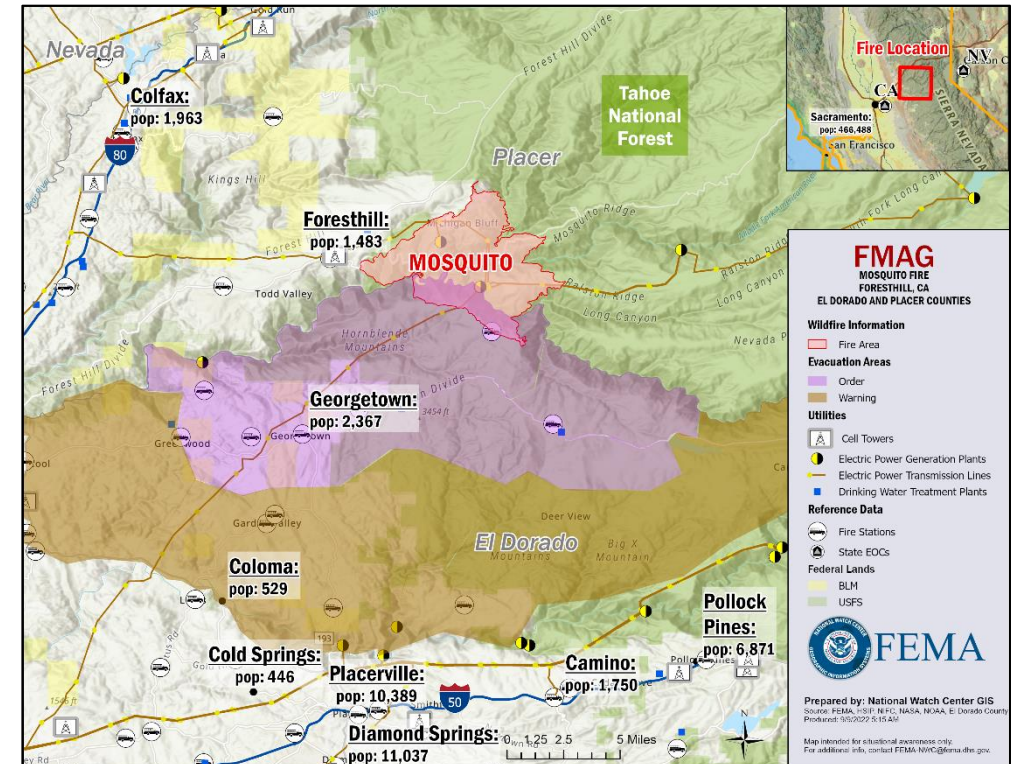

Current Situation:

- The fire began on September 6, 2022, and is burning on state and private land in and around Foresthill, CA (population 6,963); winds are blowing the fire towards the communities of Georgetown, Quintette, Todd Valley, Michigan Bluff, Volcanoville, and Chickenhawk Ridge
- 3,606 homes (90% primary, 10% secondary homes) threatened
- Also threatening 3 schools, a community center, Foresthill Fire Protection District, Sugar Pine Dam and Reservoir, Placer County Sheriff substation, Cal Fire Station 11, a water treatment plant, 2 hydro power plants and pipelines, two 30 KV and two 60KV power lines, and 2 public radio towers and radio repeaters for fire and law enforcement communications
- Mandatory evacuations in effect for 5,777 people
- 3 shelters open

Response:

- CA EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19); Governor declared a state of emergency for Placer and El Dorado counties
- Region IX RWC and the NWC continue to monitor and provide updates
- FMAG approved September 9



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Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 1,100 miles E of the Leeward Islands
- Moving WNW at 15-20 mph
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 5-day: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

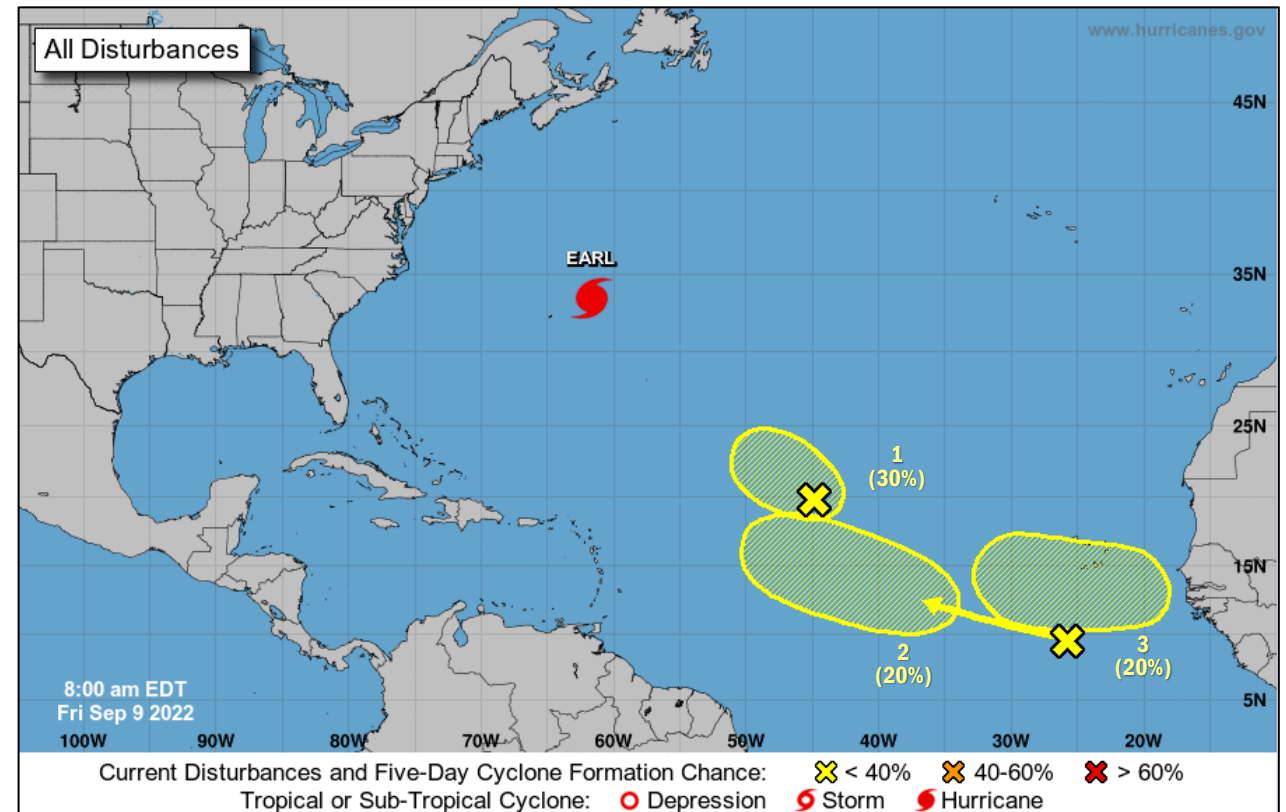
- Located several hundred miles S of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving WNW at 15-20 mph
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 5-day: Low (20%)

Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located off the coast of Africa
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 5-day: Low (20%)

Hurricane Earl (CAT 2) (Advisory #26, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 140 miles ENE of Bermuda
- Moving NNE at 17 mph; maximum sustained winds 100 mph
- Some additional strengthening is forecast through tonight
- Expected to transition into a powerful hurricane force extratropical low on Saturday and then gradually weaken
- Hurricane force winds extend 80 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend 205 miles

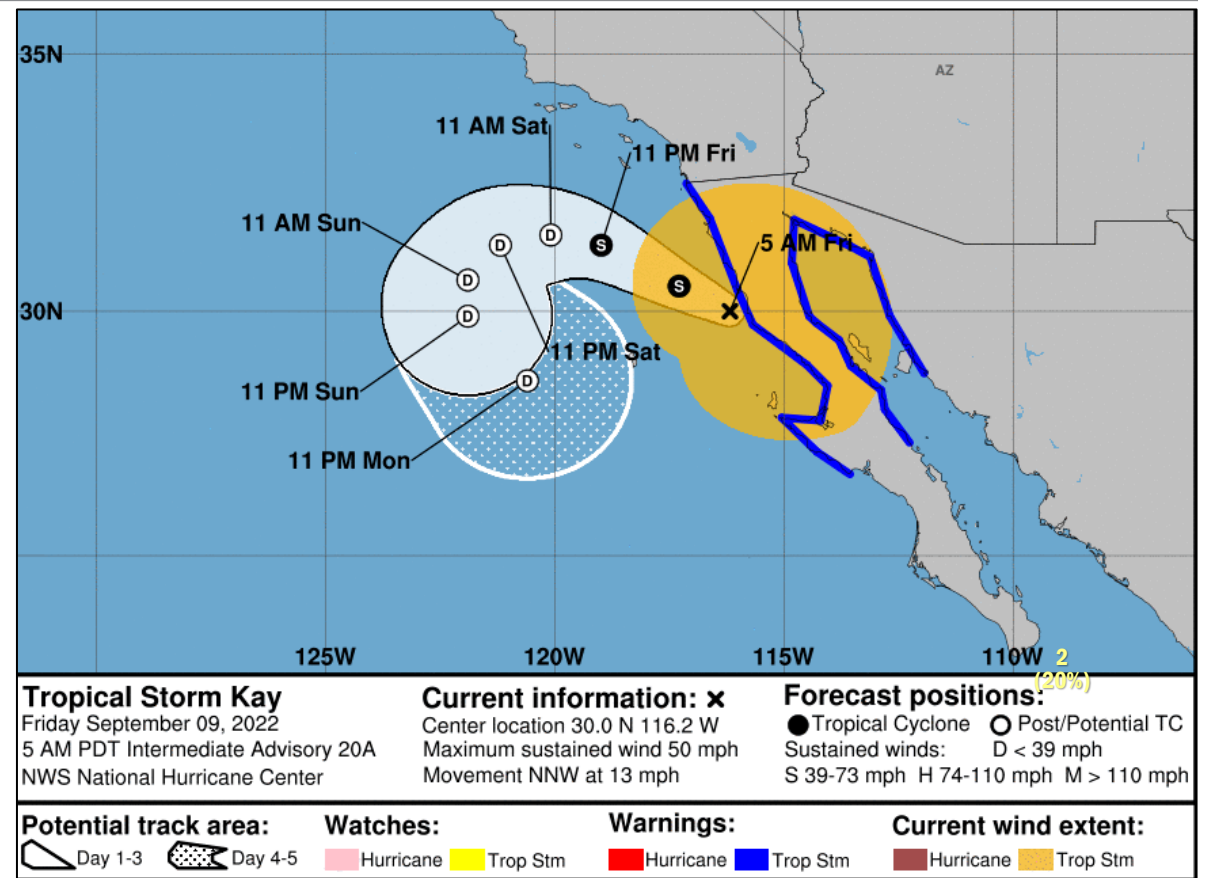


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Tropical Storm Kay – Eastern Pacific

Tropical Storm Kay (Advisory #20A, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

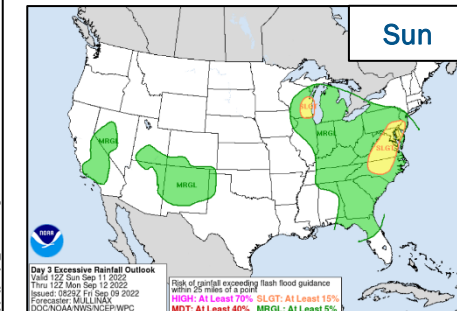
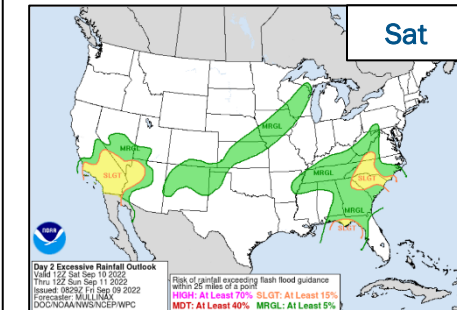
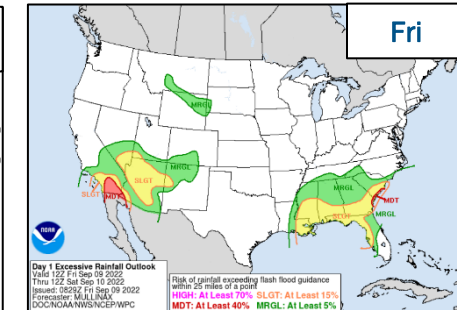
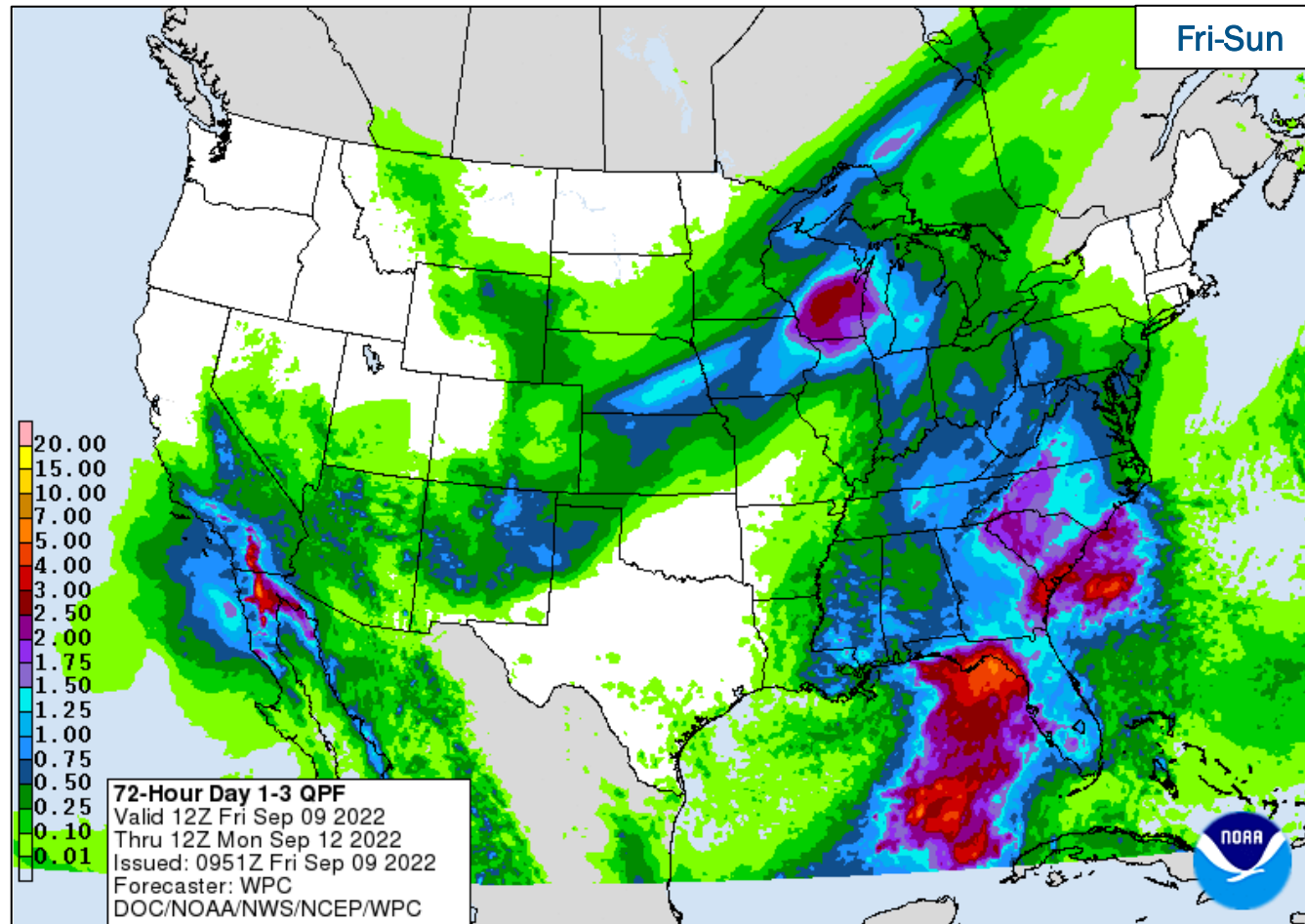
- Located 195 miles SSE of San Diego, CA
- Moving NNW at 13 mph; on the forecast track, the center will parallel to the coast of northwestern Baja California peninsula through today, and then begin to move further offshore by Saturday
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Expected to degenerate into a remnant low by late Saturday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 230 miles
- **Rainfall:** 2-4 inches, isolated 6-8 inches, in southernmost CA; 1-2 inches, isolated 3 inches, in southwest AZ; could cause flash flooding
- **Wind:** strong winds not directly associated with Kay's core wind field are expected across portions of southern CA and extreme southwestern AZ beginning today



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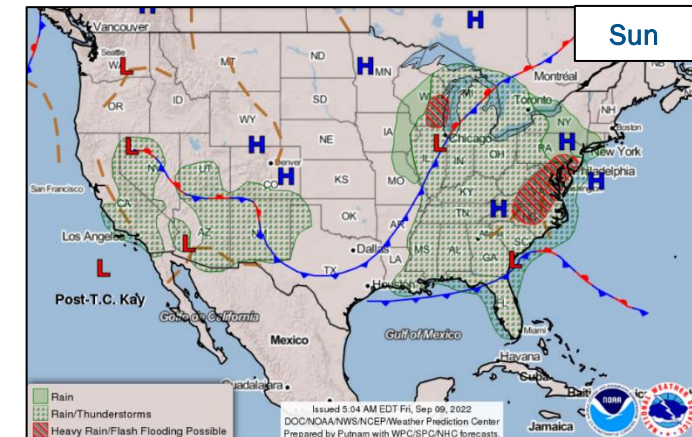
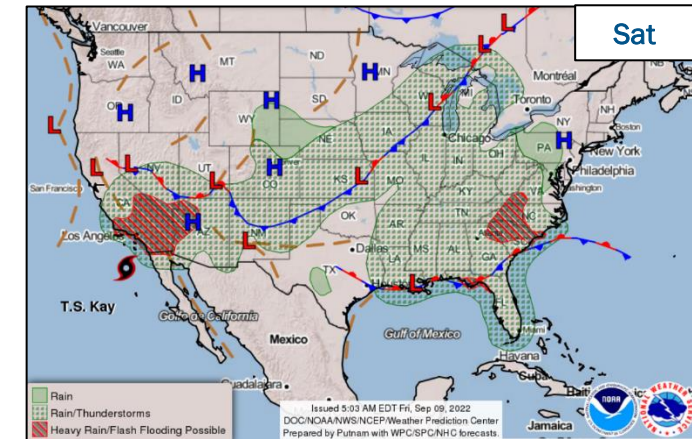
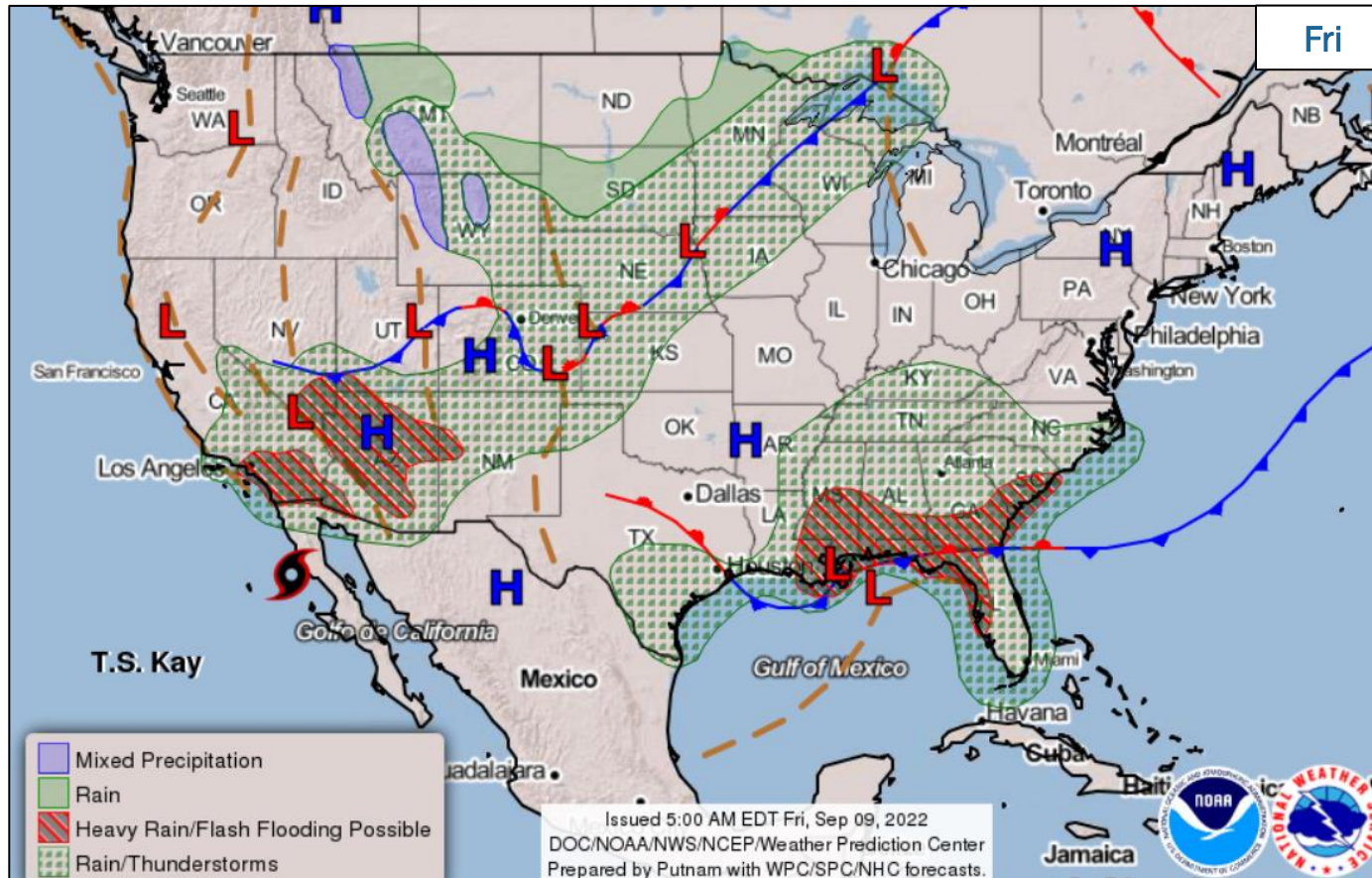
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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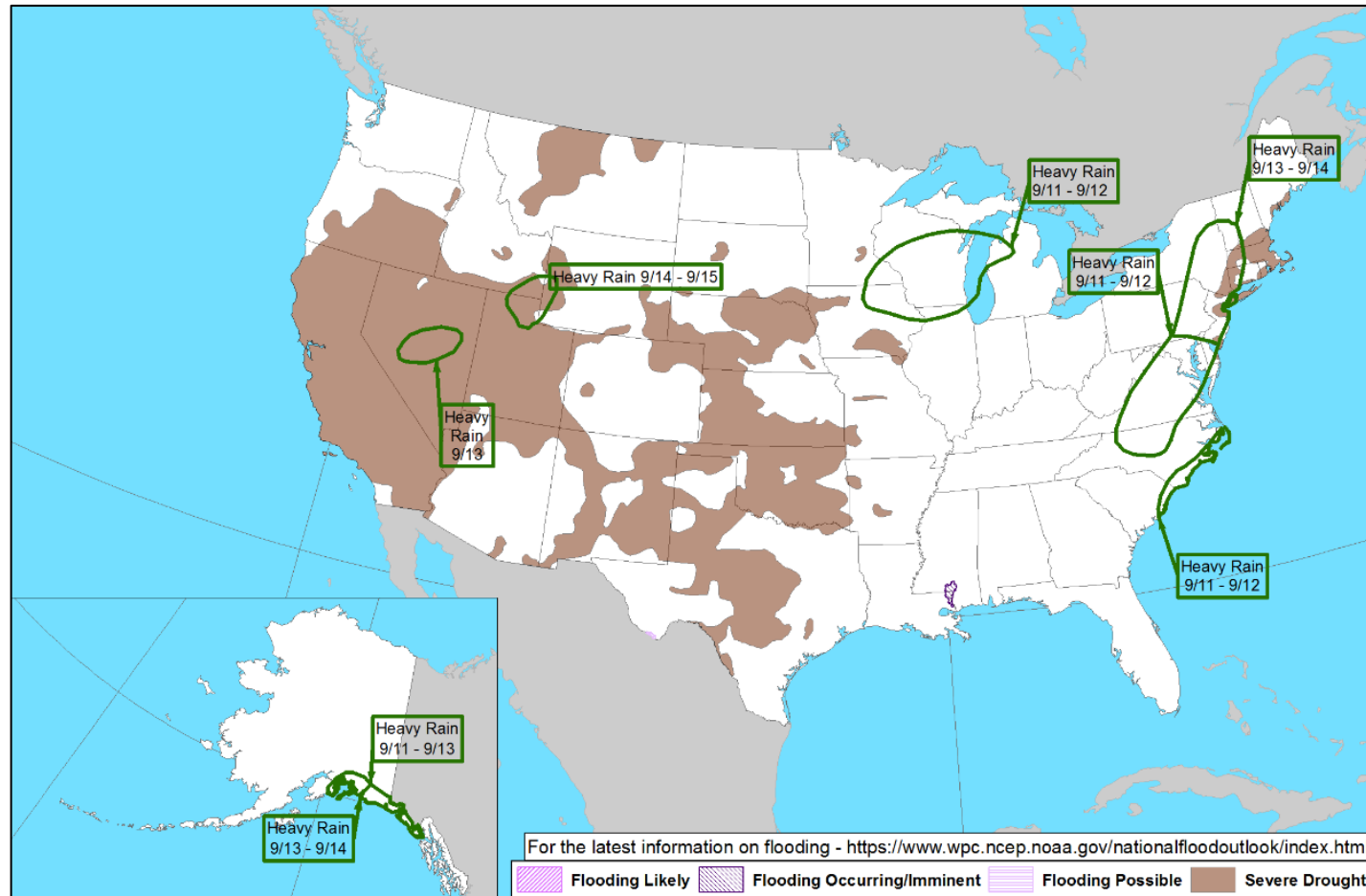
National Weather Forecast

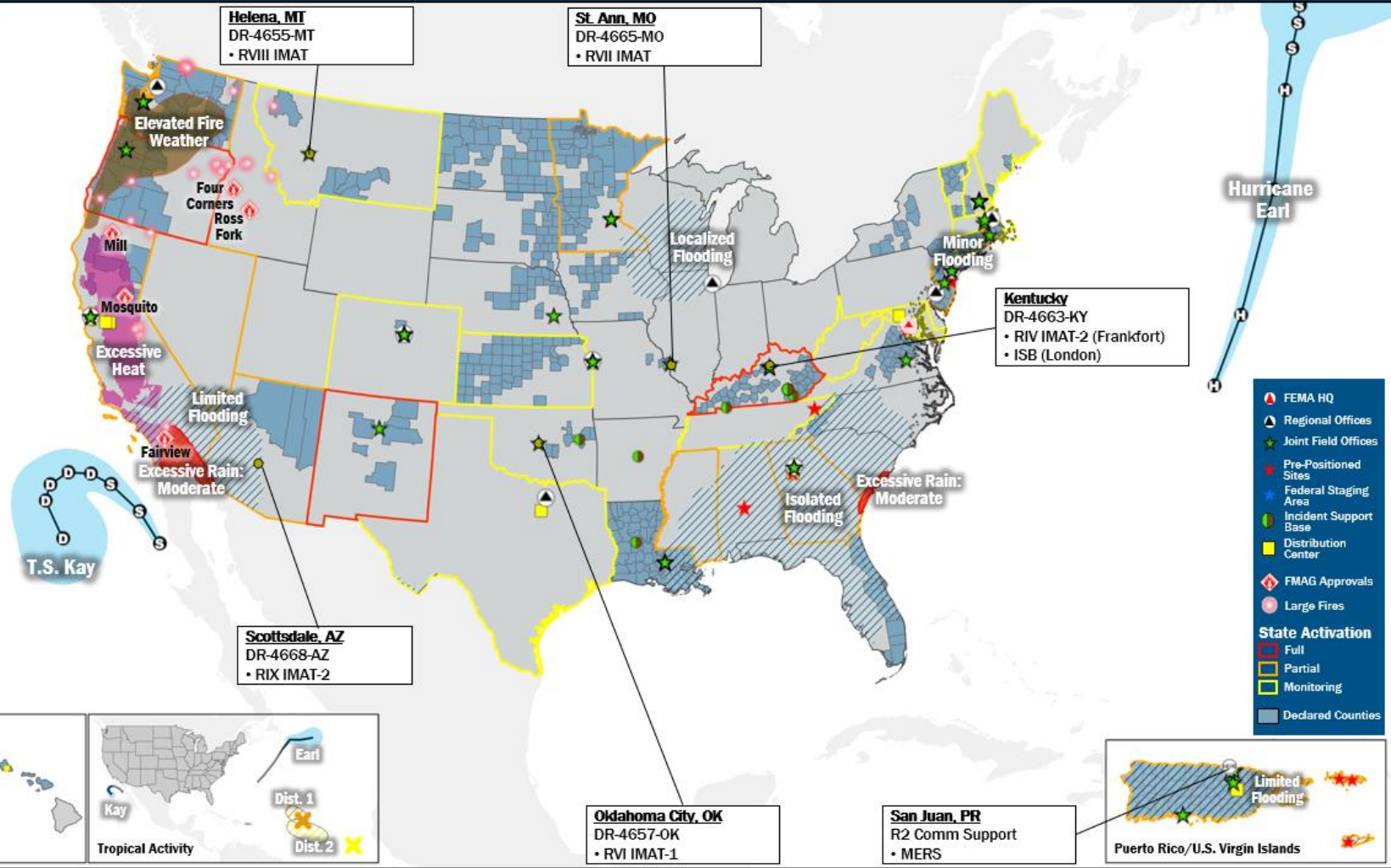
