

#### Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located approximately 1,000 ESE of Hilo, Hawaii
- Only a slight improvement in organization could result in the formation of a tropical depression or tropical storm later today
- This system is currently crossing into the Central Pacific basin, where it is then forecast to strengthen during the next couple of days and move near the Hawaiian Islands late this weekend or early next week
- Formation chance 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day:
   High (90%)



### Hurricane Gilma (CAT 3): (Advisory #16, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- Located 1,025 miles WSW of southern tip of Baja, California
- Maximum sustained winds 115 mph
- Moving WNW at 6 mph
- Some additional strengthening is possible today, and Gilma is likely to remain a powerful hurricane for the next couple of days
- Hurricane-storm-force winds extend outward up to 30 miles; Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 125 miles

#### Disturbance 1:

See Central Pacific for Disturbance 1

#### Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles S of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula
- Environmental conditions are forecast to be generally conducive for development over the next several days, and a tropical depression is likely to form during the next few days
- Formation chance 48-hour: Med (50%); 7-day: High (80%)



No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days

<u>Situation:</u> A tropical depression or tropical storm is likely to develop later today. A weather system is located about 1,000 miles east-southeast of Hilo, Hawaii traveling westward at 10 to 15 mph. This system is expected to strengthen as it moves into the central Pacific basin early today and move near the Hawaiian Islands late this weekend or early next week. (NHC, as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

# **Fire Weather Outlook**



# Hazards Outlook - Aug 24-28








