Wildfires - Hawaii



<u>Current Situation:</u> FEMA and federal partners continue to support the state of Hawaii in response and recovery efforts from Hawaii Wildfires. Mission priorities remain focused on Search & Rescue, fire containment operations, and damage assessments in the impacted area (Maui County). Federal teams, commodities, and equipment continue to move into the impacted areas to respond and support state and local partners.

<u>Lifelines Impacts:</u> (SLB #5 as of 5:00 a.m. ET Aug 16) Safety and Security:

- West Maui schools closed indefinitely
- Central Maui schools: Most opened yesterday for staff, will open this week for students; King Kekaulike HS will remain closed due to damages; repairs in progress

Food, Hydration, and Shelter: (ARC Shelter as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Shelters: Maui County 8 shelters open with 325 occupants
- State of HI secured more than 400 hotel rooms and 1,400 units from AirBNB for displaced (FEMA-DR-4724 State SITREP Report)

Health and Medical:

106 (+7) confirmed fatalities

Water Systems:


- 2 (-2) water wells still experiencing intermittent interruptions to power
 - Temporary power provided to 2 water wells; temporary power installation scheduled for other 2 today (8/16)

Energy:

2k (3%) customers remain without power in Maui County (DOE Eagle-I as
of 6:30 a.m. ET)

Communications:

- Maui County:
 - 11 (-8) cell towers offline
 - Local cell providers deployed 14 assets to improve cellular service ill
 West Maui
 - AT&T deployed 1 cellular asset last night, expected to be online today, to strengthen communications capabilities for responders



Transportation:

- 2 Temporary Flight Restrictions(TFR) in effect for Lahaina and Kula
- Lahaina Bypass Road opened fully
- USCG reduced size of Safety Zone; access authorized on a case-by-case




Disturbance 1 (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a few hundred miles S of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Tropical depression likely to form within a day or two
- Formation chance 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day: High (90%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Could form S of the Gulf of Tehuantepec over the weekend
- Some gradual development possible
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)

Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 750 miles WSW of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Tropical depression could form during the next several days
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: Medium (50%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to move off the coast of Africa early Wed
- Further development possible over the weekend
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Medium (40%)

Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Could form in the Gulf of Mexico by the beginning of next week
- Slow development is possible
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)






Hurricane Fernanda – Eastern Pacific

Hurricane Fernanda (CAT 2) (Advisory #15 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Approximately 2,000 miles SE of Hilo, HI
- Moving W at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 75 mph
- Rapid weakening is forecast to continue, and Fernanda is likely to become a tropical storm on Wednesday, and a post-tropical low on Thursday
- Hurricane-force winds extend 25 miles, tropical-storm-force winds extend 80 miles






Tropical Storm Greg – Central Pacific


Tropical Storm Greg (Advisory #10 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 855 miles SE of Honolulu, HI
- Moving W at 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Gradual turn toward the west-northwest expected tonight
- Some slight strengthening is possible through Wednesday, followed by weakening Thursday and Friday
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 70 miles
- Greg will shift toward the west-southwest late Thursday and Friday








Hazards Outlook - Aug 18-22







