Flash Flooding - Kentucky















Current Situation:

Over the last 24 hours, an additional 1-3" of rain fell over the southeastern corner of KY which has slowed the recession of floodwaters. Drier conditions are expected over the next 48 hours. Gauge locations along the Kentucky River, North and South Folks of the Kentucky River and the Red River are expected to recede to "Minor" flood stage by Sunday July 31

.Lifeline Impacts: (Region IV SLB as of 7:33 p.m. ET, July 29)

Safety & Security:


- Unknown number of missing persons or people trapped in flooded houses reported in Breathitt, Perry,
 Knott, Letcher, Floyd, and Pike counties; search and rescue operations continue
- Panbowl Dam in Jackson, KY at risk of overtopping; a dam failure is not expected at this time; 110
 homes, 13 businesses, 2 churches, a school and a hospital evacuated as a precaution (National Weather Service Significant Event Report, Update #1)
- Elkhorn Lake Dam overtopped and was inspected but no issues at this time; USACE inspected
 Buckhorn Dam with no issues; Carr Creek Dam to be inspected today

Health & Medical:

- 25 (+22) confirmed fatalities: unknown number of injuries
- KY River Medical Center, Nim Henson Geriatric Long Term Care Facility, Letcher Manor, and Henson Health evacuated
- Appalachian Regional Hospital in Hazard, KY lost potable water; state is providing water tanker for nonpotable water and pallets of water for potable use

Food, Water, Shelter:

- 12 (+3) shelters open with 388 (+120) occupants
- 18 (-3) water systems with limited or unknown operational capability; at least 38,530 service connections without water; 23,000 service connections under boil water notices;
- KY requested 18 truckloads of water (290k liters); at least 10 truckloads of water to be delivered by July 31





Kentucky – Flooding Response

Communications: (FCC Operations Center, as of 7/30/2022 04:00 a.m. ET)

- Breathitt County able to receive 911 calls, but unable to make outgoing calls, provider is working to correct Energy: (Eagle-I, as of 6:30 a.m. ET)
- 16k customers without power in 4 counties (Knott, Letcher, Perry, and Breathitt)

Hazardous Material:

18 wastewater systems under limited operations due to flooded infrastructure

State / Local Response:

- KY EOC at Full Activation (Flooding and Marion Water Shortage); KY Governor declared State of Emergency
- KY National Guard activated with high-water vehicles and aircraft for search and rescue operations

FEMA / Federal Response:


Region IV:

- RRCC at Level III with all ESFs and DCE (day shift only); RWC is monitoring
- IMAT-2 and LNO deployed to KY EOC

FEMA HQ:


- Expedited Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4663-DR-KY approved July 29; provides emergency protective measures (Category B) under the Public Assistance program for 13 counties
- Staging Management Team (SMT) and Incident Support Base (ISB) teams deploying to KY to arrive by July
 31
- Urban Search and Rescue resources deployed to Hazard, KY: One Mission Ready Package Command –
 Incident Support Team; four Mission Ready Packages Water Rescue; augmentation resources for OHTF1 and IN-TF1 mission ready packages to two Type 3 task forces staged in Richmond, KY
 - MERS deployed to KY to support IMAT with MEOV and US&R IST with IRV
 - NWC continues to monitor

Hurricane Frank (CAT 1) (Advisory #17, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 600 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving NW at 12 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 90 mph
- Could become a major hurricane by tonight
- Hurricane force winds extend 25 miles; tropical storm force winds extend 115 miles

<u>Tropical Storm Georgette</u> (Advisory #12, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 1,205 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving WSW at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Little change in strength forecast during the next couple of days
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward 35 miles




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
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall











