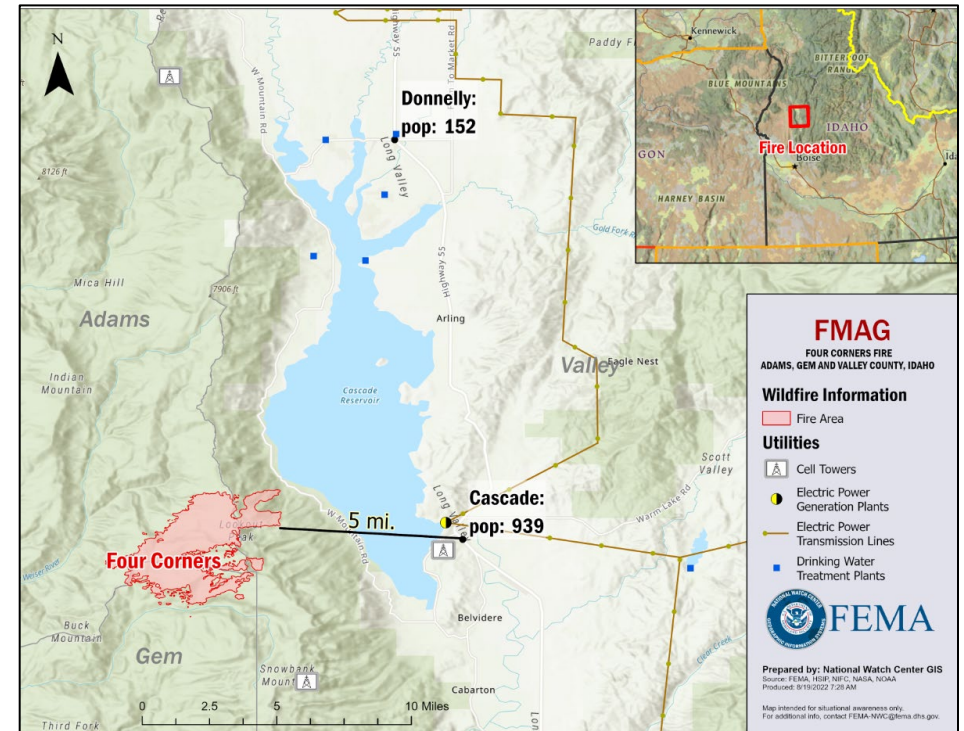

Current Situation:

- The fire began August 13 and is burning on federal, state, and private land in and around the communities of French Creek, Gods Acres, and Campbell Creek south to Raspberry Road, near the City of Cascade (population 939)
- 76 primary homes and 431 secondary homes threatened
- Also threatening privately owned power lines, municipal water pumps, privately owned church camp, and a federally owned radio repeater
- Mandatory evacuations for 500 people

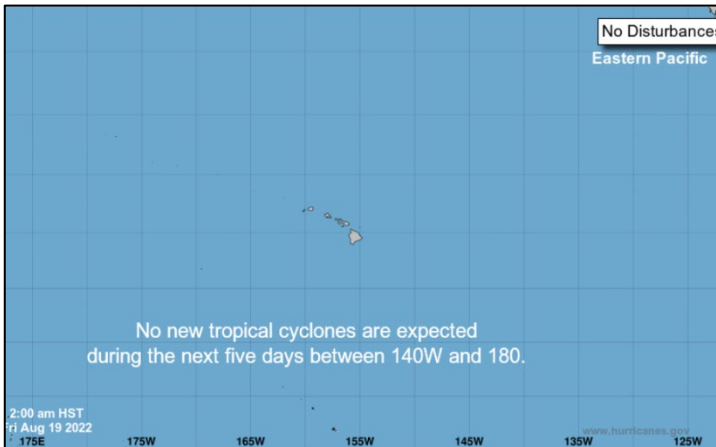
- ID EOC at Normal Operations

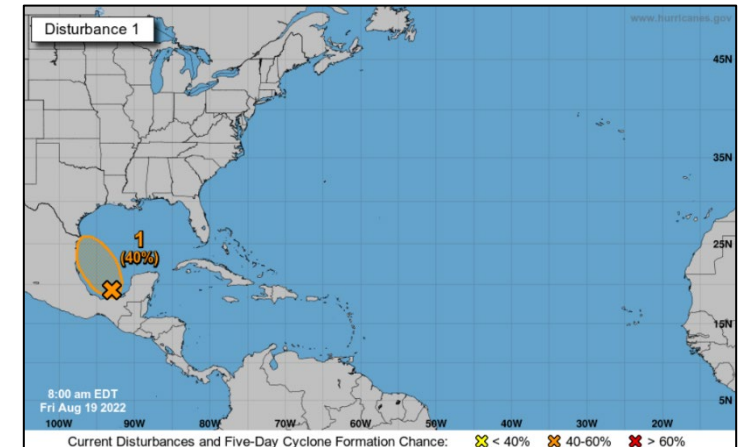
- No new tropical cyclones expected during the next 5 days

Disturbance 1 (Invest 99L) (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

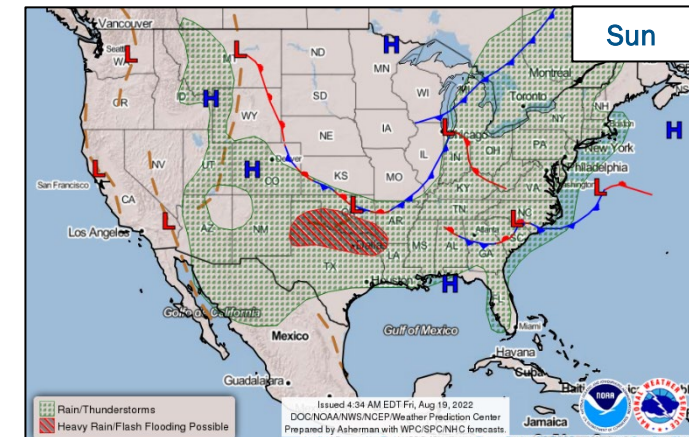
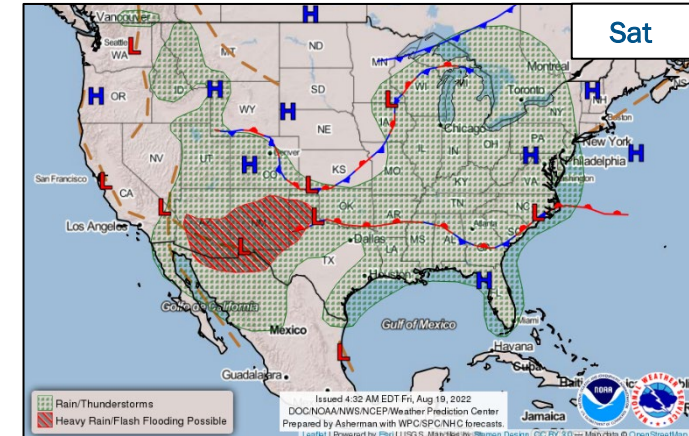
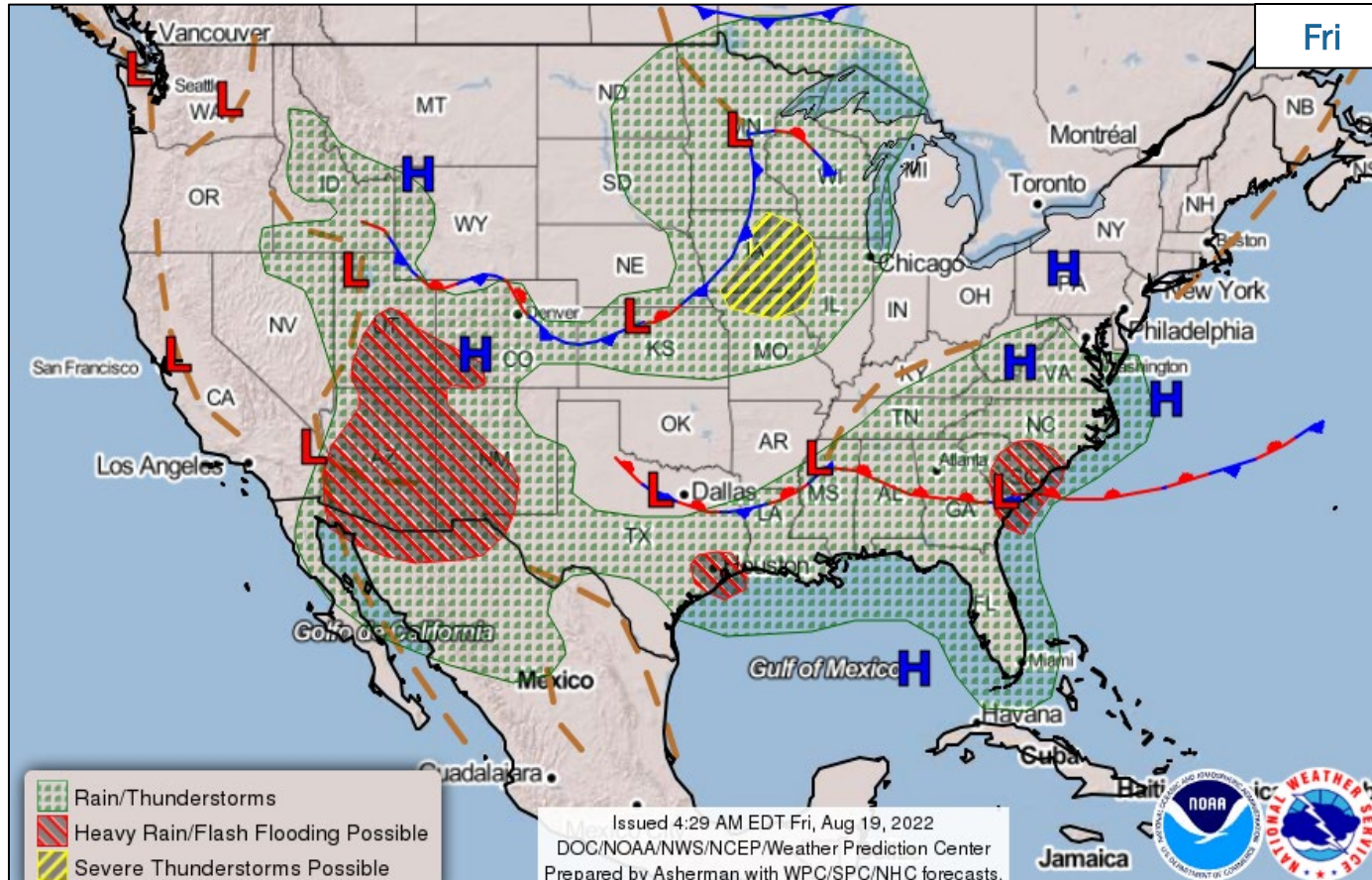
- Located over southwestern Gulf of Mexico and Bay of Campeche

- Formation chance – 48-hour Medium (40%); 5-day: Medium (40%)



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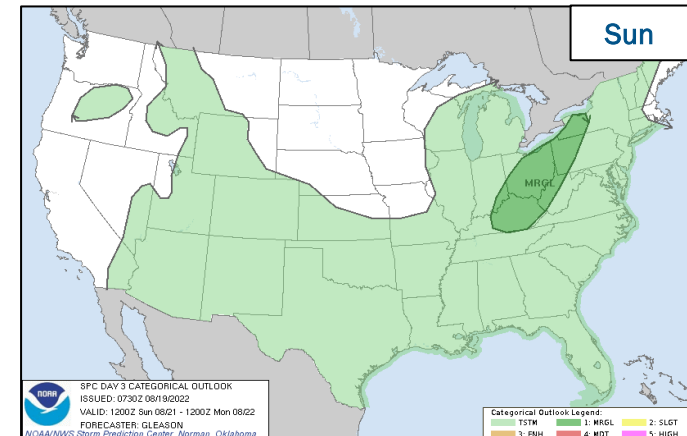
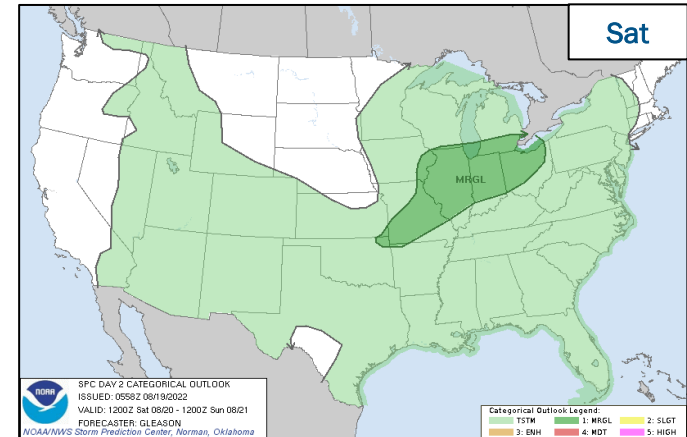
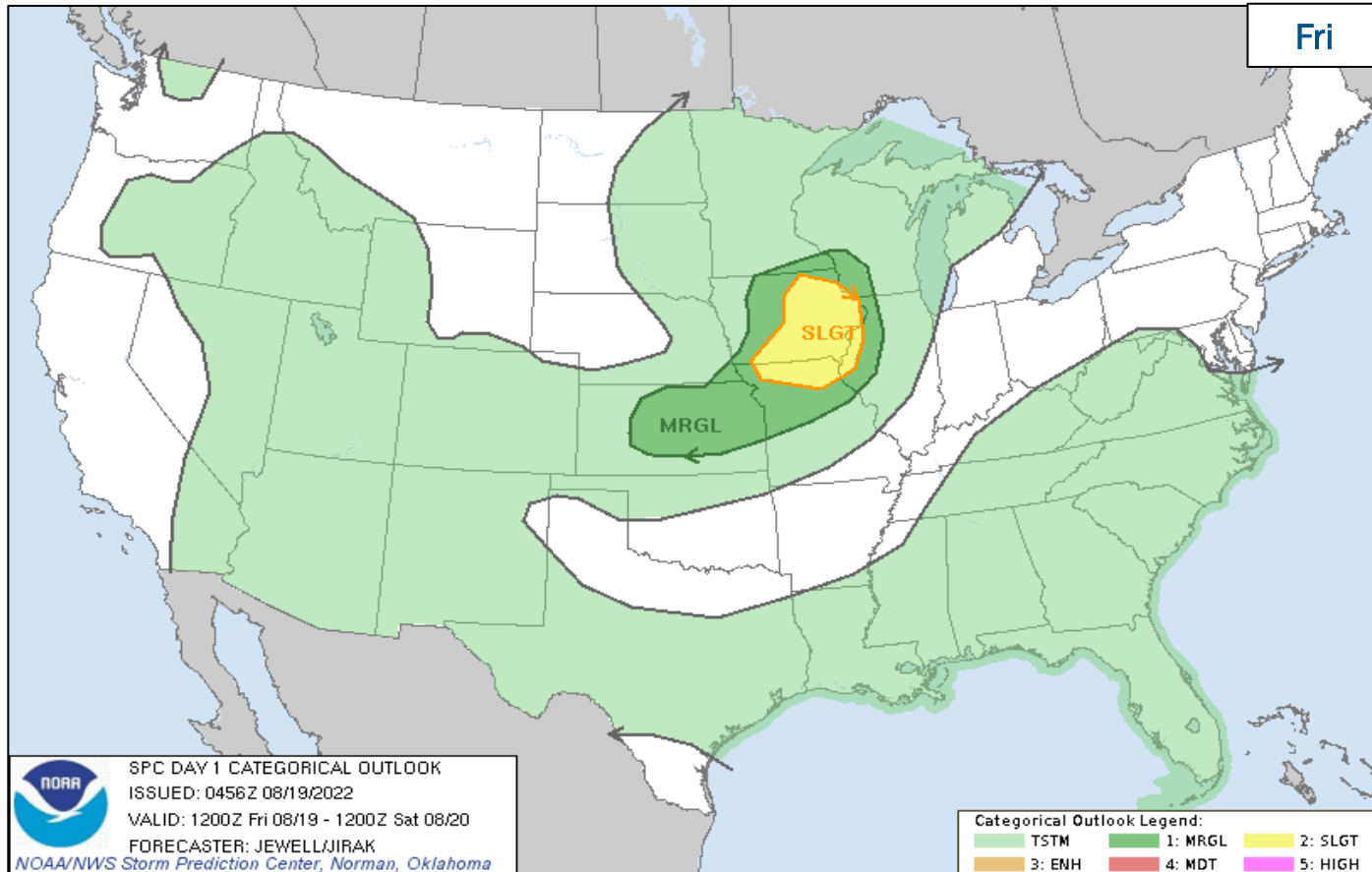
National Weather Forecast



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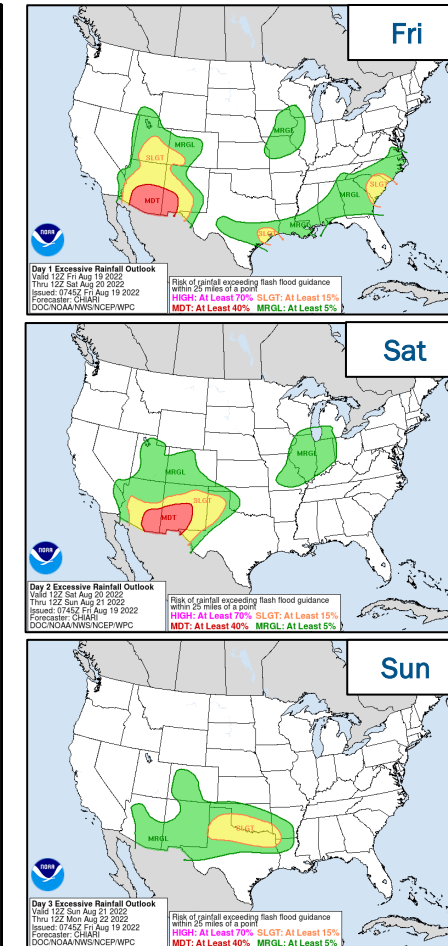
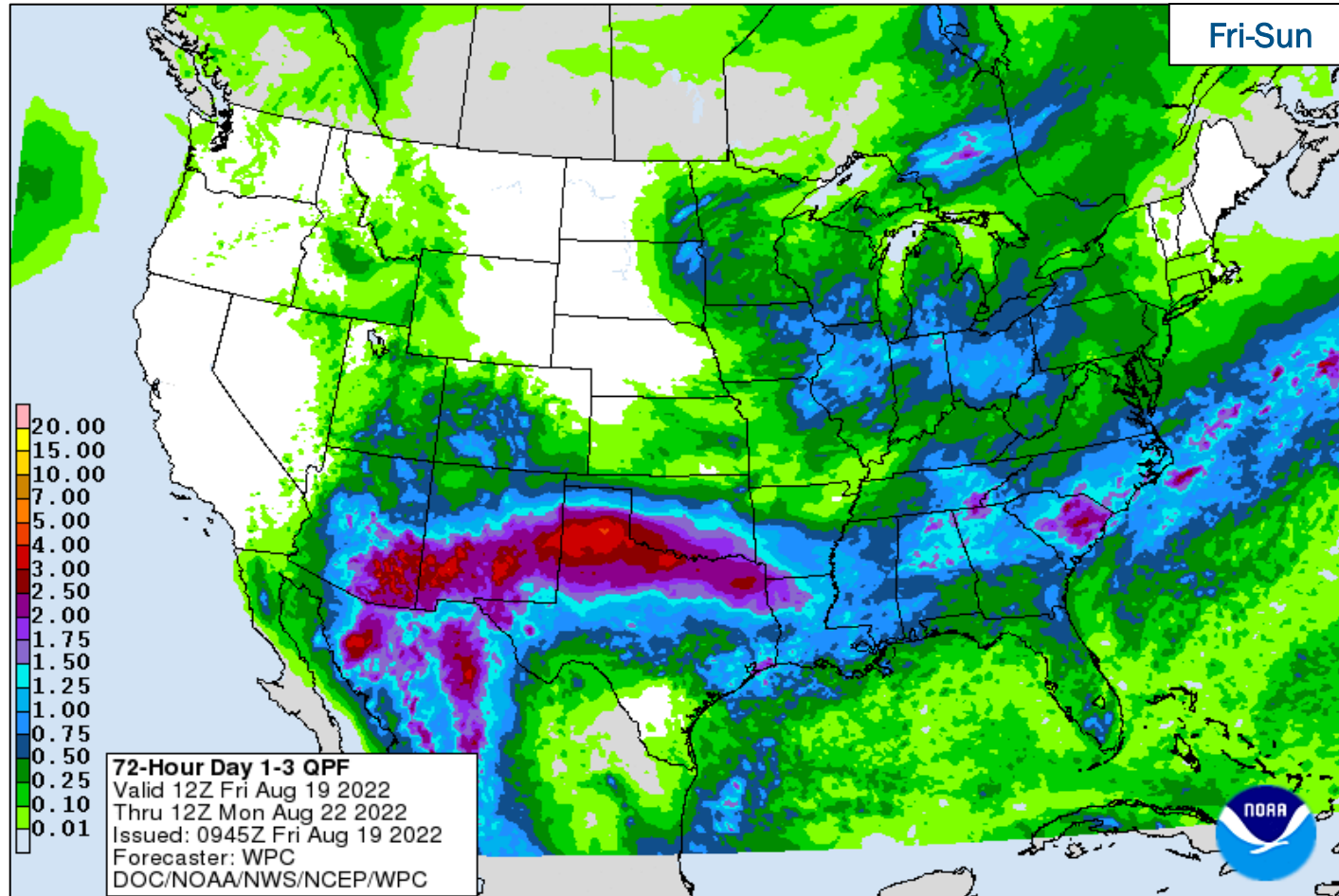
Severe Weather Outlook



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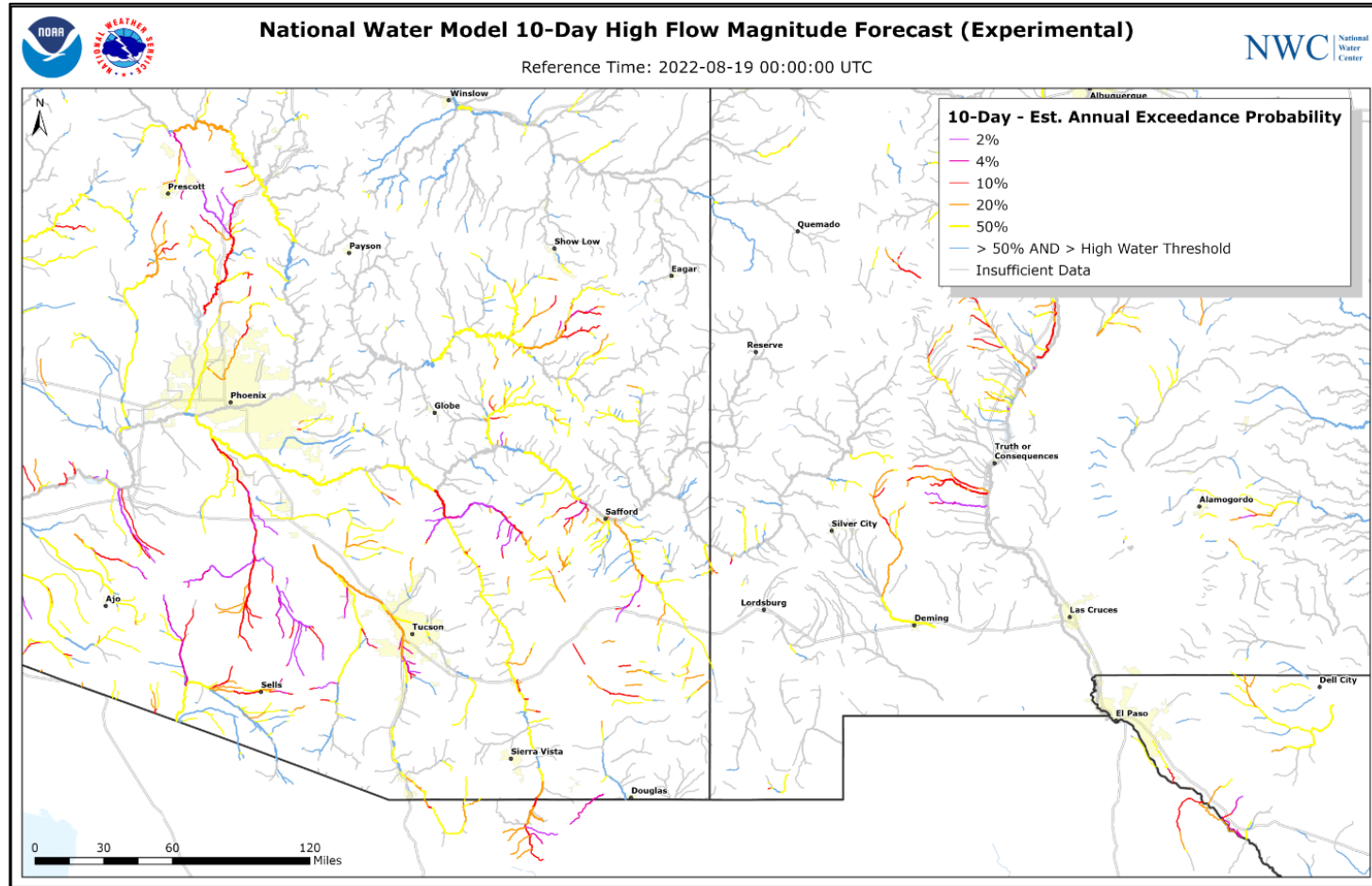
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Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



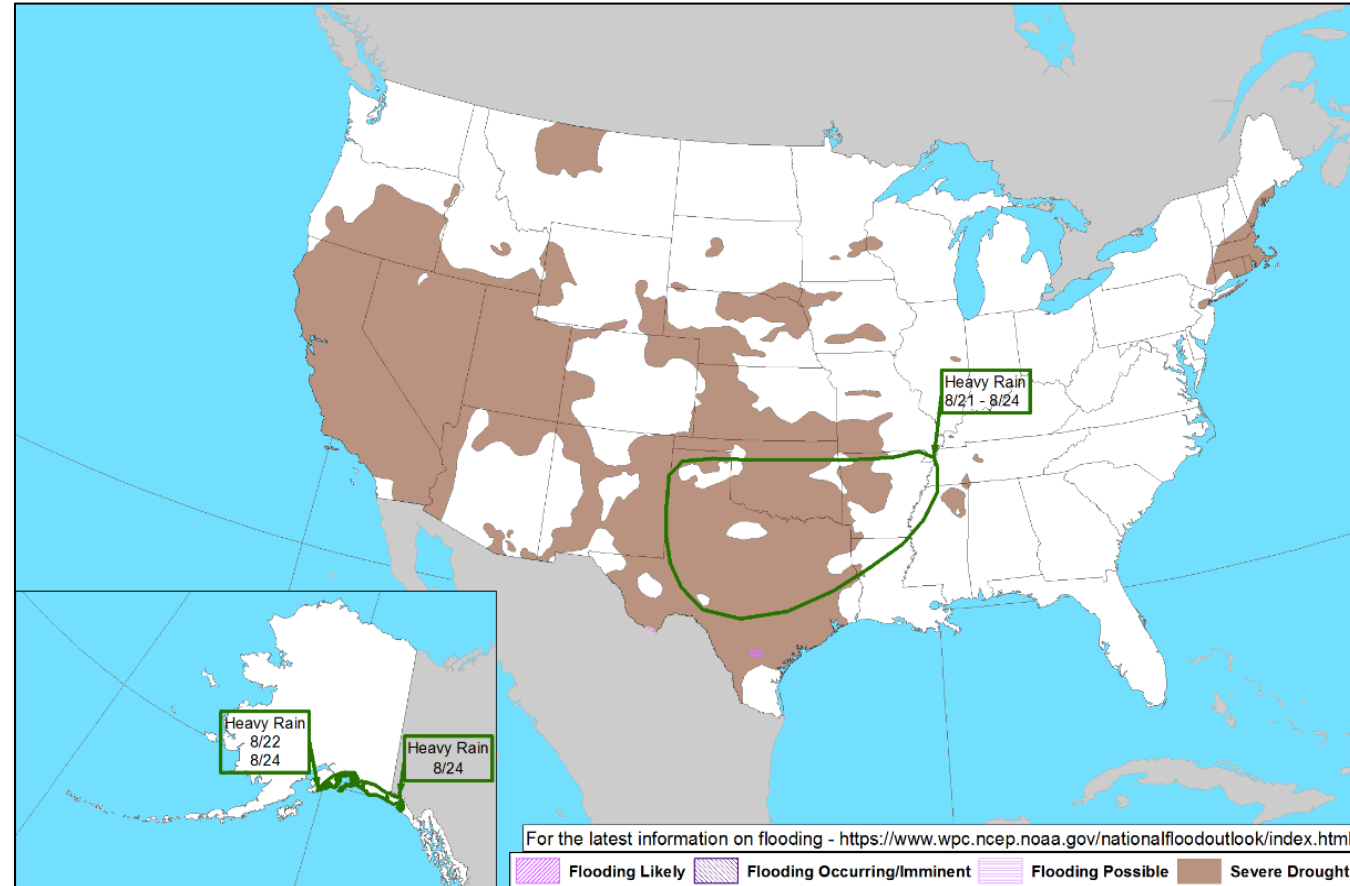
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National Water Model – Southwest U.S.

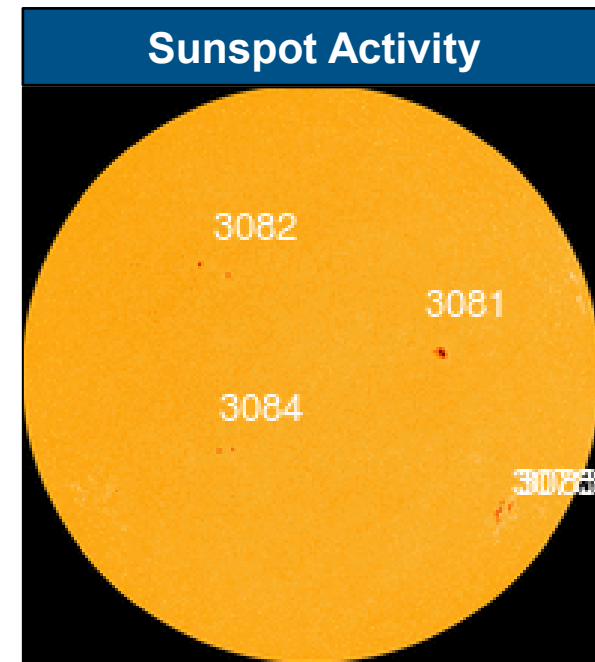
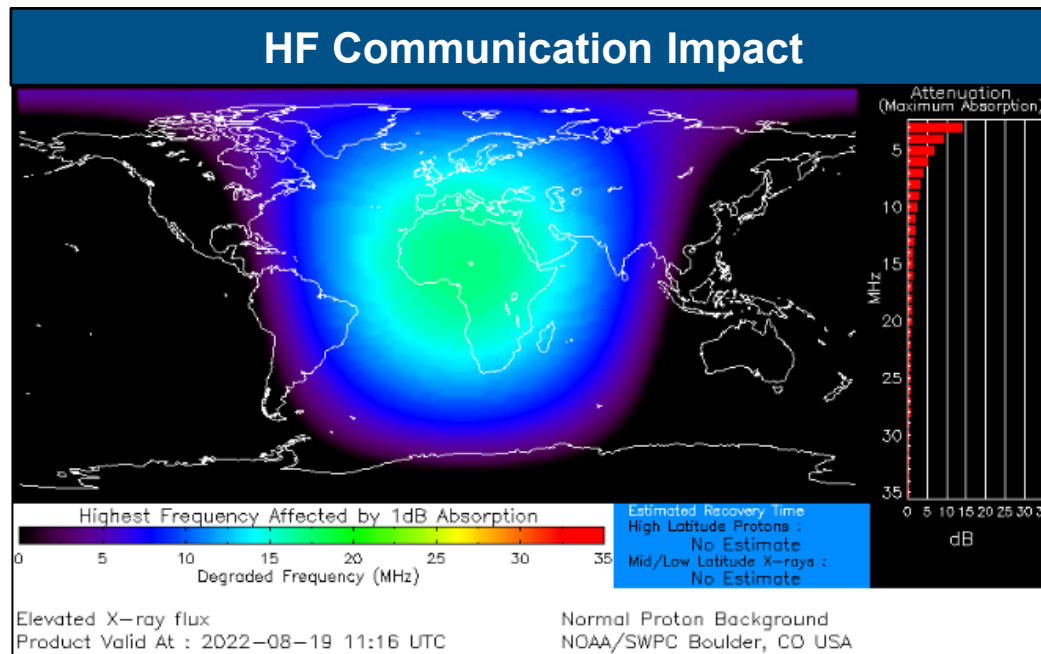

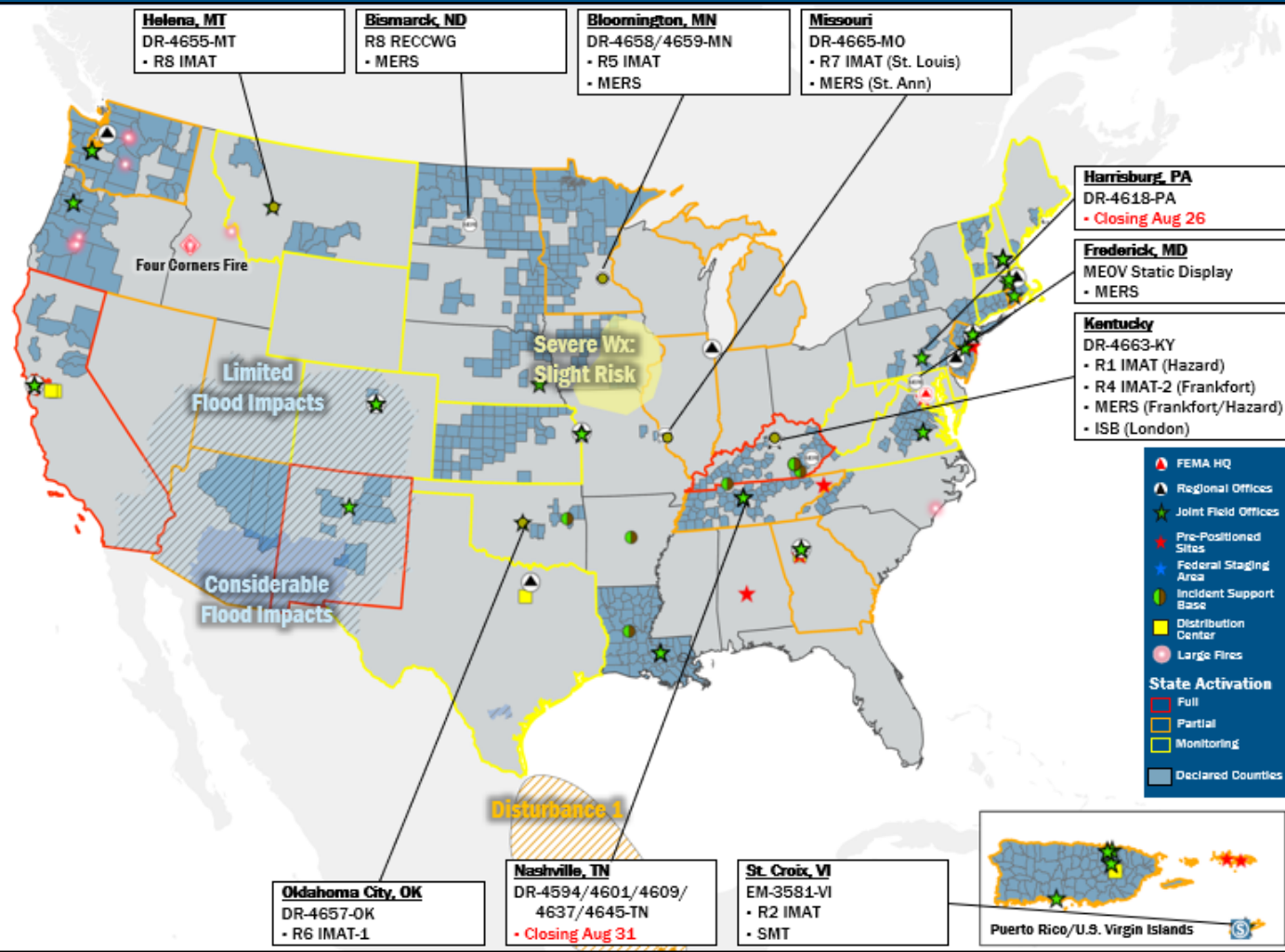
