National Current Operations and Monitoring **FEMA**

Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Wildfires
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Mid-Atlantic
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic:
 - Tropical Cyclone Paulette
 - Tropical Cyclone Rene
 - Disturbance 1: Medium (60%)
 - Disturbance 2: Low (30%)
 - Disturbance 3: High (90%)
 - Disturbance 4: Medium (40%)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Disturbance 1 Low (20%)
 - Disturbance 2 High (70%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic


Tropical Cyclone Paulette (Advisory #18 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 810 miles ENE of the Northern Leeward Islands
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 65 mph
- Gradual strengthening is expected
- Tropical storm force winds extend 205 miles

Tropical Cyclone Rene (Advisory #17 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 985 miles WNW of Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving WNW at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Gradual strengthening is forecast
- Tropical storm force winds extend 70 miles





Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Extending from near the Bahamas eastward over the western Atlantic
- Forecast to move west, crossing the Bahamas and Florida on Friday, and into the eastern Gulf of Mexico over the weekend
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (40%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (60%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · Located over north-central Gulf of Mexico
- Some slow development is possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)


Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- · Located a few hundred miles southeast of Cabo Verde Islands
- Gradual development is forecast
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (70%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)

Disturbance 4 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Forecast to emerge off the west coast of Africa
- Tropical depression could form early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)





Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 400 miles SW of the southern tip of Baja California Peninsula, Mexico
- Some development is possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)


Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 300 miles SSW of the coast of southwest Mexico
- Moving slowly WNW away from the coast of Mexico
- Gradual development is possible; tropical depression could form over the weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (50%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)

Wildfires – Western US




<u>Situation (as of 06:00 am ET)</u>: More than 100 large fires are currently burning uncontained across the US, the majority of which are in FEMA Regions VIII, IX and X (*NIFC SITREP, Sep 9*). The NWC is closely monitoring 29 FMAG-approved wildfires. Homes, public facilities and infrastructure are threatened.

- Acreage burned: 111,689
- Homes / structures threatened: 4,203 / 104
- Homes / structures destroyed: 32 / 43
- Fatalities / Injuries: 0 / 13
- Evacuations: Over 9,000 (some fires have unknown number) FEMA Region IX: 5 FMAGs (CA-5)
- Acreage burned: 646,215
- Homes / structures threatened: 34,194 / 756
- Homes / structures destroyed: 1,416 / 594
- Fatalities / Injuries: 13 / 34
- Evacuations: 52,130
- FEMA Region X: 21 FMAGs (OR-16; WA-5)
- Acreage burned: 1,117,773
- Homes / structures threatened: 134,179 / 5,417
- Homes / structures destroyed: 965 / 295
- Fatalities / Injuries: 2 / 8
- Evacuations: Over 201,870 (some fires have unknown number)

 - UT EOC at Full Activation; CO & MT EOCs at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- Region IX: IMAT deployed to CA EOC (wildfires)
 - FEMA-4558-DR-CA approved for Wildfires
 - CA EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19 and wildfires)
- Region X RRCC at Level III (Wildfires & COVID-19); IMAT deployed to OR EOC
 - OR Governor verbally requested an Emergency Declaration
 - OR & WA EOCs at Full Activation (COVID-19)



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 23 (+2) states/territories, with 12 (+4) states/territories in a plateau status, and 21 (-3) states/territories on a downward trajectory. 19,795 (-452) Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,738 (+1) FEMA employees deployed. (COVID-19 SLB, as of Sep 9)


Nationwide Testing: 93,431,083 (+1,022,849) cumulative (as of Sep 9)

 - Worldwide: 894,983 (+29,829)





Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall










