


East Pacific Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK




Atlantic Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK




Hurricane Fiona FORECAST TRACK




Tropical Depression Nine SATELLITE LOOP




Tropical Depression Nine FORECAST TRACK

Hurricane Fiona – Response



Current Situation:

Localized urban and small stream flooding will be possible through early this weekend due to a strong tropical disturbance south of Puerto Rico bringing additional rain; however, accumulations are expected to be minimal across the islands, with generally less than 2 inches expected. Soils remain near-saturated from significant amounts of rainfall associated with Hurricane Fiona, so any additional rainfall could quickly lead to runoff and flooding issues.

Lifeline Impacts: (NRCC SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET)

Safety and Security:

- PR National Guard and local fire departments continue search and rescue operations
 Food, Water, Shelter.
- 31 (-7) shelters open with 388 (-81) occupants in PR (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:49 a.m. ET)
- Boil water advisory in effect throughout PR

Health and Medical:

- PR: 5 confirmed fatalities
- All hospitals are operational; 40 (-1) on generator power in PR

Energy: (DOE SITREP, as of 4:28 p.m. ET)

PR: 1.0 million (-100k) (68% (-6)) customers without power


Transportation

- All ports open without restriction
- Airports: Mercedita Airport in Ponce re-opened and remains on generator power; all other airports open and operational

PR EOC at Partial Activation



- 507 (+107) FEMA and 565 (+65) OFA responders deployed to PR and Region II RRCC
- National IMAT Blue deployed to PR
- US&R MD-TF1, NE-TF1 and IST White deployed to PR
- ISB, SMT and MERS deployed to PR
- Region II RRCC at Level II (day shift), with all ESFs and DCE
- Regions I, II, and V IMATs are deployed to PR






