### Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen - Preparations


<u>Current Situation:</u> Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen is moving northward and threatening the Eastern seaboard from South Carolina to New York with heavy rain, winds and tidal flooding. FEMA is coordinating with state, local and federal partners in preparation for potential impacts.






# Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen SATELLITE LOOP






### Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen FORECAST TRACK




# Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen TROPICAL STORM WARNINGS




# Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen PEAK STORM SURGE FORECAST




# Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen 3 DAY RAINFALL









# Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen EXCESSIVE RAINFALL OUTLOOK




# Potential Tropical Cyclone Sixteen DAY 1 CONVECTIVE OUTLOOK




