# National Current Operations & Monitoring

## **Significant Incidents or Threats:**

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Central Plains to Upper Mississippi Valley
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible – Central Plains and Upper Mississippi Valley
- Critical fire weather possible – Southwest, Central Great Basin and Central Rockies
- COVID-19

## **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic: Invest 98L – High (70%)
- Eastern Pacific:
  - Tropical Storm Cristina
  - Disturbance 1 – Medium (40%)
  - Disturbance 2 – Medium (40%)
- Central Pacific: Disturbance 1 – Low (10%)
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests



# Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



## **Invest 98L** *(as of 8:00 a.m. ET)*

- Located along the coast of South Carolina
- Expected to move NE near or just offshore of the NC Outer Banks on Thursday, then turn NNE and move along the Mid-Atlantic coast on Friday
- A tropical or subtropical cyclone is likely to form within the next couple of days
- Regardless of development, expected to produce locally heavy rainfall that could cause some flash flooding across portions of eastern NC, the coastal Mid-Atlantic, and southern New England during the next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: **Medium (60%)**
- Formation chance through 5 days: **High (70%)**



# Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



## Tropical Storm Cristina (Advisory #7 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 380 miles SSW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 13 mph; this motion expected to continue during the next few days, keeping it well away from the coast of Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph; forecast to become a hurricane on Thursday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 35 miles

## Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 1,000 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Some slow development possible over the next 2-3 days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)

## Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to form S of the Gulf of Tehuantepec late this week or this weekend
- Tropical depression could form early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)




# Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



## **Disturbance 1** *(as of 8:00 a.m. ET)*

- Located 950 miles SE of Hilo, Hawaii
- Development, if any, will be slow to occur as it moves W at 10 mph
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)



# COVID-19 Update




**Situation:** The National rate of COVID-19 test positivity is 9% with a daily average of 419k tests since testing began. Currently, 13% of hospital admissions are COVID-19 patients (peak 22%), 11% of COVID-19 inpatients are on a ventilator, 22% of in-use ventilators are occupied by COVID-19 patients (45% peak in April), and 19% of hospitals have more than 80% of their ICU beds occupied. 31,711 (-34) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,277 (-26) FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 37,258,821 (+1,002,933) cumulative as of July 7.

  - United States: 2,932,596 (+46,329)
  - Worldwide: 11,327,790 (+202,545)
- Deaths caused by COVID-19
  - United States: 130,133 (+322)
  - Worldwide: 532,340 (+4,134)





- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring





# Fire Weather Outlook






