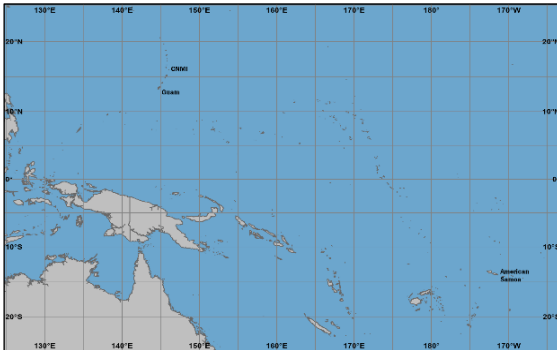

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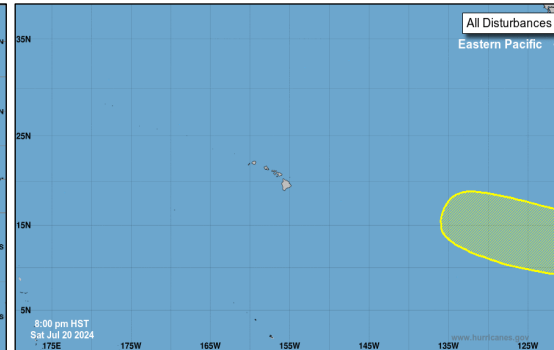

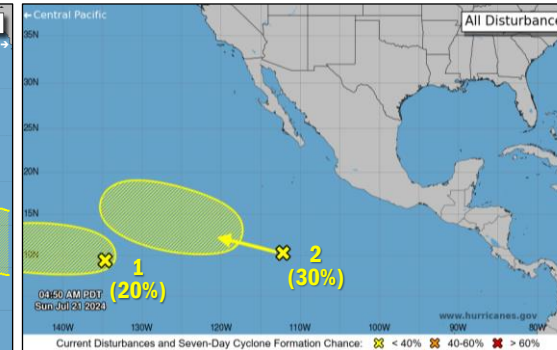

Eastern Pacific



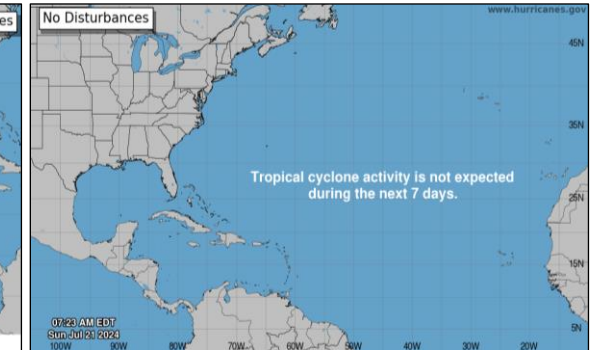
Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well to the south-southwest of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula
- Conditions appear conducive for some gradual development
- Formation chance: 48-hour – Low (near 0%); 7-day – Low (30%)

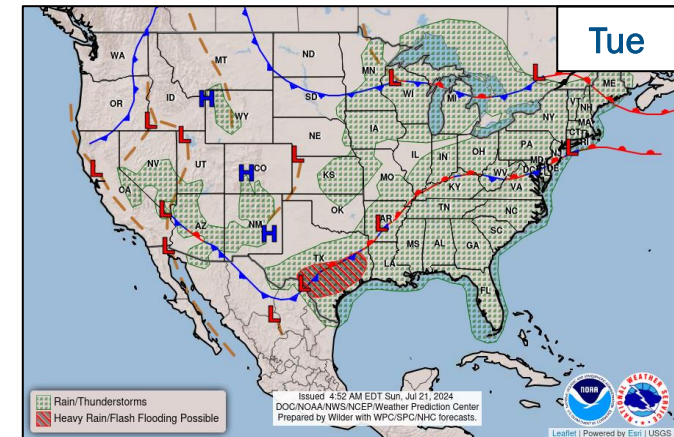

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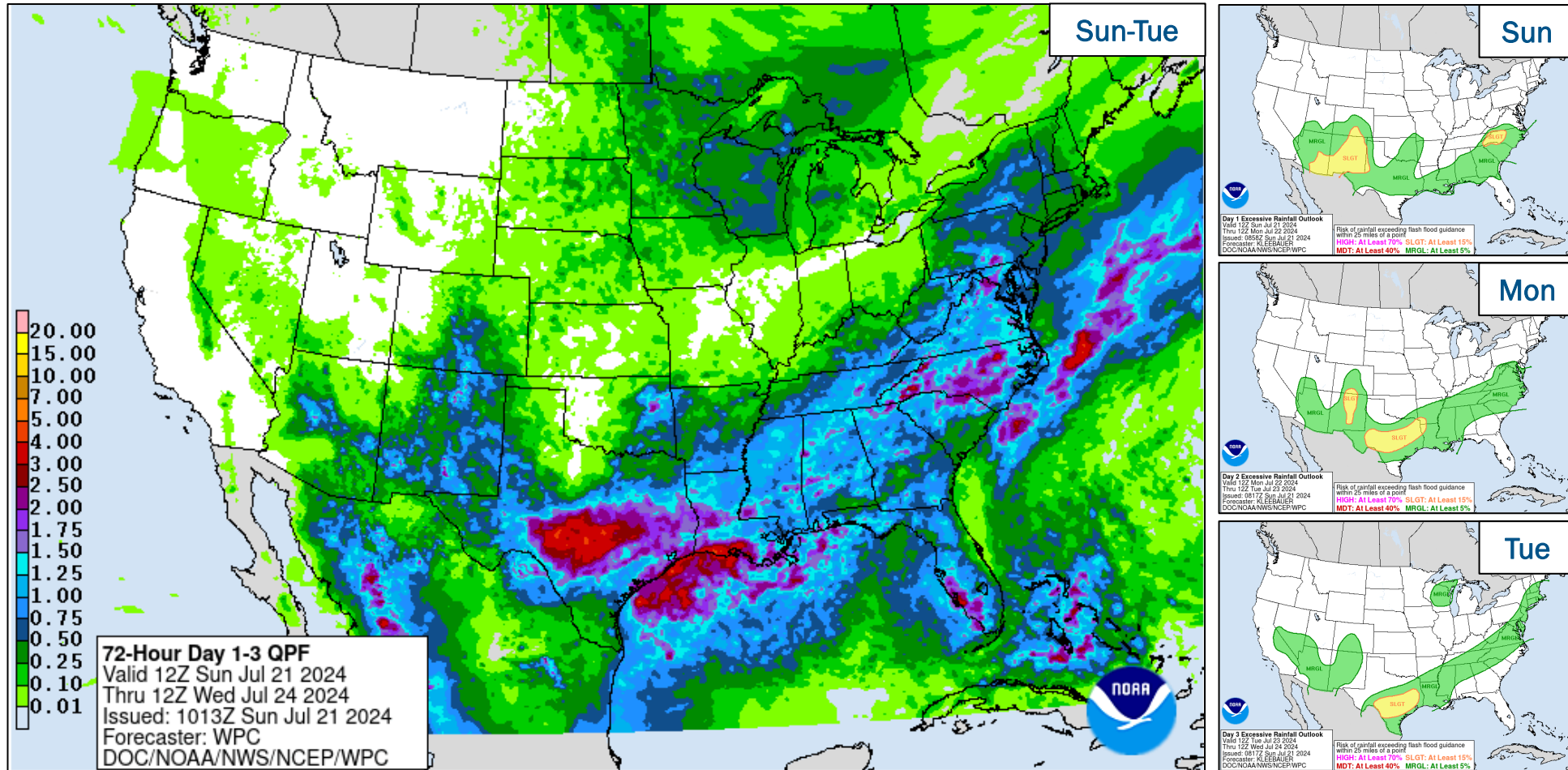
National Weather Forecast



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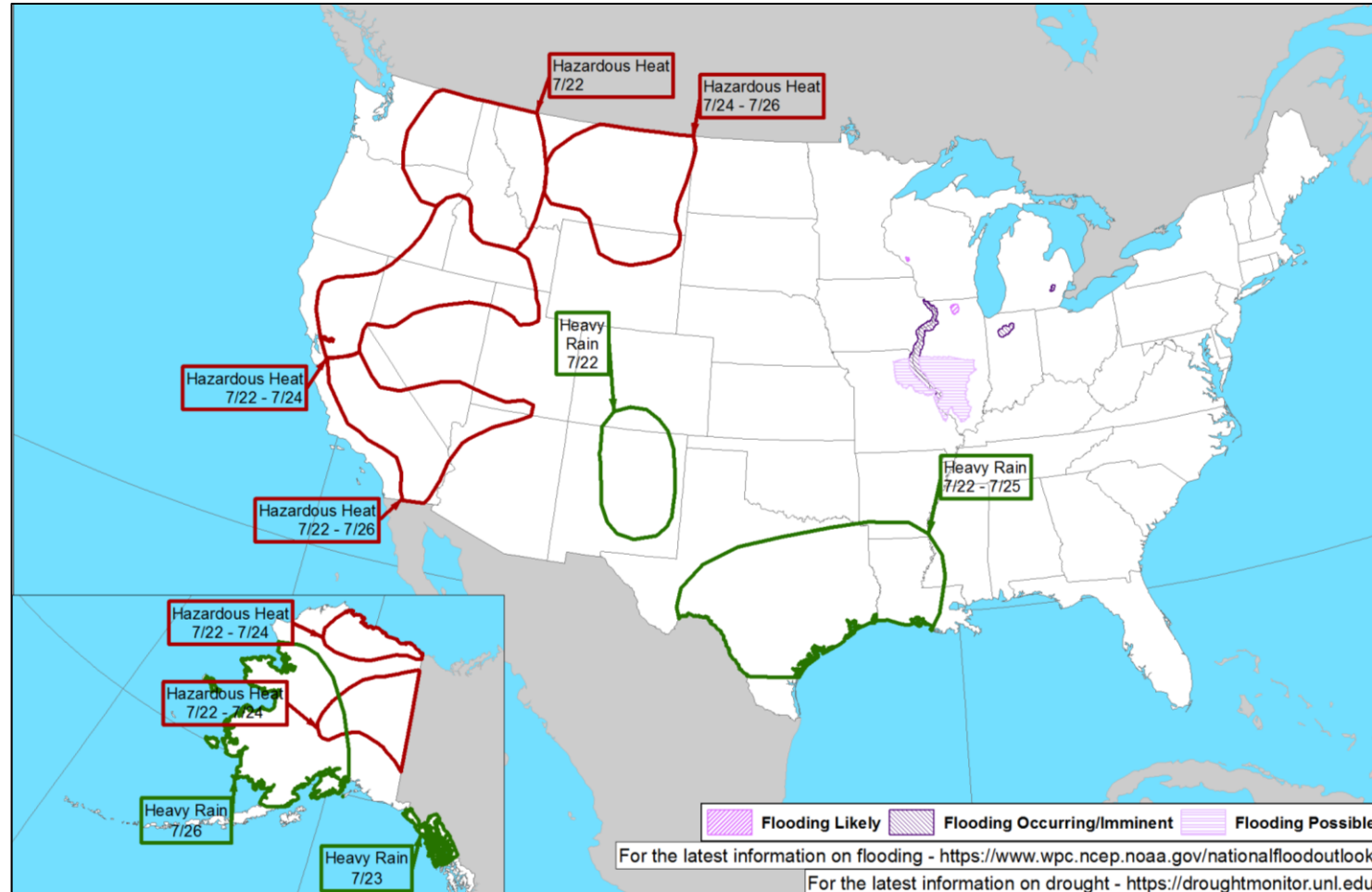
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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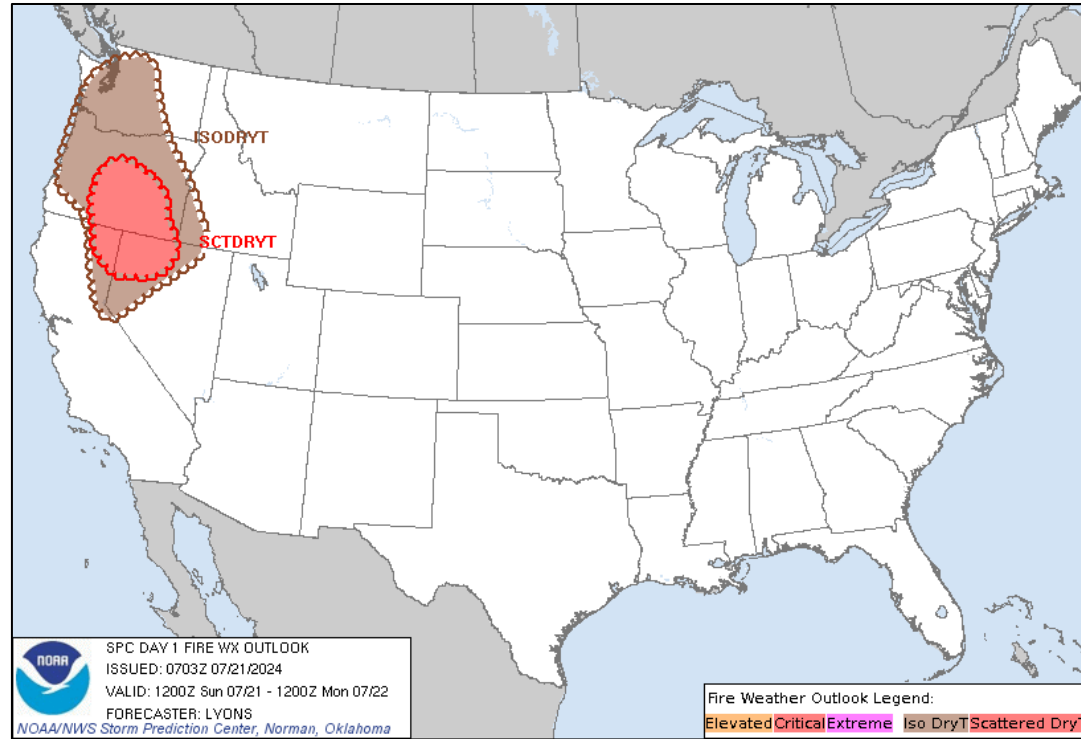

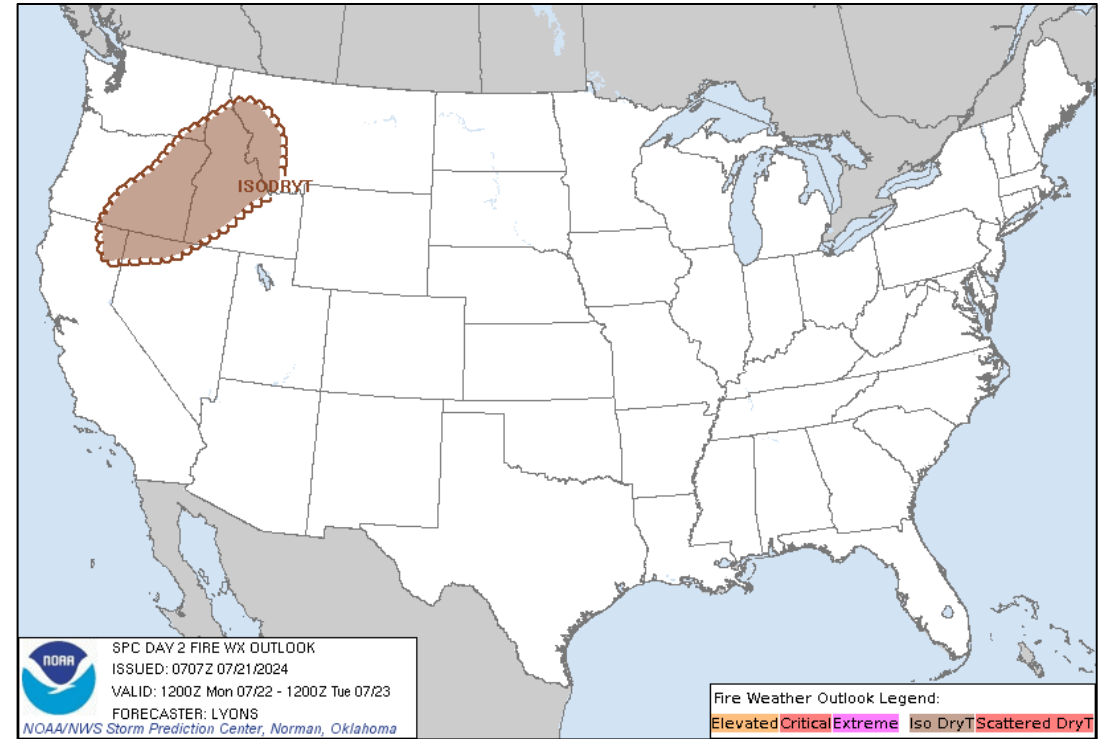


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Fire Weather Outlook

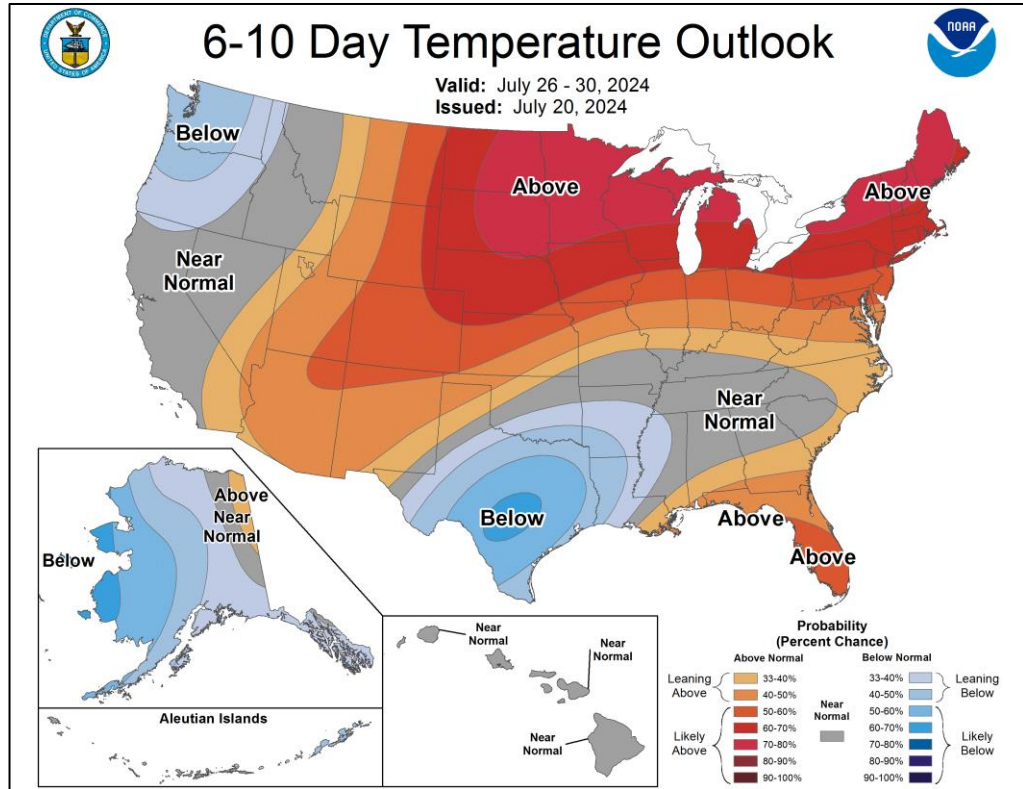

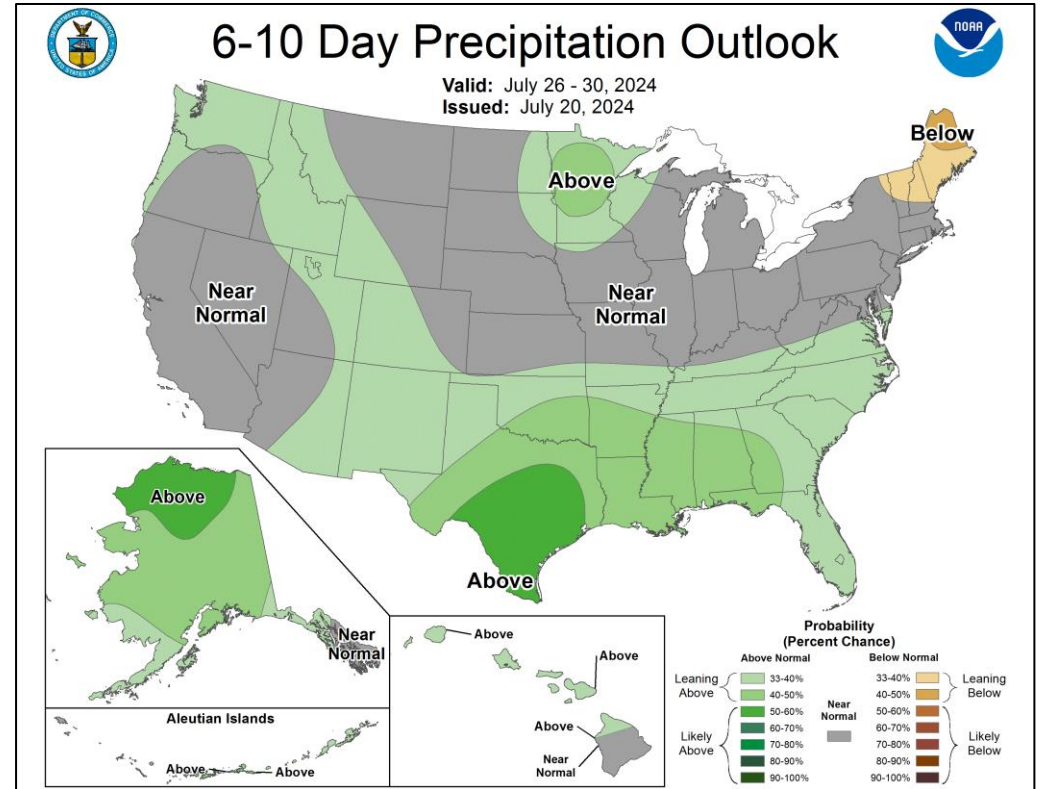
