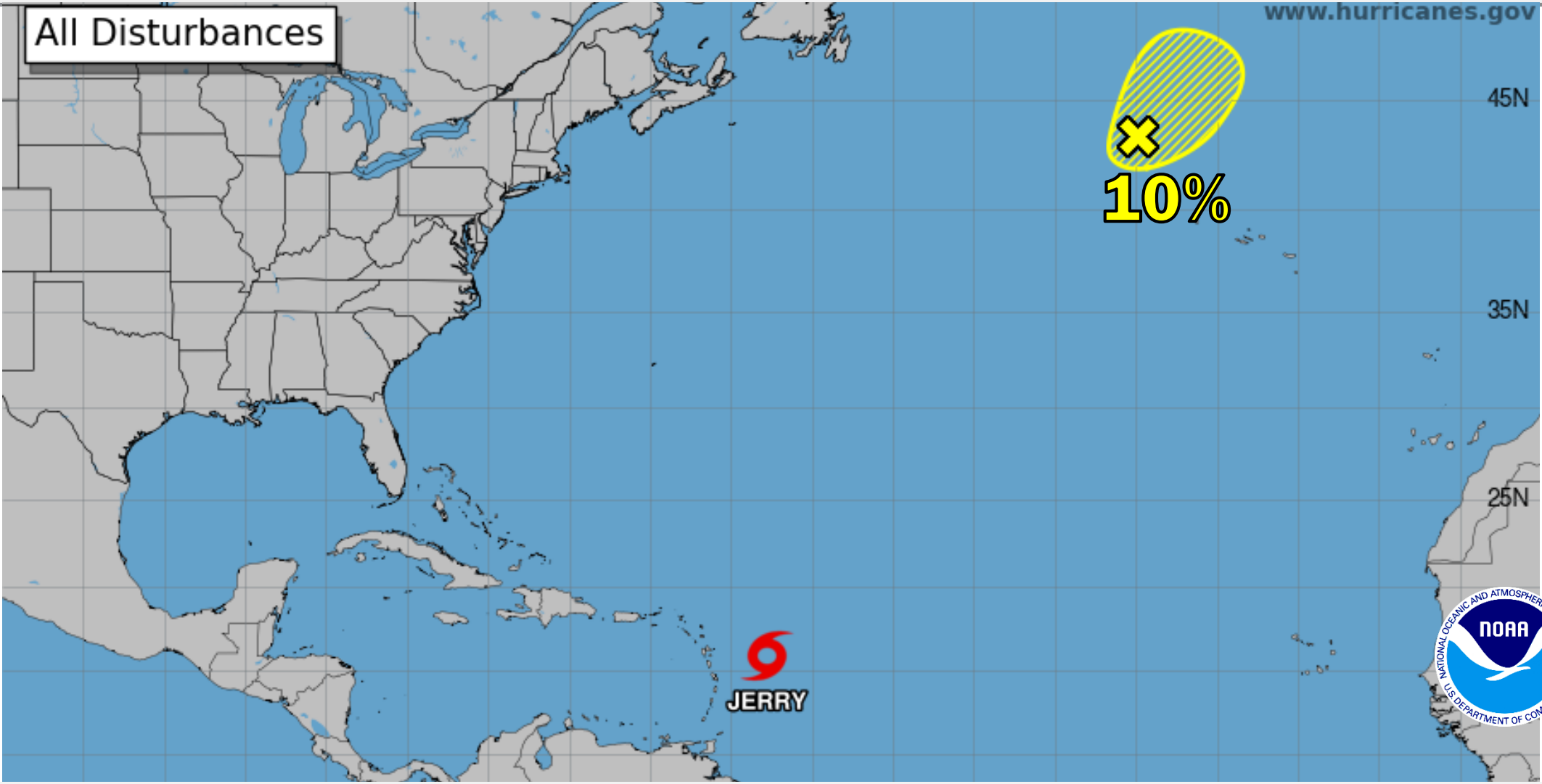

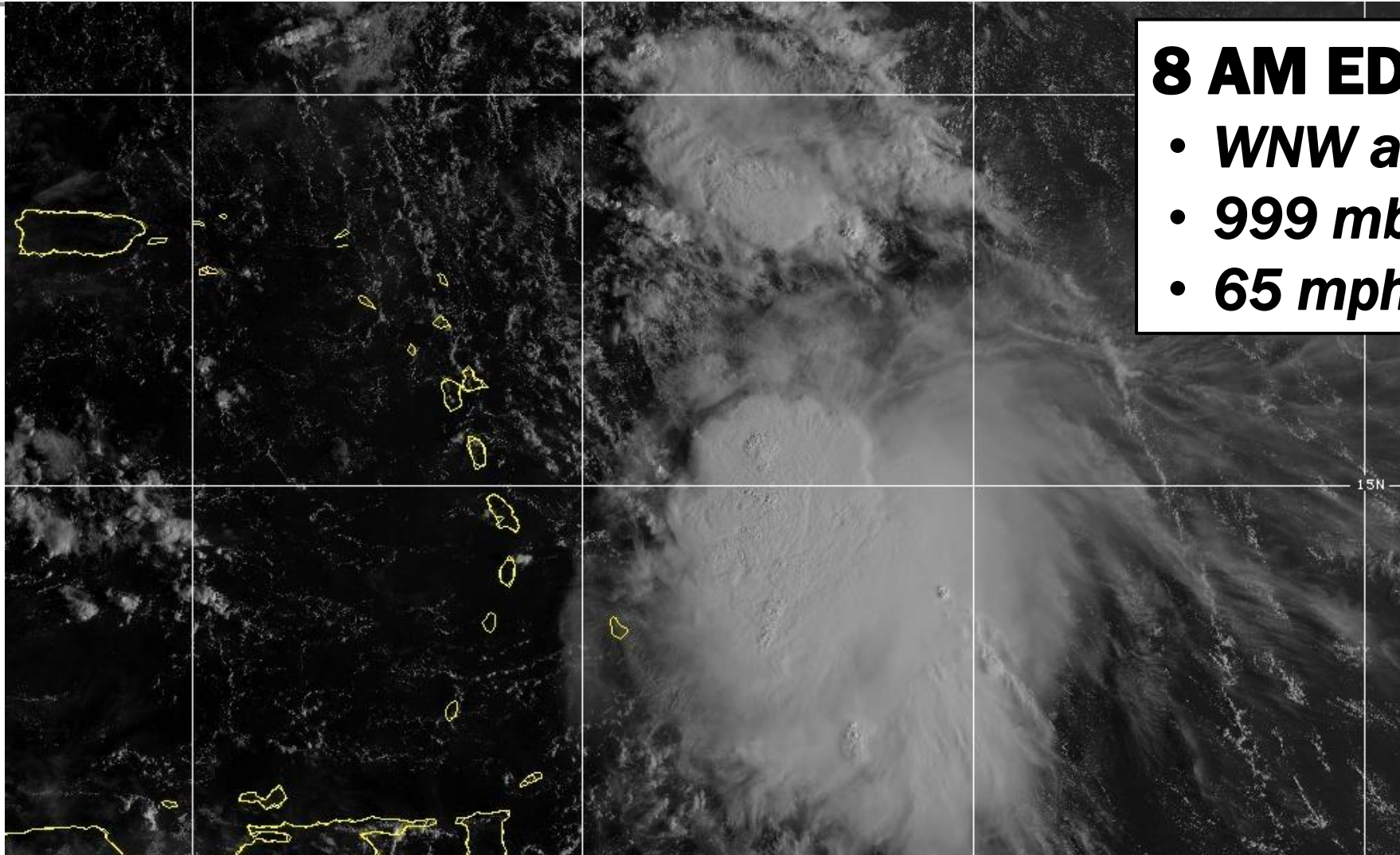

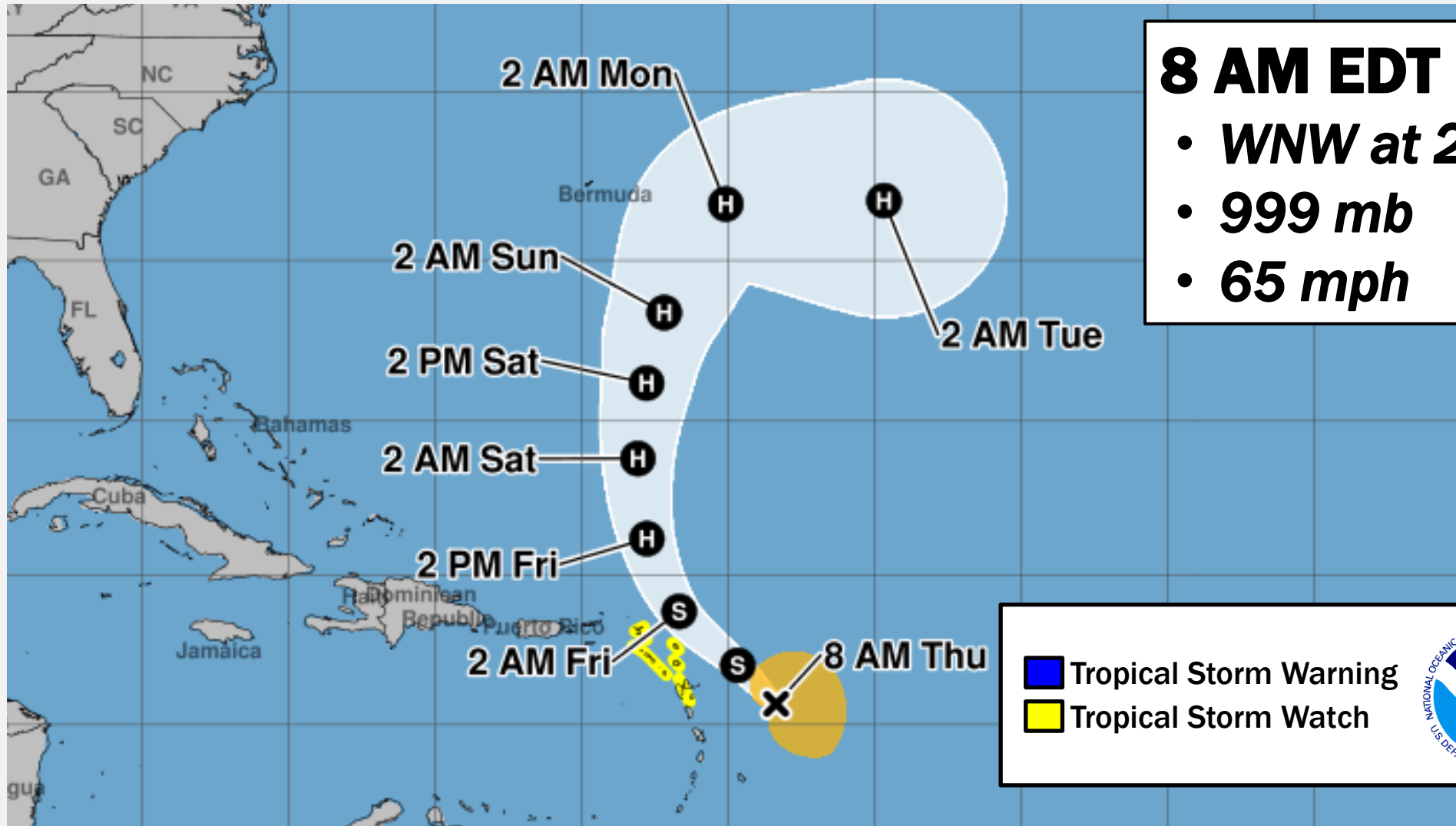

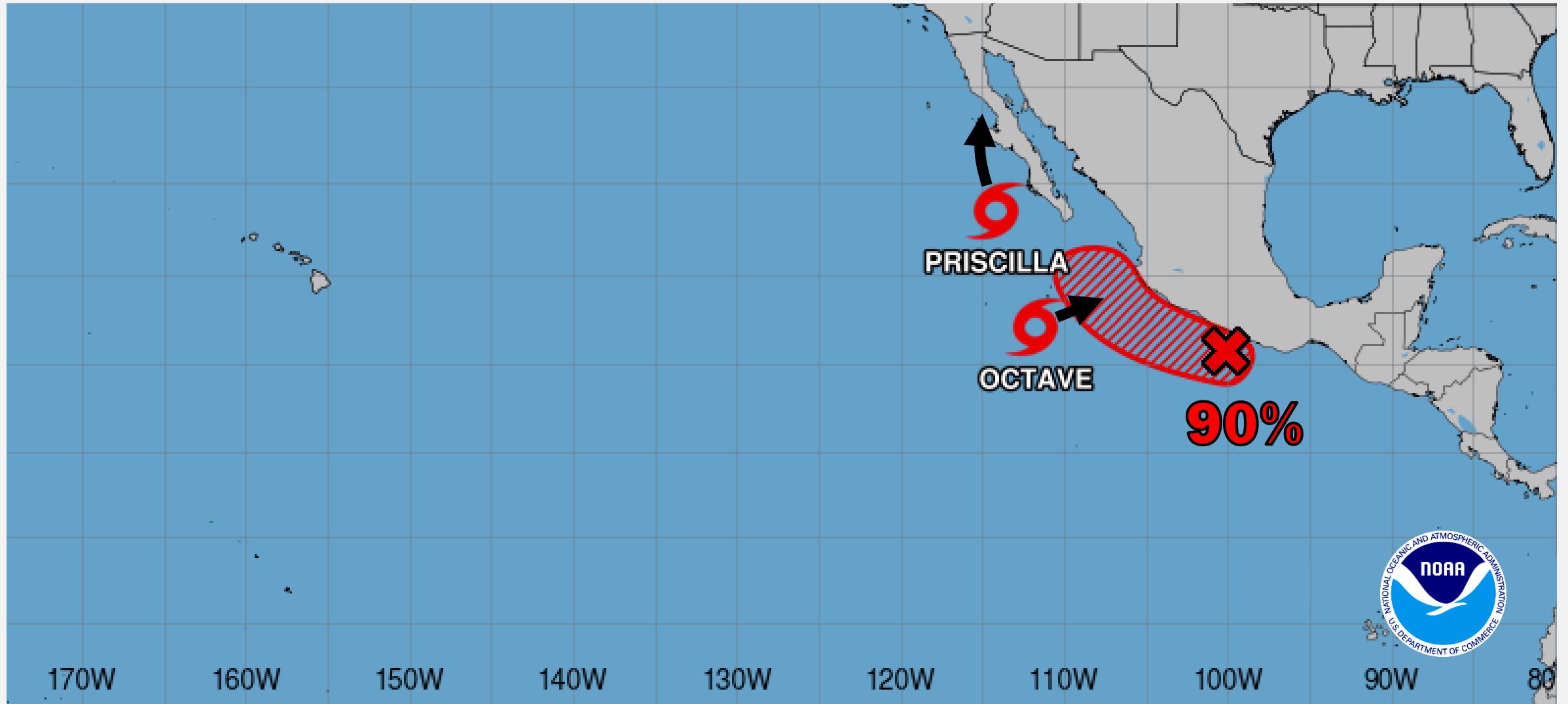

4 DAY RAINFALL FORECAST



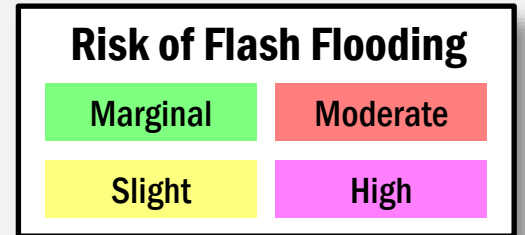
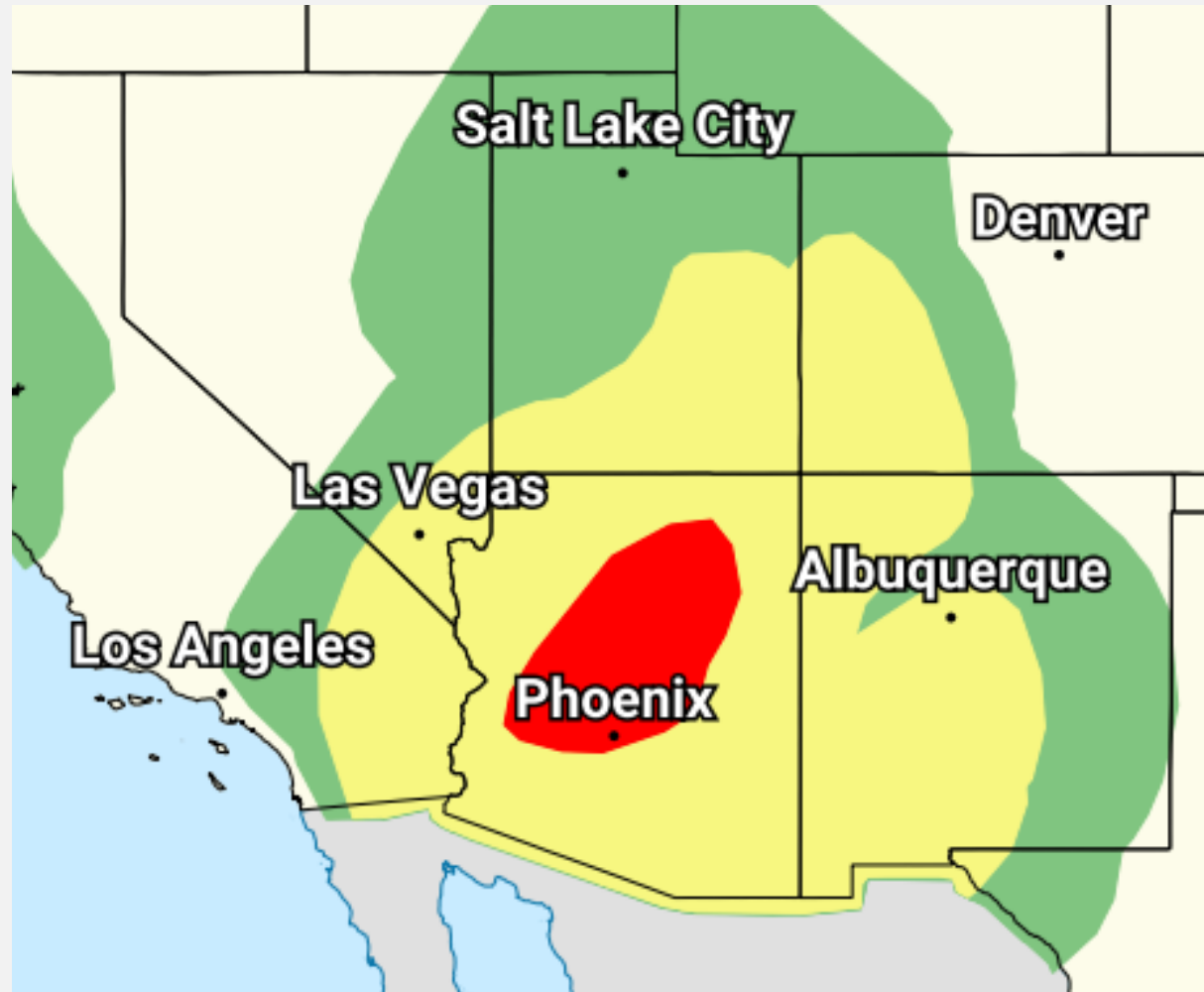

Tropical Storm Jerry – U.S. Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico



Situation: Tropical Storm Jerry, in the Atlantic Ocean, is forecast to pass Puerto Rico (PR) and the U.S. Virgin Islands (USVI) today and Friday. FEMA HQ and FEMA Region 2 deployed and activated various response and logistics resources in PR and the USVI in preparation of any requests from the territories.

Territorial / Local Response: PR and USVI EOCs at Normal Operations

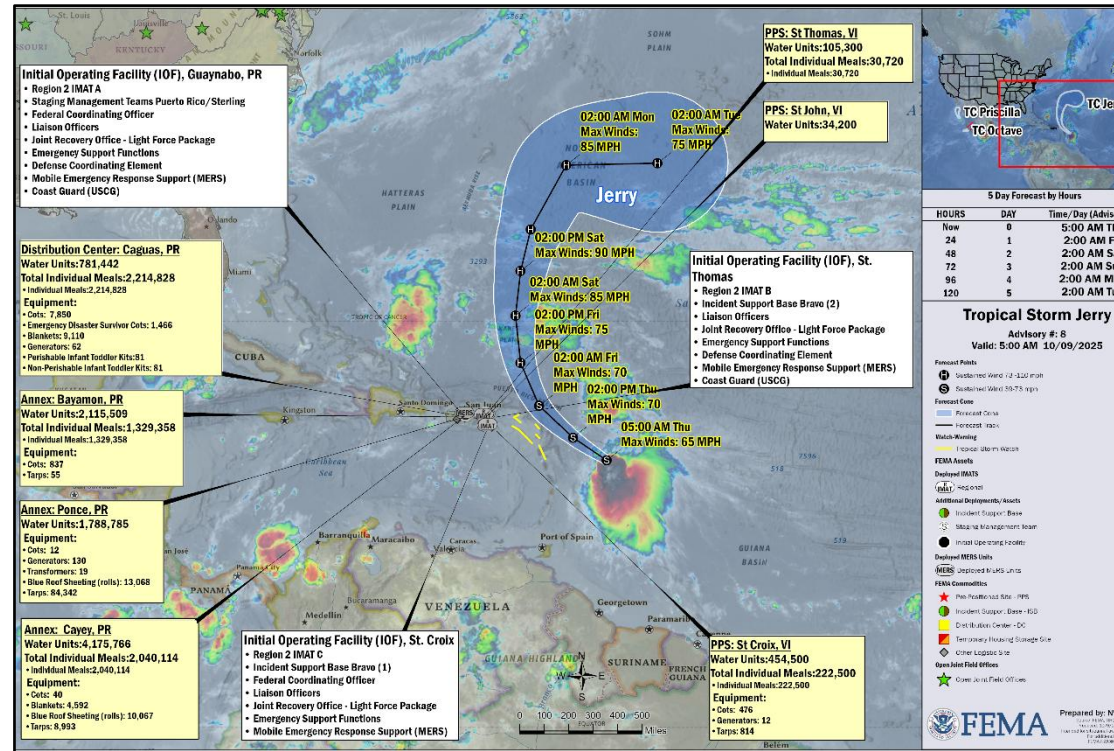
FEMA / Federal Response:

PR:

- Interim Operating Facility (IOF) in Guaynabo is active with resources including Federal Coordinating Officer (FCO); Liaison Officers (LNOs); Joint Recovery Office Light Force Package; Incident Management Assistance Team (IMAT)-C; Emergency Support Functions (ESFs) 2, 3, 8, 12, 13, 14, 15; U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), and Defense Coordinating Element (DCE)

USVI:

- IOFs in St. Thomas and St. Croix are active with resources including: FCO; LNO; Joint Recovery Office Light Force Package; IMAT-A and B, ESFs 2, 12



The NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with FEMA Region 2. Updates will be provided as the system develops.

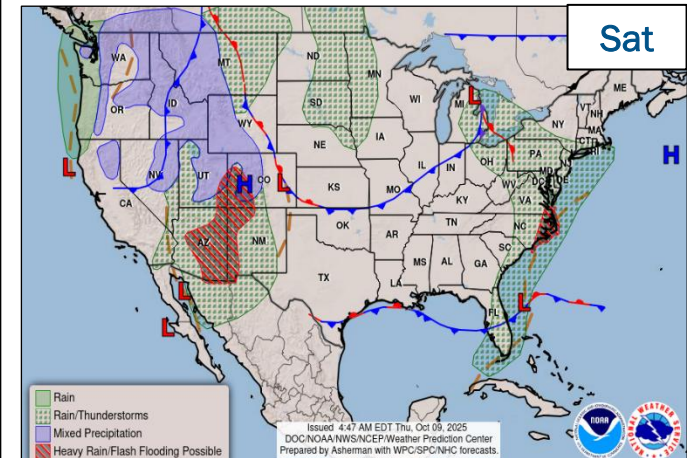
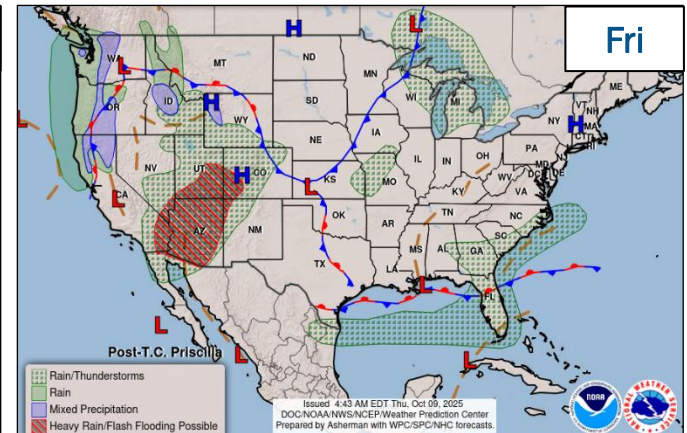
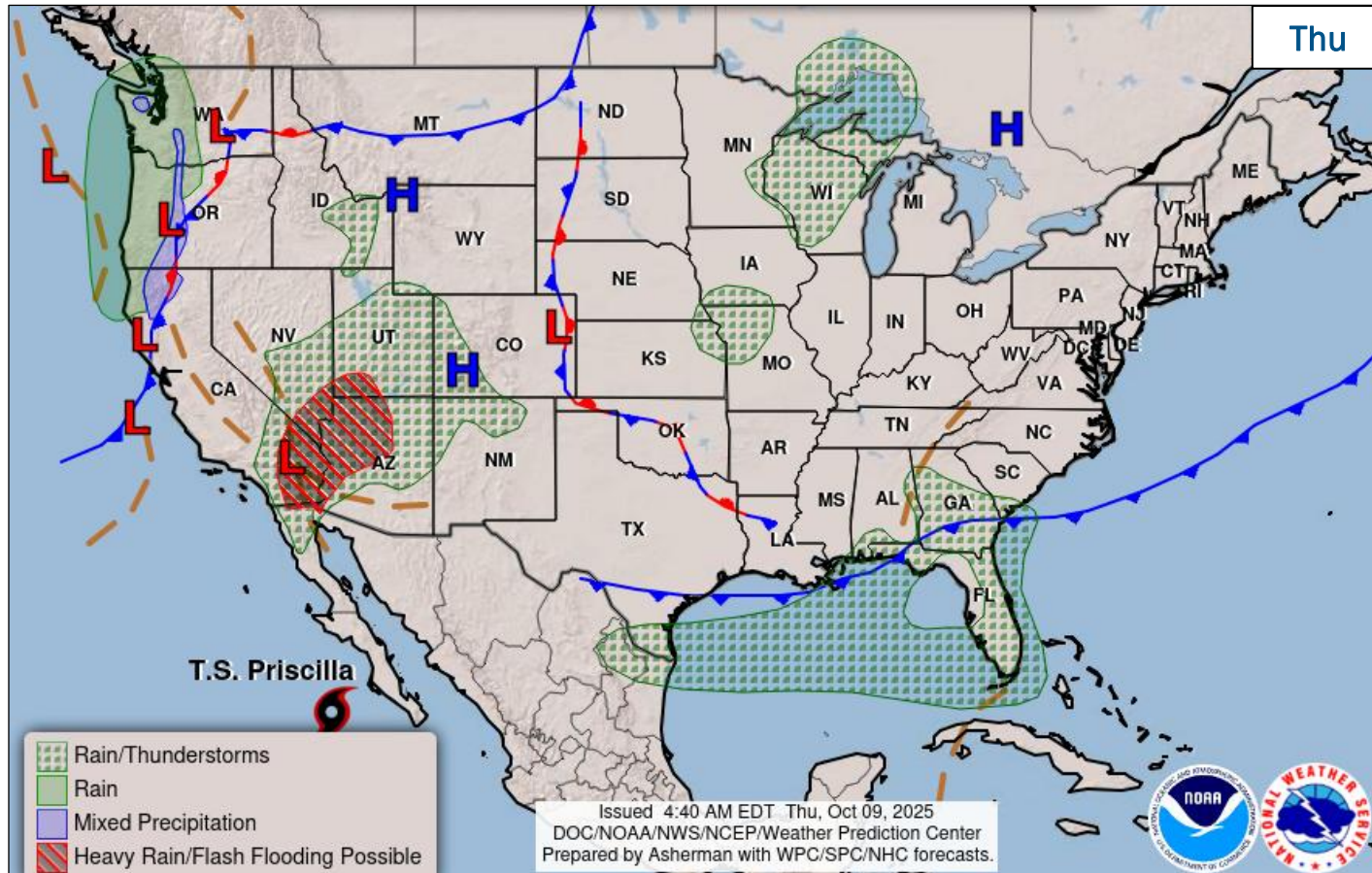
- RWC is Monitoring; RRCC is at Level 3 with ESFs 2-8 and 11-15, USCG, and DCE activated
- R-IMAT is deployed to St. Croix, USVI
- FEMA Integration Teams (FIT) embedded in PR & USVI EOCs

HQ:

- FEMA NWC is Monitoring; NRCC is at Steady State (Blue Team Rostered)
- Staging Management Team (SMT) Sterling and Puerto Rico deployed to Caguas, PR; Distribution Management Power Support Systems Mechanic/Fleet Management LNO deployed to Bayamon, PR
- Incident Support Base (ISB) Bravo 1 deployed to St. Croix, USVI; ISB Bravo 2 deployed to St. Thomas, USVI
- Maynard Mobile Emergency Response Support (MERS) assets deployed to Guaynabo, PR and St. Thomas/St. Croix, USVI



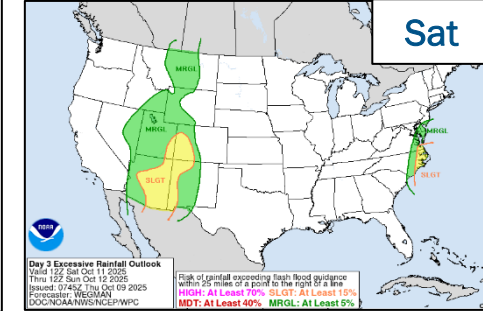
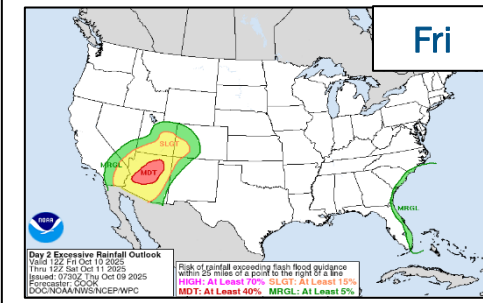
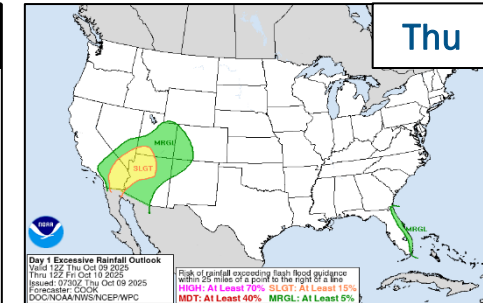
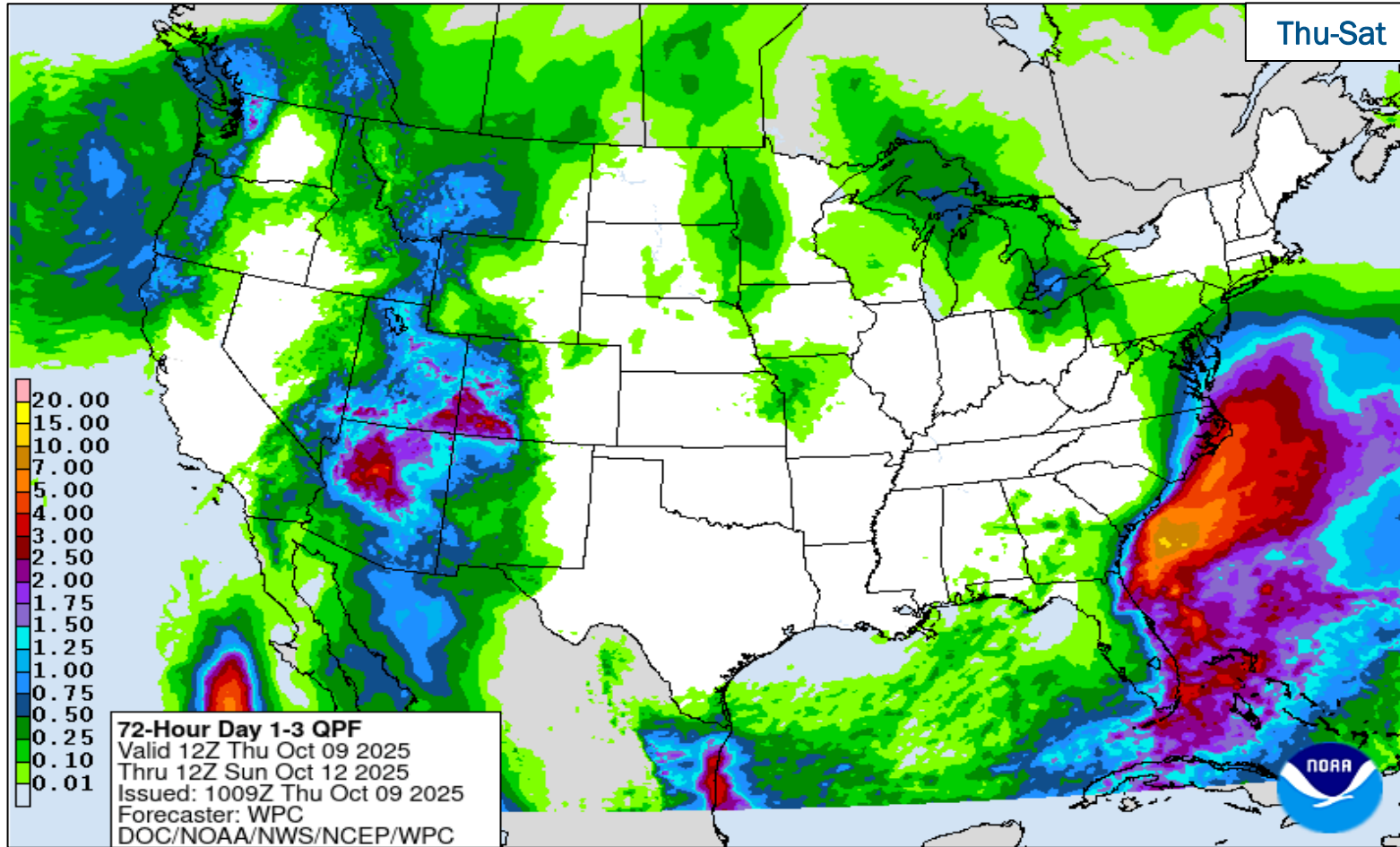

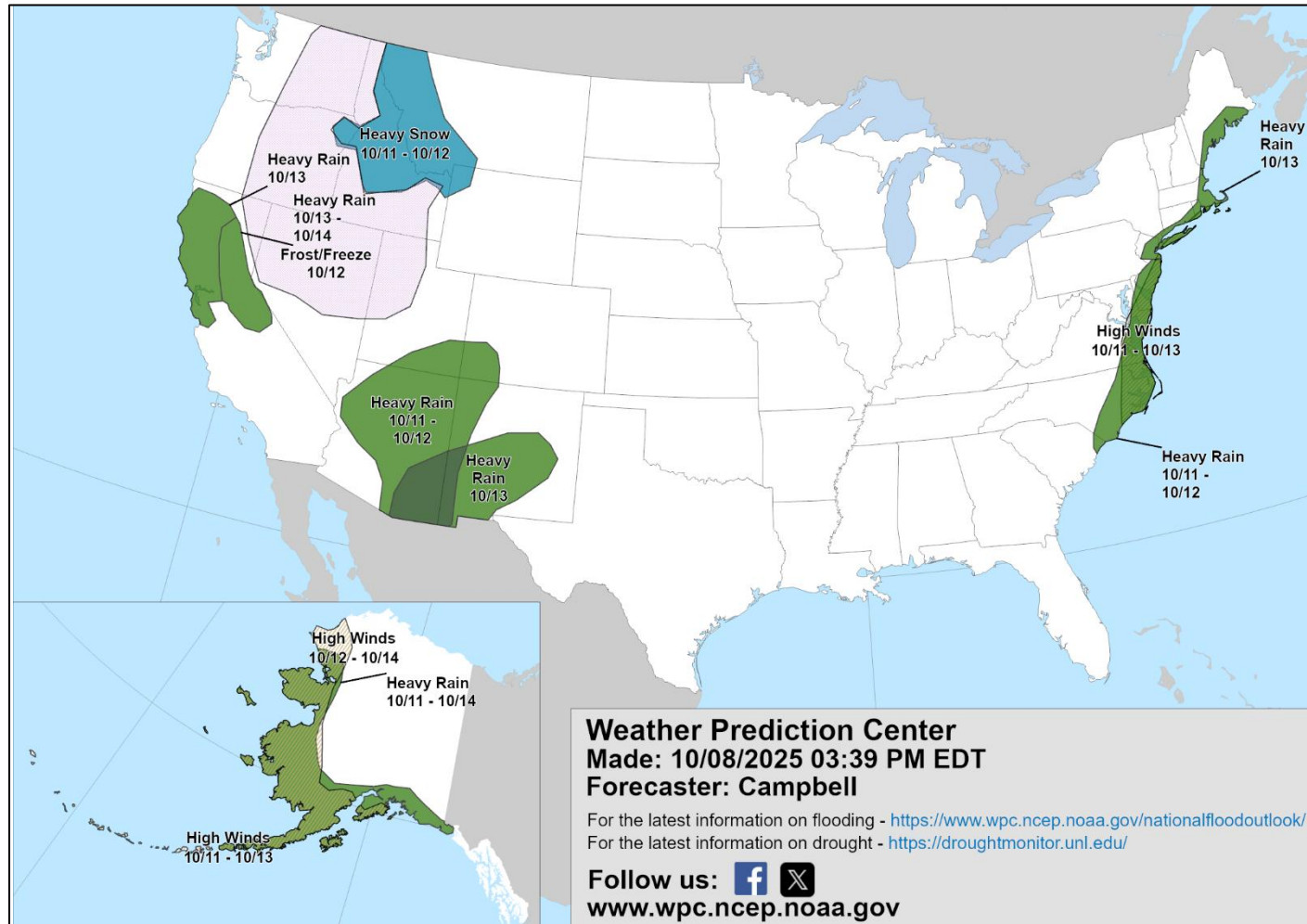
