

Central/East Pacific Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK




Atlantic Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK



RADAR LOOP




Tropical Storm Idalia FORECAST TRACK




Tropical Storm Idalia PEAK STORM SURGE FORECAST

Tropical Storm Idalia - Response



<u>Current Situation:</u> Idalia has weakened from a Hurricane into a Tropical Storm crossing Georgia, South Carolina, and North Carolina overnight and is moving off the into the Atlantic Ocean today. Region IV continues to assess impacted areas and coordinate response efforts with federal, state, local, and tribal agencies to address lifesaving and recovery efforts.

Lifeline Impacts: (NRCC SLB Aug 31, 6:00 a.m. ET)

Safety and Security:

- FL: US&R activated the Red IST & 6 task forces
- FL: Evacuation orders issued for 20 (-11) counties; 11 (-14) mandatory evacuations, 9 (-24) voluntary evacuations
- GA: US&R activated 1 Type-3 staged in Atlanta
- GA: Evacuation ordered for Cumberland Island

Food, Hydration, Shelter:

- FL: 114 (+20) shelters open / 4,924 (+17) occupants
- GA: 1 shelter open / 4 occupants
- GA: ARC has prepositioned resources for up to 20k survivors

Health and Medical:

- FL: Full evacuations of 72 medical facilities
- Ground ambulances arrived & staging in Havana, FL; additional ambulances in transit

Energy:

- Personnel staged to respond to power outages
- FL: 144k (-1k) customers without power
- GA: 185k (-5k) customers without power

Communications:

- FL: MERS assets providing comms support, assets in Lake Mary, Orlando, and Tallahassee
- GA: Assets in Thomasville and Atlanta

Transportation:

- FL: 7 (-2) ports and waterways closed








National Weather Forecast





Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall








<u>Situation:</u> The fire started on August 24 and had burned in excess of 8,500 acres of private land and is 50% contained. No homes had been destroyed, but an estimated 253 primary homes were threatened in and around Pitkin, Louisiana, (pop. 455). The fire was also threatening rural homes outside the Ernest Thompson and DE Stephens subdivisions of the town of Pitkin as well as the communities of West Port and Dido. Mandatory and voluntary evacuations are taking place for approximately 600 people. The fire was also threatening the area's electric cooperative, 2 schools, 3 fire stations, telecommunication facilities, the watershed, and environmental resources.


