Severe Weather - Southeast

<u>Situation:</u> Severe weather moved through portions of the Lower Mississippi Valley and the Tennessee Valley producing tornadoes, damaging winds, and heavy rain. Preliminary reports of 2 reported tornadoes in LA impacting Jackson parish and 1 reported tornado in TN impacting Haywood county. Damage assessments to continue at daybreak.



Flash Flooding - Northern California

Situation: An atmospheric river continues to impact northern California and present a flood threat for portion of the state. A second series of storms is expected later this week. The current wave of moderate to heavy precipitation up and down the West Coast will catch a break across California by Tuesday but will linger near the Pacific Northwest coast. However, a large and powerful Pacific cyclone brewing in the Pacific is forecast to bring the next episode of heavy precipitation toward the West Coast on Wednesday. The heaviest precipitation is forecast to reach northern California by Wednesday afternoon. Flood Watches remain in effect for portions of northern California.

Safety and Security:

- (3) confirmed storm related fatalities (FEMA RIX SPOTREP 11:08 ET, Jan 2)
- Mandatory evacuations issued in Sacramento, Calaveras, and San Mateo counties, CA impacting approximately (900) residents (FEMA RIX SPOTREP 11:08 ET, Jan 2)

Food, Water, Sheltering:

- 2 shelters opened: 12 occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Report, as of 6:52 a.m. ET)
- The water system for Washington (pop 200), Nevada County, is down, with boiled water notices in effect. County is sending pallets of bottled water (FEMA RIX SPOTREP 11:08 ET, Jan 2)

Energy:


10k customers without power due to high winds and damaged powerlines; the two most affected counties are Yolo (6k) and San Joaquin (4k) (Eagle-I, as of 7:00 a.m. ET)

Transportation:

A majority of weather-related road closures have been lifted (FEMA RIX SPOTREP 11:08 ET, Jan 2)

State Response:

- CA EOC: Full Activation (COVID-19/ Seismic Activity)
- Sacramento, the City of Placerville, Monterey, San Joaquin, Calaveras County, and El Dorado County all made a Proclamation of Local Emergency
- Tuolumne Band of Mi-Wuk Indians declared State of Emergency






National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook





Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall









