




## Tropical Storm Ophelia FORECAST TRACK








## Tropical Storm Ophelia PEAK STORM SURGE FORECAST




## Tropical Storm Ophelia 2 DAY RAINFALL









### Tropical Storm Ophelia EXCESSIVE RAINFALL OUTLOOK




## Tropical Storm Ophelia DAY 1 CONVECTIVE OUTLOOK

### **Tropical Storm Ophelia - Preparations**

<u>Current Situation:</u> Tropical Storm Ophelia will reach the coast of NC early Saturday and move across the Mid-Atlantic Saturday and Sunday. Little change in strength is forecast before landfall along the coast of NC. Weakening is expected after landfall through the rest of the weekend, and Ophelia is likely to become extratropical by Saturday night.






### **National Weather Forecast**






### **Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall**


