

Situation: (Advisory #36A, as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Located 95 miles ESE of Barbuda
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Moving WNW at 7 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 175 miles
- Little change in strength forecast during the next 48 hours;
 could begin to intensify more significantly during the middle of the week






Tropical Outlook - Seven Day

Eastern Pacific




Disturbance 1 (EP98) (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles S of the coast of SW Mexico
- Tropical depression expected to form later today
- Moving WNW to NW
- Formation chance 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day: High (100%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a few hundred miles S of the coast of Central America
- Tropical depression could form by next weekend
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day:Medium (60%)

Atlantic




Tropical Storm Philippe (Advisory #36A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 125 miles ESE of Barbuda
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Moving WNW at 7 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 175 miles
- Little change in strength forecast during the next 48 hours; could begin to intensify more significantly during the middle of the week




National Weather Forecast







Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall




