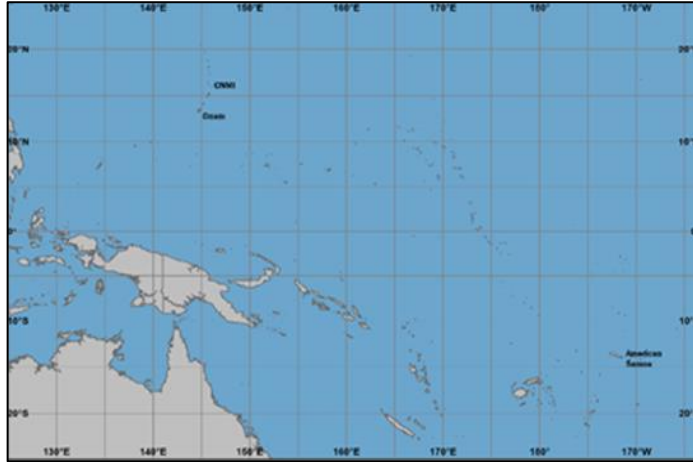

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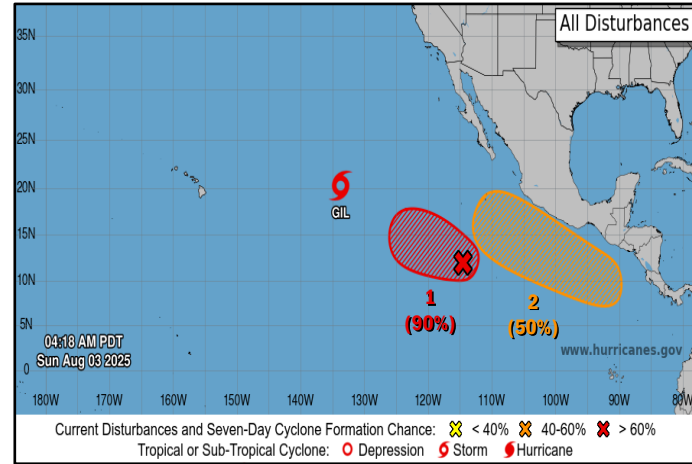

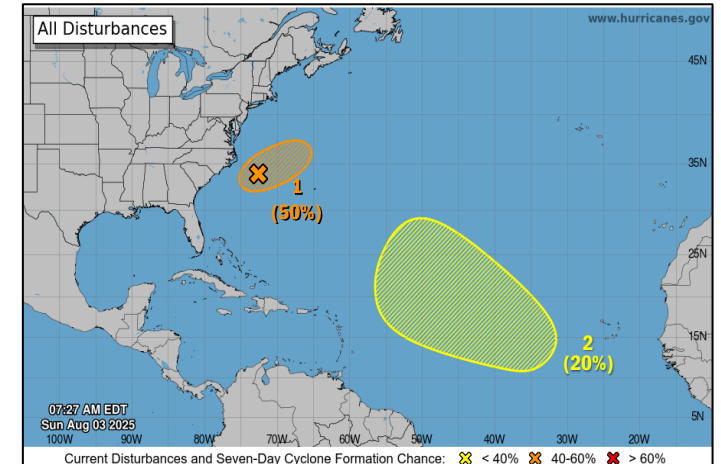
Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well southwest of southwestern Mexico; moving WNW at 10 to 15 mph
- A tropical depression is likely to form in the next day or two
- Formation chance – 48-hours: High (90%); 7-day: High (90%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Environmental conditions appear conducive for some development, and a tropical depression could form later this week; moving WNW at 10 to 15 mph
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Med (50%)

Atlantic



Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located about 180 miles off the coast of North Carolina
- Tropical or subtropical conditions could develop through Monday as it travels ENE away from the coast at 10 mph
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Med (50%); 7-day: Med (50%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Chance of Cyclone formation in 7 days
- Environmental conditions could support some gradual development during the middle to latter part of next week; moving WNW across the central tropical Atlantic
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Low (near 0%), 7-day: Low (30%)

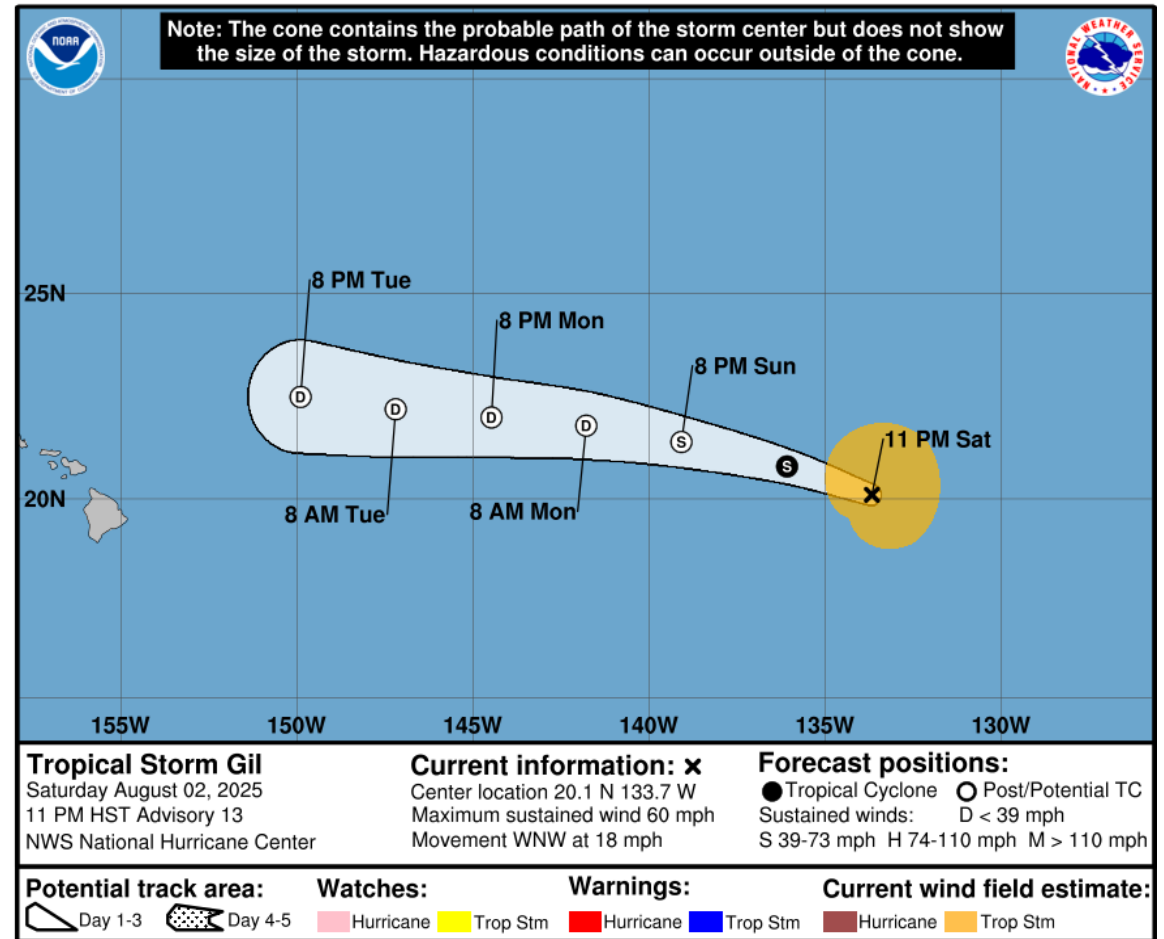


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Tropical Storm Gil – Eastern Pacific

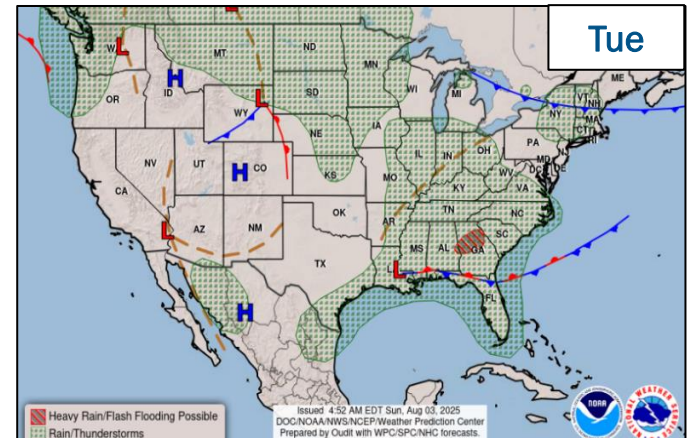
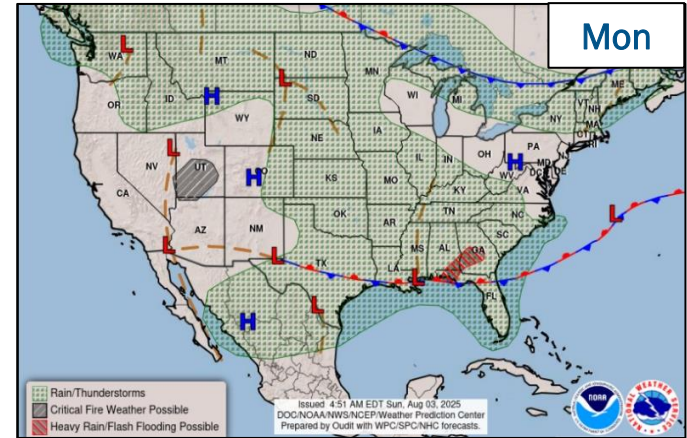
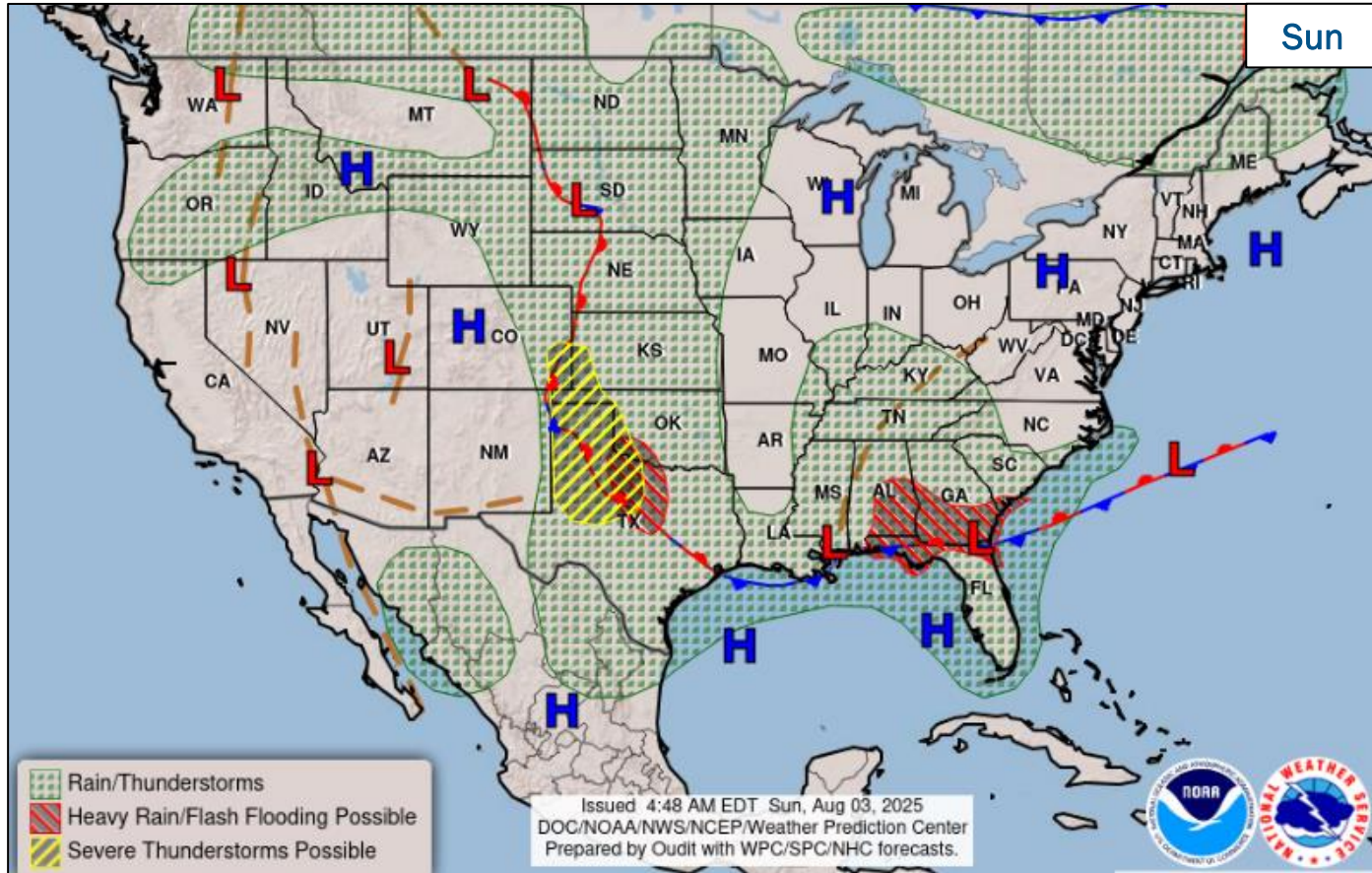
Tropical Storm Gil: (Advisory #13 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located **1,540 miles W** of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving **WNW at 18 mph**
- Maximum sustained winds **60 mph**
- Tropical Storm force winds extend up to **140 miles** from the center
- **Continued weakening is forecast, and Gil is likely to become post-tropical Sunday or Sunday night.**



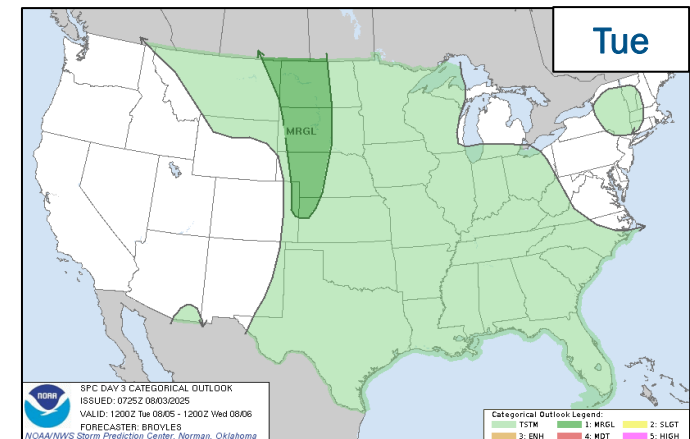
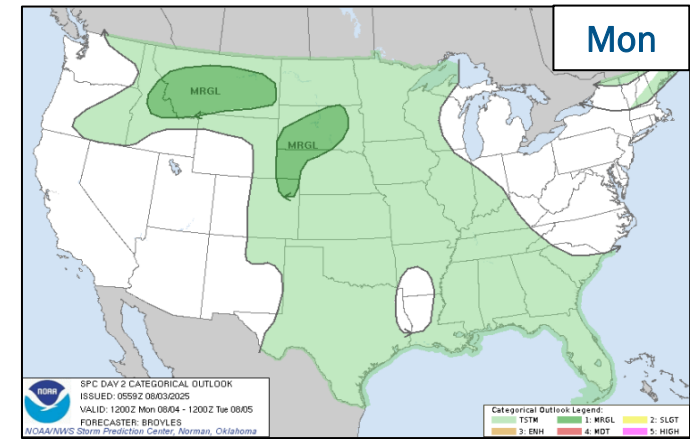
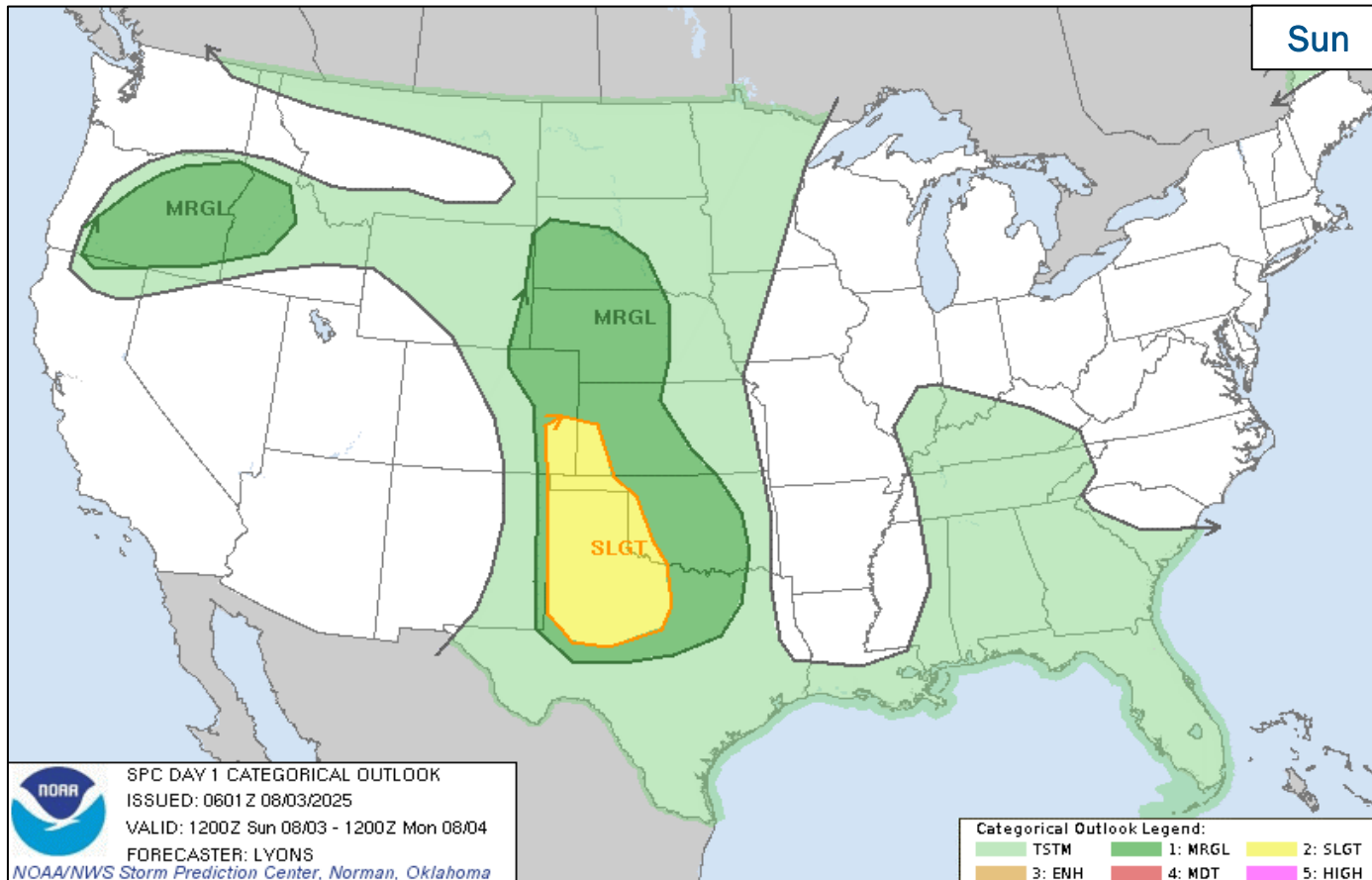

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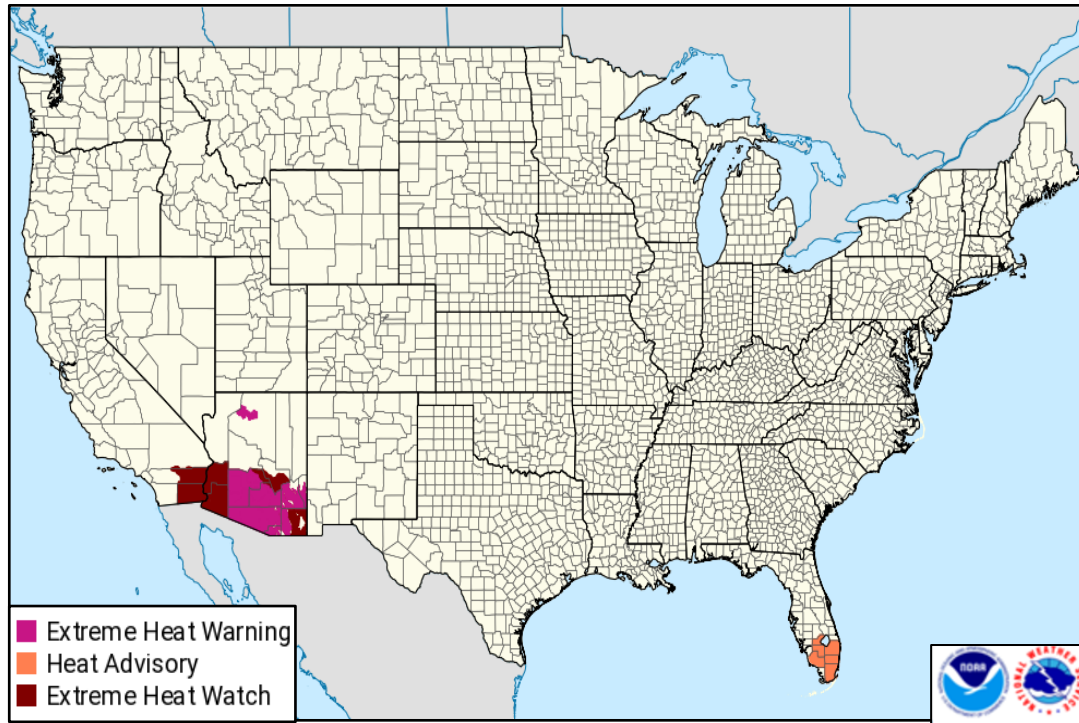

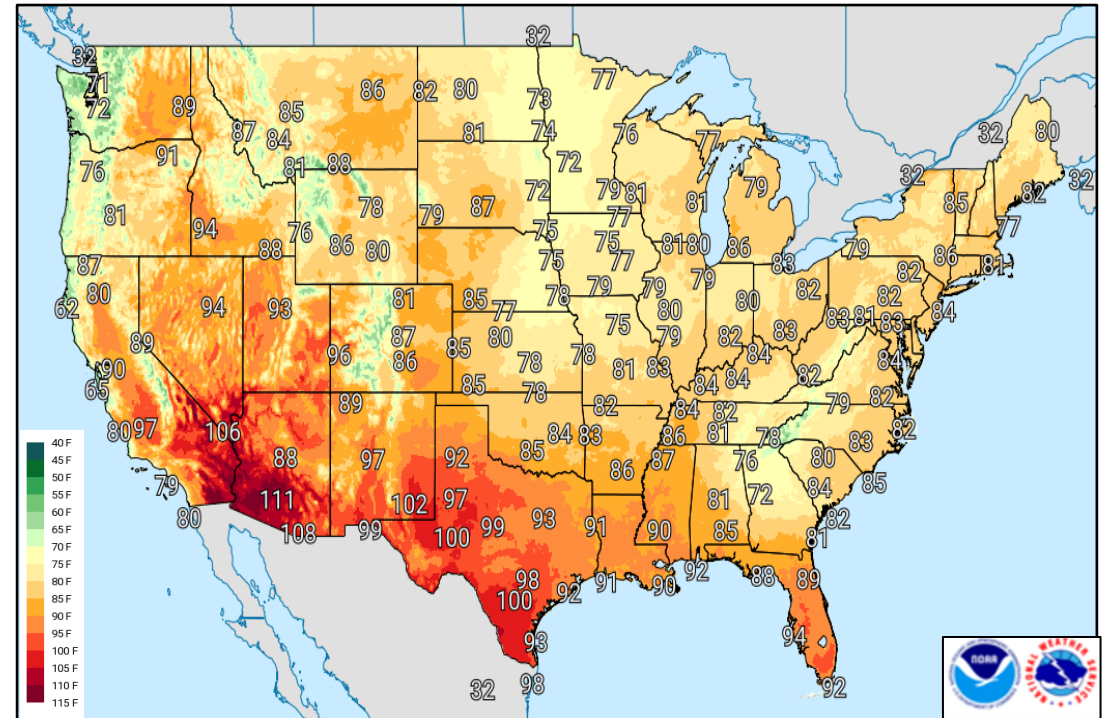


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Excessive Heat – Aug 3

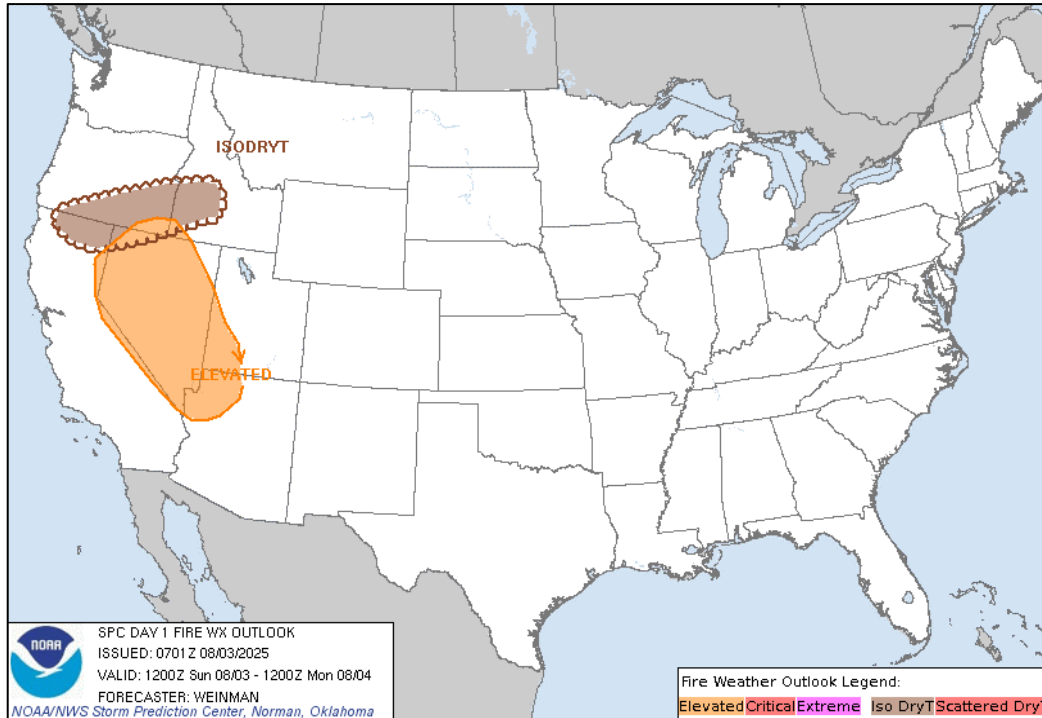


High Temperature Forecast

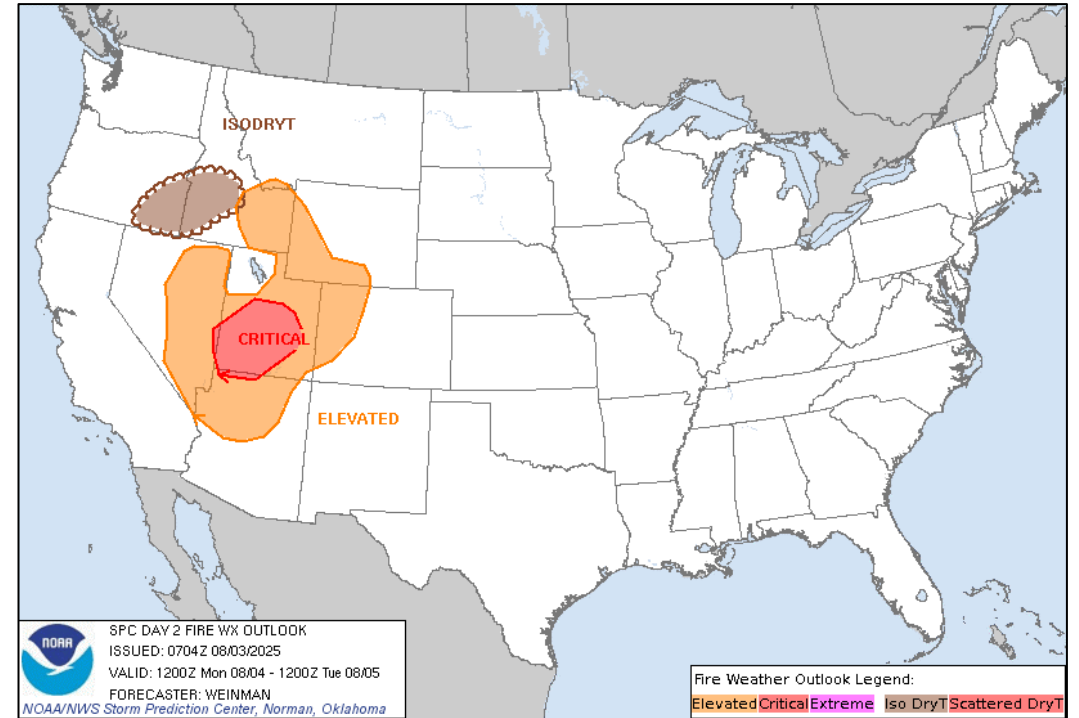

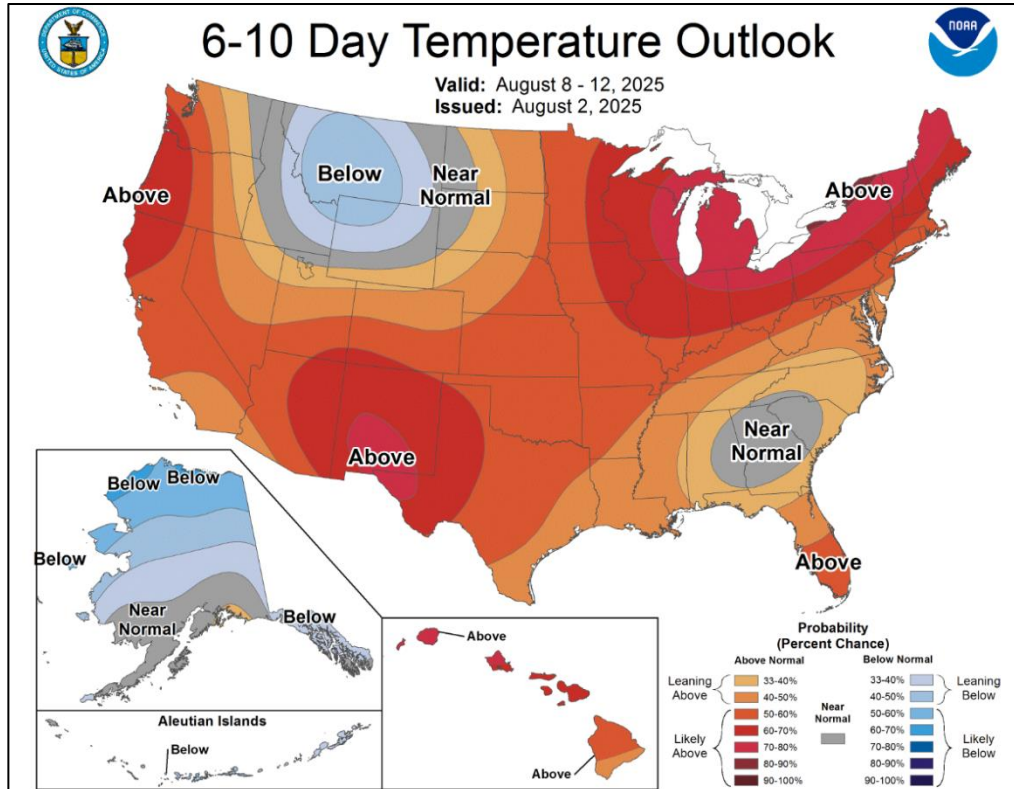

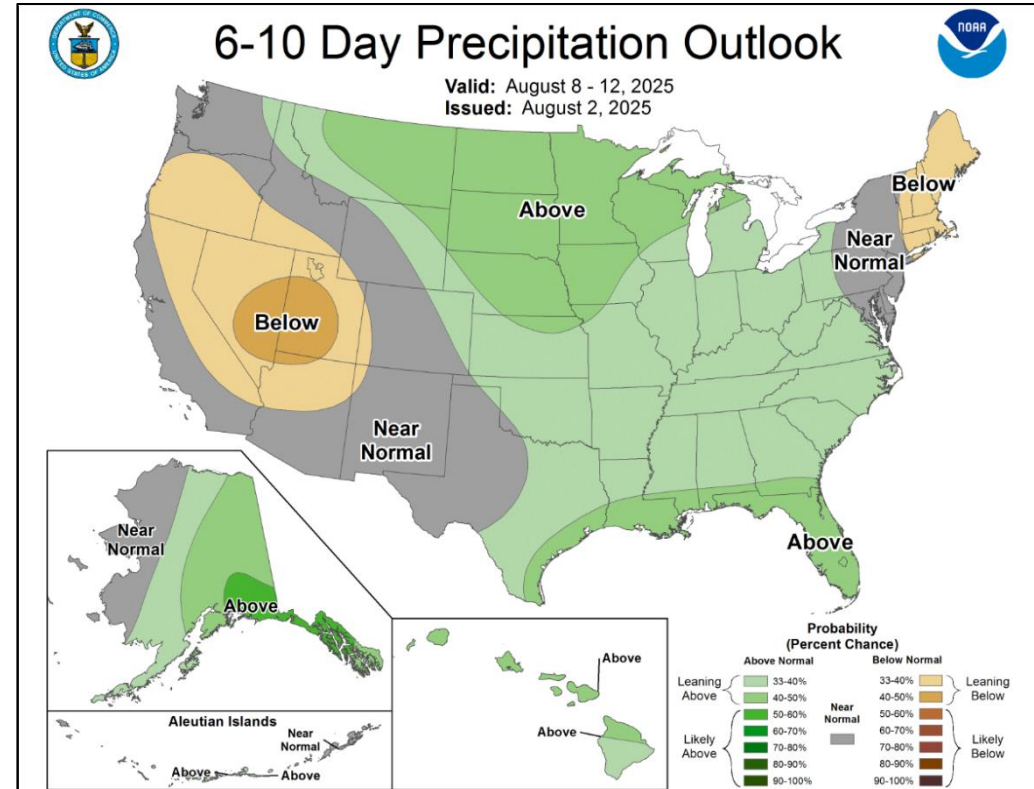
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Long Range Outlooks – Aug 8-12

6-10 Day Precipitation Probability

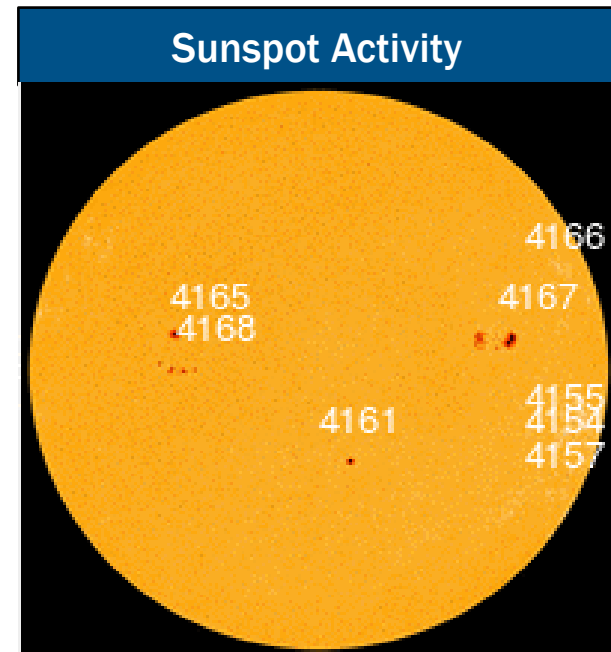
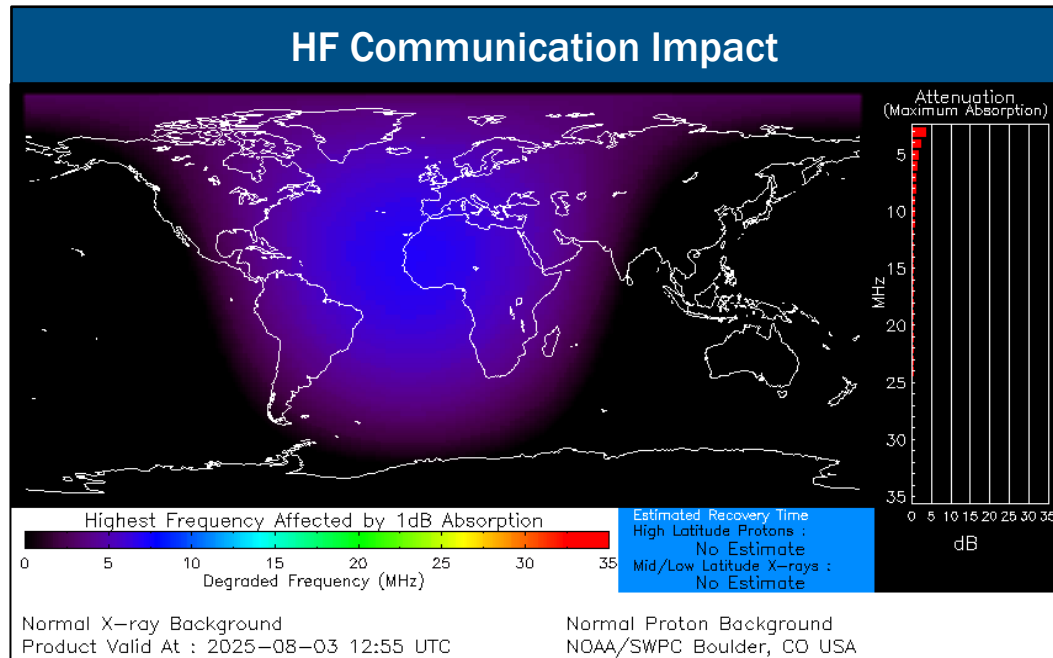
