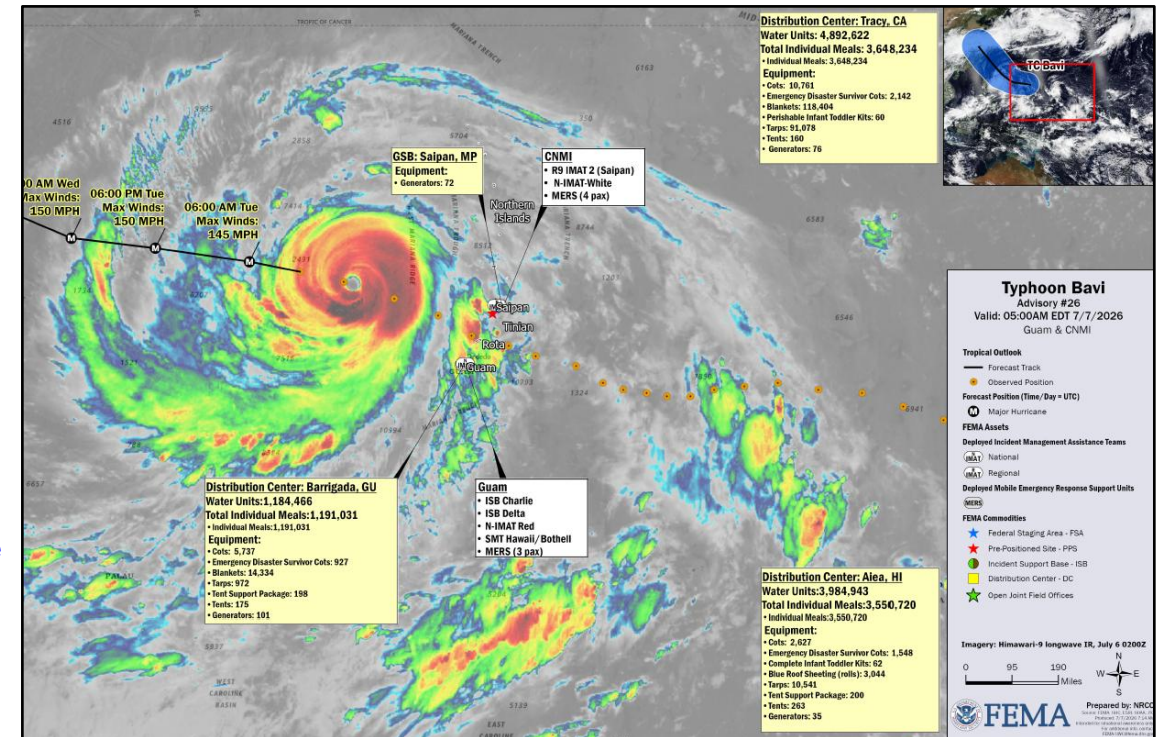

 - RRCC is Rostered (will activate 10:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. ET day shift only)
 - FIT LNOs and selected ESFs Activated for GU and CNMI
- FEMA HQ:
 - NWC at Enhanced Watch; NRCC Activated day shift only (10:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. ET) (TC Bavi)
 - N-IMAT Red deployed to GU
 - N-IMAT White deployed to CNMI
 - ISB Charlie/Delta, SMT Hawaii, and SMT Bothell personnel deployed to GU
 - ISB Alpha deployed to HI
 - Bothell MERS personnel deployed to Guam and CNMI; [Denver MERS personnel en route to Guam \(MERS Status Report, as of 11:00 p.m. ET\)](#)

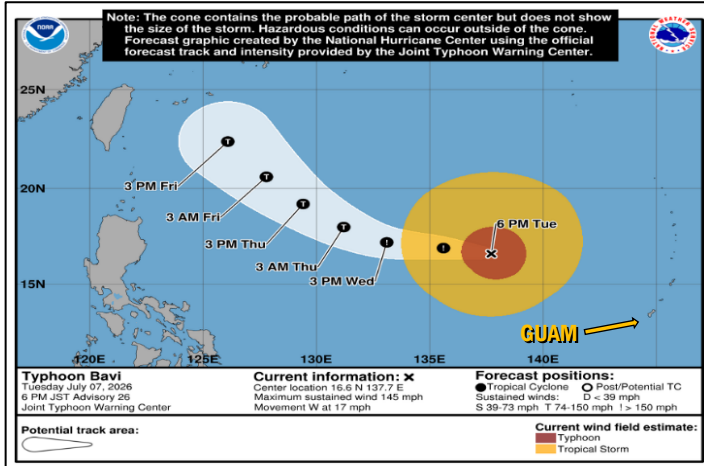

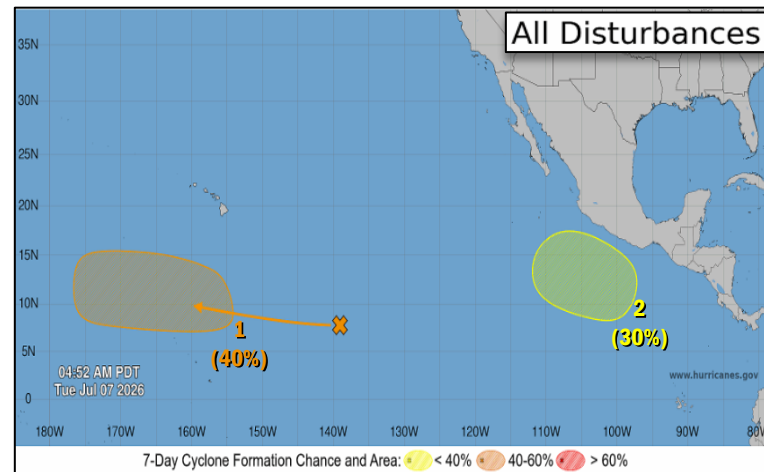

Eastern and Central Pacific



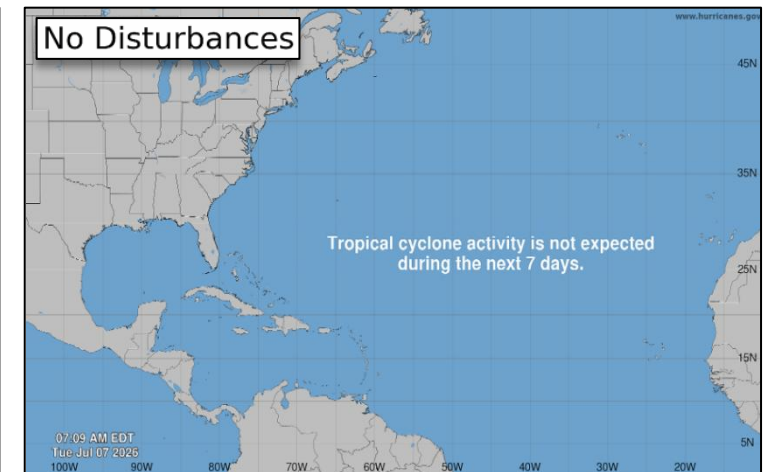
Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Over the central Pacific basin well south of the Hawaiian Islands
- Some slow development of this system is possible late this week and through the weekend while it moves W across the central Pacific
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Med (40%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- A low-pressure system is expected to form late this weekend or early next week several hundred miles south of the coast of southwestern Mexico
- Gradual development is possible after that time as the system moves WNW
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (30%)

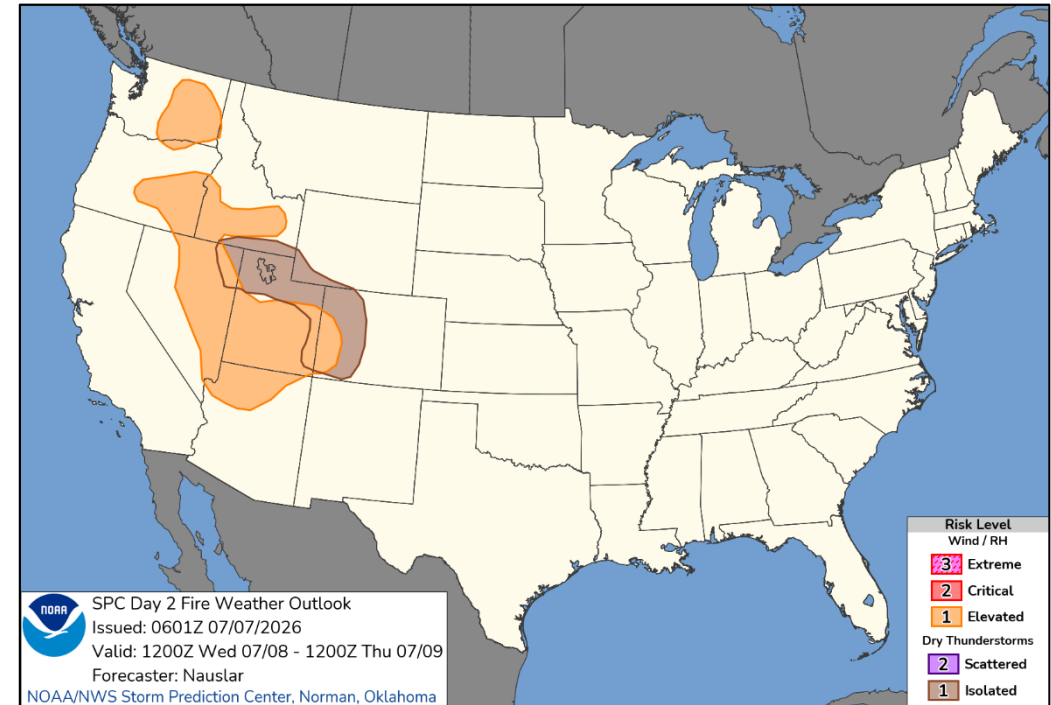


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Fire Weather Outlook

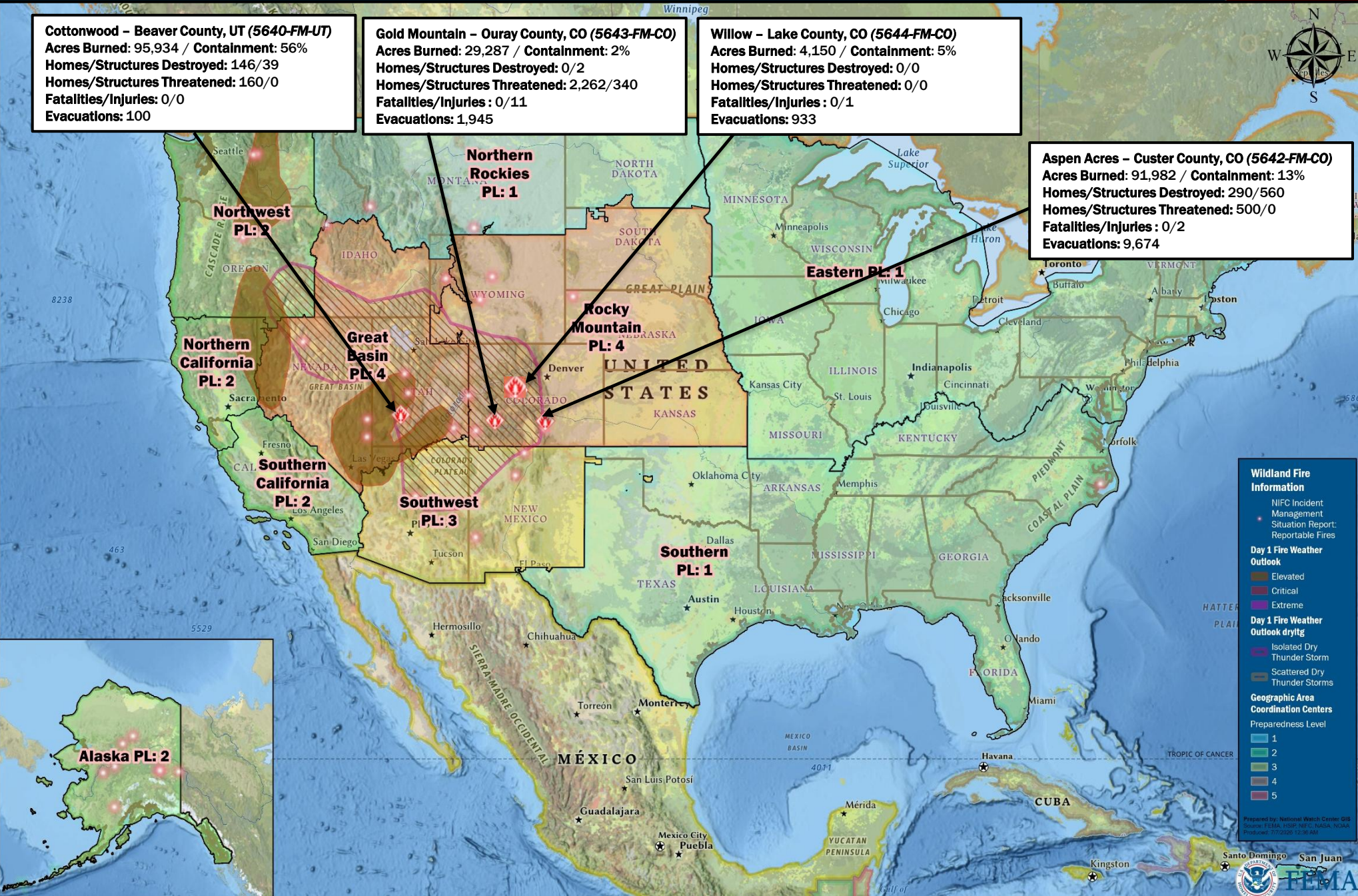

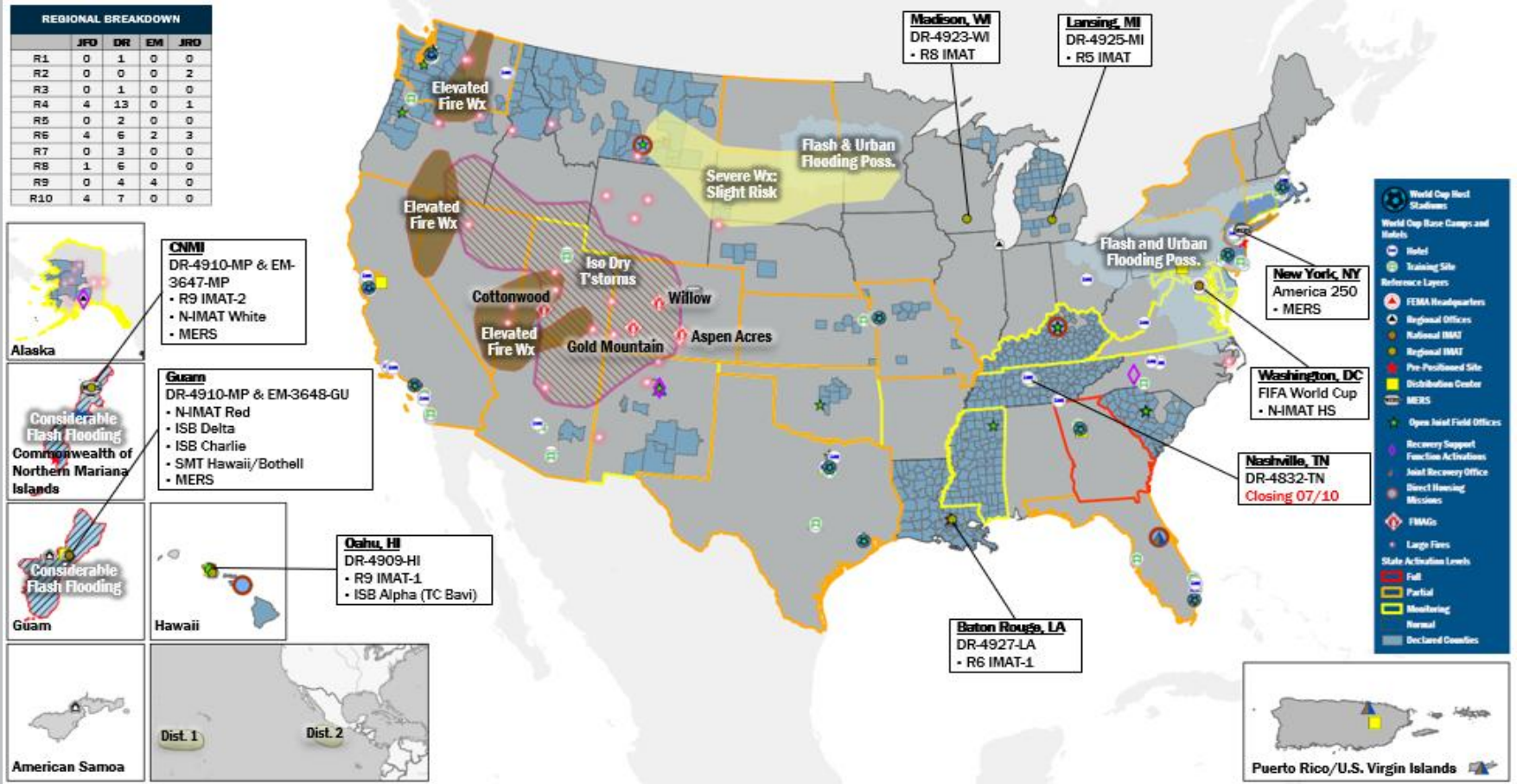
