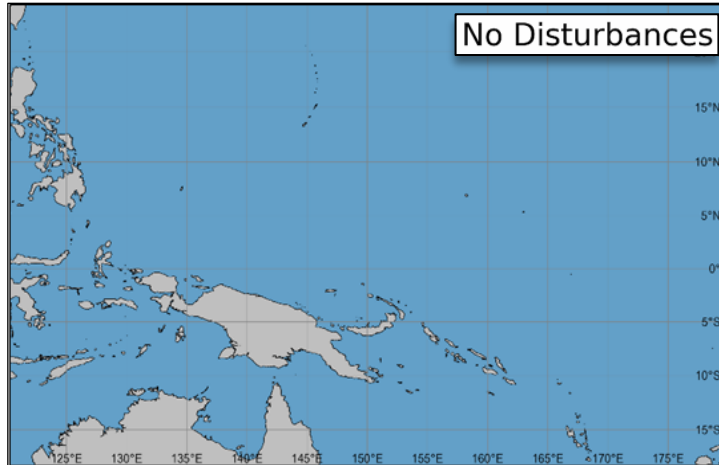

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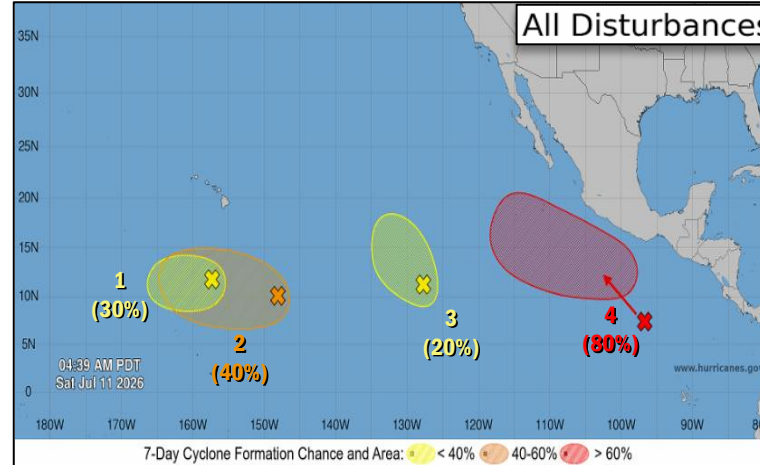

- Moving W; [Further development of the system is diminishing](#)
- Formation chance – 48-hour: [Low \(near 0%\)](#); 7-day: [Low \(30%\)](#)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located [several hundred miles SE of the Hawaiian Islands](#)
- Moving W; Environmental conditions appear favorable for [gradual development and a tropical depression could form next week](#)
- Formation chance – 48-hour: [Low \(10%\)](#); 7-day: [Med \(40%\)](#)

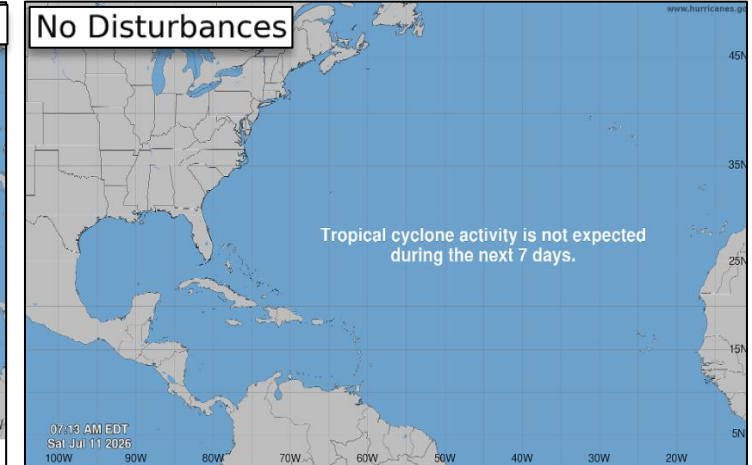
Disturbance 3: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well SW of the Baja California peninsula
- Moving NW; Slow development of this system is possible
- Formation chance – 48-hour: [Low \(10%\)](#); 7-day: [Low \(20%\)](#)

Disturbance 4: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located offshore of SSW of Southwestern Mexico
- Moving WNW; Environmental conditions appear favorable for [gradual development and a tropical depression is likely to form by the middle of next week](#)
- Formation chance – 48-hour: [Low \(20%\)](#); 7-day: [High \(80%\)](#)

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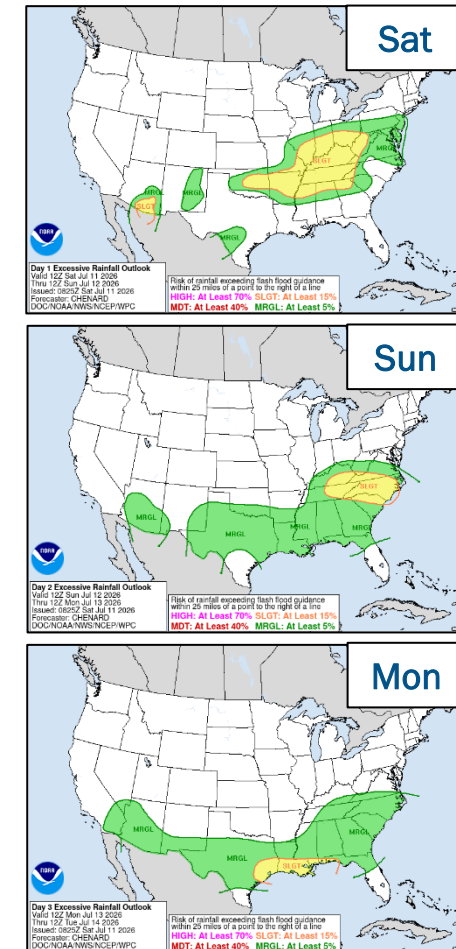
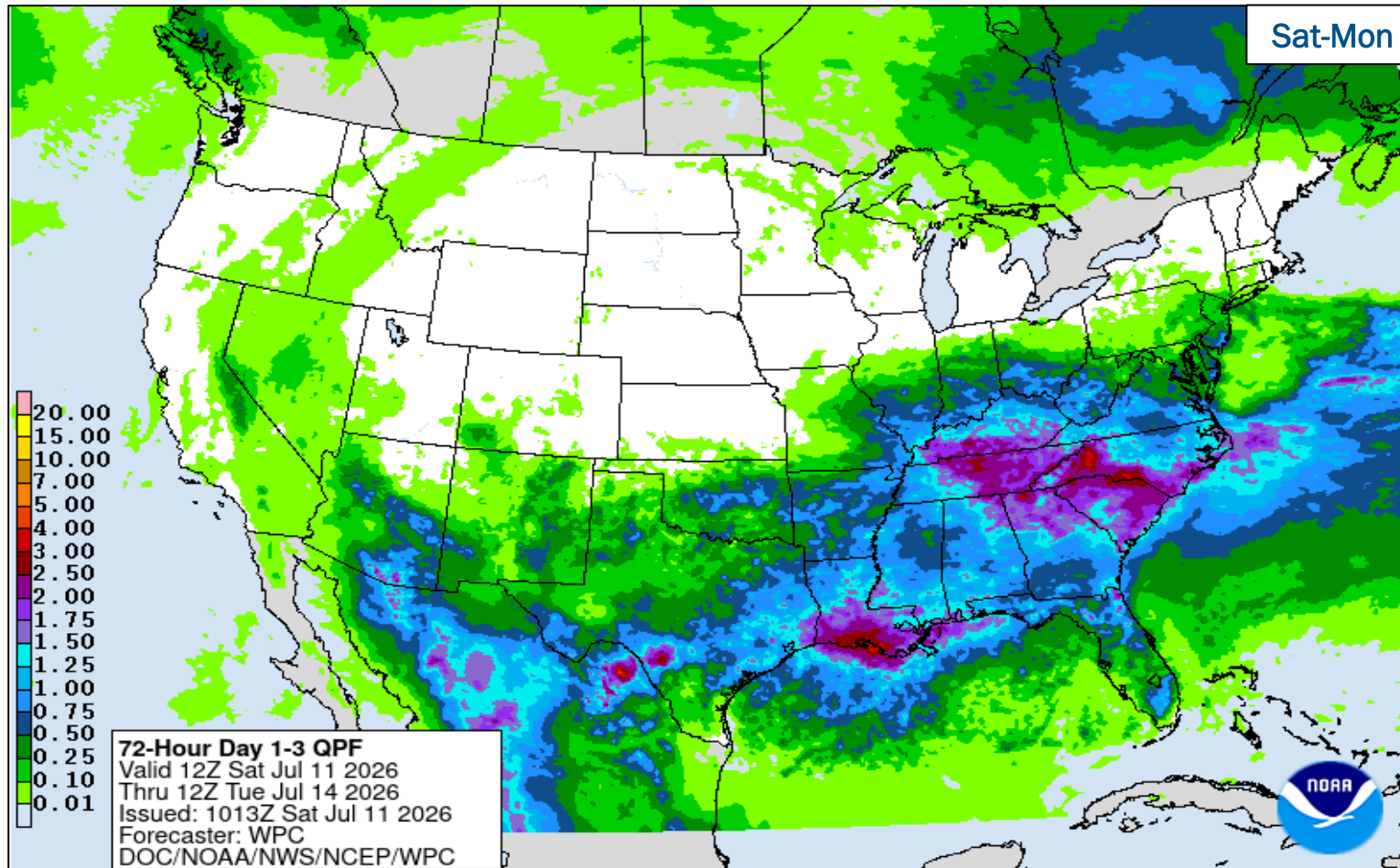
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National Weather Forecast



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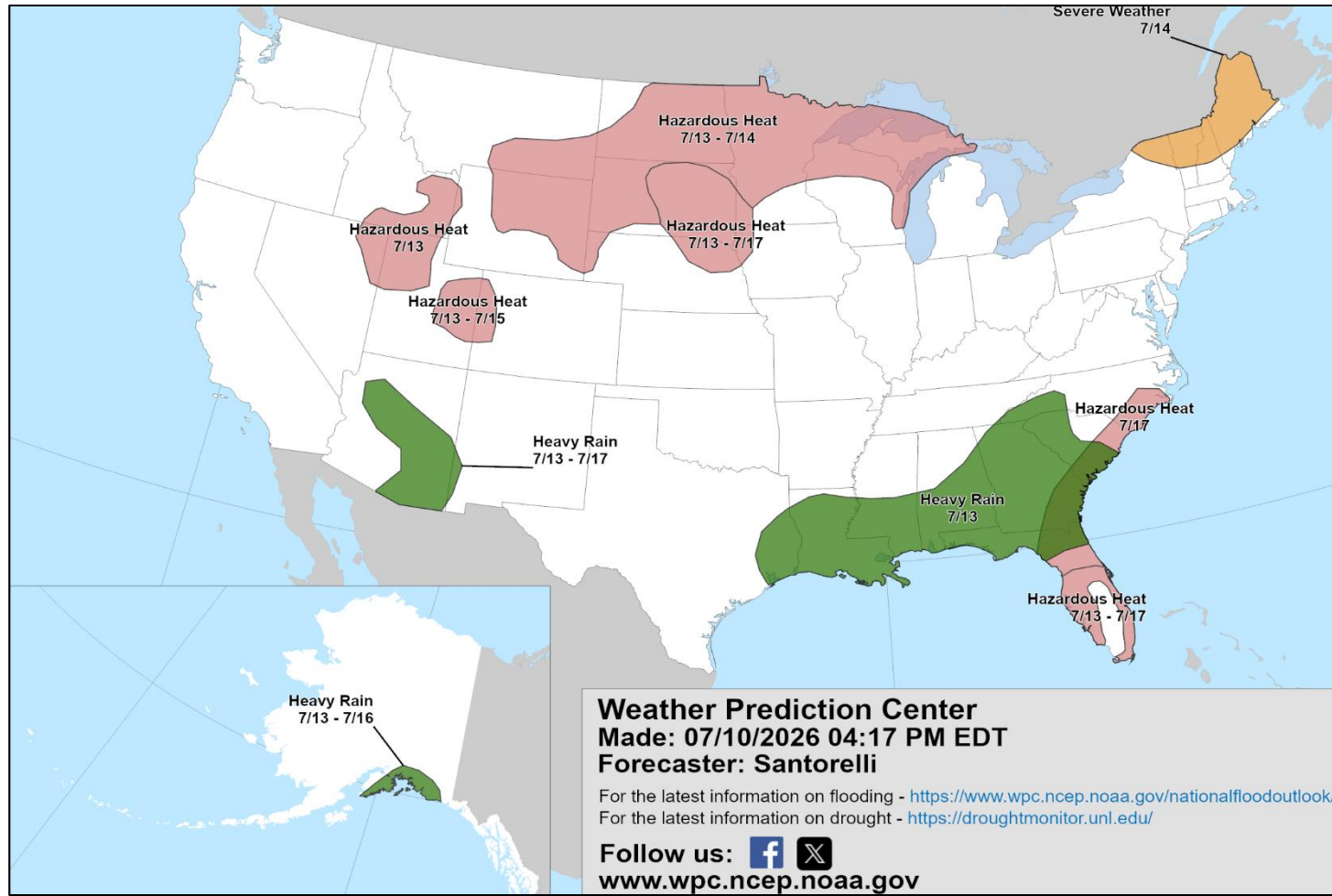
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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Hazards Outlook – Jul 14-18



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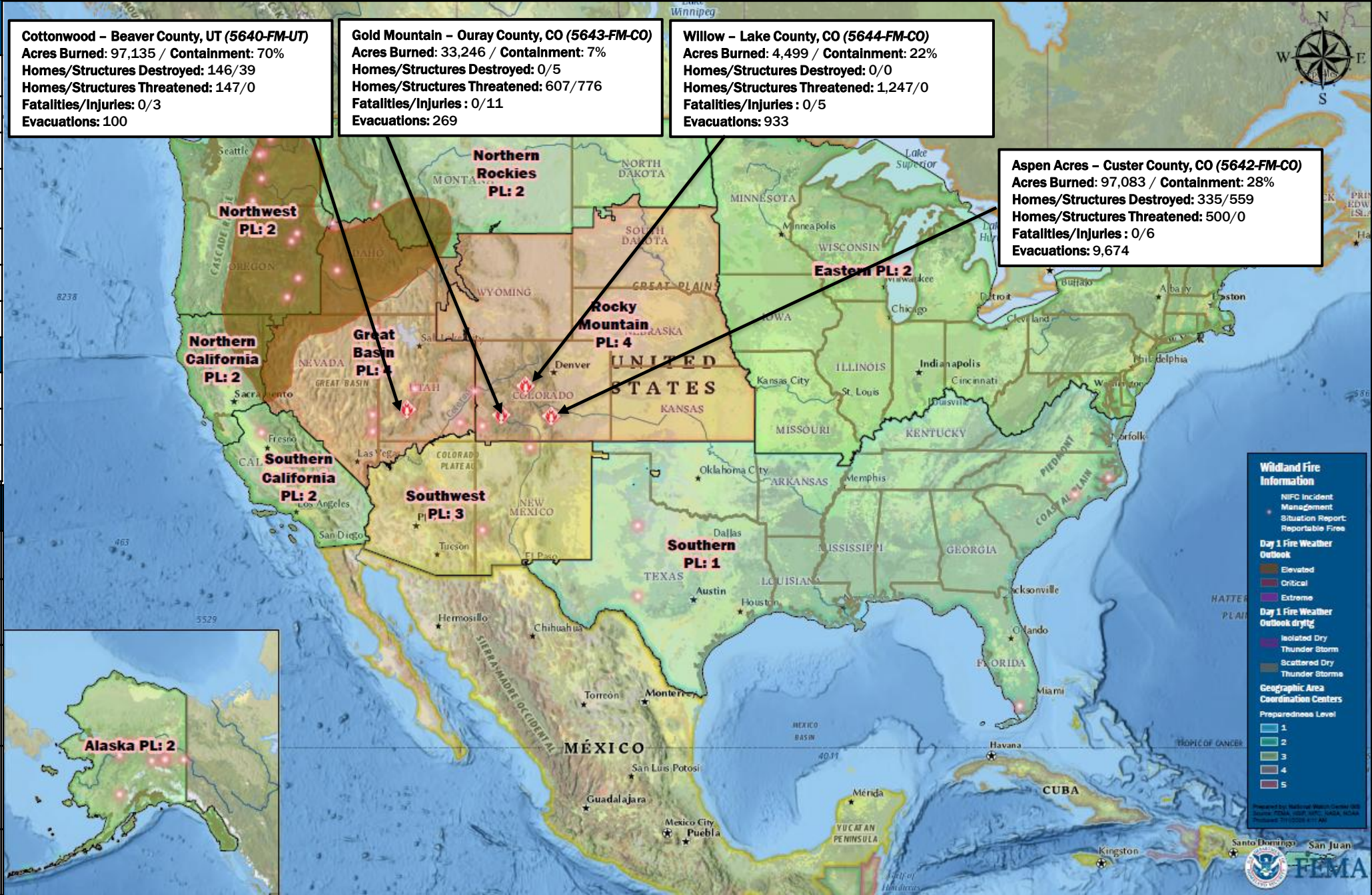

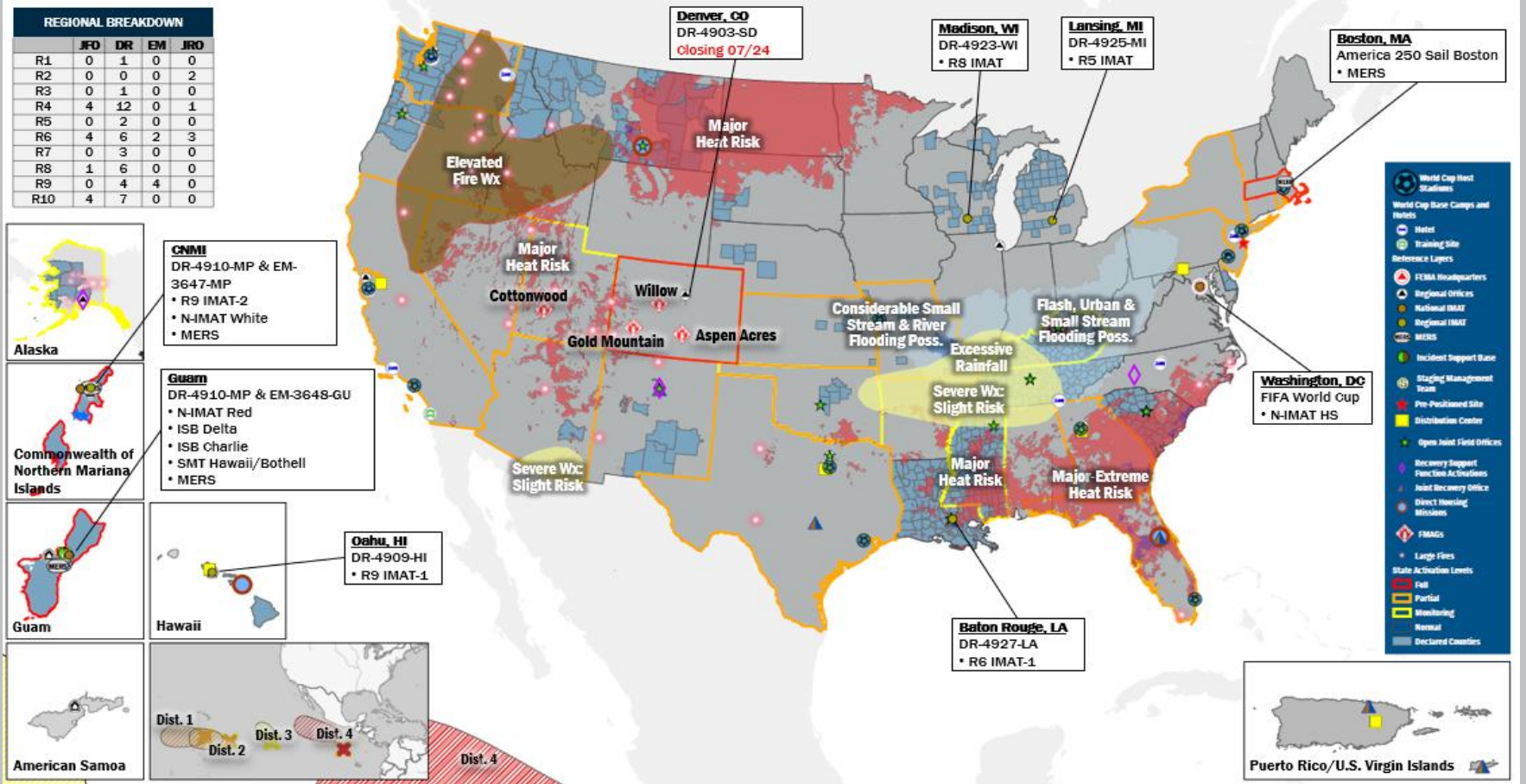

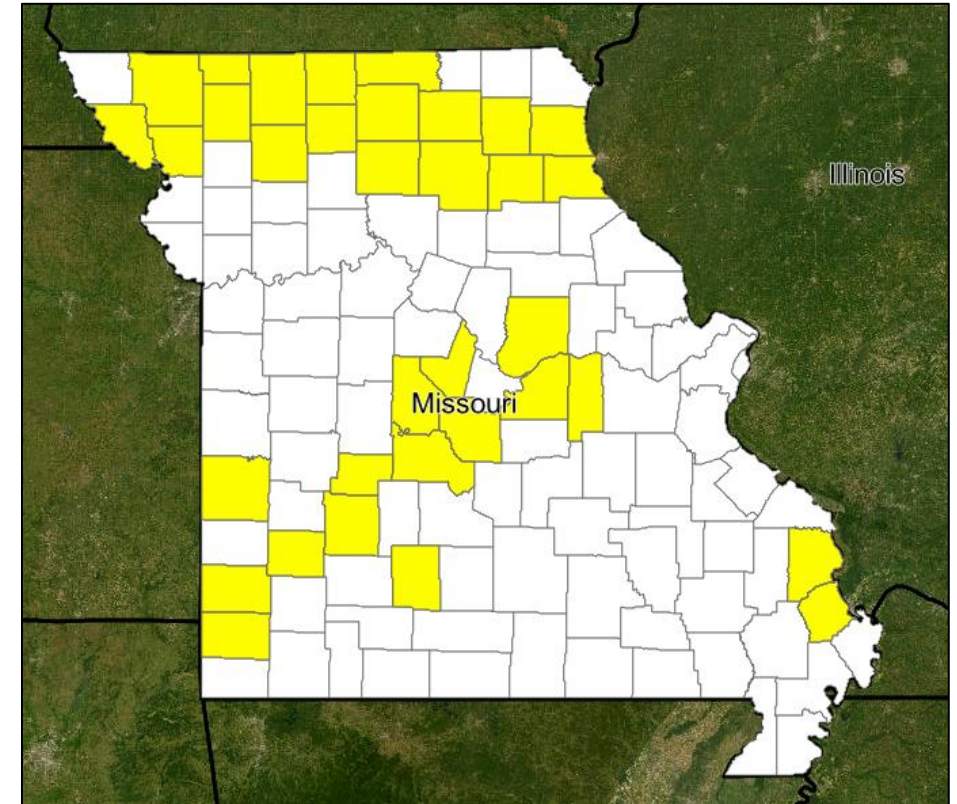
