





- Some development is possible as it moves WNW
- Formation chance: 48-hour Low (0%); 7-day Low (30%)



Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located NW of the Gulf of Mexico
- Development of this system is unlikely
- Formation chance: 48-hour Low (10%); 7-day Low (10%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Few hundred miles east of North Carolina
- Subtropical development is not expected
- Formation chance: 48-hour Low (near 20%); 7-day Low (20%)

Disturbance 3: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located E of the coast of Africa
- Slow development is possible in the next few days
- Formation chance: 48-hour Low (near 10%); 7-day Low (20%)

Disturbance 4: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located NW of the Caribbean Sea
- Significant development seems unlikely
- Formation chance: 48-hour Low (0%); 7-day Low (30%)

Disturbance 5: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located few hundred miles from the Leeward Islands
- Environmental conditions could be conductive
- Formation chance: 48-hour Low (0%); 7-day Low (10%)




National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall





Hazards Outlook - Sep 7-11








