




Tropical Outlook - Five Day




No tropical cyclones are expected during the next 5 days

- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 5-day: Med (40%)




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Formation chance 48-hour Low (near 0%); 5-day: Low (20%)







Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall







Severe Weather Outlook





Fire Weather Outlook






Hazards Outlook - Sep 12-16






Long Range Outlooks - Sep 16-20

Situation: The fire started on Sep 9 and has burned more than 24 acres of private land (0% contained) 20 miles southeast of Portland. Mandatory evacuations are in effect for 1,098 people. The fire threatens 24,526 homes in and around the communities of Estacada and Springwater, OR. 80 percent of the threatened homes are primary residences and 20 percent are secondary homes. The fire also threatens Milo McIver State Park, many commercial businesses, threatened and endangered species such as salmon and steelhead, fish hatcheries nearby, wildlife (such as big game), other environmental and cultural resources, Estacada water and sewer plant, 5 dams in the area (which power Portland General Power), Bonneville Power Authority transmission lines, and the Valley View Airport.



Situation: The fire started on Sep 10 and has burned over 5000 acres (0% contained) of federal, state, and private land. At the time of the request, the fire was threatening 911 homes in and around the communities of Skykomish, Baring, Grotto and Index. Approximately 756 of the threatened homes are primary residences; 155 are secondary homes. Mandatory evacuations are in effect for 1,500 people. The fire also threatens Puget Sound Energy Lines, BPA powerlines, Sultan Basin Watershed, Snohomish PUD, Verizon telecommunications, BNSF rail line, cultural resources, roads and bridges.

- WA EOC at Partial Activation (Avian Influenza, COVID-19, Monkeypox and Wildfires)
- Bothell MOC and NWC continue to monitor






