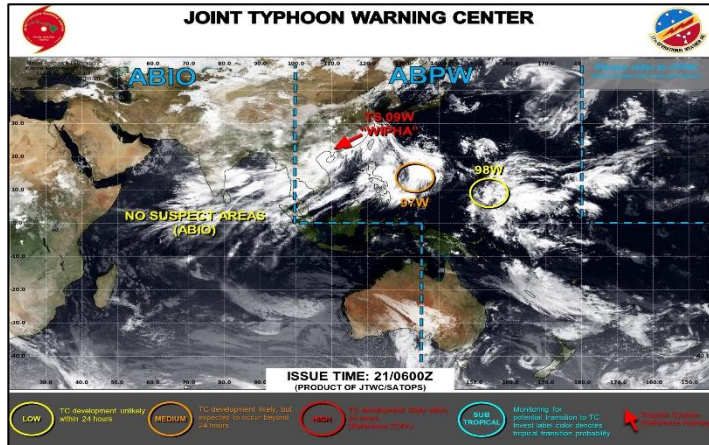

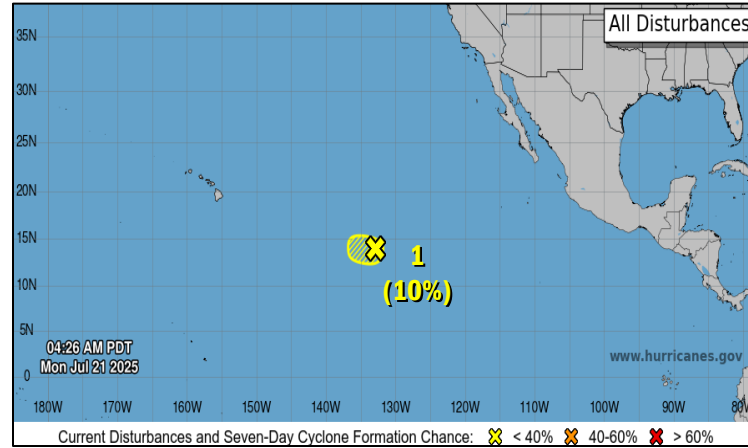

Disturbance 1 (98W): (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 775 miles SE of Guam
- Gradual development is possible over the next 5 days. Regardless of development, heavy rain is likely for Guam and CNMI by mid-week
- Formation chance – 24-hour: Low

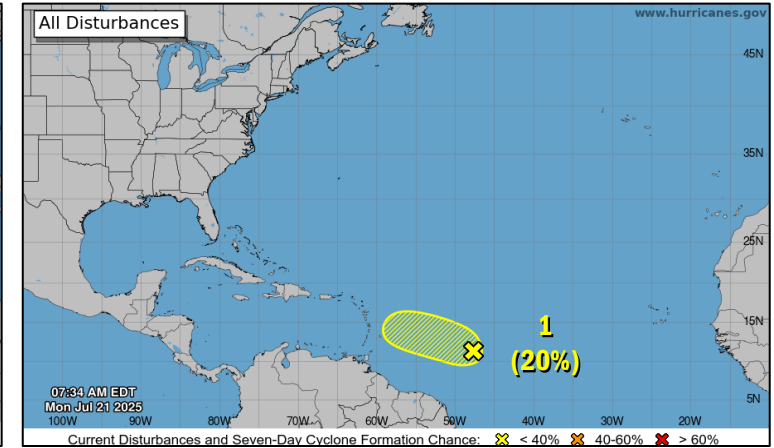
Central and Eastern Pacific

- Located well WSW of the Baja California peninsula
- Development, if any, is expected to be slow to occur during the next day or so
- Formation chance – 48 hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (10%)

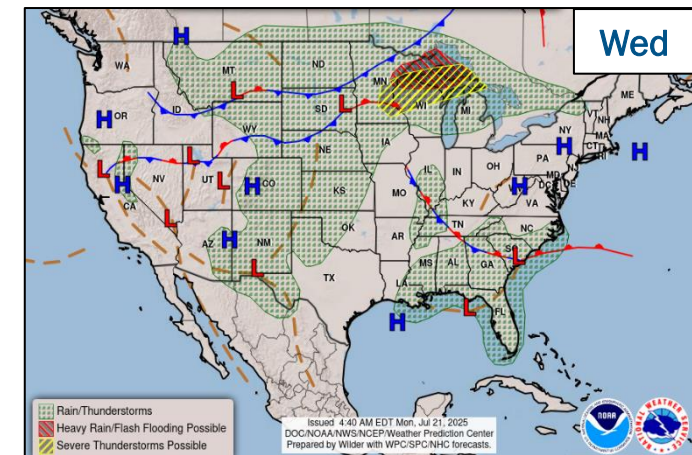
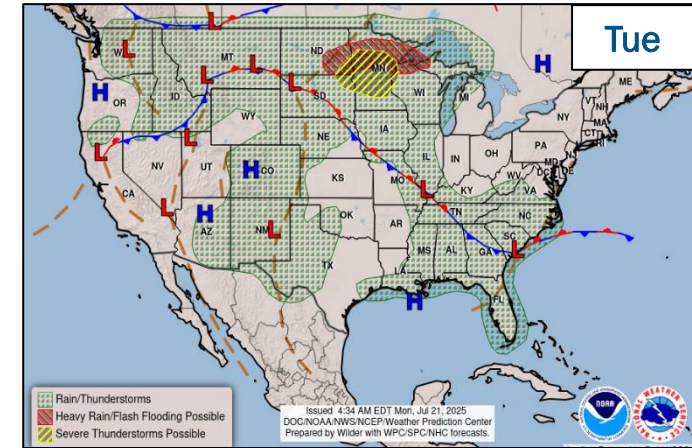
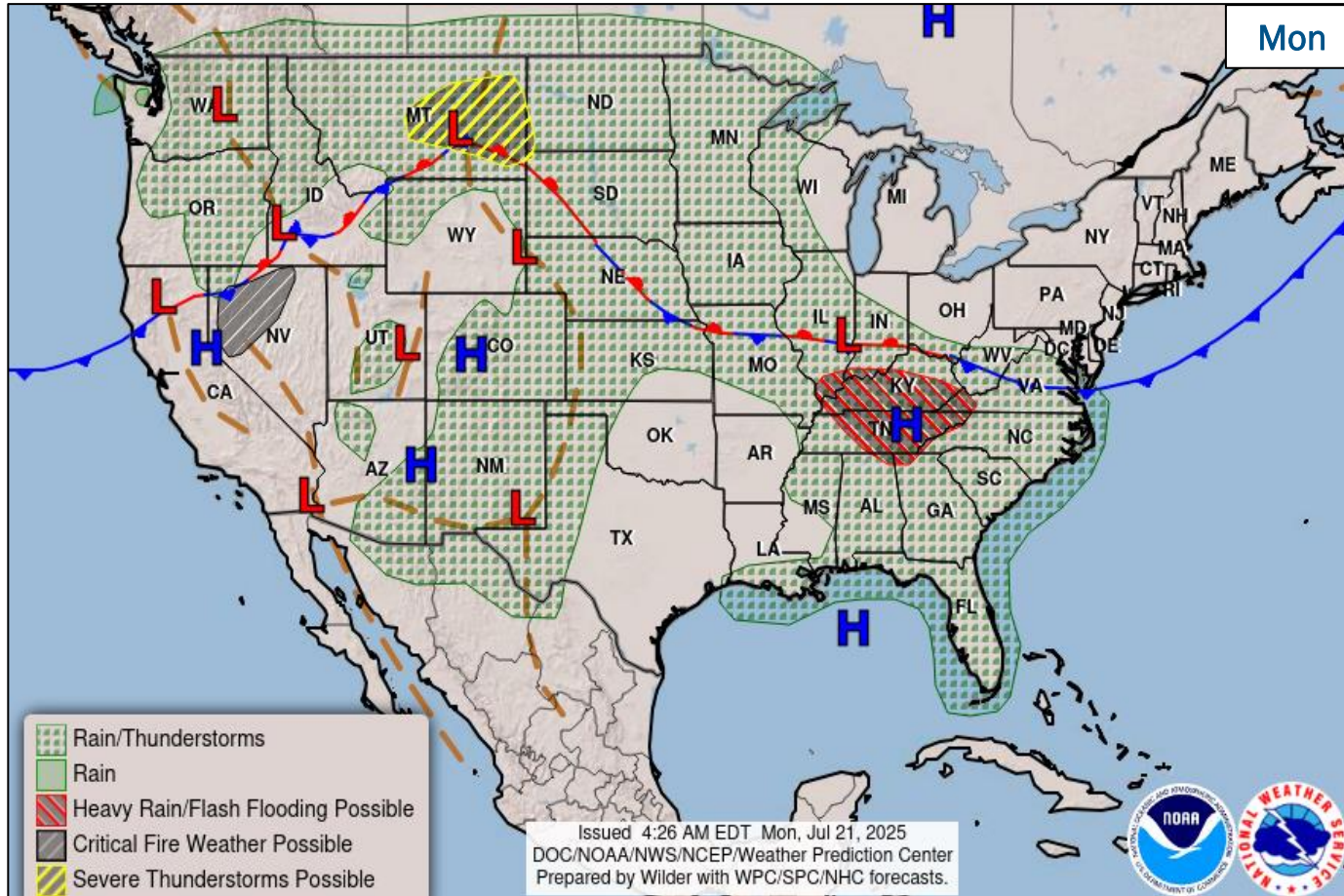
Disturbance 1 (AL94): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Formation chance – 48-hours: Low (20%); 7-days: Low (20%)



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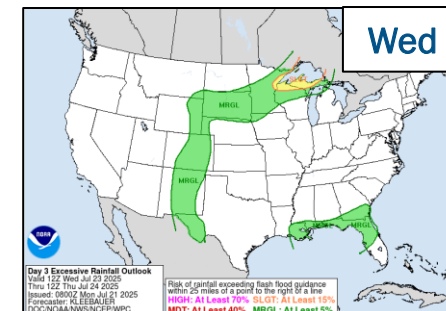
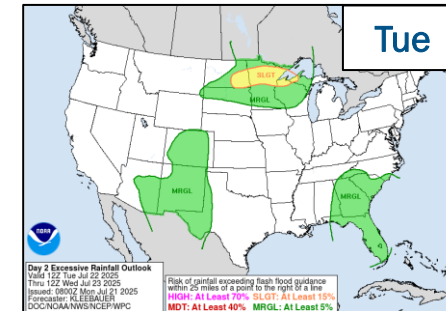
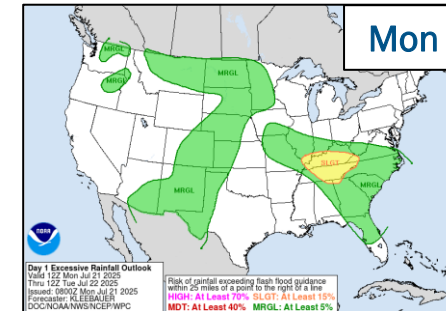
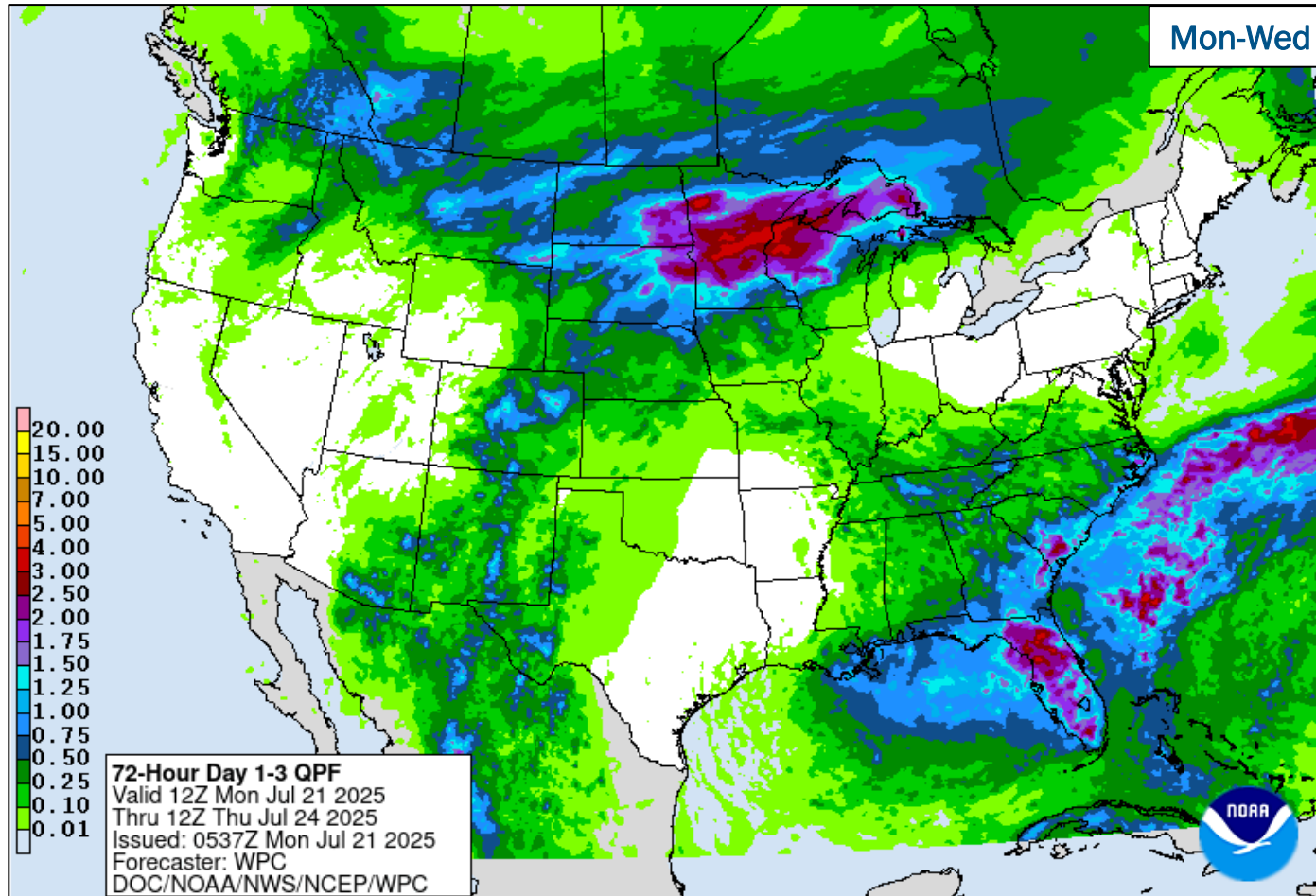
National Weather Forecast



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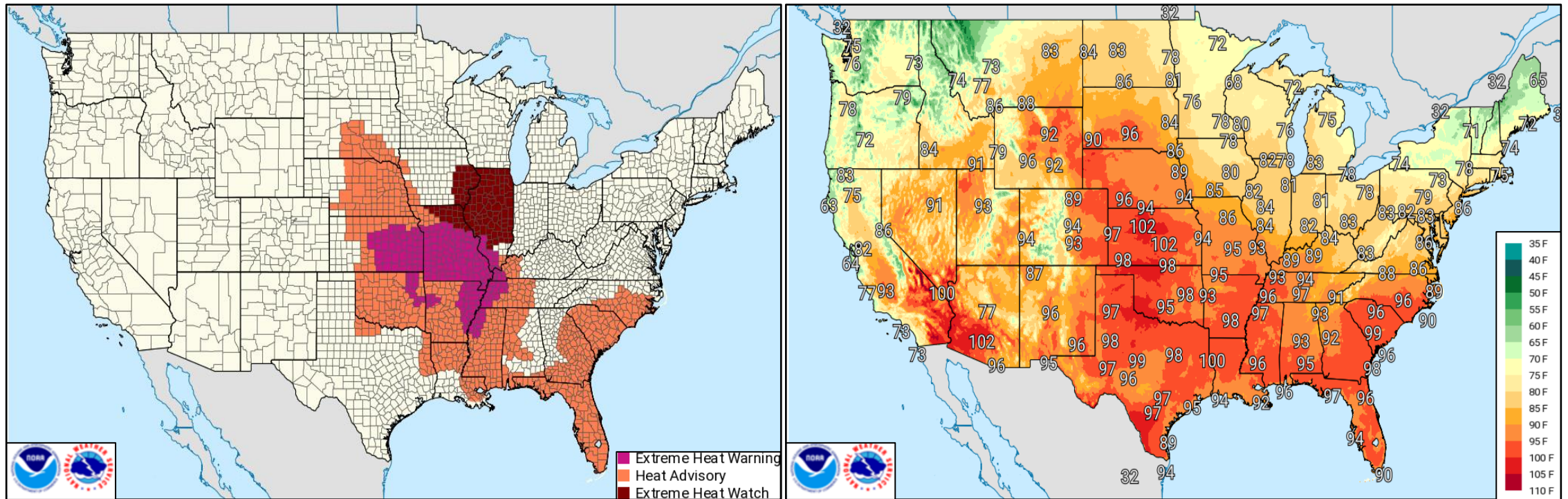
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall

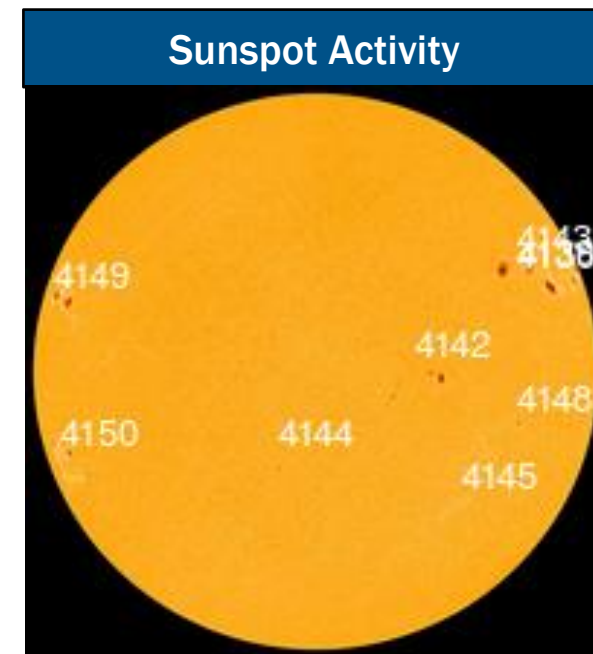
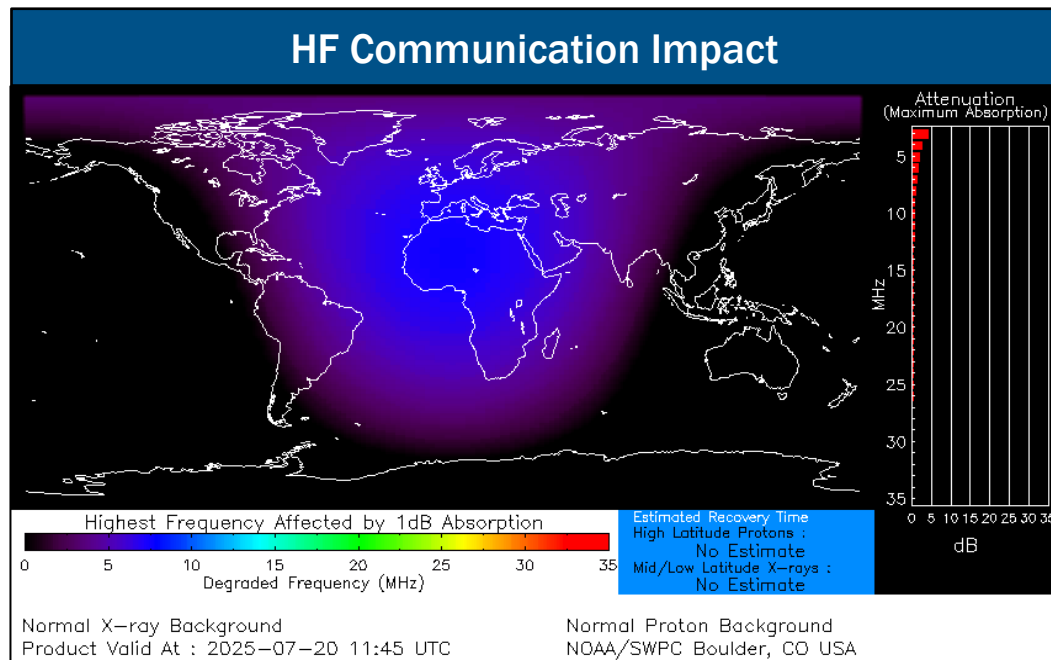

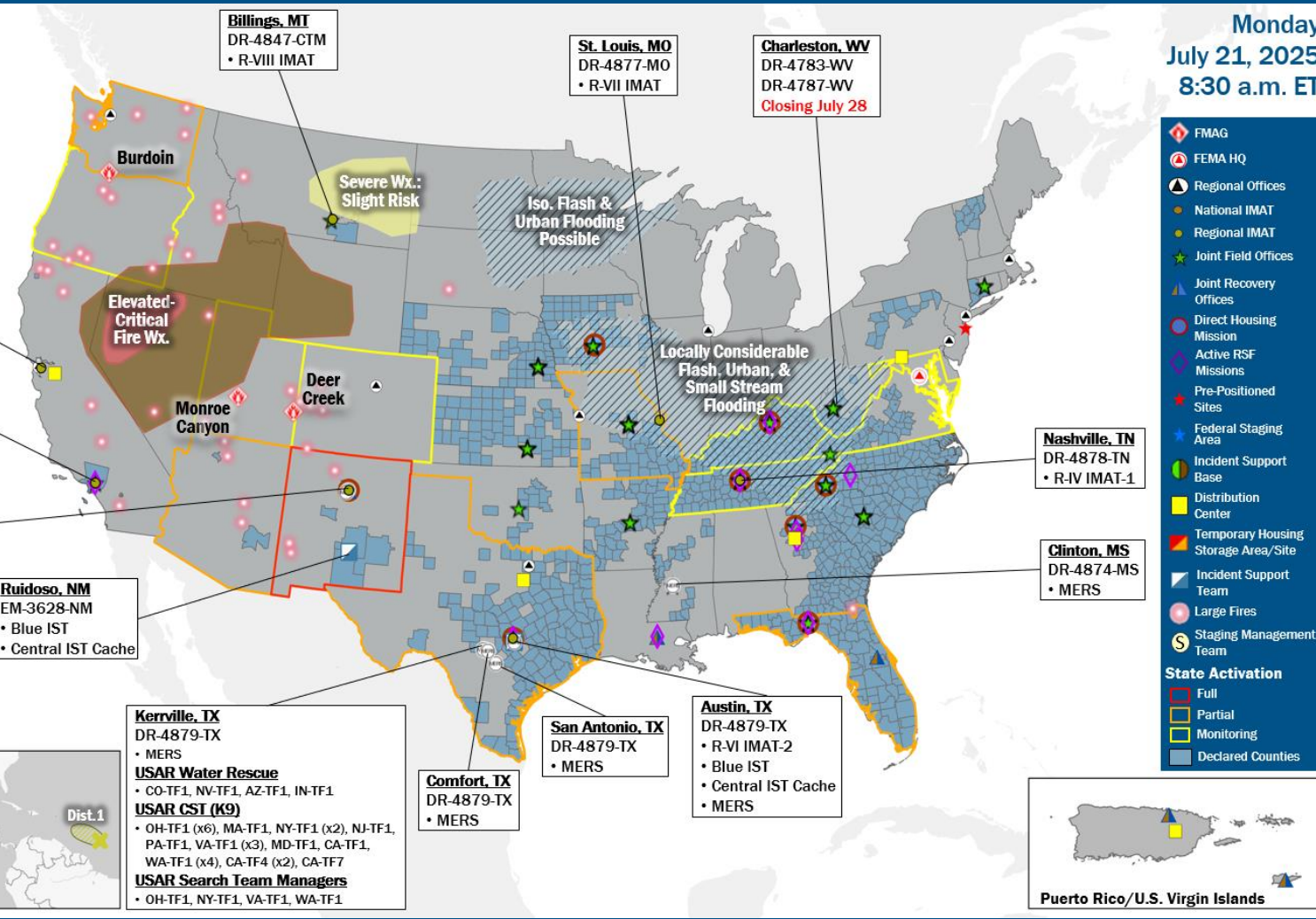
