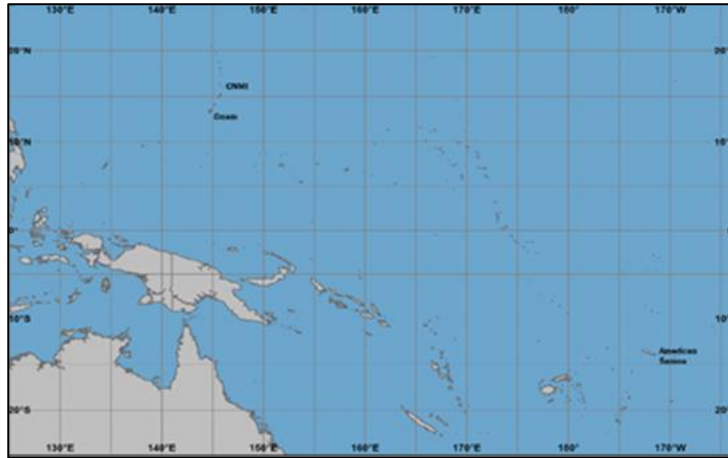

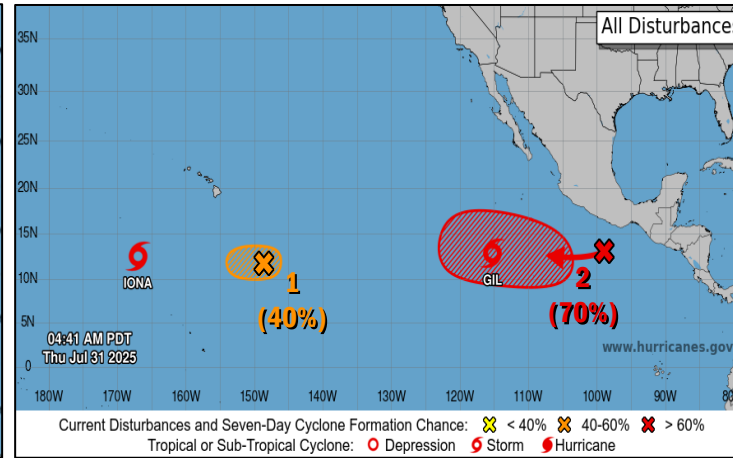

**Tropical Storm Iona:** (Advisory #17, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

**Tropical Storm Gil:** (Advisory #1 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

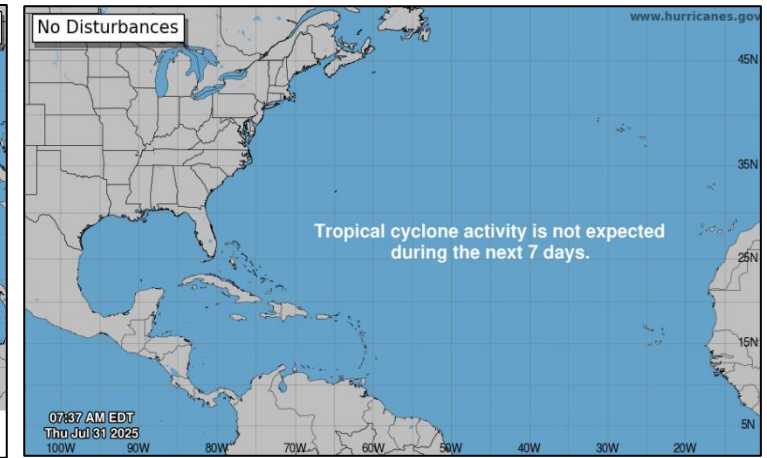
**Disturbance 1 (CP92):** (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 750 miles SE of Hilo, Hawaii
- Additional development is possible; short-lived tropical depression could develop
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Medium (40%); 7-day: Medium (40%)

**Disturbance 2:** (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Expected to form well south of southwestern Mexico in the next couple of days
- Moving WNW at 10 to 15 mph
- Gradual development possible; a tropical depression is likely to form by early next week
- Formation chance – 48 hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: High (70%)

## Atlantic



- No tropical cyclone activity is expected during the next 7 days

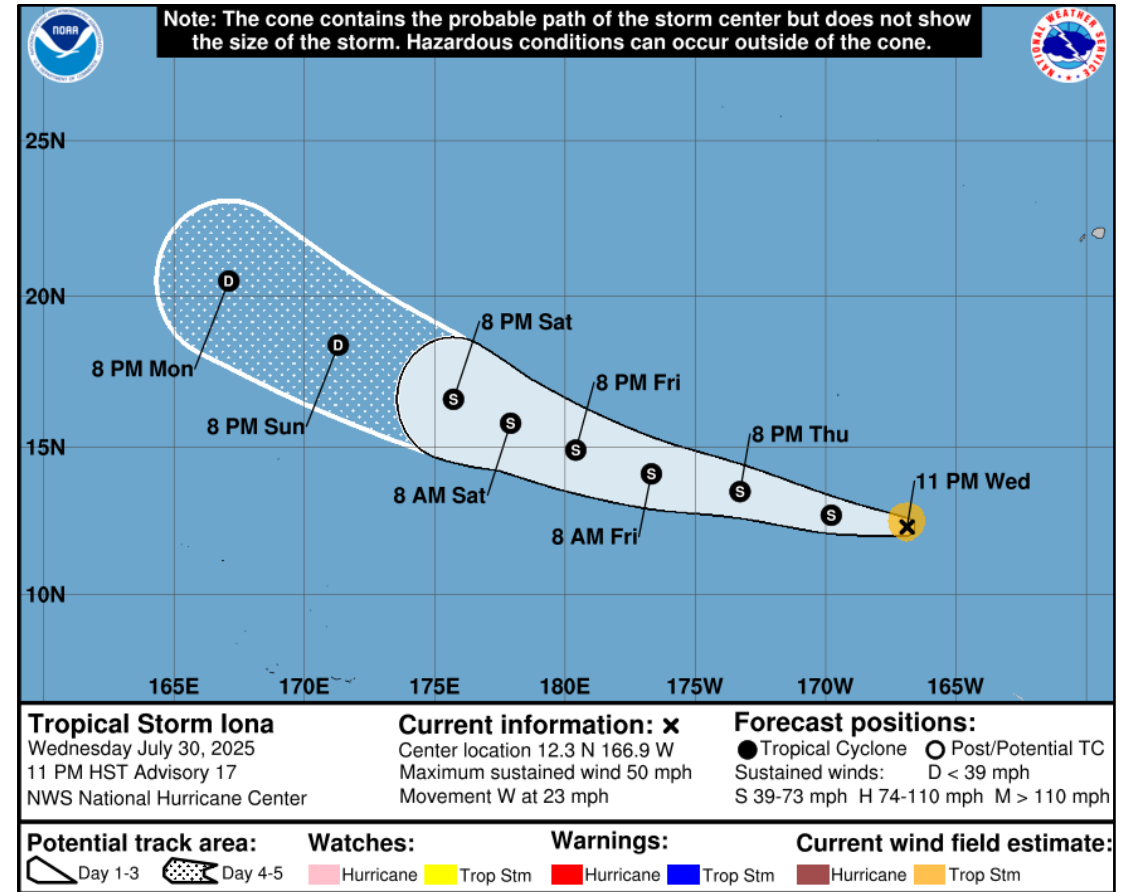

# Tropical Storm Iona – Central Pacific

## Tropical Storm Iona: (Advisory #17 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located **860** miles **SW** of Honolulu, Hawaii
- Moving W at **23** mph
- Maximum sustained winds **50** mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to **60** miles
- **Additional weakening is expected through today**

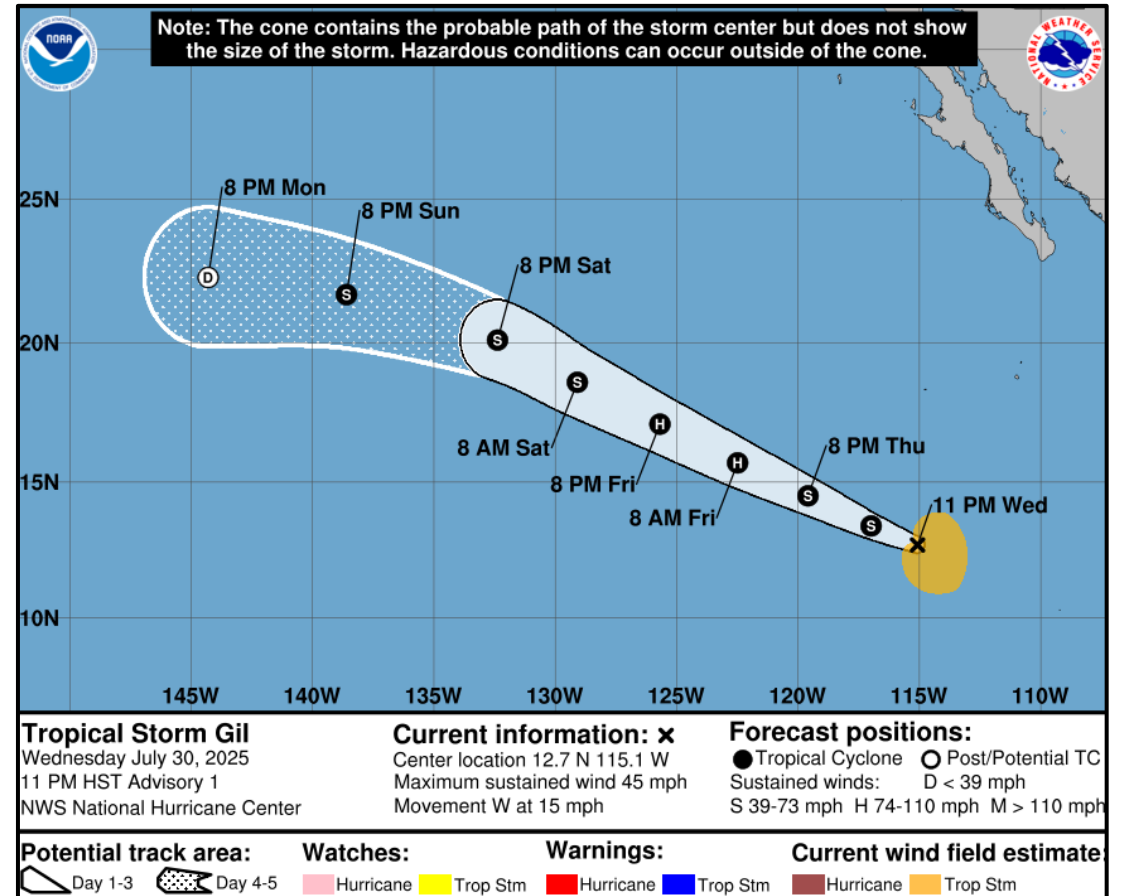

# Tropical Storm Gil – Eastern Pacific

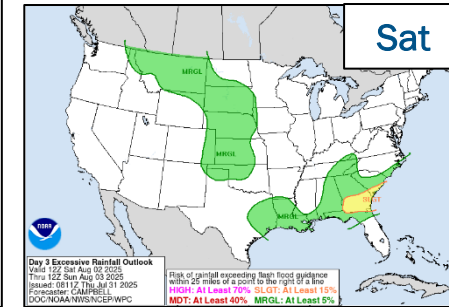
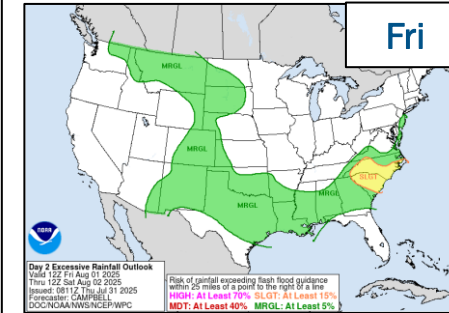
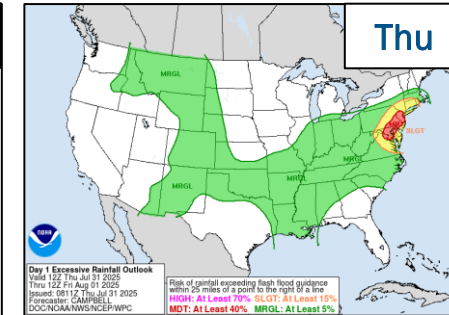
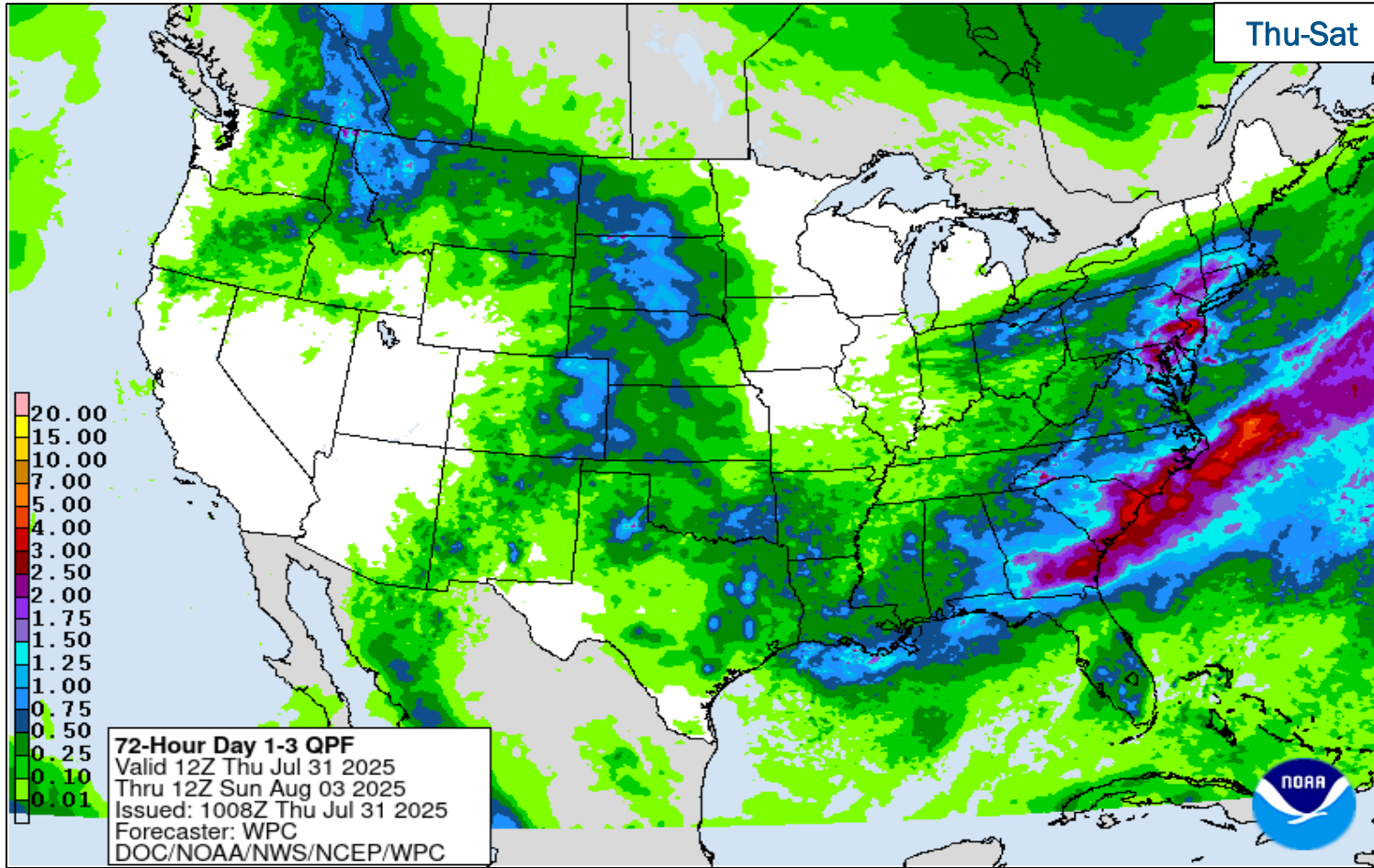
**Tropical Storm Gil:** (Advisory #1 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 785 miles SSW of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving W at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Tropical Storm winds extend up to 160 miles from the center
- Forecast to become a hurricane on Friday



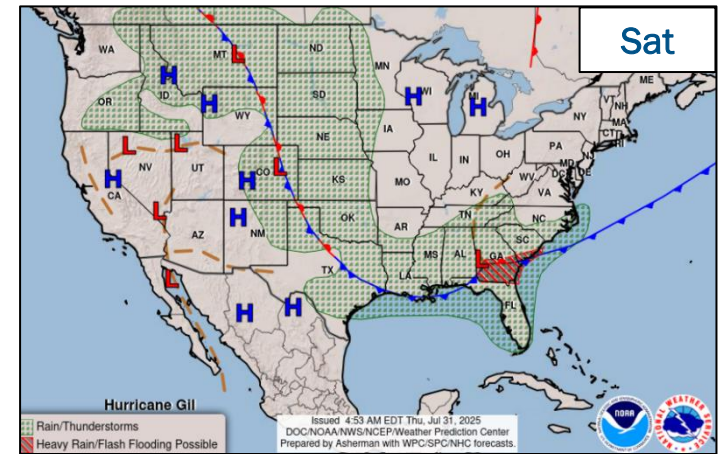
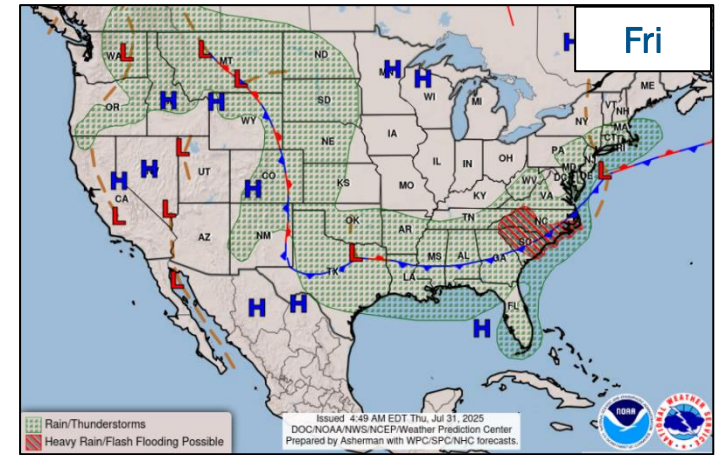
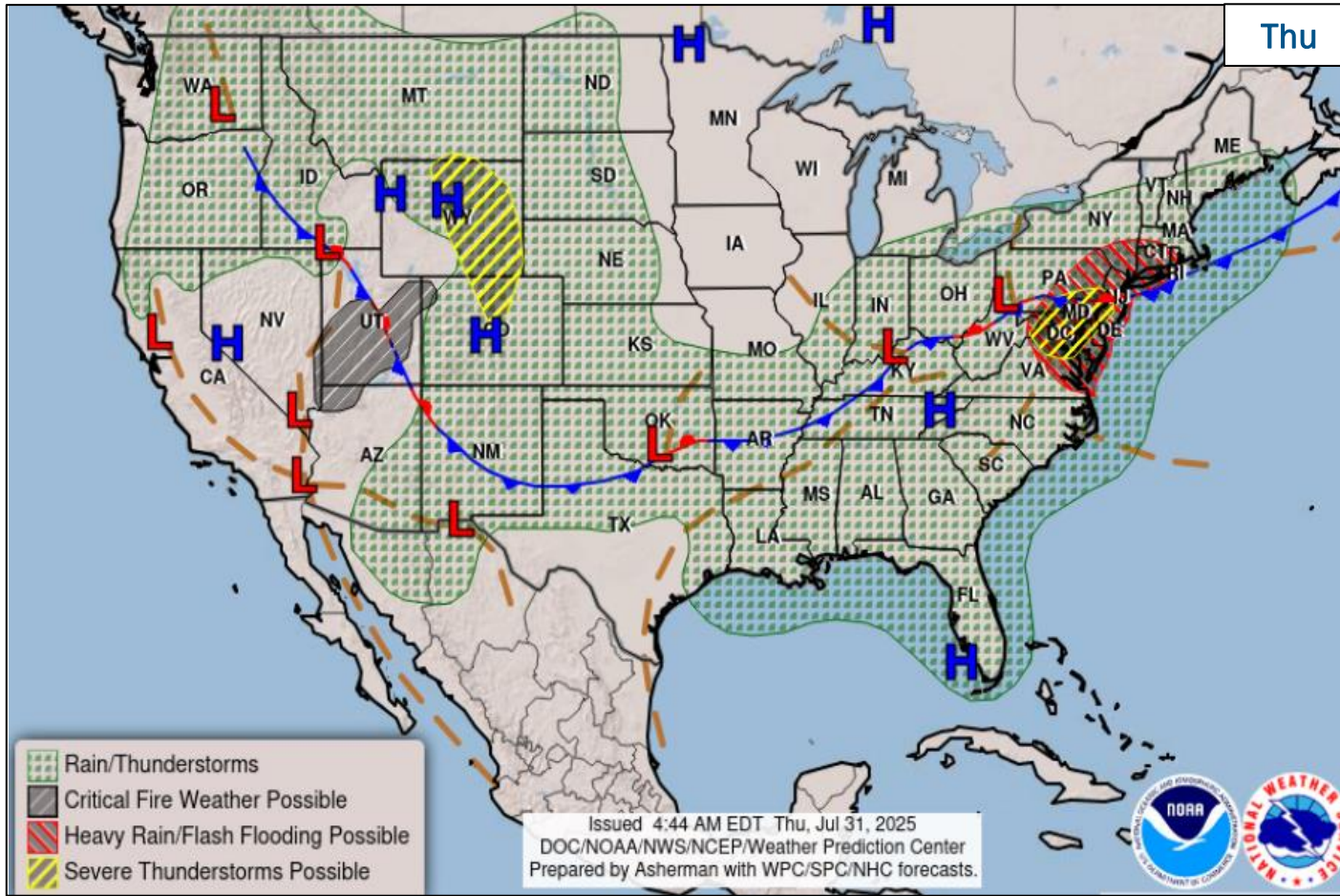

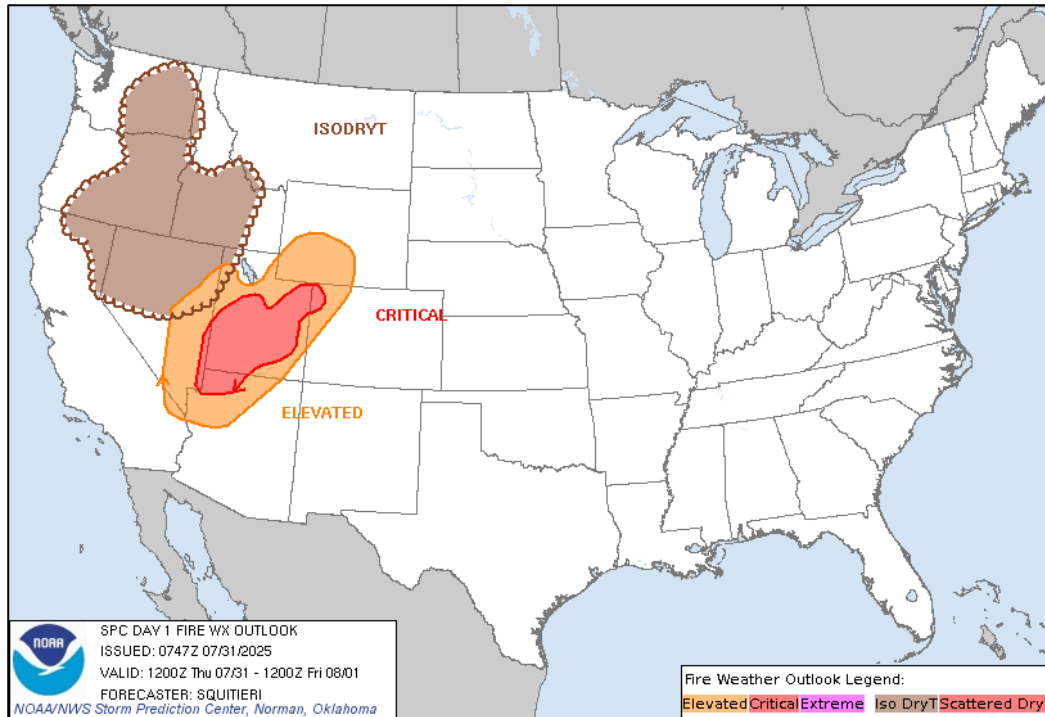


High Temperature Forecast

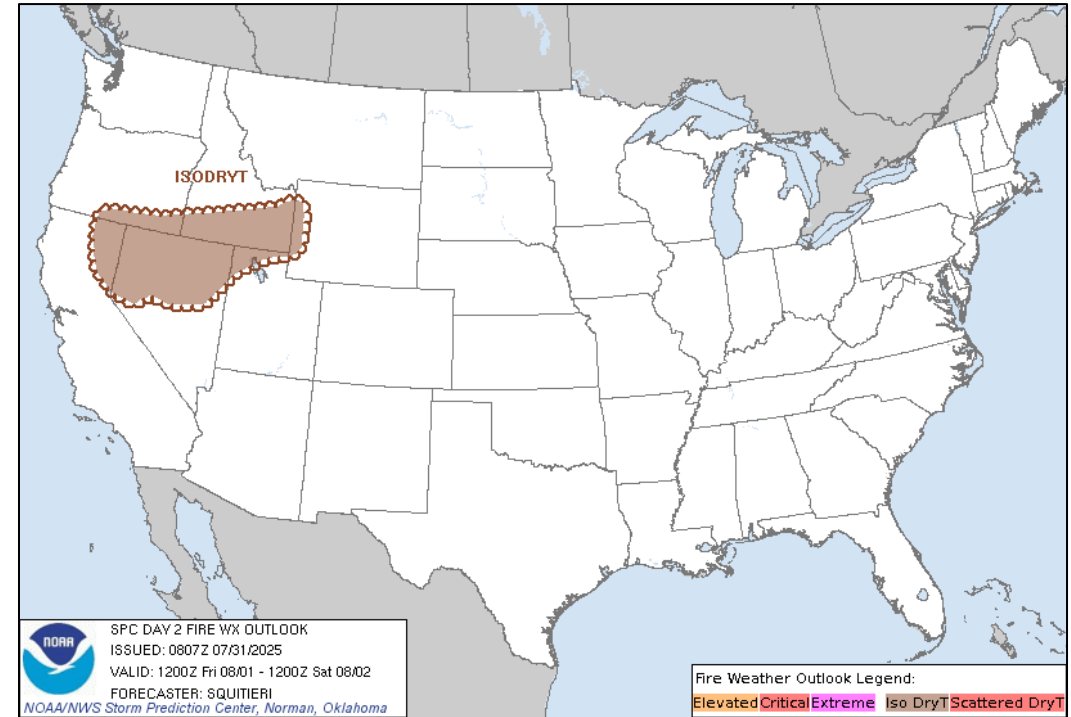
