


Tropical Outlook - Five Day

Central Pacific



No tropical cyclones expected during the next 5 days

Eastern Pacific



Hurricane Orlene (CAT 2) (Advisory #19A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 45 miles S of Mazatlán, Mexico
- Moving N at 9 mph; Maximum sustained winds 100 mph
- Weakening is expected during the next day or so
- Hurricane-force winds extend up to 15 miles; tropicalstorm-force winds extend outward up to 90 miles


Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located SSW of southern tip of the Baja California, Mexico Peninsula
- Tropical depression is likely to form later today or tonight while the system moves slowly northward-northwestward or northward
- Formation 48-hour: High (80%); 5-day: High (80%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles S of the Gulf of Tehuantepec
- Gradual development during the next several days
- Formation 48-hour: Low (20%); 5-day: Low (30%)

Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles SSW of the Cabo Verde Islands
- A tropical depression is likely to form during the early or middle part of next week
- Formation 48-hour: Medium (50%); 5-day: High (70%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles E of the Winward Islands
- Tropical depression could form within the next few days while it moves generally westward
- Formation 48-hour: Low (30%); 5-day: Med (40%)





Tropical Cyclone Ian – Response



<u>Current Situation:</u> FEMA and federal partners mission priorities remain focused on search and rescue operations, emergency debris removal, commodity distribution, restoration of critical utilities, including power and water, and damage assessments. Federal resources are prepositioned across the Region to support all impacted states.

<u>Lifeline Impacts:</u> (NRCC SLB as of 6:00 a.m. ET) Safety & Security:

- 3,404 (+674) people /155 pets rescued by FL National Guard, US Coast Guard, and US&R
- Civil Air Patrol scheduled 22 flights for imagery for US&R assessments

Food, Water, Shelter:

- **39** (-5) shelters open with 3,418 (-139) occupants
- FEMA pre-staged commodities at Maxwell ISB, AL: water, meals, infant/toddler kits, blankets, cots, tarps, consumable and durable medical supplies
- Points of Distribution (POD) began distributing food, water, and ice in Lee and Charlotte counties
- 132 (+10) boil water notices issued for 23 counties (pop 2m)

Health and Medical: 128 (-10) healthcare facilities impacted

Energy: FL: 644k (-216k) customers without power *Transportation:*

- Most major highways open; debris removal crews working on secondary and urban routes
- Southwest FL International Airport remains closed
- 24 of 28 ports are fully operational; 1 open with restrictions; 3 ports closed
- Most Amtrak / railroad services resumed normal operations


- FL EOC at Full Activation; Governor declared a State of Emergency; FEMA-3584-EM-FL, FEMA-4673-DR-FL, and FEMA-4675-DR-STOF approved
- VA EOC at Monitoring (TC Ian); Governor declared a State of Emergency
- NC EOC at Partial Activation; Governor declared a State of Emergency; FEMA-3586-EM-NC approved





- FEMA HQ: NRCC is Fully Activated 24/7, w/all ESFs, LNOs
 - National IMAT White deployed to FL EOC
 - Elements of National IMAT Blue deployed to FL EOC
 - o Elements of National IMAT Gold deployed to Ft. Myers, FL
 - US&R White IST and Federal Search and Rescue Coordination Group operational with the Florida Forest Service Gold IMT in Orlando, FL
 - 3-Type 1 (VA-TF2, OH-TF1, IN-TF1), 8-Type 3 US&R task forces (VA-TF1, TX-TF1, PA-TF1, MD-TF1, MO-TF1, NJ-TF1, NY-TF1, MA-TF1) and 4-Canine Search Teams Human Remains Detection (CSTs-HRD) (TN-TF1) conducting search and rescue operations in support of FL; 18 additional US&R CSTs-HRD requested and en route to Orlando, FL.

 - HHS: 3 DMATs deployed FL (Lee County, Sarasota, and Charlotte)







