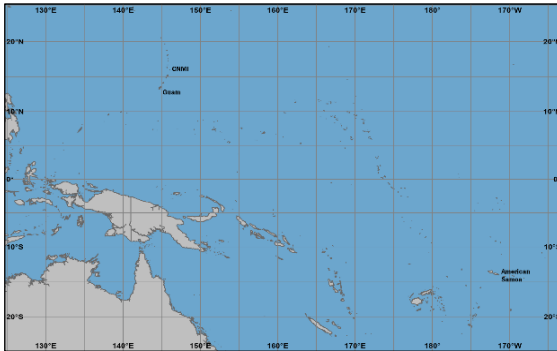

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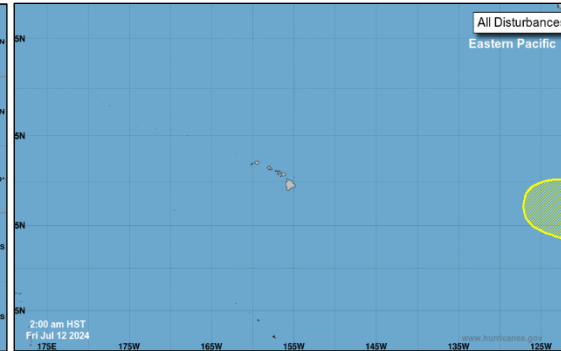

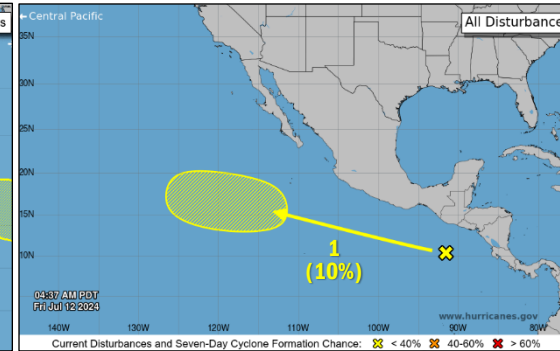

Central Pacific



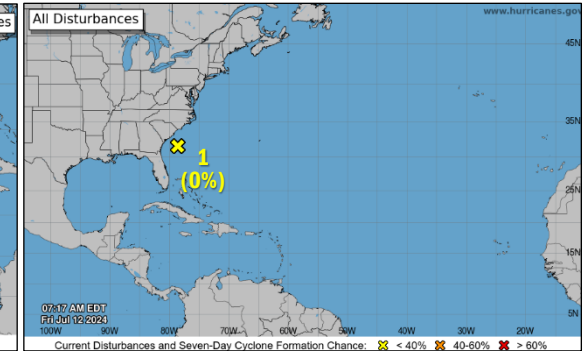

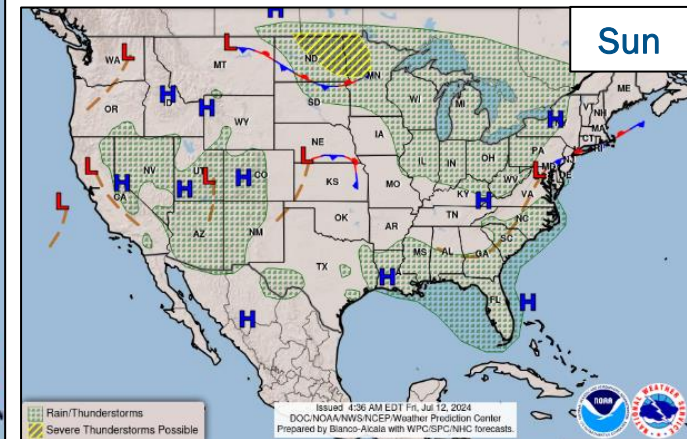
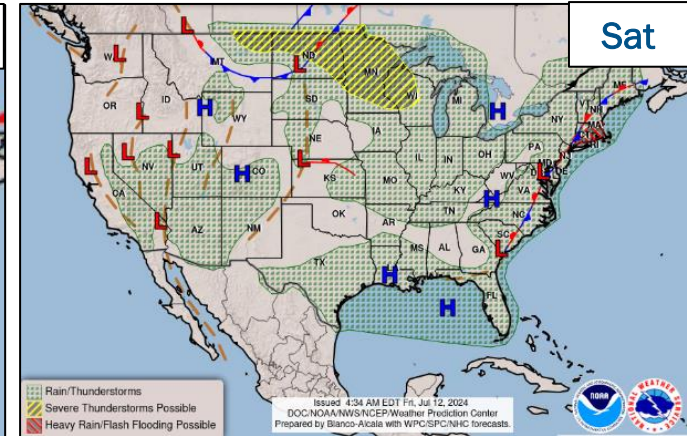
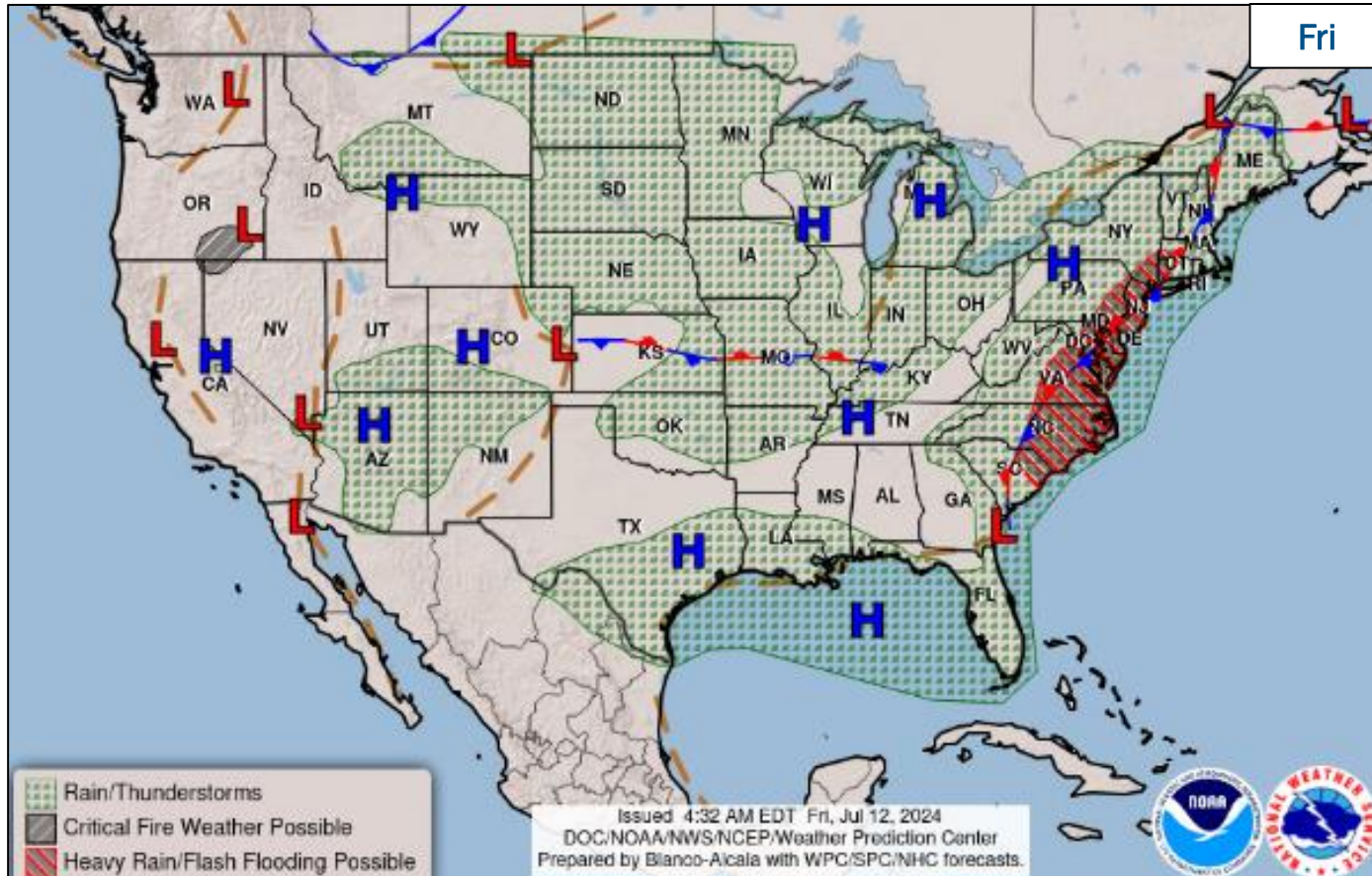


- Disturbance 1:** (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Formation chance: 48 hour: Low (**near 0%**); 7-day: Low (**near 0%**)



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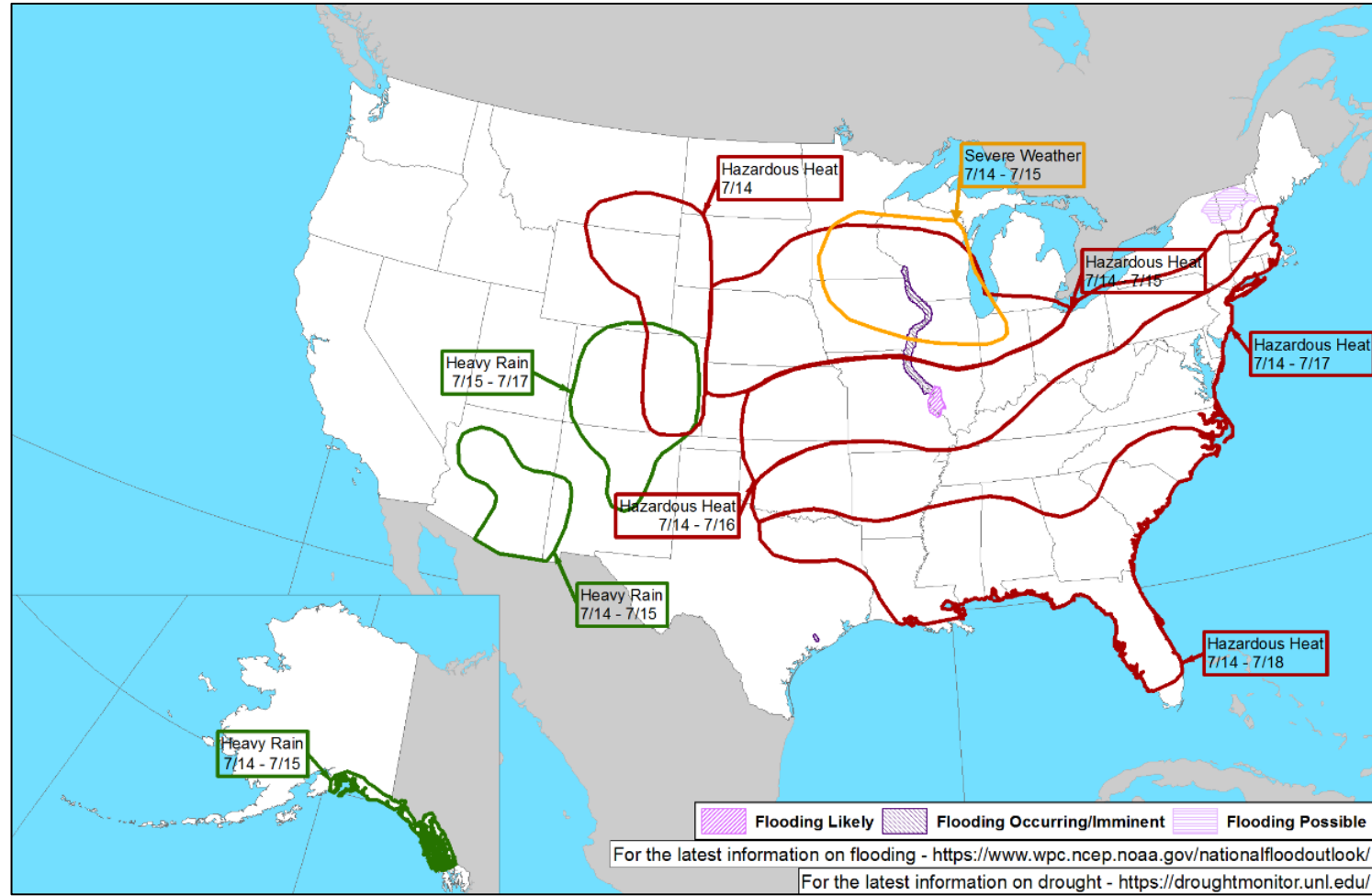

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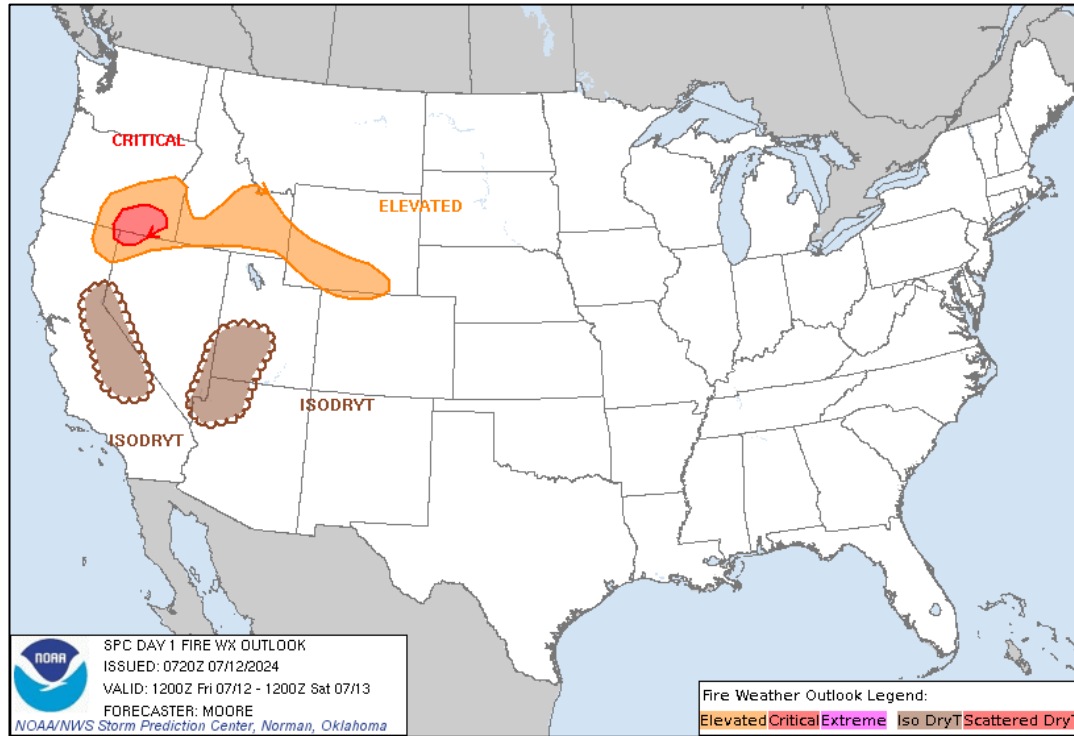

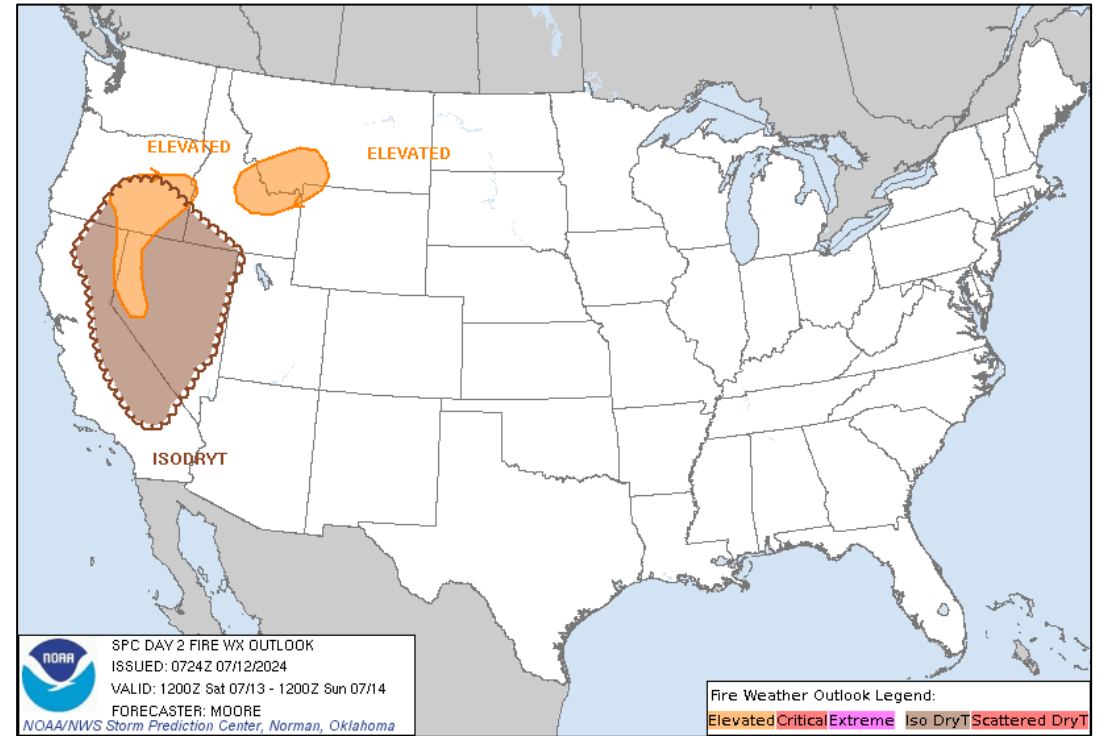


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Fire Weather Outlook

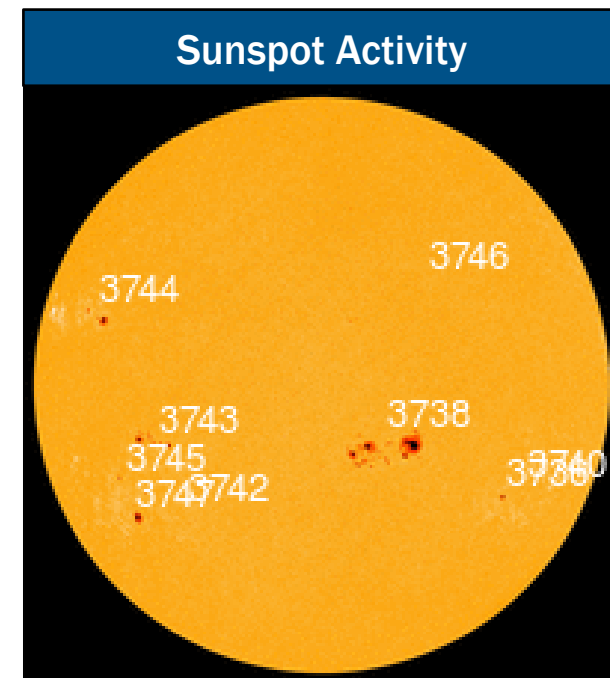
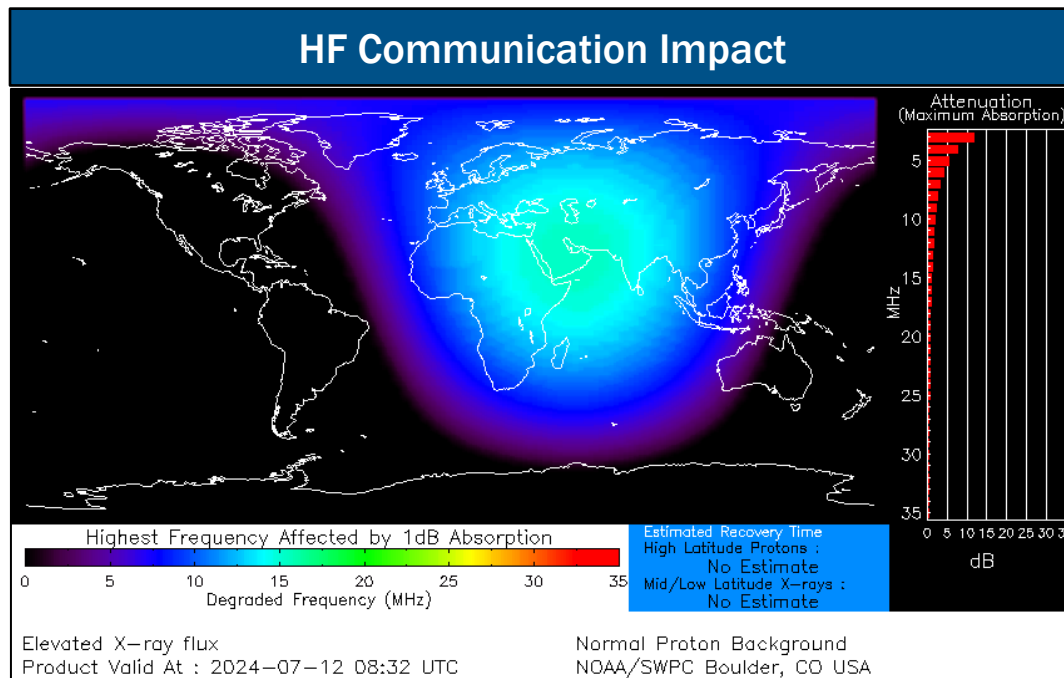

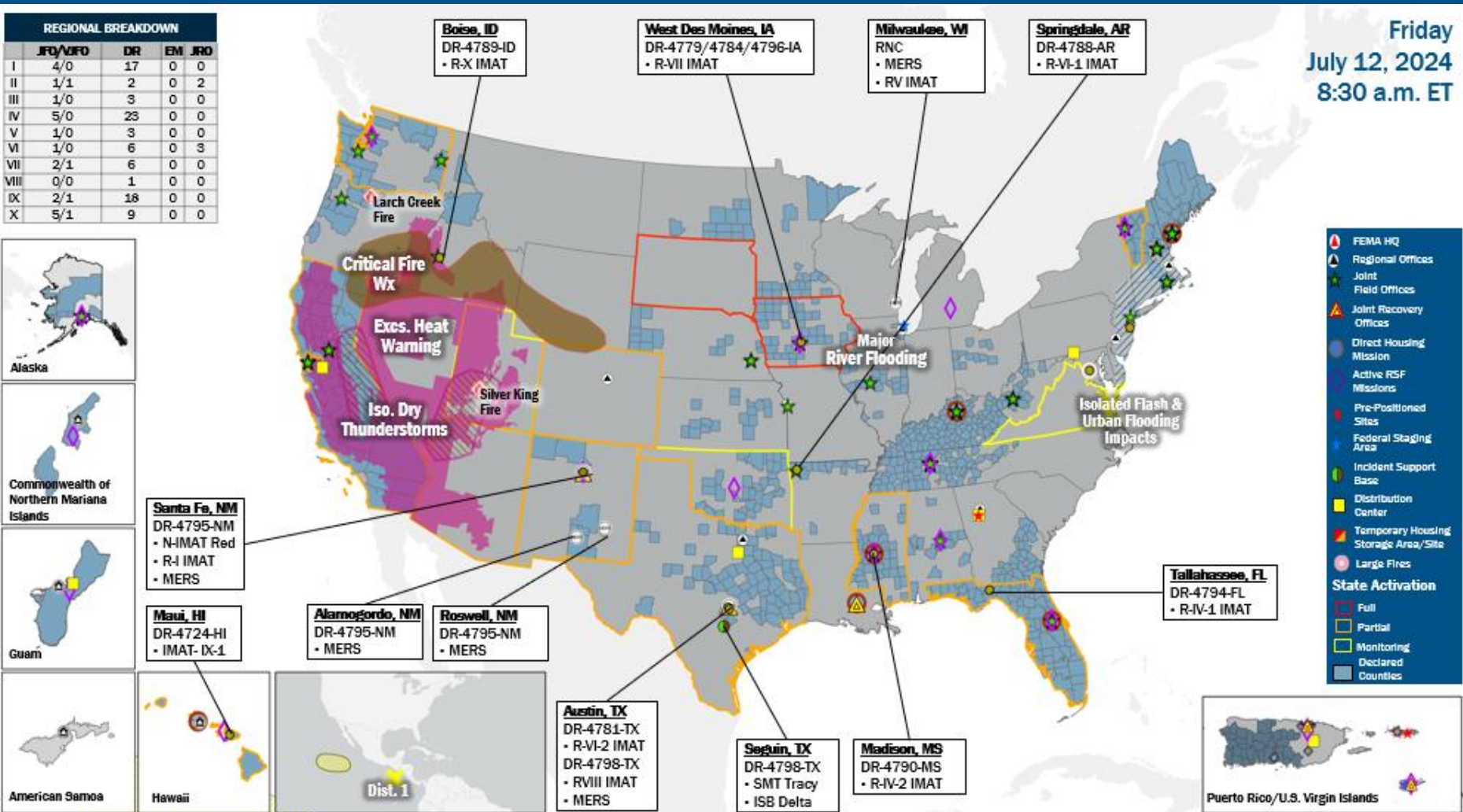
