Situation: Typhoon Bavi (CAT-3) continues to move away from the Marianas (*JTWC Advisory #32, as of 11:00 p.m. ET*). In Guam, water systems and telecommunication rehabilitation are contingent on power grid reenergization and connectivity, and temporary power installations. Federal response operations focus on maintaining situational awareness through local assessments, community outreach, and field reporting. FEMA maintains close coordination with Guam Homeland Security/Office of Civil Defense (GHS/OCD) to execute assessments of critical infrastructure systems. (*FEMA Planning Section ILBs, as of 5:00 a.m. ET*)

Lifeline Impacts: (*FEMA ILBs, as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Jul 9*)

Safety and Security: Law enforcement and other essential government services are ongoing with adaptations for disaster response

CNMI: Law Enforcement Support Team (LEST) coordinating travel to Saipan, estimated arrival 07/10

GU: Guam Department of Public Works (GDPW) and the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) opened a debris removal site at Ypao Point

Food, Hydration, Shelter: Shelters open; Territories are conducting feeding operations

CNMI:

- CNMI HSEM delivered 4-5 days worth of MREs and boxed water to shelter sites on Jul 4/5 (ET); World Central Kitchen began shelter and community feeding Jul 7
 - Tinian: ESF-6 FHD TF identifying and validating commodity needs
- 6 (-2) total shelters open / 223 (-51) occupants
 - Saipan: 3 (-2) shelters open / 148 (-59) occupants
 - Tinian: 1 shelters open / 16 occupants
 - Rota: 2 shelters open / 59 (+8) occupants. Rota HS shelter needs a generator; Rota Aging Center will receive water and toilets when route is clear

GU: 3 shelters open / 454 (-8) occupants

Health and Medical: Hospitals and select clinics on generator power

CNMI:

- Rota: Rota Health Clinic (RHC) generator is offline per USACE
- Emergency Departments are operating 24/7 on Saipan, Tinian, and Rota
- GU: DPHSS Northern Clinic closed due to lack of water access, USACE engineering conducting infrastructure assessment to identify water solutions for the facility; Guam Memorial Hospital open on generator power; 1 dialysis center closed due to landslide with patients relocated

Water Systems: Water systems are slowly being restored

CNMI:

- Saipan: 16% of water wells running on CUC generators, 86% of customers receiving intermittent water service
- 3 water filling stations opened on Jul 7
- Rota: Exposed broken water pipe was repaired and is being pressurized; Water requires testing for boil water notice to be lifted

GU:

- Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) Northern system partially operational with assessments underway; Southern and Central fully operational
- 77 (+3) of 98 water wells online; 69 (-2) on generator power
- GWA deployed water tankers in areas of low water pressure
- Boil water notice issued for GWA customers without water service for >48 hours

Energy: Power plant assessments and generator installations are underway

CNMI:

- USACE installing generators as necessary
- Tinian: USACE and CUC power plant assessment ongoing
- Rota: Power plant damage assessment indicates damages due to flooding and rain
- Select gas stations open

GU:

- 46% (+17) of system load restored / 97% of substations energized / 58% (+28) of feeders/circuits energized
- Temporary Emergency Power (TEP) Assessments and installations ongoing in coordination with GHS/OCD for further requests for critical infrastructure

Communications: Communications outages reported across the territory

CNMI:

- Saipan: Responder communications continued throughout the storm; alternate numbers available if 911 goes out of service (OOS)
- Cellular infrastructure:
 - Saipan: Cell sites OOS: 19 of 75 (26%)
 - Tinian: Cell sites OOS: 3 of 9 (33%)
 - Rota: Cell sites OOS: 9 of 11 (82%)

GU: 150 of 240 (62.5%) cell sites online, with 36 out (no power) and 166 on backup power; assessments ongoing

Transportation: Port of Guam resumed gatehouse operations

CNMI:

- Crews conducting route clearance and "grab and go" removal and prioritizing critical locations for clearance first
- Tinian: Airport is open to receiving humanitarian aid only
- Saipan mass transit services suspended until further notice

GU:

- All major roadways open; GH-1, GU-10, 15, and 17 are degraded due to flooding or debris
 - Only 1 lane on GU-10 passable, GDPW sourcing cutting crew for debris removal
- Port of Guam resumed gatehouse operations allowing cargo movement through terminal; Apra Harbor water ways open with no restrictions (Condition Whiskey)

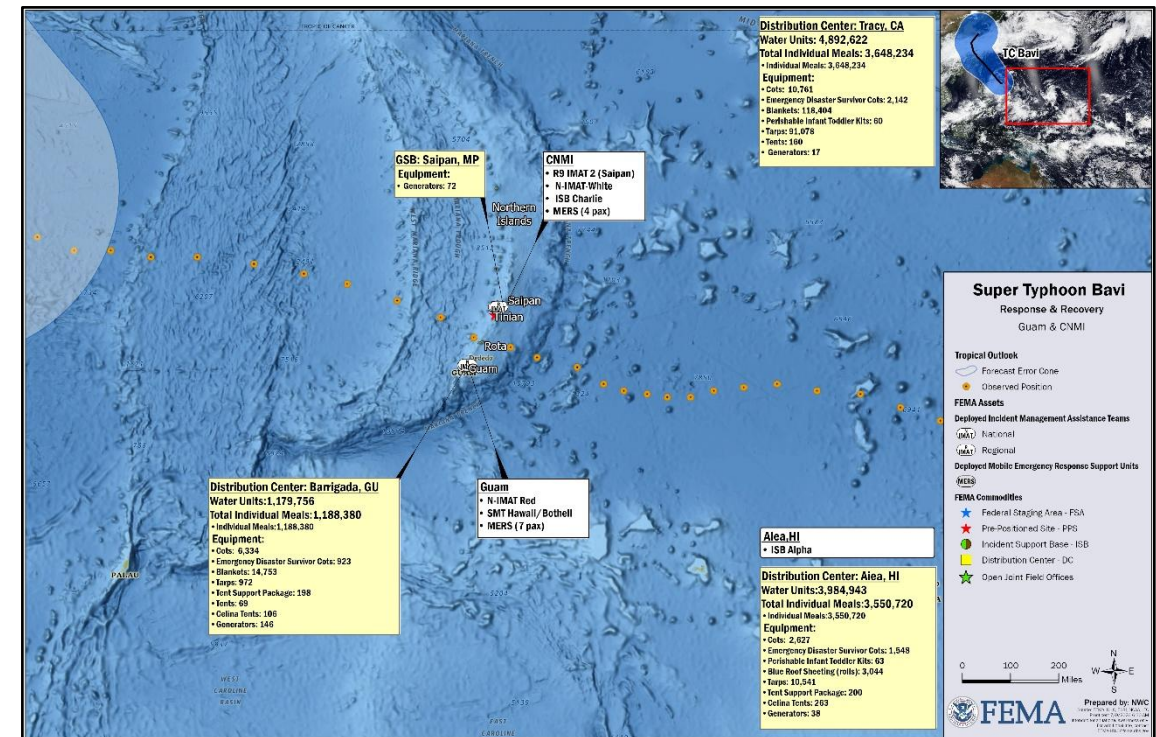

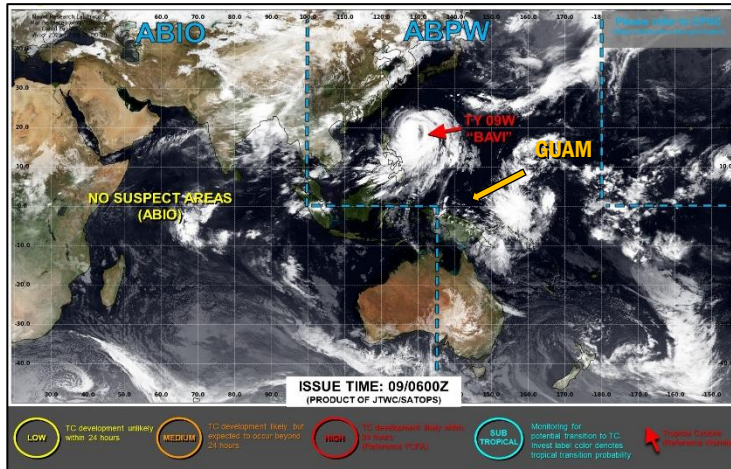

Western Pacific



Typhoon Bavi (CAT-3) FINAL: (Advisory #32 as of 11:00 p.m. ET)

- Located approximately 1000 miles WNW of Guam
- Moving WNW at 13 mph, continuing to pull away from the Marianas
- Maximum sustained winds of 130 mph
- Tropical Storm force winds extend outward up to 310 miles from center
- Typhoon force winds extend outward up to 120 miles from center
- This will be the last advisory issued by the National Weather Service on Bavi

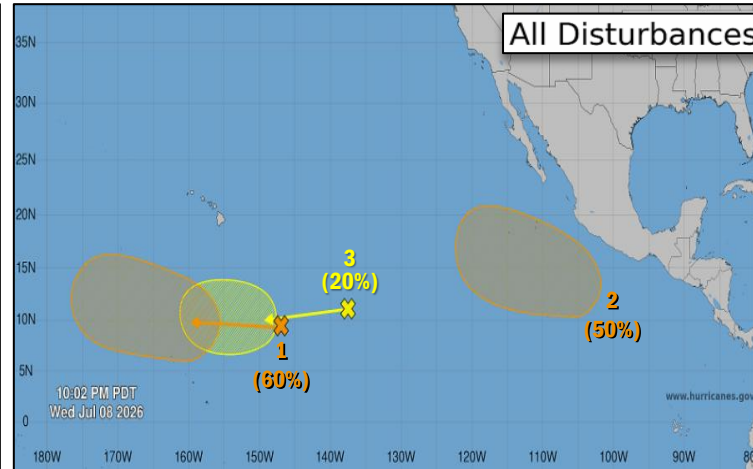
Invest 97W: (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- No significant development expected over the next 24hrs.



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Eastern and Central Pacific



Disturbance 1: (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located SE of the Hawaiian Islands
- Moving W to WNW
- Environmental conditions appear favorable for gradual development later this week and into early next week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Med (60%)

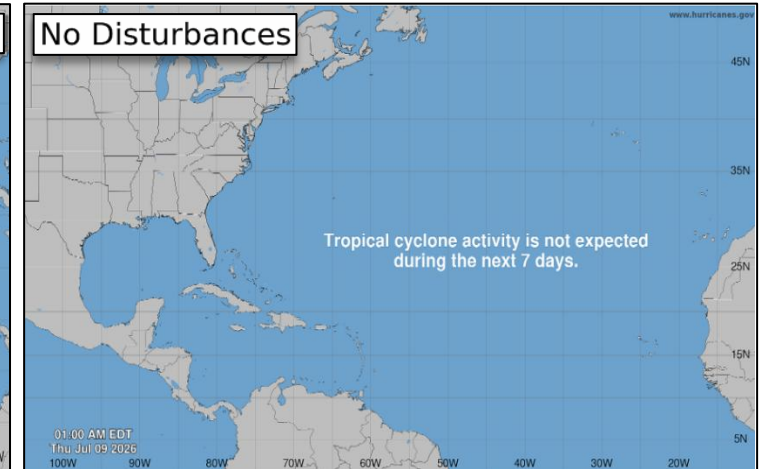
Disturbance 2: (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located offshore of Southwestern Mexico
- Moving W to NW
- Environmental conditions appear favorable for gradual development and a tropical depression could form as the system moves generally WNW
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Med (50%)

Disturbance 3: (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located SE of the Hawaiian Islands
- Moving W to WSW
- Environmental conditions appear favorable for slow development this weekend into early next week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Med (20%)

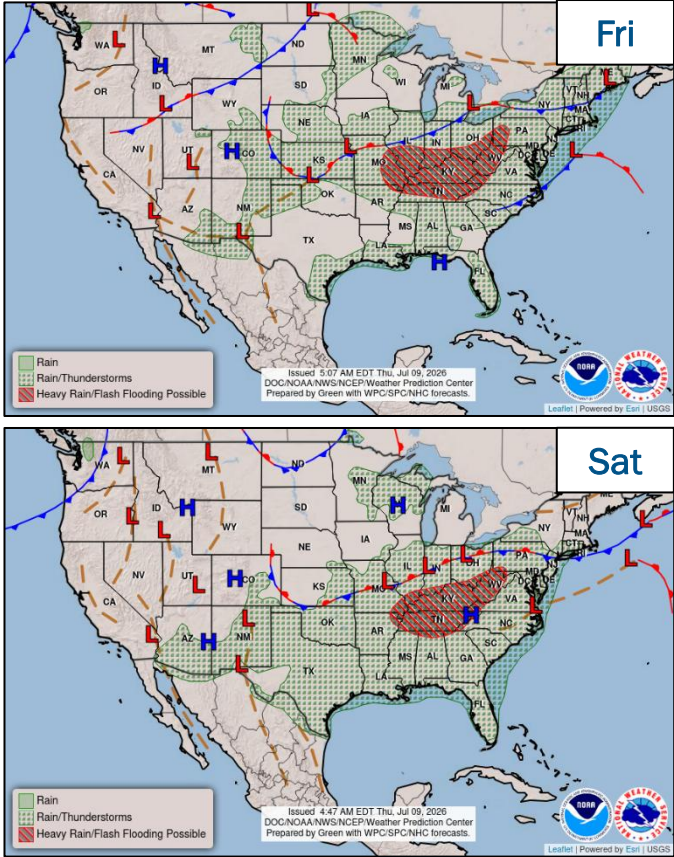
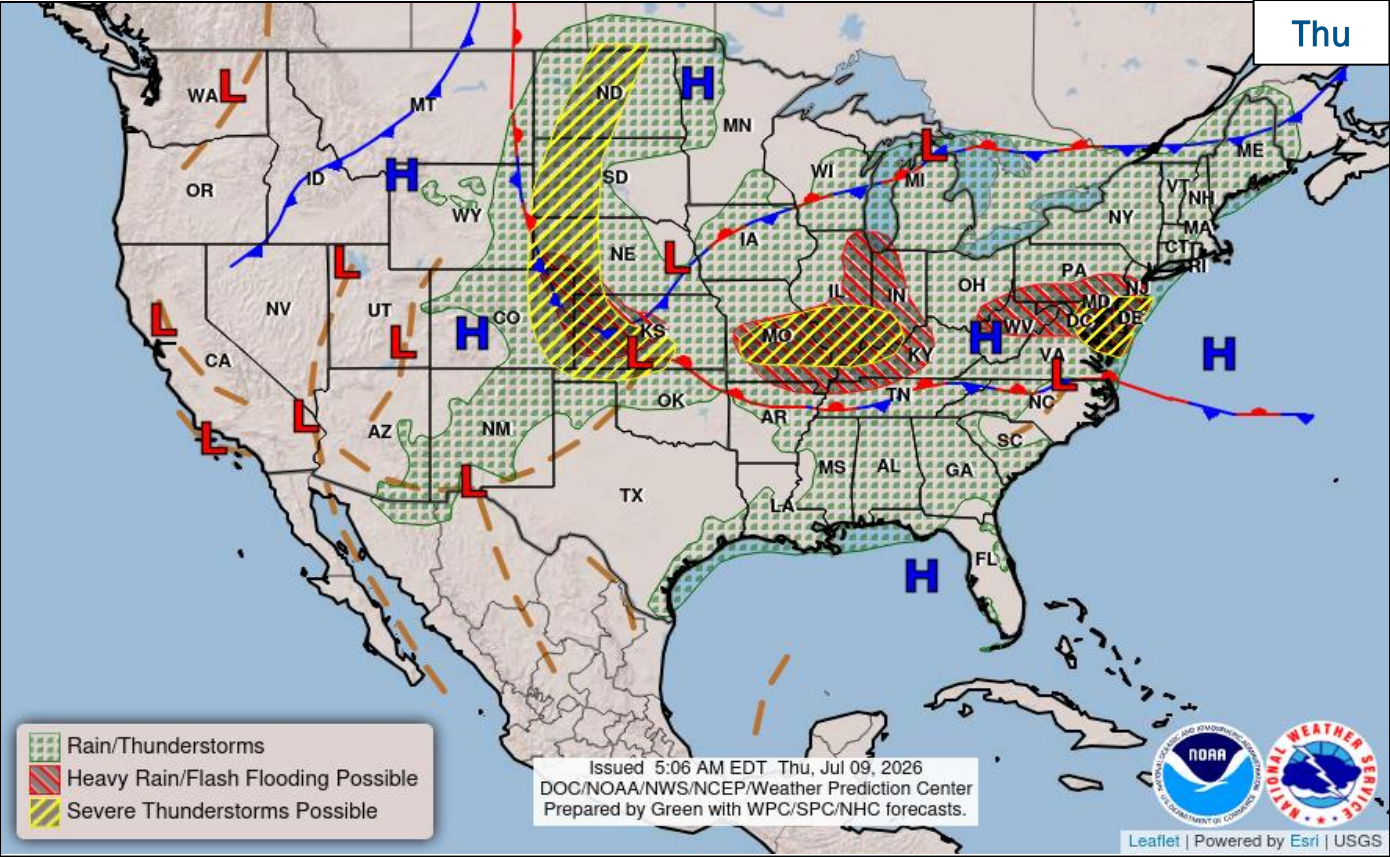

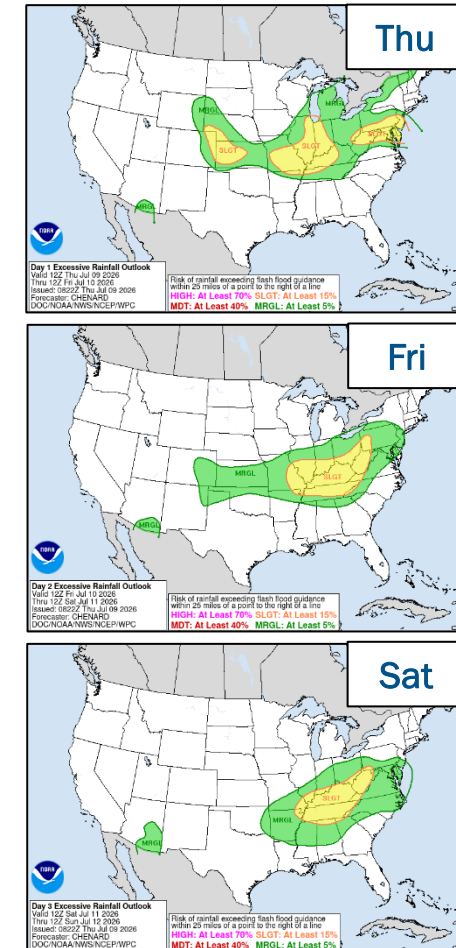
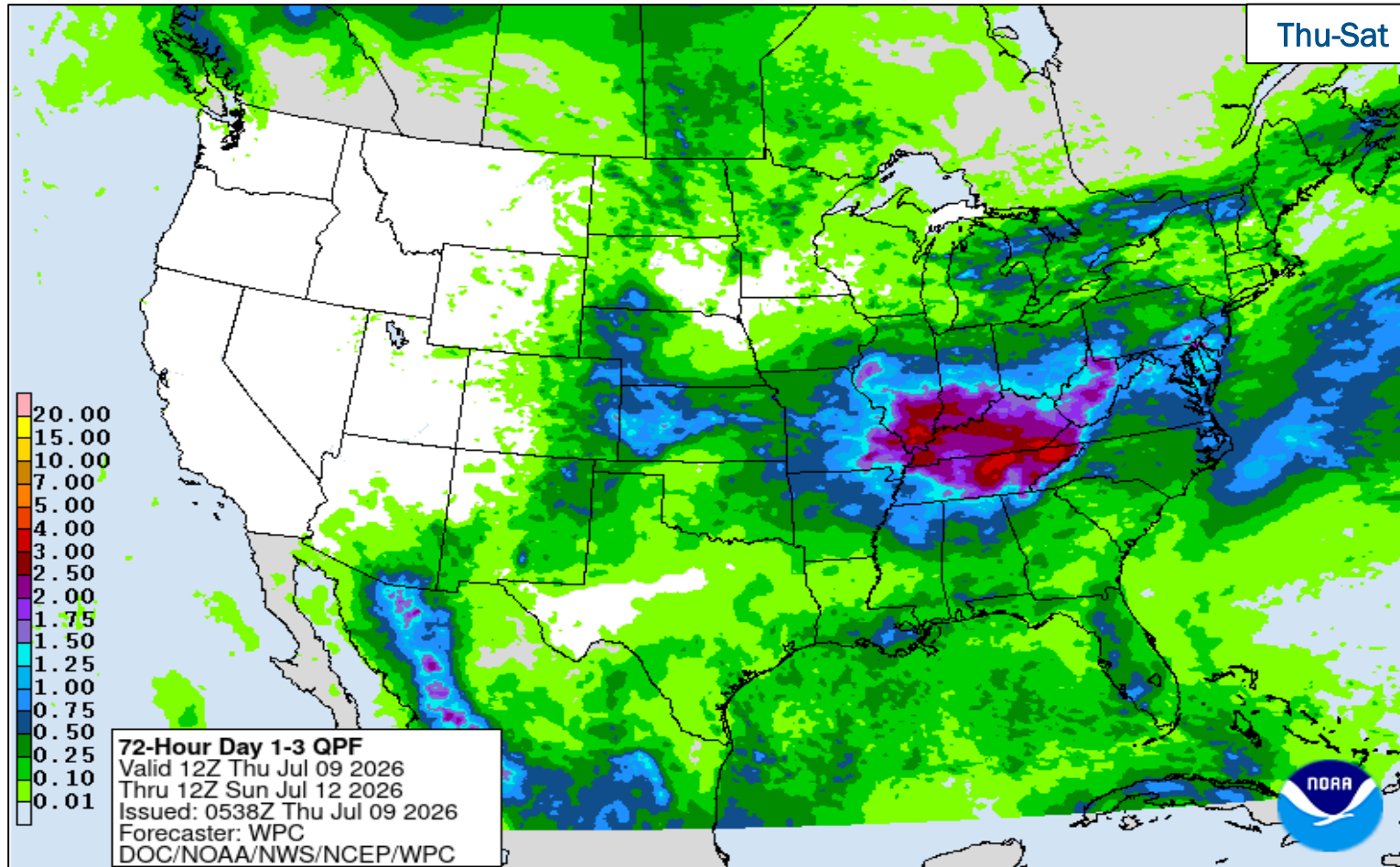
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National Weather Forecast



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Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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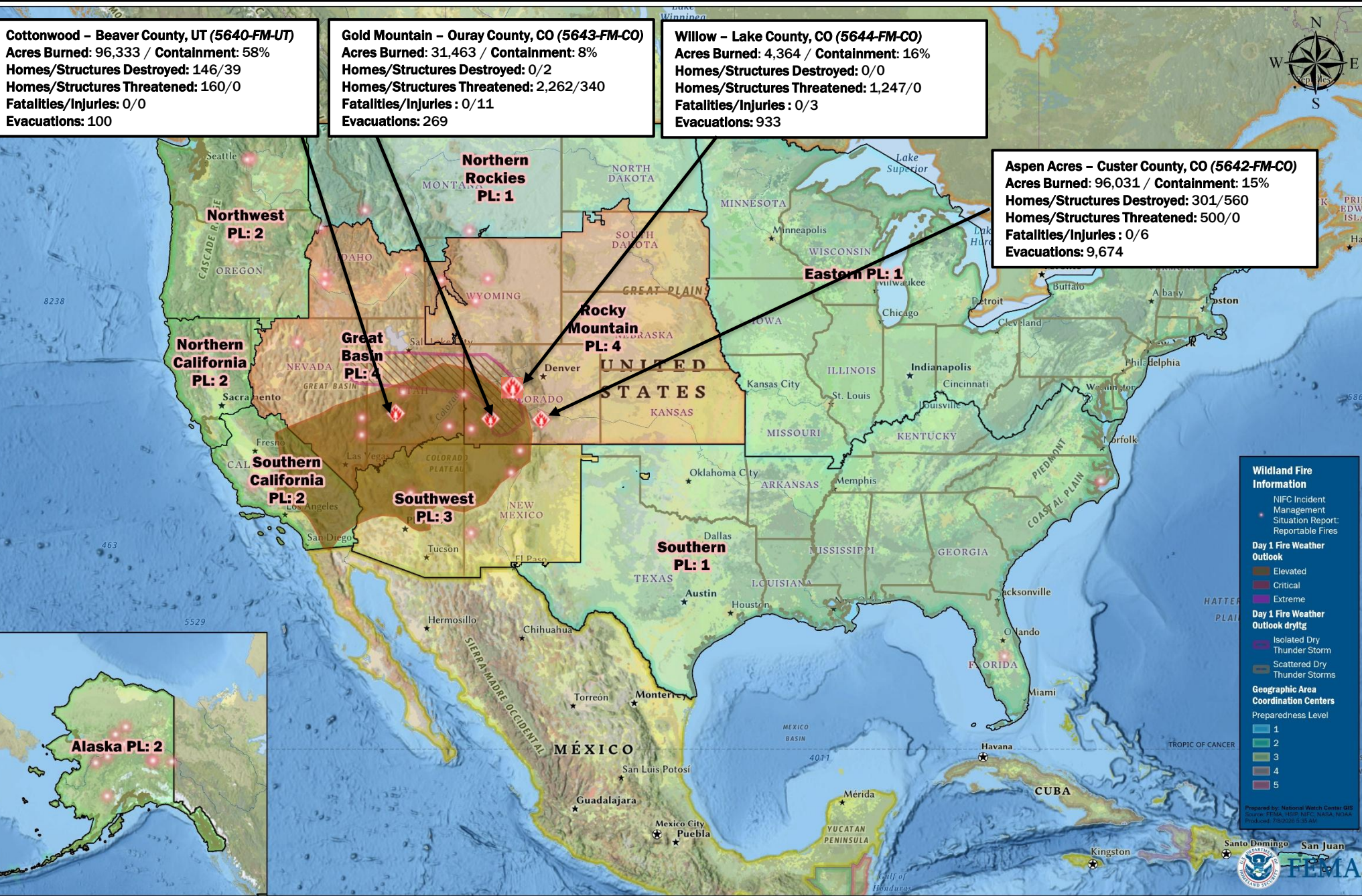

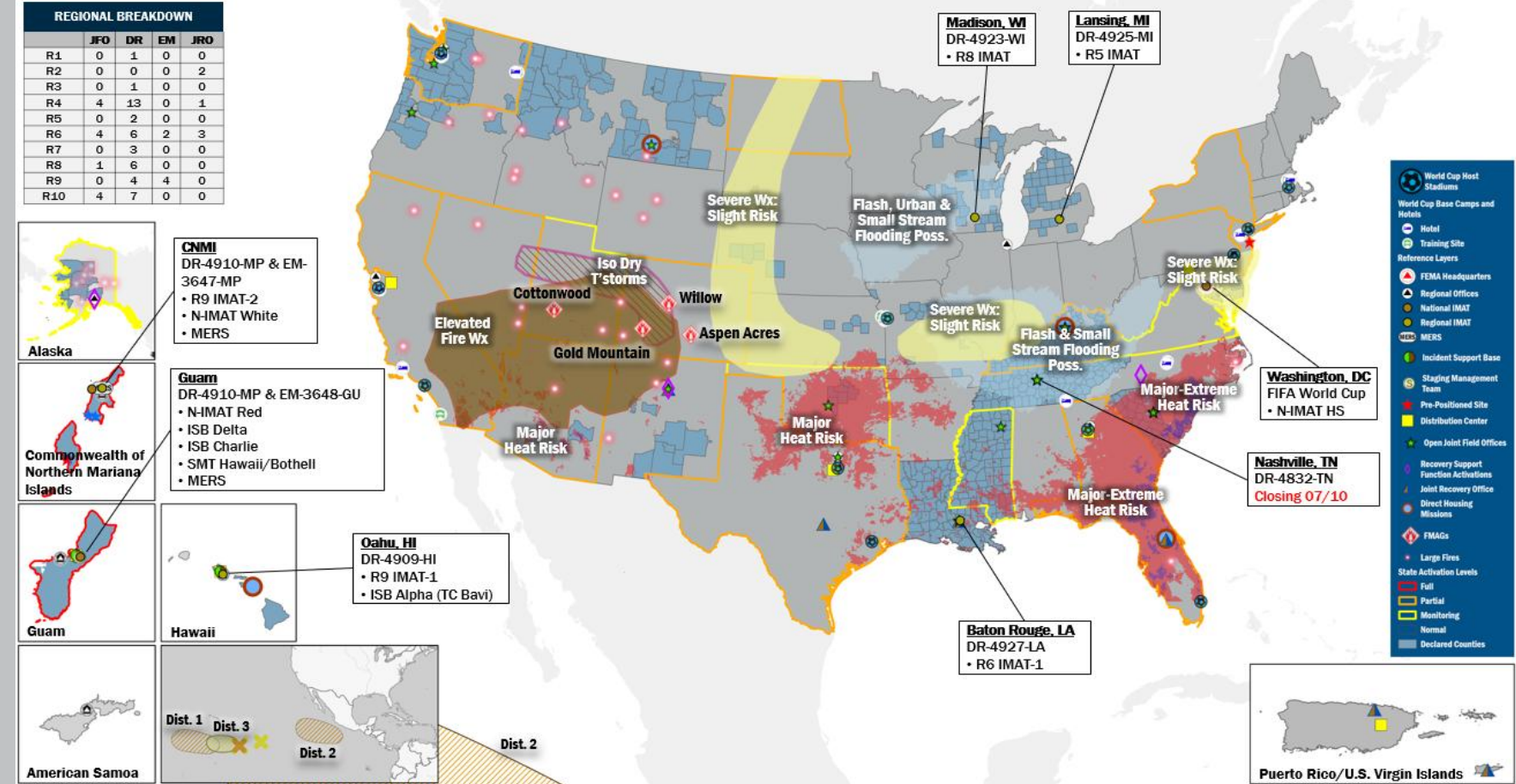

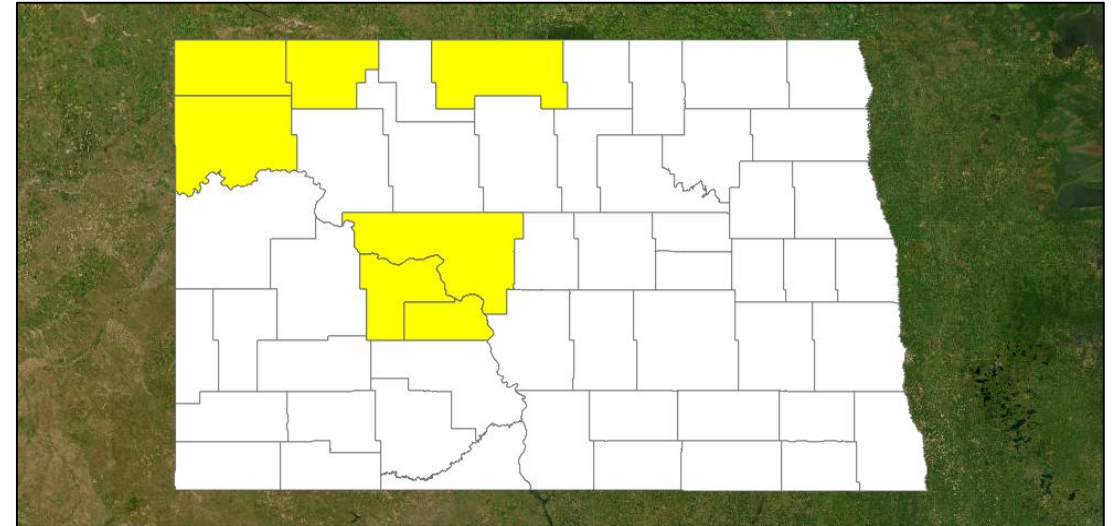
