


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located in the far eastern portion of the eastern North Pacific
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (10%); 5-day: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located SWS coast of Mexico
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 5-day: Low (20%)

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located over the central subtropical Atlantic
- Some slow development is possible during the early to middle part of this week
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 5-day: Low (20%)



Tropical Storm Fiona – Atlantic

Tropical Storm Fiona (Advisory #16A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 80 miles WSW of St. Croix, USVI and 65 miles SSE of Ponce, PR
- Moving WNW at 8 mph
- On the forecast track, the center will approach Puerto Rico this morning, and move near or over Puerto Rico this afternoon or evening
- Maximum sustained winds 70 mph
- Strengthening is forecast, expected to become a hurricane before reaching the southern or southwestern coast of PR later today
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 140 miles
- Hurricane Warning for PR; Hurricane Watch and Tropical Storm Warning for USVI
- Rainfall: 4 to 6 inches with local maximum totals of 10 inches in USVI;
 12 to 16 inches with local maximum totals of 25 inches for PR
- Storm Surge: 1-3 feet for southern coast of PR; 1-2 feet for USVI;
 localized flooding also possible elsewhere in PR






Tropical Storm Madeline- Eastern Pacific


Tropical Storm Madeline (Advisory #3A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located 165 miles SSW of Cabo Corrientes, Mexico
- Moving N at 9 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Some slight strengthening is forecast over the next day or so, weakening is forecast to begin later this week
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 150 miles

Tropical Storm Fiona - PR and USVI

Current Situation:

On the forecast track the center of Tropical Storm Fiona will approach PR this morning, and then move near or over PR this afternoon or evening

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security: Preventative discharges in the Carrizo and La Plata reservoirs to avoid overflow

Food, Water, Shelter:

 87 shelters open with 644 occupants in PR; USVI 0 shelters open (Region II Response DD Email as of 7:26 a.m. ET)

Communications:

• PR: Communication cables damaged in Vieques and Culebra; repairs scheduled for September 20 (Region II SLB as of 2:00 p.m. ET)

Energy:

PR: 112k (7.58%) customers without power (peak 141k); USVI: 9k (16.03%) customers without power (peak 12k) (Eagle-1 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


Transportation:

- PR and USVI ports at port condition ZULU (closed to all traffic)
- All PR and USVI ferry services suspended (Region II SLB 2:00 p.m. ET)

State / Local Response:

- PR EOC at Partial Activation; Governor declared a state of emergency
- Approved: PR Emergency Declaration on September 18
- USVI EOC at Full Activation





FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region II RRCC at Level III, day shift, with ESFs 2, 3, 8, 12, 13, 14, DCE
 - Region II IMAT deployed to USVI; FCOs deployed to PR & USVI
- National IMAT Blue deploying to PR
- ISB and SMT teams and MERS deployed to PR & USVI
- US&R MD-TF1 and White IST deploying to PR
- NWC continues to monitor and provide updates

Remnants of Typhoon Merbok – Alaska

Current Situation:

Remnants of Typhoon Merbok will continue to bring high winds, serious storm surge, and potentially historic coastal flooding to southwestern Alaska today. All impacted and potentially impacted areas are predominantly Alaskan Native Villages. Reports from multiple communities of power disruptions, damaged homes, flooding, and some infrastructure damage. Residents are sheltering at schools. Response is anticipated to remain within State capabilities and AK has sufficient commodities to meet the needs of impacted communities.

Lifeline Impacts:

Food, Water, Shelter

- 1 shelter open with 100 occupants (Kusilvak County) (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:51 a.m. ET)
- 7 community shelters open with unknown number of occupants (Region X SPOTREP 6:30 p.m. ET)


Energy: Unconfirmed reports of 3 communities with power outages (Region X SPOTREP 6:30 p.m. ET) Transportation: All major land transport, seaports, and airports (Anchorage and Fairbanks) are fully operational (Region X Impacts Assessment 9:12 p.m. ET)

State / Local Response:

AK EOC at Partial Activation; Governor declared a state of emergency


FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region X and Bothell MOC continue to monitor; RRCC and ESFs on alert
- Region X IMAT and Bothell MERS deployed to AK, National IMAT Red Deploying.
- U.S. Coast Guard and American Red Cross deployed to AK
- NWC continues to monitor and provide updates






National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall







Severe Weather Outlook





Fire Weather Outlook






Hazards Outlook - Sep 19 - 23






Long Range Outlooks - Sep 23 - 27
