Democratic National Convention – Chicago, IL



Democratic National Convention - Chicago, IL

<u>Situation:</u> The Democratic National Convention (DNC) will be hosted at the United Center in Chicago, IL from Aug 19-22. The Secretary of Homeland Security has designated the 2024 DNC as an event of national significance and a National Special Security Event (NSSE). FAA Temporary flight restrictions will be in effect from Aug 19-22.

Preparations / Response:

- The USSS is the lead federal law enforcement agency
- The Chicago Police Department is the lead local law enforcement agency
- The FBI is the lead federal agency for intelligence and counterterrorism
- FEMA is the lead federal agency for crisis and consequence management
- Temporary road closures in effect intermittently around McCormick Place beginning Aug 16 and around the United Center on Aug 17
- The FAA will enforce daily temporary flight restrictions





Tropical Storm Gilma: (Advisory #4 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 625 miles SSW of southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Moving W at 13 mph
- Slow strengthening is expected during the next few days
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 45 miles

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well ESE of Hilo, Hawaii
- Tropical Depression likely to form in the next couple of days
- Formation chance 48-hour: High (70%); 7-day: High (80%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well WSW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Tropical Depression could form within the next few days
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (20%); 7-day: Medium (40%)

Disturbance 3: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well S of the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Slow development is possible
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)




Hurricane Ernesto (CAT 1): (Advisory #31, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 340 miles SSE of Halifax, Nova Scotia
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph
- Moving NNE at 21 mph
- Little change in strength is forecast today, and a weakening trend is expected to begin tonight
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward up to 35 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 220 miles




National Weather Forecast







Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall


