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# National Current Ops / Monitoring

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## New Significant Incidents / Ongoing Ops

- Hurricane Kiko (CAT-4) Preparations – Central Pacific

## Hazard Monitoring

- Severe Weather/Heavy Rain/Flash Flooding – Mid-Atlantic to Northeast
- Fire Weather – Pacific Northwest and Northern Intermountain
- Tropical Activity:
  - Atlantic:
    - Disturbance 1 (AL91): Low (30%)
  - Eastern and Central Pacific:
    - Hurricane Kiko (CAT-4)
    - Disturbance 1: Low (20%)

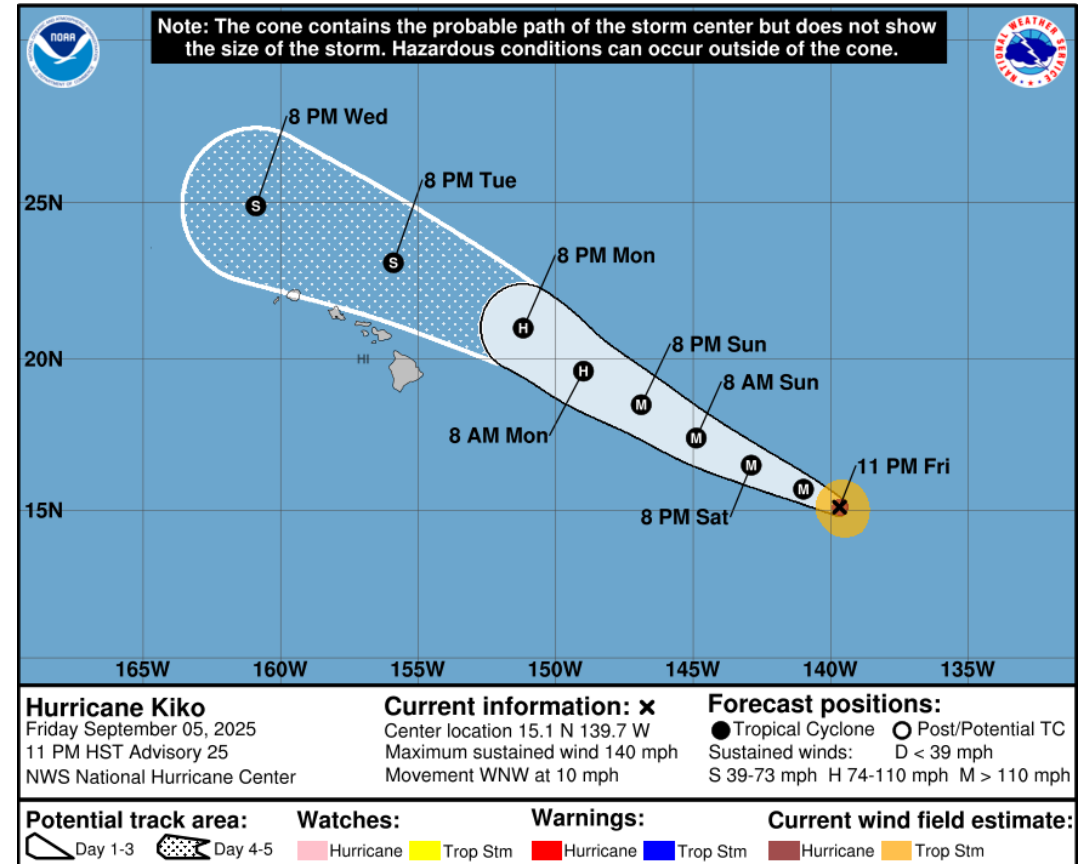


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# Hurricane Kiko (CAT-4) – Central Pacific

**Situation:** *(Advisory #25, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)*

- Located **1,065** miles ESE of Hilo, HI
- Moving W at **10** mph
- Maximum sustained winds **140** mph
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward up to **25** miles from the center; tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to **80** miles
- **Minor fluctuations in strength are anticipated through today, with gradual weakening expected to begin tomorrow**



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# Hurricane Kiko (CAT-4) Preparations – Central Pacific

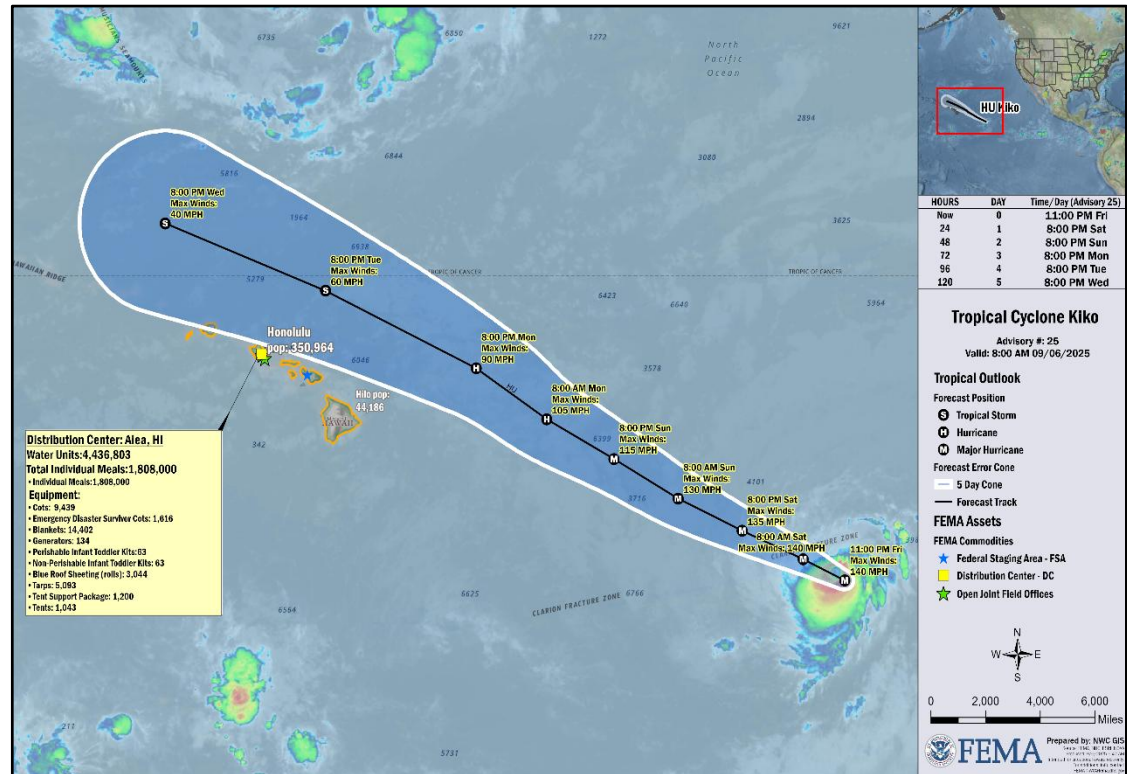
**Situation:** Hurricane Kiko (CAT-4) is expected to approach the Hawaiian Islands next week, with the risk for wind and rainfall impacts increasing. FEMA and our federal, state, and territorial partners are preparing for potential impacts from the tropical activity.

## State / Local Preparations:

- HI:
  - SEOC at Normal Operations
  - HI Distribution Center has commodities available/stocked, if needed

## Federal / FEMA Preparations:

- FEMA Region 9:
  - Conducting coordination calls with Hawaii Emergency Management Agency (HIEMA), National Weather Service (NWS), U.S. Army Corp of Engineers (USACE), and ESF partners
  - Logistics has mapped out both sea and air transport of resources inter-island and from CONUS
  - RWC at enhanced; RRCC is rostered
  - R-IMAT 1 is deployed to CA; R-IMAT 2 is available
- FEMA HQ:
  - NWC is Monitoring; NRCC is at Steady State
  - Operations Coordination Call convened on Sep 5



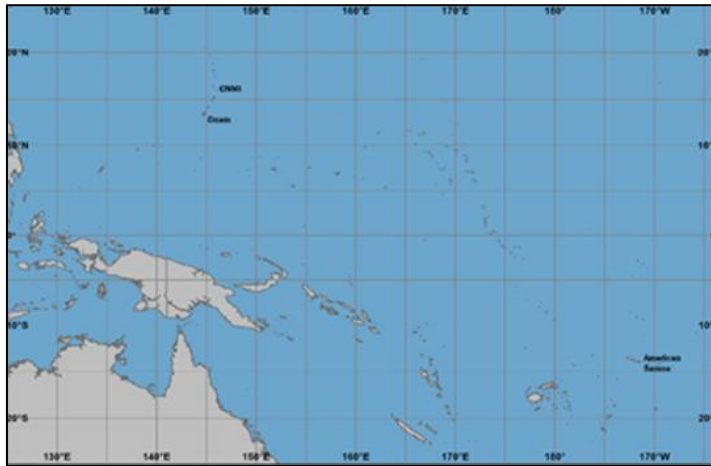

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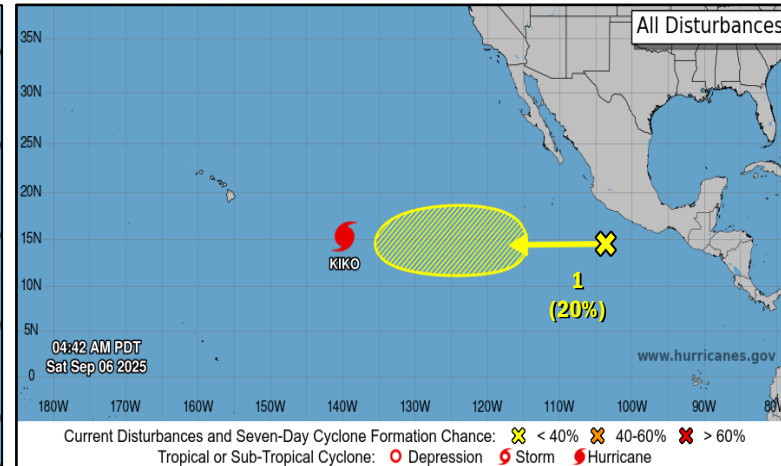
# Tropical Outlook

## Central and Eastern Pacific



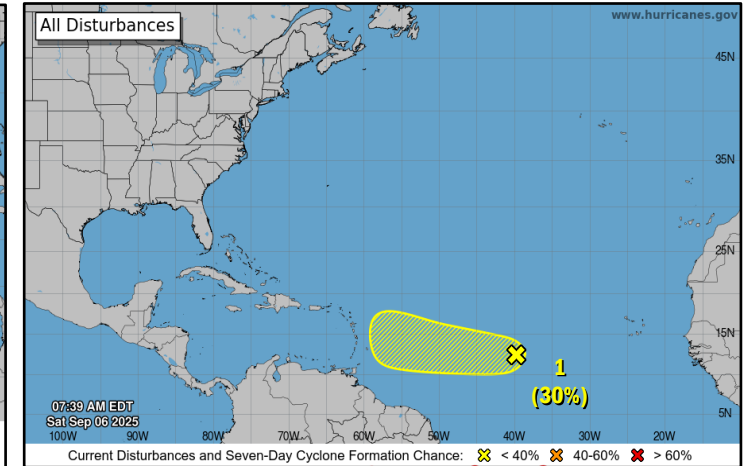
### Hurricane Kiko (CAT-4): (Advisory #25, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

### Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located south of the Baja California Peninsula
- Slow development of this system is possible as it moves westward over the East Pacific
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)

## Atlantic



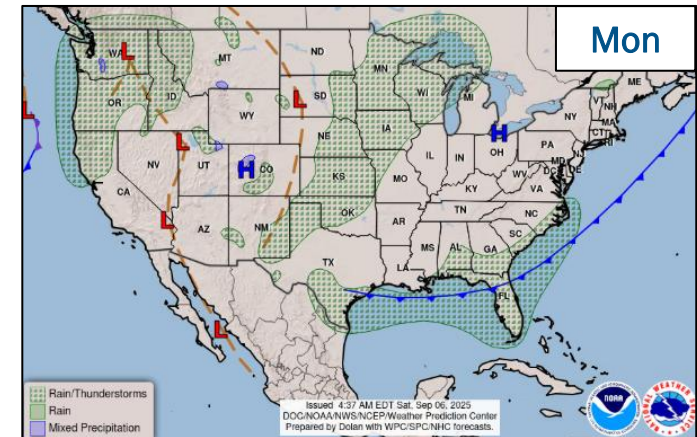
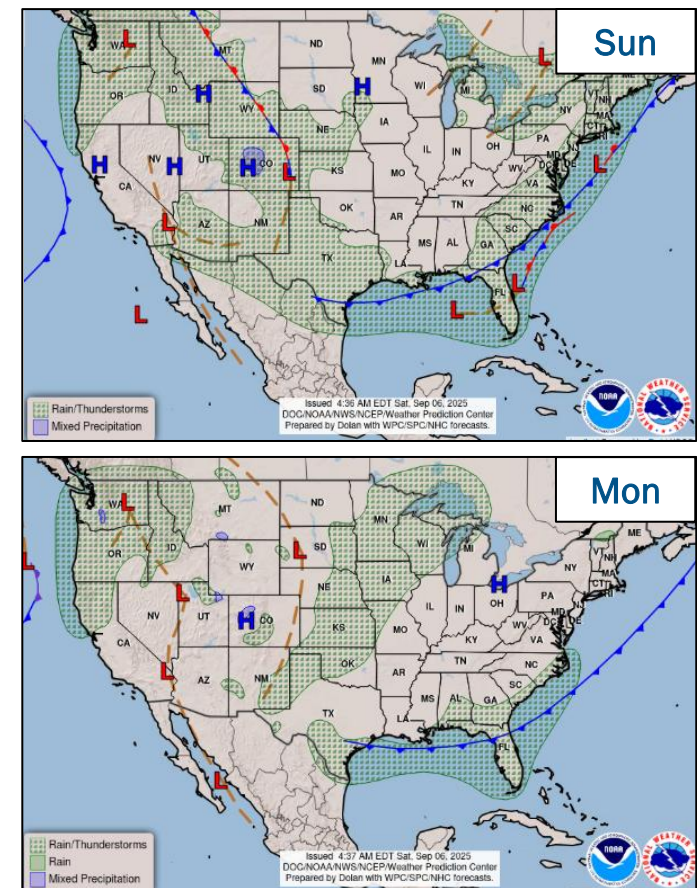
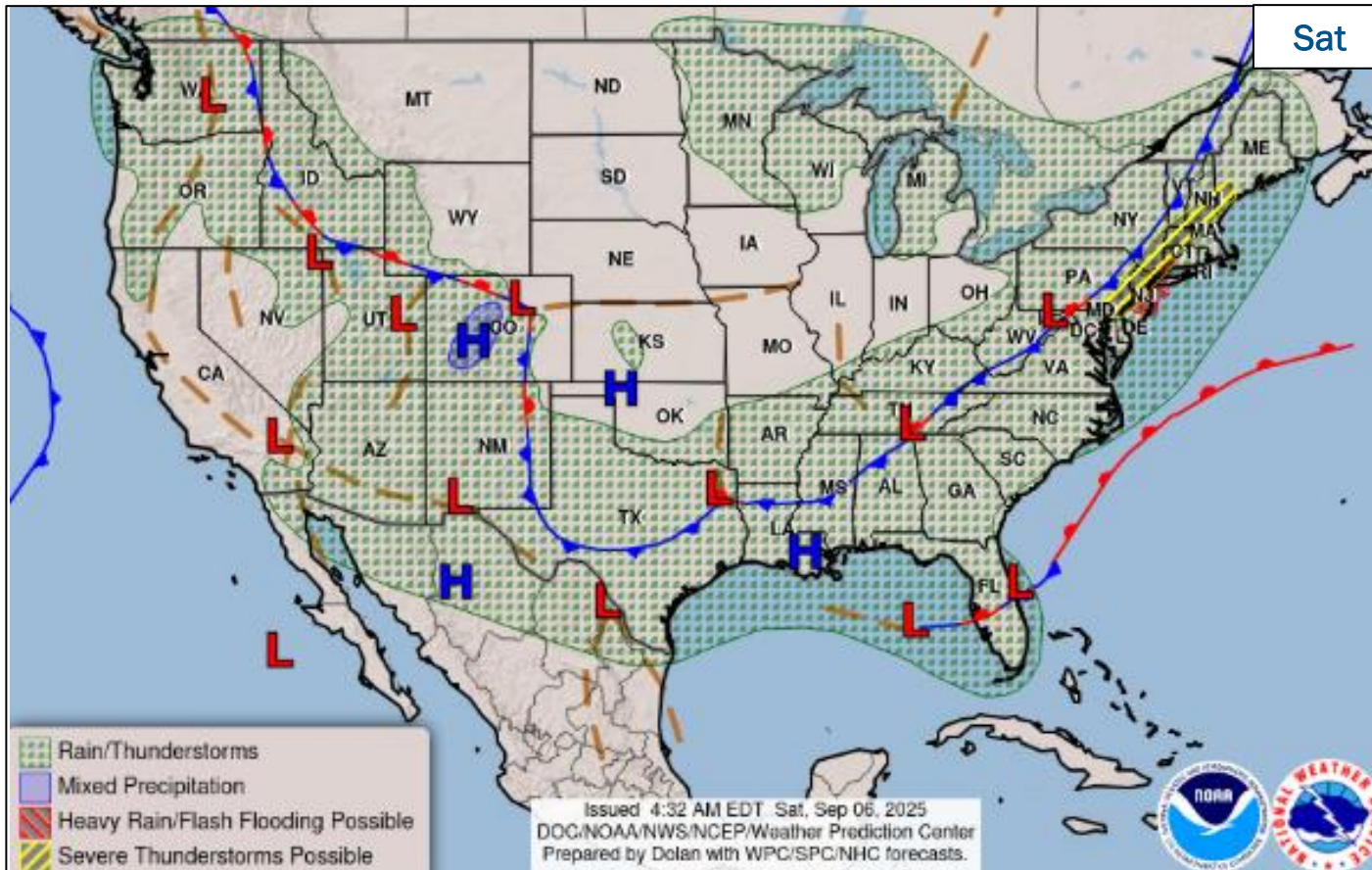
### Disturbance 1 (AL91): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the central tropical Atlantic
- Environmental conditions are only marginally conducive for development, and the chances of this system becoming a tropical depression are decreasing
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: Low (30%)



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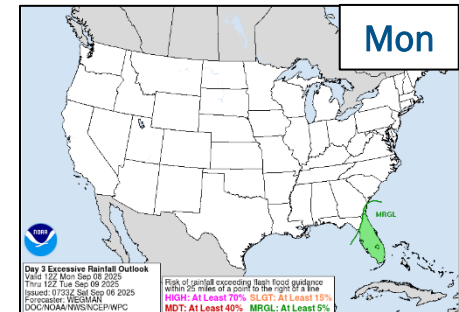
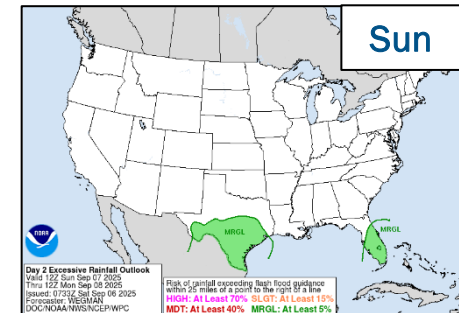
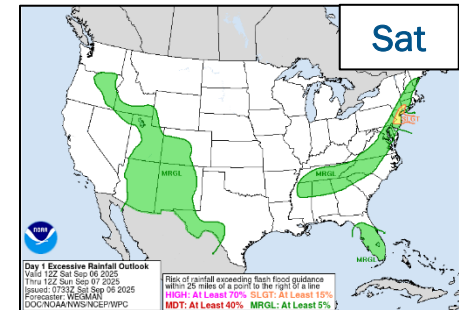
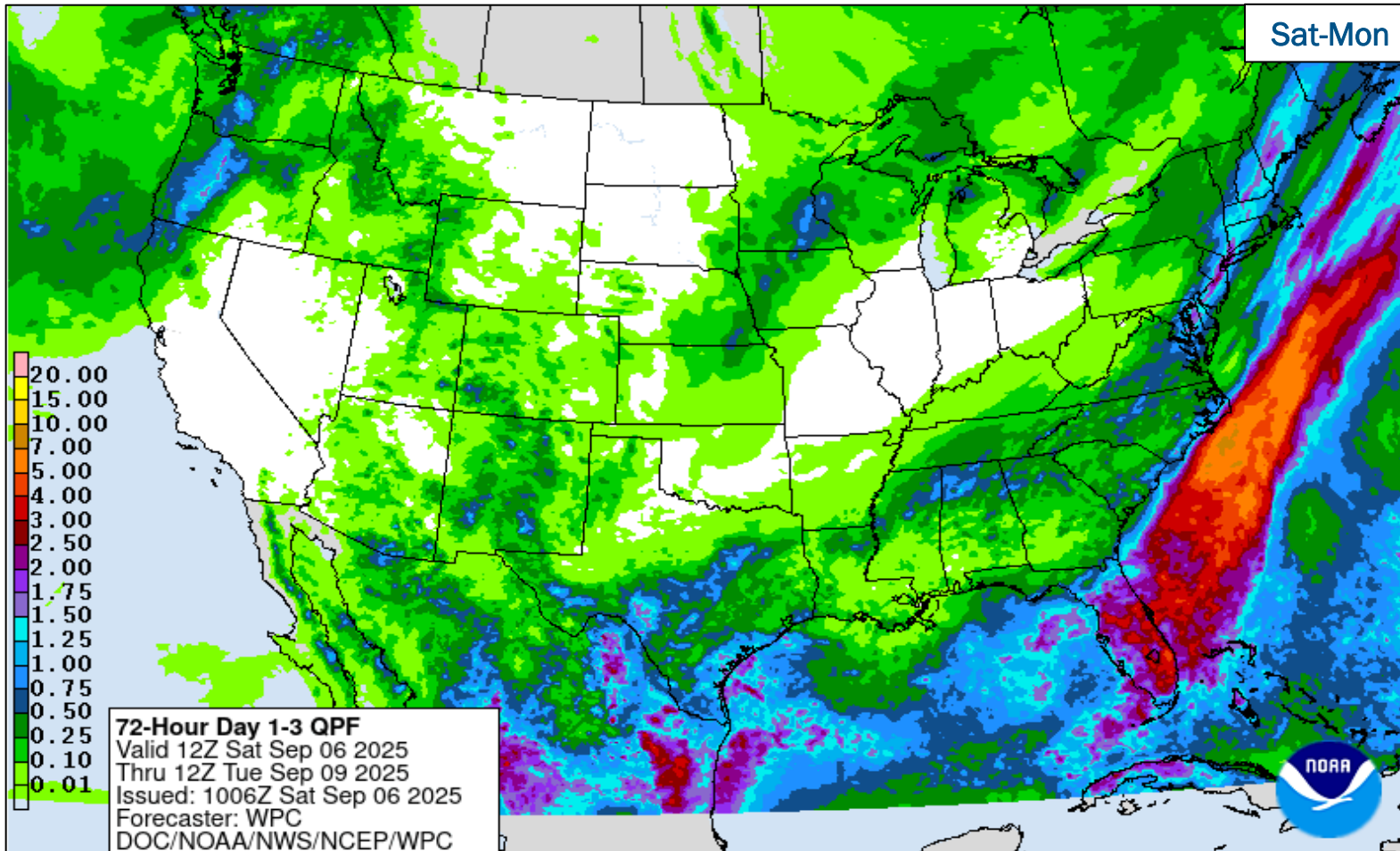

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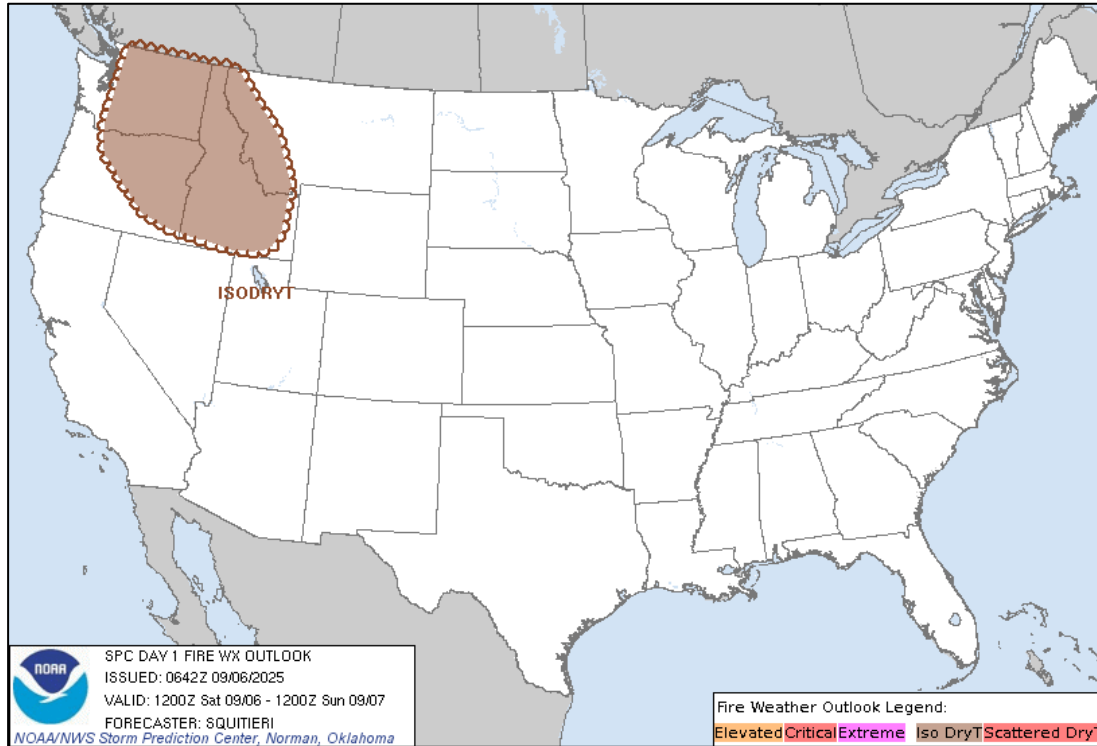

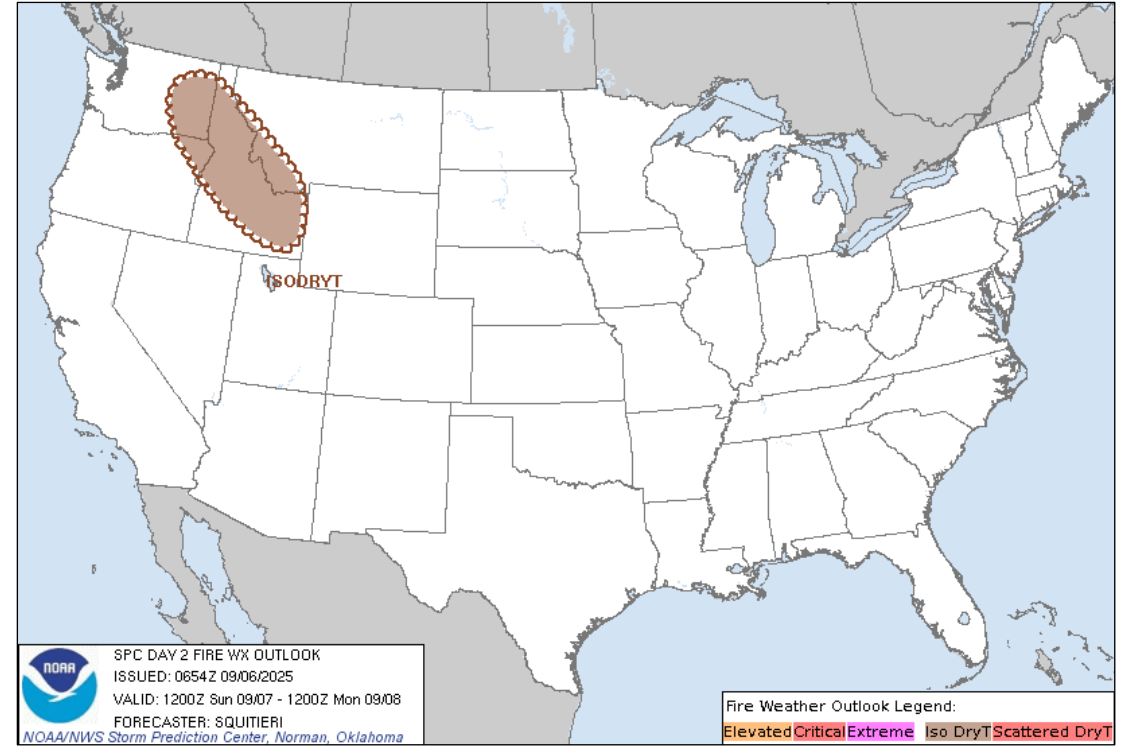
