
Current Situation:

- The fire began Sep 2nd and is burning on state and private land in and around Weed, CA (pop. 8k)
- At the time of the FMAG approval: 1,228 acres burned; 0% contained
- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 11,000 people
- 2,500 primary homes are threatened; Multiple structures destroyed
- 2 ARC Shelters open Yreka; 54 Occupants
- The fire is also threatening US Route 97, Union Pacific Railroad, domestic water system, communications, electrical transmission lines, and Lake Shastina watershed in the area

Response:

- CA EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- Region IX and the NWC continue to monitor
- FMAG approved Sep 2nd




Tropical Outlook - Five Day

Eastern Pacific




<u>Tropical Storm Javier</u> (Advisory #7A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 305 miles WNW of the southern tip of Baja California, Mexico
- Moving NNW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Some additional strengthening is possible this morning before the tropical storm begins to weaken by this evening
- Expected to become post-tropical Sunday
- Tropical storm force wind extend out 90 miles

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles S of the coast of southern Mexico
- Tropical depression is likely to form later today or Sunday
- Formation chance 48-hour: High (90%); 5-day: High (90%)

Atlantic



<u>Tropical Storm Danielle</u> (Advisory #9 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 915 miles W of the Azores
- No present movement; with maximum sustained winds 70 mph
- Slight strengthening is expected tonight through Monday, and Danielle could regain hurricane strength on Sunday
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend out 125 miles


Tropical Storm Earl (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 115 miles ENE of Northern Leeward Islands
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Present movement is WNW at 13mph
- Earl is expected to pass north of the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico tonight and Sunday
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend out 175 miles


Excessive Heat Outlook








Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall




